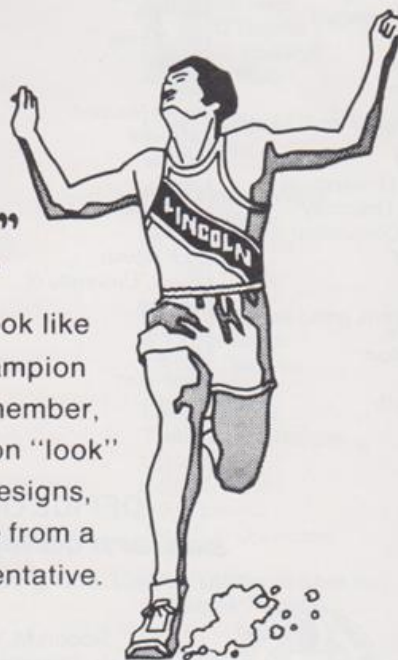

Turtles, Wildcats, and Championships

Everybody has heard the story of the tortoise and the hare. Have you heard the one about the turtle and the cat?

It's a race that has taken place for the past half dozen years or so. Happens once a year the first weekend in March. It's held in Princeton, N.J. indoors. And it's always a race.

If you believe that Maryland and Villanova are just two of 97 schools battling for the annual IC4A Track and Field Indoor Championship, consider this:

--Maryland has won the indoor team title in 1976 and finished second in 1975, '77 and '78. Villanova has copped the team trophy three times in the last five years: 1974, '77 and '78. It placed third in '76.

--Together, the Terrapins and the Wildcats have eight of the meet's 18 records. Villanova has six, Maryland two.

--Last year, Villanova won with 64 team points compared to Maryland's 39, a greater total than the next nine teams in order combined. After collecting 103 of the meet's points, it left 156 to be distributed for the other 95 schools.

--The two schools scored points in 15 of 18 scoring events. Firsts were awarded in 11 events. Maryland has seven All-IC4A athletes, Villanova had nine and all three relays.

This is the kind of stuff that fairy tales are made of. Many tactical hours go into the strategy of the race, though outwardly each coach will have you believe that it's just another weekend.

It's not, it's IC4A time, and the two gigantic powers in the IC4A have as much in common as the tortoise and the hare.

"Our team is different," says head coach Frank Costello, from his tortoise shell in the confines of Cole Field House, College Park, Maryland. "We're in a conference, the ACC, and we build a team differently."

Maryland has an awesome dual meet and conference record. In 25 years, the Terps have never lost a track conference championship, indoors or outdoors. Maryland beats teams by picking them apart, winning meets through sheer balance. Very few teams across the land can match Maryland's one-on-one type of success.

Costello, in his five years at Maryland, has put his team on the national map through upgrading an already competitive program. He does not hide his insatiable appetite for success. "My philosophy is that I want to be the best. I want to win the NCAA," says the coach of two IC4A championship teams, one indoor and one outdoor.

To be the best, Maryland has relied on its history of field success and has subtly changed the complexion of its track team.

"All the long jumpers and high jumpers and triple jumpers come to me," he explains. "We've been able to coach jumpers very successfully."

"I have been putting more emphasis in the sprints. We're a speed team with hurdlers and a good mile relay."

Powered by the Dennis Ivories and the Larry Longs and the Brad Turleys and the Ian Pykas, Maryland has garnered large leads the first day of the IC4As. Sunday, though, is track day and to put other teams away with an untenable lead requires good runners.

Jesse "The Book" Abramson

**Jesse Abramson isn't infallible,
it only seems that way.**

The man who is nicknamed "The Book" for his vast reservoir of knowledge of all sports, once made a mistake. Harold Rosenthal, a long-time colleague on the then Herald Tribune, recalls the circumstance with relish.

"It happened at the Millrose Games back in the 1920's," said Rosenthal. "I was in the office and Jesse's report of the meet came in saying that Joie Ray won the Wanamaker Mile."

"Well, six minutes later we got a follow up which read, 'Scratch the lead, Ray was second.' It was probably the only error he ever made. Jesse has the most unbelievable memory a human being can have.

What makes Abramson's total recall even more remarkable is that his knowledge is spread among such diverse activities as boxing, baseball, swimming, football, and fencing.

Track, however, is perhaps his first love. He has covered every Olympic Games since 1928 in Amsterdam and has served as a press coordinator for the IC4A Championships for the last 51 years.

The 1979 IC4A Indoor Track and Field Championships at Princeton won't be the same this weekend because for the first time in six decades Abramson won't be there. He has cancer.

"We shouldn't mourn Jesse, we should celebrate having known him," said Frank Litsky, the assistant Sports Editor of the New York Times and the President of the New York Track Writers Association.

"We are all better for having touched him. He has given the journalism profession integrity. Jesse has a love affair with the facts. No one could distort them, not while he was there. Nobody could say anything bad about track while he was around either. One thing he especially couldn't tolerate was a reporter not knowing his basic facts and asking a stupid question. Because of him our jobs are a lot easier."

Abramson's expertise knows no bounds. He can tell you who finished third in the 400 meters at the 1932 Olympics, who came in sixth in the Millrose 60 yard dash, in what round Joe Louis knocked out Max Schmeling, or who was the second baseman on the 1939 New York Yankees. "He remembers things that just seem impossible to remember," Litsky went on. "At a reception after the first Clay-Liston fight in Lewiston, Maine, a judge came up to Jesse and said, 'You probably don't know me but I won the IC4A Cross Country Championships in 1923.'"

JADWIN: Jewel Of Jersey

Like the Belle of the Ball whose dance card is totally filled, Princeton's Jadwin Gymnasium is far from a wallflower. In its ten year existence the multi-faceted athletic facility has hummed like the proverbial beehive from November until April, a schedule of utilization which has made it one of the best known indoor athletic facilities in the nation.

Jadwin has known the polite applause of tennis and squash, the excited crowd noises of basketball, wrestling and track and the stomping, pulsing cacaphony of the Rock Concert audience. It has housed championship and preliminary events on a broad scope in addition to the regular University athletic events. Its versatility can be attested to by a review of the broad spectrum of entertainment which it has hosted since its opening in January of 1969.

The first athletic event in Jadwin was the Penn-Princeton basketball game of January 25, 1969 though there was still completion work to be done on the structure. A little over a month later--on March 1-- the official dedication was held on the occasion of the Harvard-Princeton-Yale track meet.

Once things got underway, there were few dark nights. Not long after its dedication, a massive "teach-in" was held on the main floor, one of many such affairs which were associated with the unrest attending the war in Vietnam. While no Commencement Exercises have yet been staged here, Jadwin will be the site of any future graduation ceremonies forced inside by inclement weather.

Among the concerts which have put maximum stress on the very foundations of the building are the Beach Boys, Chicago, Boston, Bruce Springsteen, and Cat Stevens. On the other side of the coin, the Cleveland Symphony Orchestra has performed to an appreciative audience as well.

This winter, Jadwin hosted its first regular season National Basketball Association game with the New Jersey Nets meeting the New Orleans Jazz. In earlier years, the New York Knicks played exhibition games here against the Atlanta Hawks and the Philadelphia 76ers. National teams from Yugoslavia, Peru, Italy and Canada have competed against the Princeton varsity.

Just two weeks ago, the fabulous Harlem Globetrotters made their third appearance in Jad-

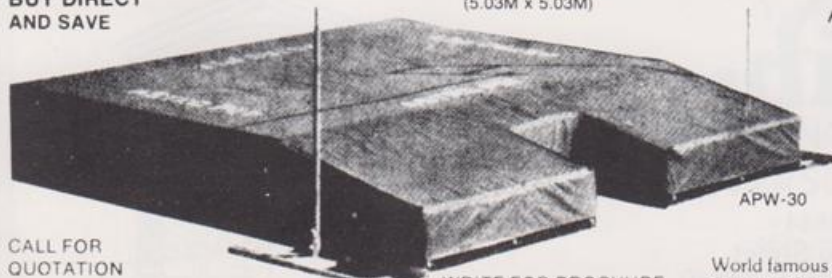

Evidence of this transition is the example of one Bob Calhoun. Calhoun returns to defend his long jump and 60-yard dash crowns. He was the first man to double indoors since Ron Delany did it in the 1000 and two mile way back in 1958. He's the first man to double in track and field.

In one eight-day period, Renaldo Nehemiah smashed three world records in the 60-yard hurdles. Only a sophomore at Maryland, the sleek Nehemiah runs more like an antelope than a turtle. He may be the best at his trade in the world.

He and Greg "Fly" Robertson make up a likely 1-2 finish in this year's ICs.

Then there are the newcomers: seven-foot high jumper Mike Corbin and long distance runners, Dave Cornwell and John Green. A pair of 16-foot pole vaulters, Dan Jump and Chip McCarthy, may keep Maryland's tradition in tact in that event, and there are the other reliables, 600-yard runner Mark Fields and the multi-purpose jumper, Ivory.

Balance notwithstanding, Costello casts a wary eye to his nemesis, Villanova. "It's always come down to Maryland and Villanova," he sighs. "Jumbo's team this year is literally awesome indoors. Most countries would have difficulty beating them indoors."

Introducing the hare.

Villanova is truly a college track phenomenon. A small, Catholic college located in the rural outskirts of Philadelphia, Villanova has facilities which consist of an indoor banked board track which is used outdoors and plenty of roads and golf courses on which to roam. The magnet which attracts the premier middle distance runner to Villanova is James Francis Elliott, better known as "Jumbo" Elliott.

For 45 years, he has guided teams to countless championships. His needs are different than Maryland's.

"The question that I'm asked most often is 'Why don't I get a field team?'," says the IC4A "Coach of the Century."

"We don't have dual meets, we're strictly a quality meet team. By quality meets I mean that we go to invitationals and relay carnivals. We compete against the top runners because we are a running school."

Costello believes Villanova's team this year is untouchable in certain areas. The areas range from 440 yards to two miles and is the heart of the Wildcats' strength.

Whereas Maryland finesses the opposition with points anywhere, Villanova overpowers its competition in lightning fashion.

To accomplish its goal of a team championship, manipulations are made to utilize its limited manpower to peak effectiveness. Elliott is the master general of all battle-plans, plotting where others will put their athletes so as to maximize his potential output.

To illustrate this point, Villanova won the 440, 600, and 1000-yard races last year, but also picked up points in the one and two mile and won two out of the three relays.

The Wildcats will present four sub-4:00 milers to this meet: Don Paige, Sydney Maree, Dean Childs and Amos Kipchirchir. Korir is a sophomore transfer from Kenya and broke the barrier early this winter. Yet, they may all run in different races.

Anthony Tufariello, who scored in the 600 last season, ran the fastest 800 meters since Jim Ryun last summer. Quarter-miler Tim Dale and triple jumper Nate Cooper are both two-time defending champs.

As one can readily see, both teams ooze with strength. As to which team is the stronger, let's ask the coaches.

Says Frank Costello: "I don't think Jumbo's losing too much sleep over this one."

Says Jumbo Elliott: "In a meet like the IC4As, you have to have balance. Maryland will always be the team to beat."

Late in the afternoon on Sunday, the race will be over and the only thing that is certain is that one will win--the turtle or the cat.

Jesse Abramson continued

Jesse told the judge, "of course I know you, but your Championship was in 1922." The judge was positive Jesse was wrong and even called his office. Sure enough the judge's secretary said the plaque on the wall read 1922.

Get the facts and make the truth known, those are his credos. When Jesse thought something was wrong he wrote it and if he disagreed with something he wouldn't hide his feelings. "Jesse was our publicity director for more than 50 years," said Howard Schmertz who succeeded his father as the director of the Millrose Games.

In the 1950 Wanamaker Mile Don Gehrman appeared to nip Fred Wilt at the finish line. The judges couldn't agree and finally Asa Bushnell, who was the chief judge, decided Gehrman had won.

"Well in Monday's Tribune Jesse wrote that Gehrman's victory was illegal because the chief judge couldn't have an opinion. Well his story touched off a series of appeals that lasted 11 months. It was the longest mile in history. By the way it was finally decided that Gehrman did win.

Abramson, who has been the meet director for the Olympic Invitational since its inception in 1967, founded the New York Track Writers Association and also was the president of the New York Football Writers Association.

He was also the first to employ charts in the newspaper to predict winners of track meets. "Everybody always used to read Jesse to see how the IC4A's were going to come out," said Stan Saplin, a track historian and a former rival track writer at the Journal American. "His word was gospel. Finally I did charts too and it was always a big thrill for me to beat him. I actually did it once or twice and won a few dinners."

In the final analysis it's probably Abramson's adaptability and versatility that have made him one of this country's foremost sports journalists.

"The first thing you have to remember about Jesse is that he is now and always was a terrible athlete," added Rosenthal with a smile. "He didn't know about football from playing it, he just had an instant feel for things and made himself an expert."

When you read his articles you never missed a thing. One time he covered a doubleheader when the St. Louis Cardinals came in to play the Dodgers. Dizzy and Paul Dean pitched shutouts for the Cardinals and Jesse wrote a story like he had been doing baseball his entire life.

The man just immerses himself in anything he does. He was supposed to retire when the World Journal Tribune folded in 1967 but his pace didn't let up one bit. He never could take it easy.

Illness has forced Jesse to finally take a break for a while. Saturday and Sunday he'll miss his first IC4A meet since 1927. His absence will be felt by all of his friends at Jadwin Gymnasium. Press Row just won't be Press Row without him.

win. On each occasion, large and enthusiastic audiences have been in attendance. These Trotter games have been part of the continuing Jadwin Benefit Series wherein "special events" are hosted to provide some of the proceeds to charities such as the United Way and the Medical Center.

Jadwin's main basketball court, with a seating capacity of some 7500, has been the scene of numerous post-season games. Among these were NCAA preliminaries between Penn and Niagara and between Villanova and East Carolina; an NIT first round contest between Rutgers and St. Bonaventure; and an ECAC opening round double-header among St. John's-St. Peter's and Rutgers-LIU.

Princeton fans harken to the memories of Tiger triumphs against such top flight competition as Notre Dame, Michigan, North Carolina and Stanford, victories spearheaded by Ted Manakas, Brian Taylor, Andy Rimol, Armond Hill, Barnes Hauptfuhrer, Mickey Steuerer, and Frank Sowinski.

Jadwin's all-time crowd crush occurred during the 1975 NCAA Wrestling Tournament when 48,000 fans squeezed in for the six sessions, capped by the final evening's wall-to-wall 10,000. Princeton has twice hosted Eastern Wrestling Championships, in 1969 and again last week.

Jadwin has become an Eastern Track "mecca". These IC4A's have been an annual here since 1971 and the increasingly star-studded Princeton Indoor Relays have become a lightning rod each February. This year, the Eastern Women's Championships (March 10-11) will be run on Jadwin's tartan surface as well.

Downstairs, the fine Jadwin squash courts have hosted a wealth of talent. Both the men's and women's U.S. Squash Raquets Championships have taken place here as has the Inter-collegiate Squash Championships.

Fencing, too, will share the limelight as the NCAA Championships come to Jadwin on March 22-25. While the building contains what may well be the largest fencing room extant, these Championships will be staged on the main floor.

Jadwin gets major usage by high school athletes also. The New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association sponsors year-end tournaments in both basketball and wrestling as well as its major track championships. The track and wrestling have been held in Jadwin for many years and the basketball games, while somewhat itinerant over the years, have often seen the majority played here.

Another major attraction is the annual Princeton Invitational Indoor Tennis Tournament featuring top collegians from the Eastern Seaboard. These take place on the six fine composition courts on Jadwin's lowest level. In 1973, Jadwin's indoor courts "saved the day" when inclement weather threatened to wash out the outdoor NCAA Championships. Had the competition not been able to use the indoor courts, it is doubtful the tourney would have run to its completion.

Happy moments and busy times. These have been the trademarks of Princeton's flexible indoor athletic center. Just as "Franco" doesn't need the "Harris" for identity among NFL fans, so Jadwin needs no other identification among Eastern sports cognocenti.
