

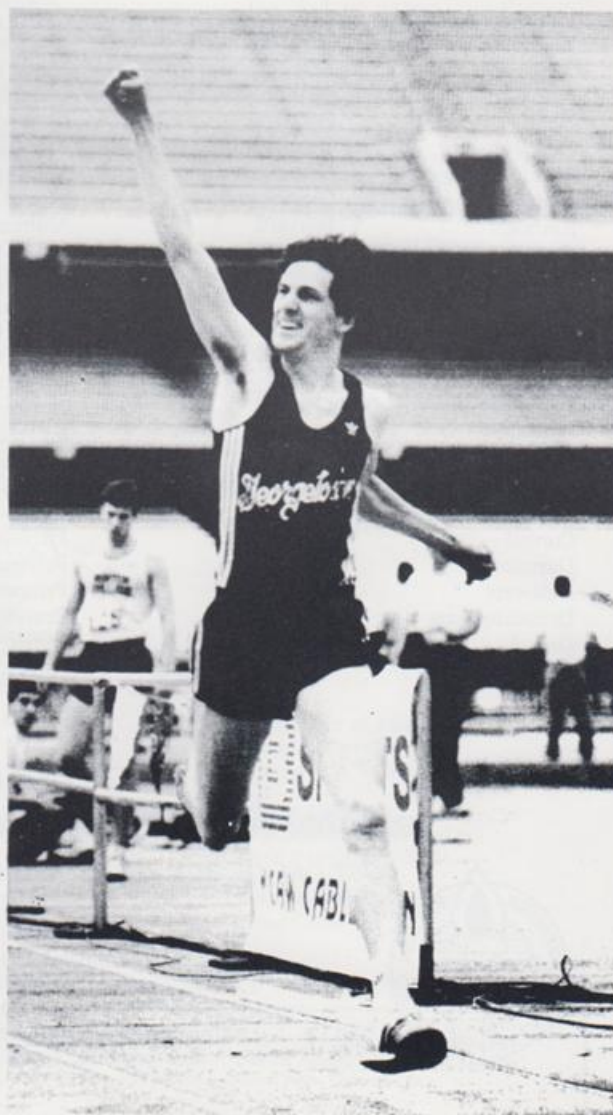

Princeton and its Rich Olympic Tradition

How quickly the time has passed since the world's athletes descended on Los Angeles, California, for the Summer Olympic Games. Of course, the Calgary Olympics have come and gone and later this year the amateur athletic spotlight shines on Seoul, Korea. It seems more than appropriate to recall Princeton's impact on the track and field competition at those Olympic Games and its direct corollation with this IC4A meet.

Most recently, it was Princeton track and cross country coach Larry Ellis who wrote a memorable chapter in Old Nassau's Olympic contribution. Ellis was selected the U.S. Olympic Men's Track and Field Coach for the L.A. Games. The highly successful team dominated the competition, winning nine gold medals, eight silvers and seven bronzes. Not only was Ellis the driving force behind the planning, organization and implementation before and during the Games, he also worked directly with team members participating in the 400 meter run, the 800 meter run, the Intermediate hurdles and the 1800 meter relay. He was assisted by four coaches and four managers. Needless to say, Ellis considers his Olympic assignment the highlight of his career.

August Wolf '83 won Heptagonal shot put titles during his undergraduate days under the tutelage of Princeton field events coach Fred Samara. He also won the shot put championship at the 1981 IC4A's and took second at the NCAA Indoors. While pursuing post-graduate studies at the University of Cologne in West Germany, he trained intensely with the hopes of gaining world-class status. He returned to the States and won the TAC Indoor National Championship with a heave of 69'3/4". He also won the TAC Outdoor Nationals with a 70'5 3/4" effort. He made the Olympic team and finished fourth (68'8").

Along with August Wolf, four other Princetonians competed in the 1984 U.S. Olympic Trials. Craig Masback '77, a standout miler at Old Nassau, competed in the 1500 meter run. Masback was an IC4A and Heptagonal champ and a member of the NCAA Champion two-mile relay combo in 1976. He is currently a track commentator for CBS television. Sally Anderson '83 competed in the 400 meter hurdles.

The former Ivy League champion in that event maintained her high level of training while pursuing graduate studies at the University of Pennsylvania. Lynn Jennings '83 competed in the 3000 and 5000 meter runs. David Olde '83 competed in the demanding Olympic Marathon Trials in Buffalo, New York, on May 26. It was only David's second marathon, his first being a winning effort in Detroit in December, 1983 (2:16.0).

But Princeton's Olympic connection runs far deeper than that. Rebirth of the ancient Olympic Games received considerable boost from five Princetonians - four juniors and a Professor of Latin. In 1894, a commission was formed to reinstate the Olympic Games. One of its representatives was Professor William Milligan Sloane of the Princeton classics department. After meeting with considerable reluctance on the part of American athletes nationwide, Professor Sloane hit paydirt in Boston and Princeton. Six members of the Boston Athletic Association finally agreed to take part as did four daring juniors at Princeton. They were led by Bob Garrett, captain of the Tiger track team.

Garrett, a specialist in the shot put, also competed against the talented Greeks in their premier event, the discus. Garrett practiced with a tailor-made, oddly-shaped weight which weighed some 20 pounds. How surprised he was when he arrived in Athens and discovered the real discus weighed just five pounds. Garrett's first effort at Athens was awkward, but he managed to qualify for the finals. He pulled himself together and on his final throw he won the event with a 95'7 1/2" effort. He thus became the first Princetonian to win a gold medal and later won his second gold in the shot put. He also took second in the broad jump and third in the high jump. The total haul for the Princeton contingent meant 11 olive branches, the most amassed by any national group.

Are there Olympians on the horizon this year? Debbie St. Phard '87, the outstanding shot putter who won Heptagonal and Eastern championships last year, has begun training for the Games. She competes for her native country of Haiti and is a virtual lock to compete in Seoul. Last summer, she finished fourth at the Pan American Games. St. Phard spent the fall in her first semester at Temple University's medical school and will return there following her Olympic experience.

Princeton and the Olympics, it's been a wonderful marriage that continues to grow.

Nine Returning Champions Highlight 67th IC4A Indoor Championships at Princeton

Nobody did it better last year than the nine defending champions who hope for a command performance at the 67th IC4A Indoor Track and Field Championships at Princeton University's Jadwin Gymnasium.

In what promises to be one of the most exciting and competitive IC4A meets ever, Penn State returns with another strong team and will attempt to defend its team title from '87. Other top squads appear to be George Mason, Georgetown, Maryland and Pittsburgh -- all of which finished among the top seven teams at last year's event at Harvard University's Gordon Track. Host Princeton University could be a darkhorse team.

The defending individual track champions include Lee McNeill of East Carolina in the 55 meter dash; Michael Timpson of Penn State, the co-champion in the 400 meter (as well as co-holder of the IC4A Meet Record at 46.81); Michael Greene of Navy in the 500 meter run and Mike Stahr of Georgetown in the one mile run, who also captured the NCAA title.

The IC4A defending field champions are John Finney of Maryland in the pole vault; D.D. Manns of James Madison, who set a meet record of 26-5 1/2 in the long jump; Cyril Mowatt of Georgetown in the triple jump; C.J. Hunter of Penn State in the shot-put and Gary Halpin of Manhattan in the 35-pound weight throw.

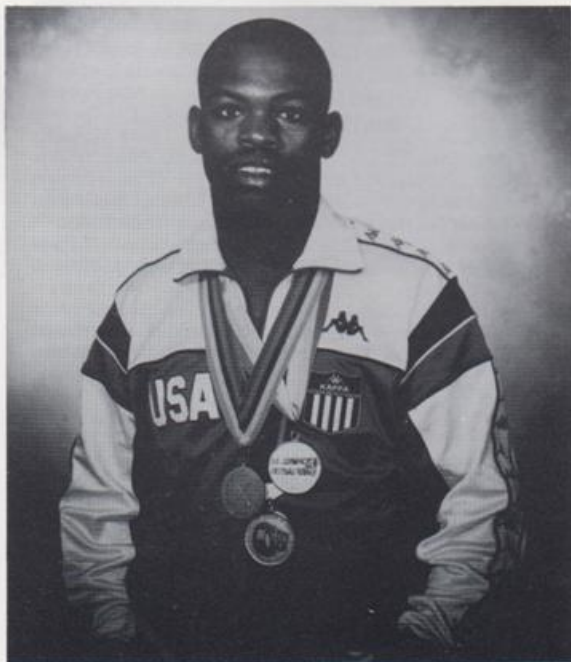
Several of these defending champions will have to contend with '86 IC4A indoor titlists in such events as the 55 meter dash, where IC4A and World Indoor recordholder,

Lee McRae of Pittsburgh returns following a one-year hiatus; the 400 meter, where Edwin Modibedi of Villanova is back and in the 5,000 meter, where Eric Carter of Penn State attempts to regain his '86 title after finishing second last year.

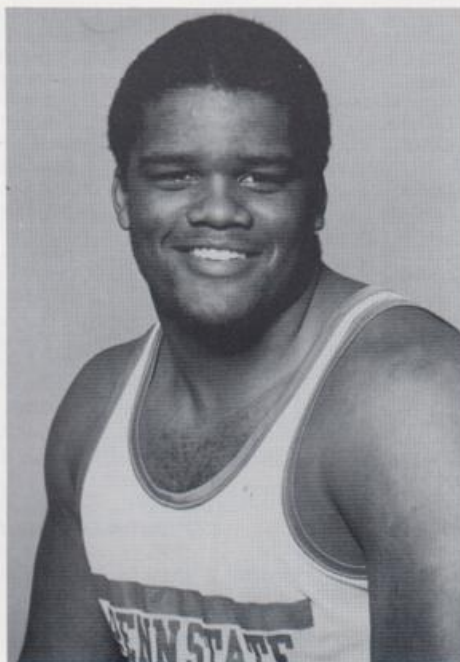
Perhaps one of the most competitive events will be the long jump, where Manns, the current IC4A Indoor record-holder, takes on Ray Humphrey of Georgetown, who is the '86 meet champion and "IC4A Collegiate" record-holder at 26-7 but was sidelined last year with a knee injury.

"We had a great indoor ICAAAA Championship at Harvard last March, with eight meet records set," explains first-year Eastern College Athletic Conference and IC4A Track and Field Administrator Larry Byrne. "But now we return to the familiar confines of Jadwin Gymnasium on the campus of Princeton University, where the ICAAAA has held its indoor championships (with the exception of '87) since 1971. From the number of returning champions from last year and the '86 meet at Princeton, the '88 meet should produce any number of fine performances, some of national-ranking calibre that should serve as a "qualifier" for the NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships the following week in Oklahoma City. Byrne, by the way, replaces long-time ECAC and IC4A track administrator Art Farnham, who retired from that position in August.

To accommodate the "long-sprinter" on the indoor program, the IC4A will conduct the 200 meter dash for the first time and it will be a scoring event. It will also serve as a qualifier for the same distance at the NCAA Championship meet.

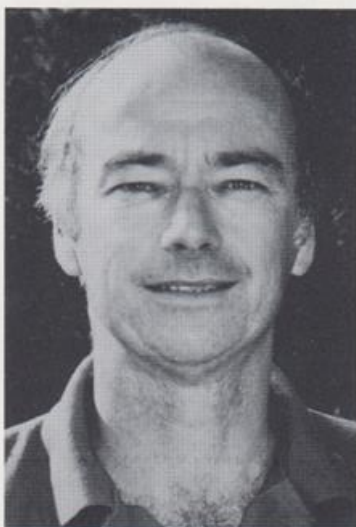

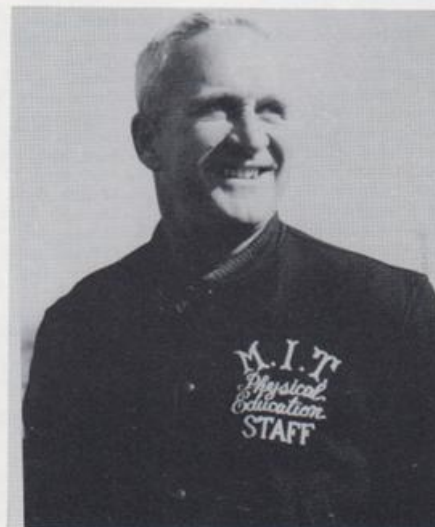

The ECAC

*The Nation's Largest
Athletic Conference*

50 Years of Tradition, Diversity & Service

Proudly celebrating its 50th anniversary in 1988, the Eastern College Athletic Conference is a voluntary association of 250 colleges and universities throughout New England, the Middle Atlantic states, Virginia, the District of Columbia and North Carolina.

The ECAC, which is the nation's largest athletic conference, is unique in that institutions of Divisions I, II & III are members, from the largest state-supported universities to the small private or church affiliated colleges, lending the conference an unparalleled diversity in membership and philosophy.

A Conference of conferences, the ECAC umbrella covers dozens of playing conferences and other associations. Colleges and universities from the Big East and Ivy League to the Pennsylvania, Massachusetts, New York and New Jersey State Conferences, along with 14 other Division I, II and III conferences, hold active membership in the ECAC.

Over the years, the ECAC has developed a strong voice on not only the regional level, but also on the national scale with the National Collegiate Athletic Association. Since over 25 percent of the NCAA is made up of ECAC members, the Conference membership has the ability to play a leading role in the development of national athletic policy and action.

From the viewpoints of both philosophy and personnel, the ECAC's impact upon the NCAA is well documented. The ECAC and its member colleges have been prime movers in the development of divisional structure and autonomy which was also adopted by the NCAA. John Toner, University of Connecticut athletic director and Boston College's athletic director, Bill Flynn, have served both as NCAA and ECAC Presidents to head the list of prominent ECAC administrators who have served key leadership roles in the NCAA. Former Cornell athletic director Dick Schultz is now the executive director of the NCAA.

Founded in 1938 as the Central Office for Eastern Intercollegiate Athletics, the ECAC began with a charter membership of 53 colleges and has grown into its present membership of 250. From the start, under the leadership of its first Commissioner, Asa S. Bushnell, the conference addressed the concerns of its members in the same fashion as it does today. Bushnell and the Central Office were able to meet and resolve athletics scheduling issues, administer the assignment of officials and lend its management skills to various tournaments and championships.

In 1947, the Central Office officially became the Eastern College Athletic Conference and another assignment was taken on by the ECAC -- that being the maintenance of minimum standards of eligibility for student athletes and the establishment of basic principles for the ethical conduct of intercollegiate athletics, by member colleges. While recognizing the right of each individual college to set its own academic standards programs and operate under its own code of ethics, the membership of the ECAC legislated certain minimum standards of eligibility which now apply to all Conference members in such areas as amateurism, recruiting, academic standing, financial aid, years of participation and outside competition, all of which are now consistent with standards also adopted by the NCAA.

Bushnell molded and guided the organization from its inception until his retirement in 1970, at which time his long-time associate, George L. Shiebler, was appointed Commissioner. Robert M. (Scotty) Whitelaw, who joined the ECAC in 1960 as Assistant Commissioner, succeeded Commissioner Shiebler upon his retirement in 1972. Under Whitelaw's leadership the ECAC has continued to prosper as the largest and one of the most dynamic and diversified athletic conferences in the country.

Today the ECAC has evolved to the point where its member institutions not only enjoy the benefits such as the professional management and coordination of its numerous tournaments and championships, expertise on eligibility and rules interpretations and the assigning of officials, but also public relations department and service bureau to promote the membership's teams and student athletes, all in an atmosphere of mutual trust which was always commonplace among ECAC institutions from the start.

The ECAC now assigns officials for regular season and championship events in the sports of baseball, men's and women's basketball, fencing, football, gymnastics, ice hockey, men's and women's soccer and wrestling, as well as the ECAC affiliate championships in cross country, indoor and outdoor track, crew and swimming.

In addition, the ECAC professionally manages over 70 championship events for its member colleges -- including those for Division I men's basketball, ice hockey and baseball tournaments whose winners receive automatic berths into their respective NCAA Championships, and terminal ECAC championships for all three divisions in the sports of football, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's golf, men's and women's lacrosse, field hockey, men's and women's gymnastics, men's and women's ice hockey, swimming and diving, women's volleyball, cross country, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track, softball and Division II and III baseball.

The ECAC office also helps manage the championship tournaments of its affiliates in cross country and track (IC4A), wrestling (Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Association), fencing (Intercollegiate Fencing Association), swimming (Eastern Intercollegiate Swimming League), crew (Eastern Association of Rowing Colleges & the Intercollegiate Rowing Association) and gymnastics (Eastern Intercollegiate Gymnastics League). The ECAC Holiday Basketball Festival, held every year at Madison Square Garden in New York City, is sponsored by the ECAC and is the premier Christmas tournament in the country.

With the help of its public relations and service bureau departments, the ECAC helps to promote its members' athletic programs and athletes through weekly and seasonal players and teams of the year awards, selection of all-star teams, compilation of statistics and publications, as well as publicizing its championships.

The ECAC current headquarters, the Asa S. Bushnell Center, is located in Centerville, Mass., and was dedicated to its first commissioner in 1974. The ECAC is currently staffed by 20 full-time employees with an additional part-time staff of 15 serving as supervisors of officials.

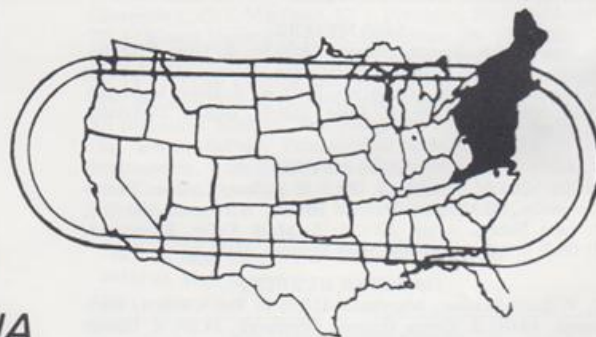
