Welcome, Freshmen, to THE MEET

Charles H. Sherrill, G. R. Fearing, A. B. Coxe, J. R. DeWitt and Vic Frank are names that should intrigue the Class of 1974 which is making its collective debut in the Intercollegiate A.A.A.A. outdoor championships.

These five form an exclusive club. They are the only men who have won four straight in the 95 years of the country's oldest track meet.

Winning four straight in one event is a valid goal in this meet now that freshmen, starting right here, are welcomed into the competitive lists. (Except freshmen of the Ivy League, who don't get the green light until the new academic year begins in September).

So, the door is open for Bob Wheeler, Joe Savage, Mike Keogh, Ford Dennis, Bill Rea, Les Nagy, Keith Davis and their peers in the Class of 1974 who figure they have a chance to crack into the points.

In the beginning there was no eligibility restriction in the I.C.A.A.A.A. constitution for the "members of the respective colleges" who formed the track organization. Thirty years later, or about the time football legalized the forward pass, eligibility restrictions crept into the rules, chiefly a one-year residence rule, and the I.C.A.A.A.A. door was closed to freshmen.

Except for the relaxation of rules in World War II, freshmen have had no opportunity to compete in these Intercollegiate for about 60 of the 94 meets.

Perhaps Charley Sherrill (later U.S. member of the International Olympic Committee and a brigadier general does not rightfully belong with the "Four for Four" clique. He had five chances. As a freshman in 1886 he carried Yale's colors to second place in the 100, then won it the next four years.

Besides being the first four-year winner, Charley had another distinction. He introduced the crouch start, or, as I was told by Tom Keane, a professional sprinter who later coached Syracuse, Sherrill was merely the first amateur to borrow a pro trick when he employed the unorthodox crouch stance.

A perusal of the I.C.A.A.A.A. record book (available at the I.C.A.A.A.A. office, Hotel Royal Manhattan, \$2.00—Advt.) reveals that Sherrill remains the lone footracer to win four straight in

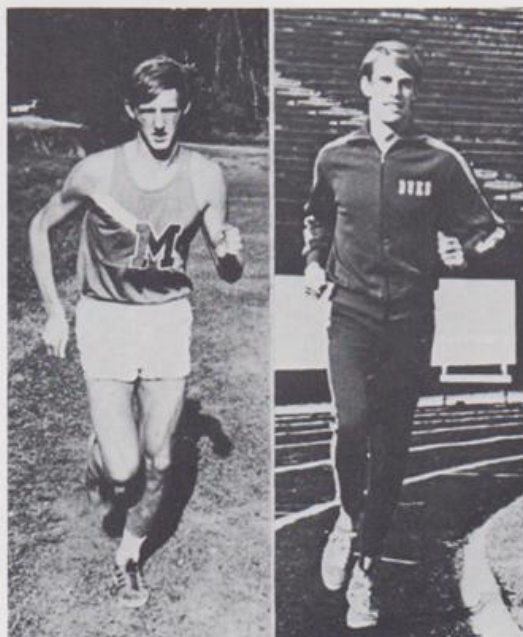
this meet. The others were field men: Coxe a Yale hammer thrower (1884-5-6-7); Fearing, a Harvard high jumper (1890-1-2-3); DeWitt, a Princeton hammer thrower (1901-2-3-4), and finally Frank, a Yale discus thrower (1947-48-49-50). Frank was the only one who took full advantage of the relaxed rule in World War II. Please note that 1947, the year Frank was a freshman, was the last year before this that freshmen were permitted to compete in this varsity gala.

End of history lesson. And, now, back to the current scene.

The freshmen entered here form a goodly company, and the chances are good they will bag at least one of the 18 solo titles.

One of them already wears an NCAA crown. He is Bob Wheeler, the precocious Duke runner from Lutherville, Md., who won the I.C.A.A.A.A. freshmen cross-country title last November, posted fast times from 600 yards to the mile last winter and

It Happened at Franklin Field

It was on a late May afternoon in 1927 that Sabin Carr of Yale University electrified a Franklin Field crowd with one of the great moments in IC4-A history, slicing through a barrier previously unconquered by man. A newspaper account the following day described it thusly:

"... It remained for Sabin Carr, Yale pole vaulter, to furnish the outstanding event of the meet when late in the afternoon, after several hours of gruelling competition, he leaped to the undreamed-of heights of 14 feet... breaking a world record.

"... Never before in the history of track has there been such vaulting. Even Charlie Huff (the former record holder) never dreamed of soaring that far from earth. Not one of the first five men to finish in this event did under 13-feet..."

This weekend, when the IC4-A championship pays its 21st visit to Franklin Field, 13-feet won't get you on the pole vault runway. This is the era of fiber-glass and speed and refined techniques, when guys are bumping their heads against a ceiling 18 feet high. But, if 14 feet seemed incredible in 1927, think how it must have looked to R. A. Gardner, another Yale great, who had established a previous world record in the IC4-A meet of 1912 at Franklin Field, by soaring over 13-1. Or to William McLanahan, also of Yale, who tumbled an IC4-A mark in 1904 by slipping over 11-8 $\frac{3}{4}$.

That 1904 meet was the first one ever held in the University of Pennsylvania's historic stadium. Yale won the team title that spring, aided by McLanahan's leap and by a record-breaking 1:56.8 half-mile by E. B. Parsons.

By that time the meet already was 29 years old, having bounced around several New York sites before landing at Franklin Field for its first running on a college campus. Between 1904 and 1936 the IC4-As were to return to Penn 15 times. With the exception of 1932 when the championships were held in California, Harvard's Soldiers' Field alternated with Penn as the host track.

With the building of Downing Stadium on Randalls Island in New York, however, the competition found a new, semi-permanent, home. During the next 32 years it returned to Franklin Field only in 1944, 1947, and 1951. Then, in 1967, Penn rolled a \$200,000 Tartan surface around its quarter-mile oval, and the lure became too great. The

championships were held here in 1968 for the first time in 17 years, repeated last spring, and return again this weekend.

Before the Tartan went down, Franklin Field had yielded records grudgingly. When they had come, they had most frequently been in field events, particularly during an era of the 20s and early 30s when West Coast schools like California, Stanford and USC sent their outstanding weight men East. An exception occurred in 1920 when Earl J. Thompson of Dartmouth shattered not only the IC4-A mark, but the world standard as well in the final of the high hurdles.

The following newspaper description of that moment appeared the next day.

"... In the 120-yard high hurdles, in which the big Princeton delegation of Erdman, Trowbridge and Massey were picked to clean up, they crumbled before the world-record breaking pace of Earl J. Thompson, the Canadian student of Dartmouth who so outhurdled the Princetonians that he clipped one-fifth of a second off the world's record and three-fifths from the old collegiate mark. His time was 14 and $\frac{2}{5}$ seconds (14.4)..."

It is noteworthy that Thompson's record was imposing enough to stand as an IC4-A mark until Ed Dugger of Tufts lowered it to 14.3 in 1940. His victory also was the turning point in Penn's upset team victory over a Princeton squad that had been heavily favored.

In 1929, Phil Edwards of NYU tumbled a 14-year-old record in the 880 with a clocking of 1:52.2. But the race that turned on the fans that year was the often drab two-mile. It matched Harvard's James Reid with Bill Cox of Penn and stirred this comment from sportswriter Ned Irish:

"... Cox held the lead with Reid close behind as they came into the stretch, both sprinting with everything they had. What a fight that was... down the stretch they came toward the tape, which must have seemed a hundred miles away..."

Reid edged ahead in the final strides and won in meet-record time of 9:22.

It was in 1947 that a fellow named George Guida, coming off a three-week layoff forced by a pulled tendon, swept to victory in the 440 in the

Emerging New Track Powers

It has been 20 years since any team other than Villanova, Maryland, Penn State or Manhattan won a team title at the outdoor IC4-A meet. And these teams are certain to be very much in evidence at the meet's 95th annual renewal this weekend. But anyone who restricts his attention to athletes from these schools, or those from other traditionally strong contenders, is going to miss some winners.

In the last two years, new track powers have emerged in the East, and outstanding individuals have been developed at institutions which have not previously had IC4-A gold medalists. They will be challenging the old guard here at Franklin Field.

Pre-eminent among the schools with newly-acquired track glory is Adelphi University of Garden City, N.Y. In the past year, Adelphi has won the mile relay at the NCAA College Division championships, the NCAA indoor championships and the Penn Relays. But the Panthers are still seeking their first IC4-A title, and the mile relay is only one of several good opportunities they will have for the breakthrough.

Their usual quartet of Ray Lee, Keith Davis, Dennis Walker and Clyde McPherson would be strongly favored in the mile relay Saturday. But the time schedule does not permit an athlete to double the 220-yard dash and the mile relay. So Walker, who brilliantly anchored Adelphi's victorious 880-yard relay at the Penn carnival, will probably go for the individual furlong title and limit his baton efforts to the 440-yarder. Fortunately, Coach Ron Bazil has several competent substitutes to choose from in Bill McPherson, Kit Pratt and Larry Ross, and so even without Walker, Adelphi will field a very strong foursome.

Quarter milers can double in the mile relay, and Davis and Clyde McPherson will be among the leading entrants in the 440-yard dash. McPherson won the 440 at the NCAA College Division meet last year and finished second by a couple of angstrom units to Rutgers' Tom Ulan in the NCAA indoor meet in March. With Ulan sidelined by injury, McPherson is the man to beat here. Lee, the remaining member of the Panthers' great relay, was a scorer in the NCAA indoor long jump and could be a factor in that event. But Ray says he

prefers running to jumping and may thus confine his competition to the track.

Another Long Island school which will be seeking its first IC4-A gold is C.W. Post College of Greenvale. Post stunned everyone last year by finishing third in the team standings here, beaten only by perennial powers Villanova and Maryland. The Pioneers went on to place second in the NCAA College Division championships, the highest spot for any non-California school in five years.

Two of the leading contributors to Post's success in 1970, Ron Stonitsch and Mike Hoses, are returning to Franklin Field this weekend. Stonitsch was second in both the three and six miles last year. He later won these events at the College Division Nationals, and seemed headed for another great season when he was injured early in the past indoor season and had to give up training for three months. Now competing again, Ron is entered in both the 3 and 6 once more, but may concentrate on just one of these grueling races. Hoses, a half miler, is also attempting to improve upon his 1970 role of runner-up, a position he retained at the indoor IC4-A's at Princeton in March, before placing third in the NCAA indoor 880.

If Adelphi and Post do attain their first championships this weekend, they will only be duplicating what two schools from Southeast Pennsylvania achieved last year, when Bill Krouse of West Chester took the 100-yard dash and Rich Weaver of PMC Colleges captured the intermediate hurdles. Krouse has been graduated, but West Chester could make it two golds in as many years if Lonnie Dalton can add the outdoor high jump title to the two which he has won indoors.

Weaver followed his victory here with another at the NCAA College Division meet last June and an outstanding gridiron season as a running back last fall. However, injury will prevent this all-around athlete from running this weekend. One of last year's small college winners who will be defending his title is Jimmy Reed, the Amherst sprinter who gave the Lord Jeffs their first IC4-A winner in 60 years by upsetting a 220-yard dash field which included Larry James, the Villanova Olympian.

The Dead Heat in Track

One of the interesting phenomena about track and field since electronics got into the act with the arrival of the Bulova Phototimer in 1948 is that it also brought into the sport the calling of dead heats.

The subject of a dead heat was a lively one in the 1968 NCAA indoor championships at Detroit's Cobo Hall when many in the capacity crowd thought they had seen a triple dead heat among Jim Green of Kentucky, Craig Wallace of Kentucky State and Lennox Miller of USC in the 60-yard dash final.

Even with the picture from the latest equipment, the Bulova Accutron Phototimer, the officials had a hard time before they could make their decision. It was that close, and a few of those who gave the picture a hard look thought there still was a tie.

But the judges were able to make their decision, and it came out Green as the winner, with the second place decision even harder to make before Wallace became the choice over Miller.

Actually, the first semifinal in that race was even closer. How anyone could have made selections without the help of the Bulova operation is hard to believe.

In that same 1968 NCAA championship still another race which could have been declared a dead heat because it was so close that it took a long time to read the picture was the 60-yard high hurdles final in which Richmond Flowers of Tennessee was declared the winner.

The fact that the judges can pick those close ones with the help of the picture would make you think that ties were very common before the days of the Phototimer. The opposite is true. There are more ties called now than there used to be.

Ironically, dead heats never were called in those days, when the officials had no outside help like the Bulova Accutron Phototimer. They always picked a winner.

One of the earliest, and most memorable, dead heats was called for third place in the 1952 Olympic trials when both Jim Gathers of the Air Force and Dean Smith of the University of Texas were declared tied for third in the 100-meters Olympic qualifying tests. Thus both, rather than one, made the Olympic team that year.

That decision made history, and so did the one during the New York A.C. indoor games at Madison Square Garden during the Winter of 1952, when Don Gehrman, the great Wisconsin miler, and FBI agent Fred Wilt engaged in another of their great mile duels, with another of the famous Gehrman victories by a hair—or so it seemed.

That was how the judges announced the outcome of the race—until they had a chance to look at the Bulova picture. They spent so much time studying that now-famous picture that it was almost an hour after the race was over that the announcement was made about the change in the decision.

This was the first announced reversal of a decision in track and field history, as Wilt now was declared the winner in one of his rare victories over the Mid-Western mile star.

These are only a few of the very many historic decisions that have resulted from the picture which comes out of that odd-shaped piece of equipment which looks like, but doesn't quite, resemble a camera and is known as the Bulova Accutron Phototimer.

It actually is a precision instrument developed by electronic and optical engineers at the Bulova Watch Company for the purpose of determining the winners of races and timing them at the same time.

It is an open-slit camera, with the time and the runner photographed simultaneously as he crosses the finish line. The camera is carefully trained to be exactly on the finish line, which explains why the Bulova technicians arrive many hours before the meet to set up their equipment.

The camera operates with moving film, like a movie camera, except that the film rolls horizontally inside the camera. The Phototimer also times races in 100ths of a second, rather than tenths.

It is that precision, and the fact that it stops the action of EACH runner exactly at that moment when he reaches the finish line, that assures the officials of an accurate call.

It also is that which can make—and unmake—a dead heat in a track race.

Champion Villanova Took Seven Titles in 1970, Including A Double



For the third time in his varsity career, Larry James won the 440 and here he breaks the tape in front of Tom Ulan of Rutgers, with Greg Daugherty of Morgan State third and another Villanovan, Hardge Davis (on the inside) fourth. James won in 0:46.2, beating Ulan by one-tenth of a second.



And one of the meet's two records was set by another Wildcat, Des McCormack, who turned in 8:46.1 for the 3,000-meter steeplechase, breaking by one-tenth of a second the old mark set by Terry Donnelly of William and Mary on this same track in 1968. Ed Walsh of Manhattan was second in 8:49.9.



Here is Marty Liquori winning the mile, also for the third time in his varsity career. Clocked in 3:58.5, he was five-tenths of a second in front of William & Mary's Howell Michael, with another Villanovan, Chris Mason, third in 3:59.9.



Here is the meet's only double winner, Dick Buerkle, who won the six-mile on Friday afternoon, then followed with the three-mile gold medal on Saturday. The six-mile, a new event to the championships, was won in 28:34.7, the three-mile in 13:34.2 and in each event Ron Stonitsch of C.W. Post was second, both times more than four seconds behind.



The Wildcat foursome that won the one-mile relay—Greg Govan, Marty Liquori (who also won the mile run), Hardge Davis and Lamotte Hyman—in 3:10.1. Morgan State was second in 3:10.3 with Adelphi third in 3:11.8.



Another comfortable victory was scored by Andy O'Reilly in the half-mile as he turned in 1:49.7 to beat Mike Hoses of C.W. Post, timed in 1:50.9. Martin Brotemarkle of Maryland was clocked in the same time but he was third.

Runner-Up Maryland Took Five Titles, Four in Field Events



For the second year in a row the Terrapins' Joe David won the high jump and for the second year in a row his winning jump was 6 feet 10 inches. Eric Howard of Morgan State also leaped 6-10, but David had fewer misses.



Another Maryland repeater was John Hanley in the shot put, although his heave of 59 feet 7¼ inches in 1970 was 1½ inches below his 1969 throw. But it was almost three feet better than the 56 feet 7½ inches turned in by runner-up Joe Wevurski of C.W. Post.



The Bush brothers, Marvin and Marshall, helped the Terps take the 440-yard relay, along with Tyrone Brown and Ralph Jones. They finished in 41.2 seconds, one-tenth of a second better than Villanova, which had two men—Hardge Davis and Larry James—from the winning quartet of 1968.



The Terps' Mike Neff didn't have too hard a time winning the triple jump as he leaped 49 feet 4 inches, beating the 48-9¼ of Harvard's Noel Hare and the 48-8¼ of teammate George Braley.



Maryland made it three titles in a row in the discus throw as Paul Corrigan tossed the platter 173 feet 8 inches, with Dartmouth's Frank Howard second with 171-3 and Penn's Ken Dietz third with 168-8.

Villanova University, taking its fifth team title in nine years, retired the seventh Championship Cup in 1970 and now the eighth trophy is in competition. It was the second straight time that the Wildcats had retired the trophy. They captured their first after their 1962 triumph. To earn that one, they took the team title in 1957, 1958, 1960, 1961 and 1962. Then they won the championship in 1966, 1964, 1967, 1968 and 1970.

As has been the pattern during the competition for the seventh trophy, it was Maryland that gave the Wildcats their stiffest battle. While Villanova was scoring 60 points a year ago, the Terrapins finished second with 52, the Wildcats taking seven individual titles to the Terps' five. Maryland had three legs on that trophy, winning the team title in 1965, 1966 and 1969.

Of the five former cups, two were won by Harvard (which leads in team victories with 13) and one each by Yale, Cornell and Southern California.

I.C.A.A.A.A. MEET OFFICIALS

General Information

N.C.A.A. RULES OF COMPETITION WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED BY REFEREE AND OTHER OFFICIALS.

Track measures four laps to mile.

All events are scratch, i.e., none is handicap.

Firing of revolver denotes beginning of final lap in all races.

In all races there is no penalty for first false start, but competitor is disqualified for second false start. However, starter's recall no longer nullifies false start by any competitor.

In hurdle races competitor is not disqualified for knocking down hurdles.

In all relay races baton must be carried in runner's hand and must be passed to next succeeding teammate within clearly marked 20 meters zone, extending 10 meters in both directions from leg finish line.

Governing rules provide that, in races around turns, any competitor willfully jostling, running across or obstructing another competitor so as to impede his progress, shall be disqualified. If in any race competitor is disqualified for any of these reasons, Referee shall have power to order race to be rerun with disqualified competitor excluded or, in case of heat, to permit any competitors affected by act resulting in disqualification, other than disqualified competitor, to compete in subsequent round of event.

Any competitor may be disqualified if, in opinion of Referee, he has in any way been aided by coach, teammate, or anyone connected directly or indirectly with team concerned, such as, running along-side of teammate, being stationed at various points near track, or located nearby any of field events for purpose of aiding or coaching competitor after race or field event has officially been started.

Each member college is limited to following numbers of actual participants in various events in the Outdoor Championships:

3 Mile Run	2*
Relays	One Team
All other events	5

Nominee or qualifier who fails to compete in any running or hurdling event for which he has been nominated or has qualified will be ineligible for any further participation in meet.

In four weight events (shot, discus, javelin, and hammer), broad jump, and triple jump, each contestant shall be allowed three preliminary trials. The first six men in the standing at the completion of the trials will qualify for the final. Each finalist will then receive three additional tries.

All performances made in field event trials shall be counted with performances in final in determining final place winners. Each competitor shall be credited with best of all his efforts.

Competitors must be on time, field contestants entering enclosure five minutes before scheduled start of their event, and track contestants entering enclosure upon completion of race next preceding theirs. As soon as their event is over, competitors will kindly leave track and infield without delay.

Spikes longer than $\frac{3}{4}$ inch not permitted.

In each event 16 points are scored: 6 for first place, 4 for second, 3 for third, 2 for fourth, and 1 for fifth.

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Mile By Mile With Marty in the I.C.A.A.A.A.



THE SUPER MILE

Marty Liquori's farewell I.C.A.A.A.A. mile for Villanova this weekend on Franklin Field—where he has never lost a race in four college years, including every relay he ran in the Penn Relays (10) and I.C.A.A.A.A. (1)—will close one of the most brilliant chapters in the long history of the country's oldest track organization.

His record:

FRESHMAN—Won freshman cross-country, record 14:20.8; ran anchor mile on winning medley for team clocking of 7:47.3, the record that still stands.

SOPHOMORE—An Olympic 1500-meter finalist, he by-passed I.C.A.A.A.A. cross-country; won indoor mile in meet-record 4:05.3, won outdoor mile in 4:03.4.

JUNIOR—Member of winning Villanova team in cross-country; won indoor mile in meet-record 4:02.1, won outdoor mile (at Franklin Field) in 3:58.5, and ran second leg on winning mile relay.

SENIOR—Did not run in cross-country owing to foot injury; won indoor mile in 4:06.1. Will defend mile title and may also run on mile relay this weekend.

Since the I.C.A.A.A.A. launched its indoor championships in 1922, only two runners have won six straight I.C.A.A.A.A. miles, indoors and out. One was Leslie MacMitchell, of NYU, in 1940-41-42; the other Dave Patrick, of Villanova, in 1966-67-68. (Ron Delany, of Villanova, won 10 I.C.A.A.A.A. track titles in 10 starts, but only four of them were miles).

If Liquori retains his outdoor title, he will be the seventh man in the history of the outdoor meet to sweep three straight miles. The others were R. Faries, Penn, in 1884-85-86; J. F. Cregan, Princeton, 1898-99-00; John Paul Jones, Cornell, 1911-12-13 (dead-heating Norman Taber, Brown, in 1912); MacMitchell, 1940-41-42; Ron Delany, Villanova, 1956-57-58, and Patrick, 1966-67-68.

The I.C.A.A.A.A. era of Marty Liquori ends right here—unless he decides to give cross-country a whirl in the fall. Owing to his Olympic participation in 1968, he is eligible for one more cross-country season before he is graduated in January, 1972.

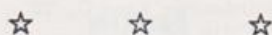

climaxed his indoor season by winning the N.C.A.A. 1000 in Detroit in a snappy 2:07.4, a record for a freshman and an N.C.A.A. record too.

In the early meets this wet, cool spring Wheeler ran the 880 in 1:49.4 (first to beat 1:50 in the I.C.A.A.A. set this year) and the mile in 4:04.1. These times suggest that Wheeler and his coach Buehler, will opt for the shorter race rather than challenge the formidable Mr. Liquori.

The same option may be exercised by 18-year-old Joe Savage and his Manhattan coach, Fred Dwyer. The big, strong blond Jasper yearling, however, thinks that racing against Liquori is "beautiful, just beautiful."

Beautiful were his anchor-leg duels with Marty in the Penn Relays, where Savage clocked 4:05.2 to Liquori's 4:04.1 in the distance medley, and 1:48.7 to Liquori's 1:48.5 in the two-mile relay. "I'd like Joe to get his 4-minute mile before we go to the N.C.A.A., though I realize he has a better chance of winning here in the 880," said Dwyer, an I.C.A.A.A. mile champion in his Villanova days. "I won't make a decision until the final declaration deadline."

The mile and 880 was once a classic double in this meet, but no one tries it now that heats are run in the mile and semi-finals in the 880.

Other freshmen attracting attention this spring include Manhattan's little Mike Keogh, who posted an 8:57.9 in the Metropolitan freshman meet, ran 13:33.8 at three miles (second best ever by any freshman) and may like the six-mile best of all; Villanova's Les Nagy, with 13:40.5 at three miles; Adelphi's Keith Davis, steady member of Ron Bazil's 3:07.9 relay and 47.7 winner of the Collegiate Track Conference 440 over teammate Clyde McPherson, no less; and Ford Dennis, English-schooled Boston U. sprinter from Liberia. Penn's Bruce Collins, 13.8 and 51.0 in the two hurdles, would be a favorite to win one or both, if the Ivy League had not fixed its date for the change.

Maryland's 54-man entry includes 20 freshmen, not all of whom will have met qualifying standards. But Nick Kovalakides may get points from Don Fisher, 230-foot javelin thrower, in his bid to dethrone Villanova. Jumbo Elliott may not need freshman aid to keep the team title at Villanova but he will have Nagy, John Hartnett and Byron Beam in the distance runs, Ted McDonough in the sprints and Ken Schappert as a member of his mile relay.

Lewis McGehee, 1:52.4 half-miler, and Ben Helmandollar, 21.4 furlong sprinter, won Southern Conference titles as William and Mary freshmen. Levine Burgess, of Morgan State, is another frosh flyer whose 9.5 and 21.4 times place him among the potential finalists. Pitt's Bill Rea has marks of 23-8¾ and 49-9 in the long and triple jumps.

So, keep an eye on our freshmen; they are going to be around until 1974.

time of 47.5. It was no record, but it was significant, nevertheless.

Guida was from Villanova, and his win was the first individual title the Wildcats had ever won in IC4-A competition. The next time the championships were held at Penn (1951), Villanova had three winners, Fred Dwyer in the mile, Cummin Clancy in the discus, and Johnny Joe Berry in the two mile. It was the start of something big.

Villanova did not capture its first outdoor team championship until 1957 at Downing Stadium, but the Wildcats have accumulated 10 more since that time. They had nine in the bag before the meet returned to Franklin Field in 1968, where they added number 10.

That also was the year that Franklin Field and its gleaming new Tartan provided one of the extraordinary moments in the 94-year history of the Championships. On a lovely spring afternoon, Villanova's Dave Patrick cut through the tension, the roar of the crowd and the tape to record a 3:56.8 mile. With that great run he pulled four other men, Brian Kivlan, Frank Murphy, Jerry Ritchey and Jack Fath, under four minutes with him.

Patrick and his teammates have since passed from the collegiate ranks. In their place this weekend stand Marty Liquori, the Wildcats' great miler of the present, and another excellent Villanova squad, with the top college stars of the East poised to challenge them. It figures to produce another outstanding chapter for Franklin Field, already so rich in track and field history.



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
