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About the Cover Tribute to Legendary Track Announcer Jack O'Reilly

Known throughout the track and field world as the public address announcer at the Penn Relays for more than 30 years, Jack O'Reilly died August 30 in Scottsdale, Ariz., after a long battle with Alzheimer's disease. Remembered warmly for the many stock phrases he used in announcing track and field, O'Reilly was the announcer at the IC4A Championships for many years. He was 89.

As assistant to previous Penn Relays announcer Pinky Sober before becoming the event's main voice from 1971-2001, O'Reilly was a standout in track and field and swimming at Brooklyn Prep before beginning a broadcasting career that saw him cover more than a dozen sports. Events he broadcast included numerous Olympic Trials and Olympic Games, in addition to games of the New York Knicks, New York Rangers, Brooklyn Dodgers and numerous college football teams.

He became the voice of the Arizona State University track and field team after moving there in 1978.

O'Reilly is survived by his wife, Nancy, five sons, one daughter and numerous grandchildren.

A TRIBUTE TO THE ONE AND ONLY "LEGS"

The long-dreaded news came to us in mid-September 2005, that two weeks earlier, on August 30, our beloved Jack "Legs" O'Reilly had finally succumbed to his three-plus year battle with the horrific Alzheimer's disease.

However, it's not the time to dwell on any "stillness" that exists without him, but rather on the better days and years of those fondest memories of Jack that we, a close-knit and very traditional IC4A family, all share and will cherish forever.

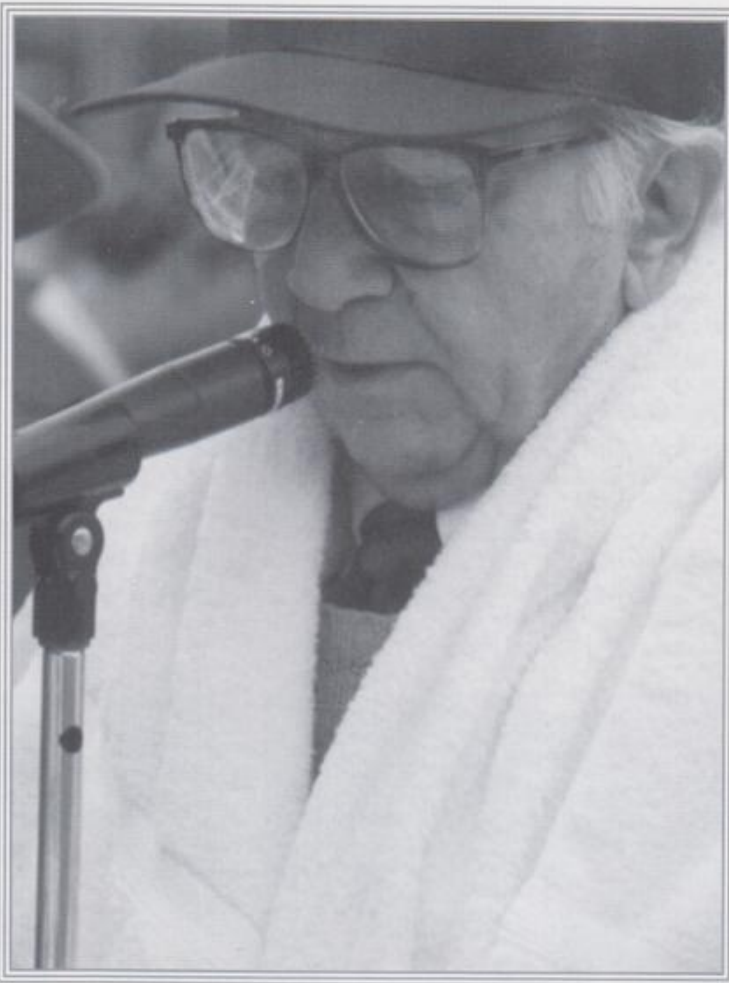
As we wander down memory lane, let's for the moment, journey back to the one of many Saturdays a decade or so ago at any of our great Indoor Championships held in Princeton's Jadwin Gym, in early March.

About an hour or two prior to the first event on that day's schedule, as the stands were beginning to fill, the imposing figure of a distinguished-looking gentleman would shuffle-step his way down front to the announcer's table, adjacent to the track, and take ownership of the "mic"...which was to be his [almost exclusive] "tool of the trade" for the next two days.

Before placing his wad of heat sheets [that the Meet Director had slipped under his hotel room door], along with results of all applicable recent conference championships, Jack would face the stands and nod affirmatively to his friends and admirers, decked out in his signature sartorial splendor, befitting a well-attired Arizona landowner by way of an earlier life in the Philly area.

Who can forget his spit-shined loafers, with no socks of course, Navy blazer contrasting the loud red-plaid trousers, with a lavender pastel cashmere sweater over an immaculate shirt and tie, so vividly offsetting the snow white mane and sun-tainted face bright as the Southwest sun from whence he just flew in to be the "many-time" beloved voice of our IC4A Championship.

Then, with all his annotated heat sheets and other notes about him, Jack would begin his role of informing one and all about what they're going to see, what they're seeing and what they've just seen. Oh,



occasionally, to catch his breath, or to turn around to schmooze with one of his many friends and acquaintances, he might reluctantly turn the mic over to an assistant to announce the results.

It was in this role, "Sitting at the Right Hand of the Father," for a dozen plus years [both Indoors and Out], that I not only honed my craft as a sometime announcer, but that I got to know Jack as a close personal friend. Perhaps it was certain similar facets of our backgrounds that created this bond, to wit: born and raised in Brooklyn; Jesuit educated, both attended Brooklyn Prep and Georgetown University [he graduated both, I didn't either one, but that's not germane to this story]. We even had somewhat of a Marine Corps connection. I had spent a career therein, while Jack's wife, Nancy, was a former officer in the Women's segment of the Corps.

Of course Jack was equally as famous, perhaps

even more so, as voice of the largest track and field "Carnival" in the country: The Penn Relays. Within the vastness of Franklin Field, where countless numbers of fans loved him, especially for the folksy "schmaltz" that he brought forth, which included many stock phrases like the eagerly anticipated "ARE YOU READY? ...[pause] ARE YOU REEEAALY READY?" when he took over the mc, energizing the crowd as the Championship portion of their program got underway.

Moreover, Jack was the Chief Announcer at Arizona State's Sun Angel Track Classic for over 22 years, as well as numerous NCAA Championships, Indoors and Out. This only came after many years as a popular voice on famous radio broadcasts at New York City and Philadelphia stations in the 1940s and 1950s.

However, "Legs"...[oh, and how he was so proud of that nickname, bestowed upon him by his schoolboy chums at "The Prep"] is known for his "Penns" and other announcing exploits, we are today selfishly and exclusively acknowledging Jack's many contributions to our IC4A family. We will certainly miss him, as we have since he was last with us in 2001.

Other, very capable and knowledgeable announcers, have stepped in to replace Jack, including Murray Peyton, another of his former assistants, Larry Newman and Andy Boyajian to name a few, all of which have done a sterling job. But despite their professional approach and enthusiasm, they each will be the first to admit, and as the rest of us well know, that no one, really no one, will ever come close to filling those sockless spit-shined loafers of Jack O'Reilly!

Thanks for the memories, Jack; they were heavenly while they lasted!

Now, with lump in throat, and tear in eye, it's time to hear: "This is not just another track meet...THIS IS THE I C 4 A!"

This story was written by Larry Byrne, who was the IC4A Administrator for 13 years (1987 - 2000), and who directed 39 consecutive IC4A Championships.

Select stories gathered to remember Jack O'Reilly at his finest.

Perhaps one of my favorite stories occurred at Penn, a number of years back, when, during a Friday evening 'twix the two big days of the Relays, I had joined a number of the IC4A coaches to relax. One in this group was Coach Bill Hodge, who that year held the head job at Lafayette College. Bill stated, "You know when you really have it made as a college coach, it's when Jack O'Reilly mentions your name, when your team is out on the track in one of the relays...like "Jumbo" Elliott's Wildcats, or Frank "Gags" Gagliano's Hoyas, or Steve Bartold's Elis....but we small guys never get a mention." Well, the following day, unbeknownst to Mr. Hodge, I saw Jack just before he went out on the infield to announce, and asked him to mention Bill Hodge and his Lafayette Leopards, when his team was on the track, to which Jack gladly agreed. Later that day, as the event Lafayette was scheduled to compete in was next on the schedule, Bill, in somewhat nervous anticipation, excused himself from our group to go down to the men's room under the stands. But, as luck would have it, that facility was crowded, and it took longer than he anticipated. Needless to say, while Bill was otherwise occupied, Jack began to intone the "intros" for the next event... "and in Lane 6, the Leopards of Lafayette, Coached by Bill Hodge..." Well, you guessed it, Bill, out of ear-shot, never heard it...his name announced before some 40,000 fans... Lafayette history in the making...Bill Hodge now among the named greats at Penn...and he never heard it! (Remembered fondly by Larry Byrne)

* * * * *

When the National Scholastic Sports Foundation was in its embryonic stages and struggling to gain some recognition, I went to Jack [during the Penn Relays] and hesitantly asked if he could mention the NSSF. "Of course," he instantly replied, "you guys (Jim Spier being the other "guy") are doing a wonderful job." A few minutes later we were thrilled to hear that wonderful voice extolling the merits of our organization. That was Jack O'Reilly, always willing to help a friend. I too will miss him. (Mike Byrnes, co-founder of NSSF).

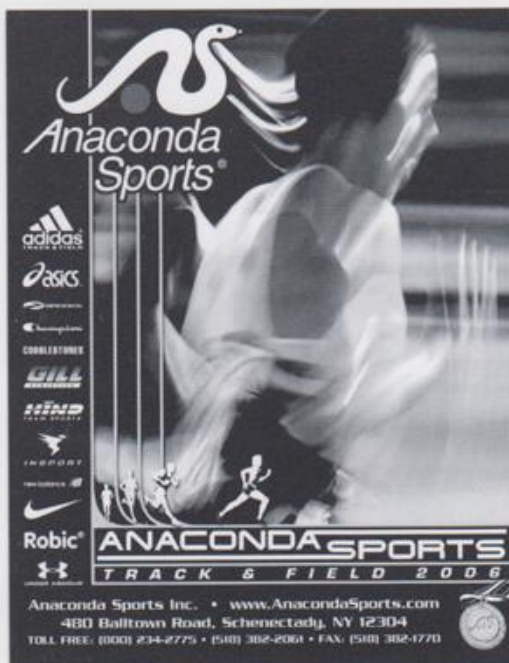
