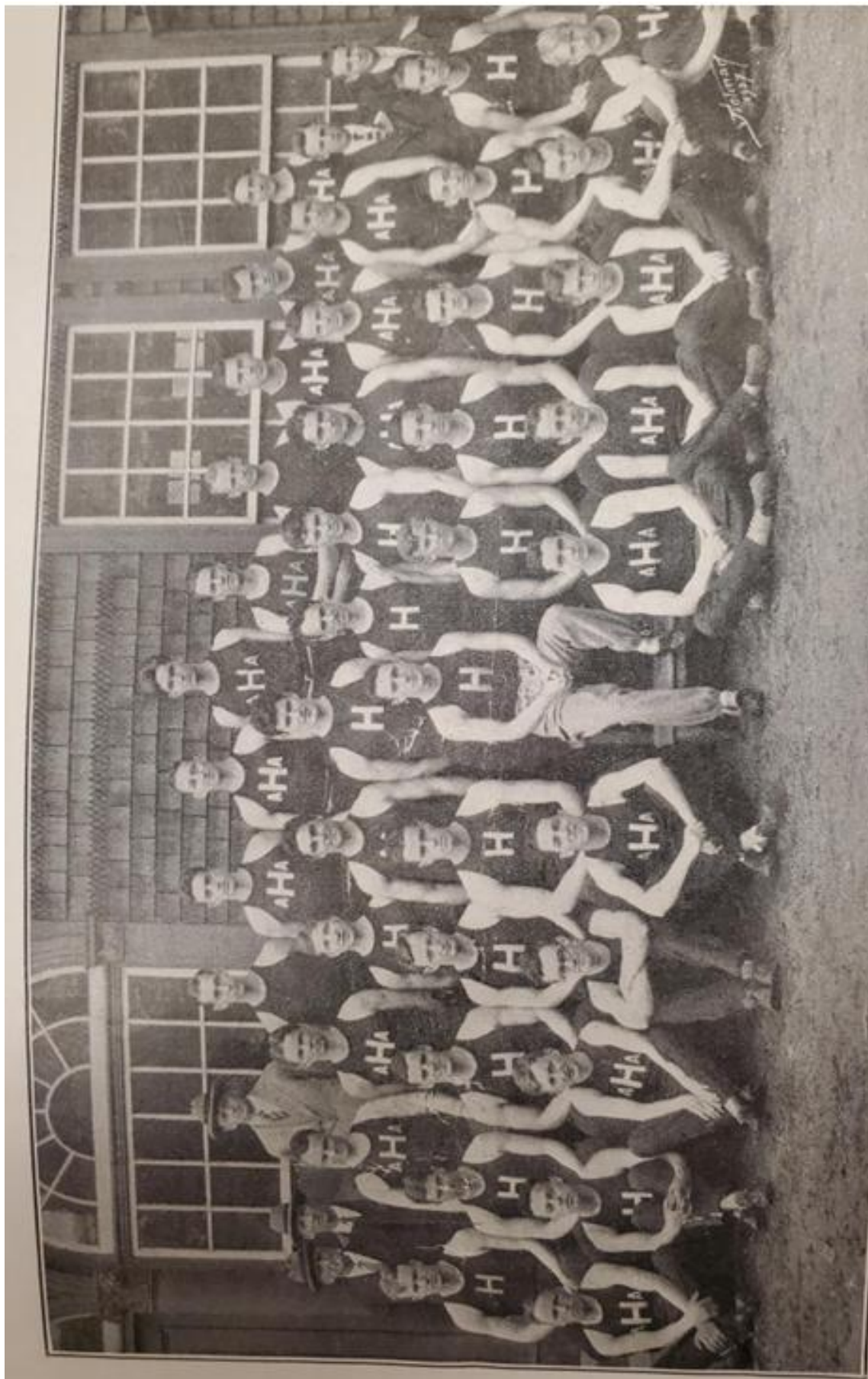

There is no penalty for the first false start. A competitor is disqualified for the second false start.

Indoor Intercollegiate record for 60 yards is 7 8-10 seconds, made by Harold E. Barron, Penn State, on March 11, 1922.

Indoor Intercollegiate record for 70 yards is 8 6-10 seconds, made by Charles H. Moore, Penn State, March 7, 1925. Previous record was 9 seconds, held also by Mr. Moore.

RUNNING BROAD JUMP

Each competitor allowed 6 trials in series of 2 trials each, but two competitors alternate in taking one jump each for their two trials. The length of the run is unlimited. The take-off is a black band painted on the runway. The edge toward the pit is the scratch line. Measurements are made at right angles from this line to the nearest break in the ground made by any part of the jumper's body. In making the jump no part of the jumper's shoe or foot shall touch the "ground" in front of or project over the scratch line. Crossing the line is a jump, crossing the balk line—6 feet in front of the scratch line without jumping is a balk; two successive balks count as a jump.
