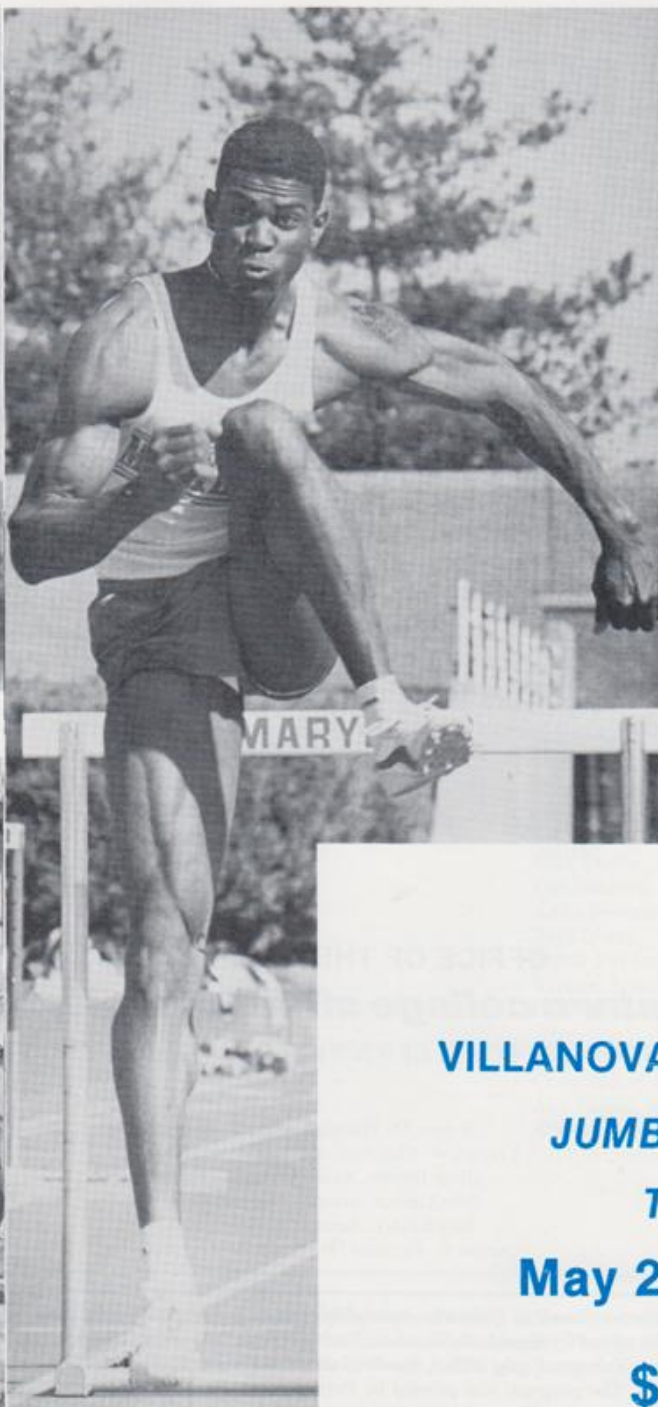

O'REILLY'S PROGRESS CAN BE MEASURED IN MILES

It was the spring of 1985, his sophomore year at Villanova, and Gerry O'Reilly was visiting his good friend and Ireland's hero, Eamonn Coghlan, in New York.

Their conversation was interrupted by a knock at the door. It was a young boy who had come to ask "Mr. Coghlan" for an autograph.

"It was funny, the kid lived about 20 miles from me at home in Ireland," O'Reilly said. "Eamonn went and got him a photo and signed it. I didn't want to ask him for one, but since he had all his things out, I said, 'Any chance you could stick your name on one of those for me?'"

"He felt I shouldn't be asking him, because we're good friends and all. But he said, 'All right, let me think.' He grabs a picture and starts scribbling away, and I could tell he was writing a lot more than 'To Gerry, Best Wishes, Eamonn,' you know."

On the action photo of himself, Coghlan had written, To Gerry.

"Junior year is where it all begins. Just relax and let it come to you."

Coghlan must have seen something in a struggling, often-frustrated sophomore that season. The following winter, O'Reilly burst upon the national track scene with a string of first-place finishes longer than a back straightaway.

Indoors, he captured the mile at the prestigious Wanamaker Millrose Games at Madison Square Garden, and doubled as the 1,500 and 3,000-meter champion at the Big East championships. Outdoors ... there isn't enough space. This should give you an idea why:

On June 14, 1986, at the Jumbo Elliott Invitational, O'Reilly ran the mile in 3:54.63.

Just five men have ever run it faster in Villanova's storied track history, past and present world class milers beginning with Sydney Maree, Coghlan, Marty Liquori, Marcus O'Sullivan and Don Paige.

It was the first time the 6-2, 158-pounder from Dunboyne, Ireland had cracked the 4-minute barrier. He didn't crack it, he took a sledgehammer to it.

"I personally didn't think I could do it," O'Reilly said. "It will not be the last time."

Last year, many people only "heard of" Gerry O'Reilly. At this weekend's 111th IC4A Championships, you not only will frequently hear his name, but also, "the next great Irish runner at Villanova."

"It's frightening," O'Reilly said. "It's really frightening. Freshman year, I can remember looking through the



track guide and seeing all the great performances of guys like Eamonn and Marcus, and non-Irish guys as well. Paige, Liquori, and thinking how incredibly fast they had run here."

"And I remember wondering if I could ever get within, like, 6 seconds of them. And all of a sudden, you find you're no longer looking up to them [statistically]. I mean, they're still up there great and everything, but suddenly you're on a par with them. It's a great honor to even be mentioned with those guys. But I feel I have a long way to go to achieve a reputation of people like Eamonn, Marty, Donald, Sydney and some of the other greats."

It wasn't so long ago that O'Reilly wondered whether he would ever make it as a middle-distance runner in America. It took him two full years, as it does many foreign athletes, to adjust to the rigorous training schedule of a top U.S. program such as Villanova's.

In Ireland, the elite runners are limited to running the hills and narrow roads of their hometowns. They rarely experience the speed of tartan surfaces. A busy year for a quality runner in Ireland is 10 meets.

"Over here, you may run four times in a weekend," O'Reilly said. "It was a shock to my system at age 19. It took a lot of getting used to."

"I remember sometimes being so depressed; because I'd had to put out 100 percent just to make it to the finals of some meets. And when I got in the race ... and seeing people like Marcus just ... just take off with a lap to go. And I'd be there with absolutely nothing left. Some days, I wondered if my turn would ever come, if I'd ever be strong enough when that last quarter came to say, 'O.K., the race is just starting now.' Back then, it was like, 'I'm dead, and those guys are just starting.'"

"I really had my doubts."

That was nothing new. If he said it to himself once, he said it 500 times while working out in county Meath, outside Dublin, after graduation (at age 17) from the Coolmine Community School in Dunboyne - "I'm not good enough to go to Villanova."

Manhattan, Arkansas, Iona and East Tennessee State got wind of O'Reilly at age 19, when he won the 19-and-under 1,500 meters at the Irish Nationals in 1983. He had spent the two years since high school training, in hopes of improving enough to draw a look from Villanova.

"I wanted to go to the States more than anything," he said.

It was on a summer training run with Coghlan in 1983 that the wheels were set in motion for O'Reilly's eventual trip to the Main Line on a track scholarship.

"I'll never forget it, because that conversation is what got me where I am today, actually," O'Reilly said. "Eamonn and I were running and I asked him, of the colleges that were recruiting me, which one would he recommend. And he was shocked that I hadn't mentioned Villanova. He said, 'What I'd like to hear you say is, 'What are my chances of getting into Villanova?'"

"I was a little embarrassed, really. I said, 'Well, the only reason I didn't ask is I didn't think I was good enough, and I didn't think they had any scholarships to offer.' He said, 'Let me give Jack Pyrah (Villanova assistant coach who specializes in landing top Irishmen) a call and get back to you tomorrow.'"

Two days later, O'Reilly was a Wildcat recruit. Last year, he became a part of Villanova track history. This year, he hopes to add to his accomplishments, and possibly rewrite some of them.

His 1987 goals include the low 3:50's in the mile, a 13:20 in the 5,000 meters - it would be the fastest in Villanova history - and an NCAA championship in the 1,500 meters. Just three Irishmen have ever done the latter: Ron Delaney (Villanova, 1956), Coghlan ('76) and Frank O'Mara (Arkansas, '83).

"I'd like to be the fourth, but if I'm not, it won't be from lack of effort," O'Reilly said.

He hopes to continue that pursuit at this weekend's IC4A Outdoor track championships where he could be featured in either the 1,500 or 5,000 meters. In the 1986 IC4A championships, O'Reilly captured both races in an amazing double, after being urged by Villanova assistant track coach Jack Pyrah.

"I never intended running the 5,000 meters last year," O'Reilly explained. "But Mr. Pyrah said if I would run and just place in the event, there was a possibility we could win the meet, so I said I'll give it a shot. I didn't feel that bad after running the 1,500, but after the 5,000 I didn't feel good at all, my feet were burning."

Will O'Reilly make an attempt at another historic double in 1987?

"It will be much tougher to do a double this year than last year because both the 1,500 and 5,000 meters will have some talented runners."

O'Reilly is referring to Georgetown's Mike Stahr, a possible contender in the 1,500, as well as brothers Kip and Charles Cheruiyot from Mt. St. Mary's in either the 1,500 or 5,000 meters.

"The IC4A's are the second to last meet of the year and all the athletes are in better shape, it's a good blowout before the NCAA's," O'Reilly said.

For O'Reilly, the NCAA championships will be the end of four years of collegiate track. But after his performances in the mile over the last two years, it marks the beginning of a long and successful career on the track that will feature Gerry O'Reilly as Villanova's next great Irish miler.



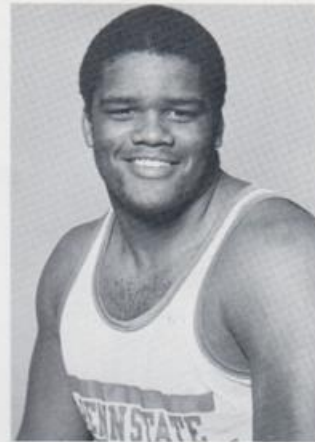

CROSSING THE THRESHOLD

PITTSBURGH -- Prestige. This is something that every school's athletic program wants. It doesn't come overnight or in months, but takes years of hard work and dedication to attain. The Pitt track team is on the verge of achieving this.

Five years ago John Vasvary took over as head coach at the University of Pittsburgh. He accepted the challenge to try and bring prestige to the track team even though he was in the midst of a football and basketball dominated school. Still Vasvary set out to build a winner.

His first year of coaching wasn't the most memorable. Although he had a talented group of athletes, only a few excelled.

"My initial year as head coach wasn't bad," Vasvary said. "Basically all we had to work with were upperclassmen. There were very few freshmen and sophomores on the team which really hurt us."

The first item on Vasvary's agenda was to go and recruit the best possible athletes that fit into his system. Because Pitt belonged to the Big East, Vasvary could offer prospective freshmen the chance to compete with some of the top athletes in the nation.

"It was a fight to try and convince some kids to choose us over the other schools," said Vasvary. "All we could tell them was what we hoped to accomplish if they came to Pitt. It was a joint effort by all the coaches to try and recruit the athletes."

Slowly, but surely, Vasvary started to have some good individuals come in and do well for him. The most noticeable was Roger Kingdom. In 1984, Kingdom won the gold medal at the Olympic games in the 110-meter high hurdles. This, coupled with strong performances during the season from other team members, finally earned Pitt some recognition.

"We no longer had to promise athletes that we were going to get better," Vasvary said. "But rather they could look and see what we had done."

Year by year Pitt started to climb in the Big East standings and now it is consistently a top five caliber team.

"We are at the point where teams are going to have to contend with us," Vasvary said. "In the past we were looked at as just another easy win. Those days of overlooking us are finished because opponents can't afford to do it. Our team is considerably better and we are a serious threat every time we step onto the track."

Vasvary can make this claim because of the athletes that now run for him. Tim Manes, Dave Moore, Bob Weiner and Joe Daniels, Pitt's 1986 All-American two-mile relay team, are among that group.

"I haven't changed a thing," Vasvary said. "I'm still using the same formula I used when I came here five years ago. The only difference is that we have a team of talented athletes instead of just a few talented individuals."

That same formula has produced twelve NCAA All-Americans under Vasvary's guidance. His most recent product that has brought by far the largest recognition to the team is All-World, All-American, and All-Big East sprinter Lee McRae. McRae has been tabbed the fastest

human in the world because of his 55-meter dash that he ran in six seconds flat.

In the past, Vasvary had to rely on the freshmen to come in and perform right away. Now with such a talented group of older athletes, there is no pressure on the younger athletes to do well in their first year of competition.

"We do have freshmen who can come in and help us, but we don't have to depend on them," Vasvary said. "Now if they come in and perform, that's great. But if they don't and it takes another year, that will be fine."

The future seems bright for coach Vasvary and the team. In five short years, Vasvary has brought Pitt track out of obscurity and into the forefront of the collegiate ranks. With a little luck and more hard work, prestige could soon be a word that is associated with the Pitt track team.

Calvin Holmes - "Has done a good job. He has placed in just about every meet this year. Solid performer."

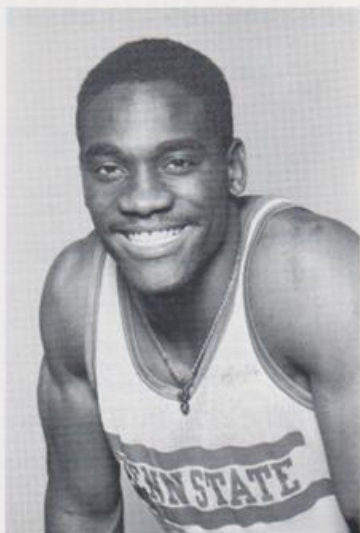

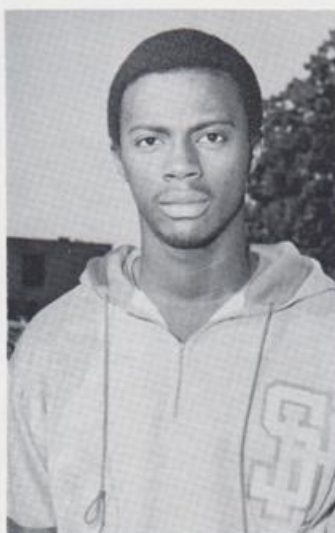
