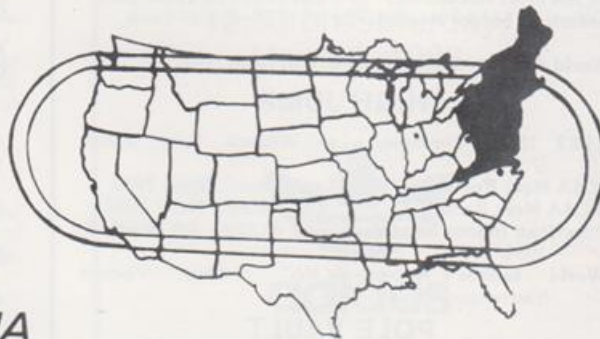

Taking the Dry Road

A Champion Swimmer Throws His Weight Around

Tom McDermott likes to talk. He spouts quotations from classic literature and stories from his 64 years of life. But, with the possible exception of his recently born grandson, Brendan Quiming, McDermott's favorite subject is his contingent of weight throwers from Southern Connecticut State University.

McDermott has been an assistant track coach for the Owls since 1966 with sole responsibility for developing Southern's weight program. It took only until 1968 for the affable McDermott to bring recognition to the New Haven campus and the SCSU program has been climbing ever since.

"There's no other program in the country that can match our success in the weight throwing events," boasts McDermott, who stands 6-foot-2 with substantial girth. "We've had place-winners in NCAA Division II for 14 of the last 15 years with seven firsts, five seconds and four thirds. And, according to my calculations, we hold some unofficial records."

One of the "unofficial" records McDermott is most proud of concerns his weight team's phenomenal display at the 1982 NCAA Division II championships at Sacramento State in California. The Owls finished sixth in the team competition with 64 points, but 41 of those points came in one event — the hammer throw.

"I checked all through the NCAA championship record book and couldn't find anywhere else where as many points were scored in a single event," McDermott said. "And that includes all three divisions."

Two-time Division II hammer throw champion Bill Borden led the Owls' onslaught with teammates Greg Gassner second, Bob Rodgers 4th, Dave Chesbrough 9th and Mark Borrelli 12th. Borden is the third SCSU trackman to have won the Division II hammer championship twice. Frank Bredice accomplished the feat in 1971 and '72 while Wayne Durrigan captured back-to-back titles in '76 and '77. George Jerome was the Owls' first champion in 1970.

Southern's track success has not been limited to NCAA Division II. McDermott's throwers have won four ICAAAA events in the 35-pound weight, have placed in the NCAA Division I indoor and outdoor championships and have also been successful in such prestigious events as the Millrose Games.

Winning and success have always been a part of Tom McDermott's life. Born in the Bronx, he was an outstanding swimmer at George Washington High, setting a national scholastic record of 53.2

seconds in the 100-yard freestyle in 1934. He helped set another national mark in 1939 when he teamed with Jim Reilly, Walter Spence and world record-holder Peter Fick for a time of 3:31.3 in the 400-yard freestyle relay at Columbus, Ohio.

McDermott's swimming prowess and overall athletic ability were put to use by the Navy in World War II when he was a physical instructor under boxing champion Gene Tunney.

"I was stationed in Seattle and Alaska and gave abandon ship drills," McDermott, the father of seven children, recalls. "I was with a lot of good fighters in the Navy including Frank Perada and Fred Apostile. I helped keep them in shape and they used to get a kick out of bouncing me around in the afternoon."

McDermott returned to competitive swimming in 1945 when he entered Rutgers University, where he earned a B.A. degree in English. He continued to swim for the New York Athletic Club, of which he has been a member for 49 years, after graduation and moved to New Haven as a sales representative for Gulf Oil.

McDermott set another American record in New Haven in 1954, an amazing 15 years after his 1939 record, when he swam the butterfly leg of the NYAC's 400-yard medley relay team in a meet at Yale. There he became friendly with Eli athletic director and swim coach Bob Kiphuth.

"Bob Kiphuth was enraptured by hammer throwers and we used to look at films of great European throwers," said McDermott, who once had a film audition for the role of Tarzan. "He (Kiphuth) introduced me to Frank Ryan, for years the Yale field event coach, who I like to call my hero. Ryan taught me a great deal about throwing, training and many things in general.

"I had always been interested in the weight throw because my grandfather, James J. McDermott, held the American record in the 56-pound weight in 1880. Then at the New York A.C., I was in awe of Matt McGrath and Pat McDonald, two weight throwers who they called the Irish Whales — they trained with a knife and fork."

While studying with Ryan, McDermott went on to earn a certificate of advanced study from Fairfield University and began teaching in the evening at the University of Bridgeport. Then, in 1966, President Hilton C. Buley hired McDermott to teach English and help the track program at Southern Connecticut.

"There's a common denominator in all sports — you have to be aggressive to get to the top," says McDermott. "But there's also more to sport. As Pindar said, 'the essence of sport is the honor and beauty.'"

McDermott works his SCSU weight throwers throughout the year and also trains some himself. He's won three World Masters titles, two in the hammer and one in the discus, and expects to compete again in September in Puerto Rico.

"Most recently we've had the good fortune of being advised by Stewart Togher of Scotland, who should be the United States weight coach for the 1984 Olympics," McDermott says. "One of our graduates, Bill Sutherland, is a member of the Olympic training committee and a top candidate for the 1984 team. He's an excellent role model for our athletes.

"We've been fortunate with our success at Southern Connecticut and we're getting better all the time," says McDermott. "I attribute part of that to what I call the Myrmidonic syndrome. In the stories of Achilles, the Myrmidons were great warriors who were respected and feared, much like our weight throwers. Our tradition alone speaks for itself."

Running them Ragged in Lewisburg

Gulden Builds Championship Program Over the Long Haul

Although California is a hotbed of track and field, it's probably that only dedicated readers of **Track and Field News** and a few distance running buffs are aware of the program at Bucknell University.

The reasons for the relative obscurity are rather obvious. Bucknell is a small, private, coeducational school that does not award athletic scholarships. Also, Bucknell, which competes in Division I of the NCAA despite the lack of scholarships, has built its reputation and program on distance running. And distance running is just becoming popular on the west coast where sprinters, jumpers and hurdlers attract most of the attention and headlines.

How has a small (1650 men and 1450 women) private school in rural (Lewisburg's population exceeds 10,000 only when Bucknell students and inmates at the local penitentiary are counted) central Pennsylvania risen to the level where its distance program has won an IC4A Championship Division cross country title, an NCAA District Two crown and has qualified for the past four NCAA Championships?

Hard work has been an important ingredient in the Bison recipe for success. Bucknell coach Art Gulden has also attracted some dedicated athletes. And, finally, Gulden made the decision when he came to Lewisburg 13 years ago that the best way to build a track program was to start a cross country program.

Consequently, the Rutgers graduate who came to Bucknell after two years as an assistant at his alma mater, began his search for dedicated distance runners who he felt had potential for improvement. Without scholarships, he couldn't go after the "blue chip" runners. Instead, Gulden said, "We did the same thing we do today. We looked for kids with potential. Up until two or three years ago we were recruiting men whose high school two-mile times were around the 10-minute mark.

"You don't have to be a nine-minute two-miler in high school to be a college All-American," Gulden emphasized. "If a runner is willing to work, puts in the time, and has other people to work with, he can be made into an All-American."

It didn't take long for the hard work to pay off. The 1973 cross country team shared the Middle Atlantic Conference championship and the 1973 and 1975 teams also won IC4A College Division honors.

And the distance runners were being joined by some other talented athletes to form a highly respectable track and field team. The most notable of the non-distance performers was Tom McLean, who switched from basketball to track at Bucknell and wound up with IC4A outdoor half-mile championships in 1976 and 1977 and an NCAA 800-meter gold medal in 1976. He also helped lead Bucknell to East Coast Conference outdoor championships for three years in a row beginning in 1975.

But, despite the contributions of McLean and several talented jumpers and sprinters, the heart of the Bucknell track and field teams, indoors and outdoors, has been the distance runners.

And the distance runners were getting better. Midway through the 1974 season the Bison cross country team began a winning streak that is still intact and stands at 93 entering the 1983 season. Gulden's horde (Bucknell traditionally has 30-35 men on its cross country squad) of harriers has won the last eight East Coast Conference championships, and the 1980 team gained a fair measure of national attention when it upset Villanova for the IC4A crown.

These are the results Gulden only dreamed about when he sent his first team to the starting line in 1970. "The winning streak is nice," he admitted, "but the conference meet and the NCAA District Two meet (held simultaneously with the IC4A race last fall) are our major goals. Those are the ones we really prepare for."

Admittedly, many of the wins in the 147-7 cross country duel meet record Gulden has compiled at Bucknell have been against Division III schools (in the early 1970s) and against the same ECC teams that the Bison have dominated in conference championship races. However, recent successes have added spice to the schedule. "Teams that we couldn't interest in running in the past now want to get on our schedule," Gulden pointed out. "They now have something to gain by running us, and will even come here (to Lewisburg) to run."

A case in point was last year's Bucknell Classic which attracted Providence, Penn State, Auburn and Syracuse to the 5.15-mile course that traverses the University's 18-hole golf course and some of the more scenic backroads in East Buffalo Township. Providence won that meet and downed Bucknell for the IC4A title, but the Friars, who have finished second in the NCAA meet for the past two years, were the only Eastern school to defeat Bucknell in cross country in 1982. The Bison placed 12th in the NCAA race at Indiana University, the best finish for the school in the last four years.

The reputation gained by Bucknell in cross country first began to spill over into track and field in 1974 when Frank Carroll, the top man in the cross country team, qualified for the IC4A mile final and anchored the distance medley relay team that placed 11th in the NCAA meet, and in 1975 with the first of three consecutive team victories in the out-

door East Coast Conference Championships.

Bucknell had three men in the IC4A indoor three-mile in 1977, and the following year George Buckheit placed second in the race in 13:32.09, the third fastest time for the distance ever by an Eastern collegiate runner. He was also 12th best in the country, but only eight runners were taken in to the NCAA field. However, in 1979, Buckheit gained the NCAA three-mile final and placed third behind Michael Musyoki and Hilary Tuwei. In doing so he became the school's first indoor track All-American.

Rick Sayre earned All-American honors in the 5,000-meter in 1981 and last year Bill Reifsnnyder was fourth in the IC4A 5,000. Bucknell had three other IC4A finalists in the 1,500 and 5,000, and NCAA qualifiers in the 1,000 and mile.

Bucknell won three of the five East Coast Conference Indoor Championships from 1978 through 1982, placing first and second in the three-mile in all but one year.

Following runner-up outdoor finishes in the ECC in 1978-80, Bucknell has won the last two team titles and distance runners have been the workhorses. In 1981, 47 of Bucknell's 141 points came in the 1,500, 5,000 and 10,000-meter runs and 1,500-meter steeplechase. Last year 77 of 171 points came in the same four events from men who had paced the conference cross country and indoor track team victories earlier in the year.

In addition, Sayre was fourth in the IC4A steeplechase and an NCAA finalist and All-American in the event in 1981, and freshman Bill Reifsnnyder was sixth in the IC4A 10,000 and second to Florida's Keith Brantley in the USA-TAC Junior National 10,000. Last year Reifsnnyder was third in the IC4A 10,000 and 17th at the NCAA meet.

The future looks bright. This winter, junior Jerry Jurick, sophomore Brian Harshman, junior Dave Hawes and freshmen Rick Hughey and Brian Fullem moved into first, third, fifth, seventh and tenth, respectively, on Bucknell's all-time two-mile list. Reifsnnyder and junior Mike Deckert are first and fifth on the three-mile roll.

Bucknell might not be a contender for the NCAA championship, or even an IC4A team title, in track and field, but it's hard to overlook the Bison when talking about distance running in Eastern colleges and universities. It's a long way from 1970 to the Division I All-American status earned by Buckheit, Sayre and Reifsnnyder, but the Bison runners Gulden has gathered have shown that they like long distances.

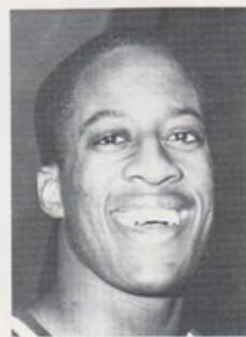
