John Gregorek: Hoya Olympian

If a track season can be compared to a canvas painting, then certainly John Gregorek's sophomore year at Georgetown University was a masterpiece.

Consider the following -- Gregorek earned All-American honors in cross country, indoor and outdoor track. He ran the fourth fastest 3,000-meter steeplechase in American history, the second fastest ever by a U.S. collegian. He was ranked among the top 25 Americans in three different events -- the 1,500 meters, the 5,000 meters and the steeplechase.

And for the crowning glory, the final stroke of the artist's brush, Gregorek gained a spot on the United States Olympic team roster at the trials in Eugene, Ore. last June.

That's pretty select company for a young man completing his second year of intercollegiate track. But then John Gregorek is not your typical collegiate athlete. Maybe that's why **Sport** magazine named him "The Top Track and Field Prospect of the 1980s."

"John is just starting to realize how significant it was to achieve something as important as making the Olympic team," says Georgetown head track coach Joe Lang. "When you stop and think of how few athletes ever make the Olympic team, you have to tell yourself, 'Hey, this is some accomplishment.'"

Gregorek believes qualifying for the Olympic team has had very real effects. He now feels he may have prepared for races with too much work, which eventually sapped his conditioning just a bit. "Now I have the confidence to know I can run with other top runners and I can get ready for races with a little less work than was necessary before."

One of the premier schoolboy runners in the nation during his days at St. Anthony's High School in Smithtown, N.Y., Gregorek has become THE dominant track performer at Georgetown. He holds five school indoor

track records and four outdoor marks. He earned All-American honors the past two years in the NCAA Cross Country Championships.

At last year's IC4A Championships, Gregorek ran one of his most impressive races of the season, defeating Villanova ace Don Paige in winning the 1,500 meters. In addition to earning All-East honors with his performance, Gregorek helped lead the Hoyas to a fourth-place finish in the meet, Georgetown's best showing in the IC4As since 1953.

Gregorek Makes U.S. Olympic Team

EUGENE, Ore., June 28—With a strong kick over the last quarter mile, John Gregorek of Georgetown University took third place to qualify for the U.S. Olympic team in the 3,000-meter steeplechase Saturday night.

Gregorek's time of 8 minutes 21.4 seconds was only two seconds off the former American record, broken by the winner, Henry Marsh, who ran 8:15.7.

Gregorek went from sixth place to third on the last lap of the race, passing Ron Addison of the Athletics West team only a few meters from the tape.

As Addison fought to retain third place, he moved into Gregorek's path and bumped him with a shoulder and an elbow.

"He moved in front of me and started cutting me off," Gregorek said after the race. "I think I already had third place won, the only thing left for him to do was run me off the track. That's what I think he tried to do." Instead of finishing third, Addison lay sprawled on the track and crawled to the finish line with a broken clavicle. He later was disqualified.

It was Gregorek's fourth steeplechase race of the season, and his time Saturday was more than 10 seconds faster than his previous best. Gregorek placed sixth in this year's NCAA 1,500 meters in 3:44.1 and earlier had run a 3:56 mile on a relay. It was his speed, he said, that helped him Saturday.

"I think I'm faster than a lot of these guys," he said. "My strategy was just to be toward the front with a lap to go, and then see what I could do. The last 220 I told myself I could take a shot at it, and I did."

Gregorek has finished his sophomore year at Georgetown and is younger and less experienced in the steeplechase than most of his competition. Marsh and Doug Brown, who finished second Saturday, were the top two finishers in the Olympic trials in 1976 and have dominated the event in this country ever since. Brown also was an Olympian in 1972.

Gregorek explained that the steeplechase is an event which combines speed, which he claims to have, with finesse.

"I need to improve my technique over the barriers," he said, "and I need the experience of running in Europe against the best in the world. Over there, they jostle and surge and throw elbows, and I'm not used to that."

Gregorek will get more experience next month when he travels with the Olympic team to meet against the German national team in Stuttgart, against the British in London and the Norwegians in Oslo. He also hopes to run in major invitational meets in France and Switzerland.

Although he has made the U.S. Olympic team, one major prize may yet elude him. The Olympic Committee will send a team composed only of the first-place finishers in each event to Japan and China in the fall. Marsh, then Brown, will have first chance at the trip. If they cannot compete, Gregorek would step in.

"I'd love to go to China," he said. "Probably it would mean that I'd have to take a leave of absence from school, but it would be worth it."

If he competes in Peking this fall, Georgetown will miss Gregorek for the cross-country season. Last year he placed 27th at the NCAA championships.

If he does not go to China, Gregorek will be back on the Georgetown campus in September, will take only a short break from running, and then will try to peak for the regional and national cross-country races.

On June 28 of last year, he became the ninth Georgetown track and field athlete to earn a berth on the Olympic team. Entered in the steeplechase, an event he had run only twice previously in 1980, Gregorek found himself in sixth place with one lap remaining. Summoning his reserve speed, Gregorek passed three competitors over the last two hundred meters, barely holding off the final challenger at the tape. His 8:21.4 clocking was good for third place and a spot on the Olympic team.

What's next for the 20-year-old Gregorek?

"This is kind of an off year in track, so we're trying to keep John relaxed and work on bringing his speed out a little more," says Lang. "He's the type of individual who will try and duplicate or better last year's accomplishments. He'll never sit back and rest on what he's already done."

In his junior season, Gregorek is scheduled to run shorter distance events to build up

his speed as well as his strength. He figures to enter more 1,500 and mile events than last year, and run in fewer 3,000 and 5,000 meter races. His best in the mile came at the 1980 Dartmouth Relays when he ran a 3:56.8 leg. His best effort in the 1,500 came in August of last year during a meet in Rome for the U.S. Olympians. Gregorek posted a 3:40.8 in that race.

"I don't feel I have to prove anything to other people," he says, "but there are certain things I'd still like to do. I've never finished higher than sixth in an NCAA track championship, and I'd like to make the World University Games in Romania in August."

As talented as he is now, there's reason to believe Gregorek's future, at Georgetown and beyond his graduation in 1982, holds even better things in store. "In terms of distance running, John's only a baby," Lang says. "His best years should be when he's 25 or 26 years old."

FDU Star Solomon Chebor— At Home on the Track

The first letter arrived shortly after he finished sixth in the 1977 NCAA Cross-Country Championships. Just a note from the president of Kenya saying how proud of Solomon Chebor everybody was back home. No one, though, could have been prouder than Chebor.

From the moment Chebor was stamped "world class" and airmailed to the United States, he felt a certain responsibility to the folks back home. The great Kenyan distance runners--the Kip Keinos, the Ben Jipchos, the Henry Ronos--all seemed to come from the Nandi district, and now Chebor was being prodded by family and friends to become the first world-class runner from the Baringo district. "That was the only thing that made me run really well," recalls the Fairleigh Dickinson senior. "Even now, I want to give the district a good name."

Especially now. For more than a year after the fall of 1977, Chebor could not help feeling that he had let down the home folks. It is indeed a reflection of his subsequent difficulties that he received only one letter from Kenyan President Daniel Arap Moi over the next two years. But that's all behind him now, along with most of the competitors.

Last year, Chebor was a four-letter man.

Yet despite all of the official recognition (it should be noted here that the president lives in Chebor's hometown), popular recognition came slowly. Even after he won the NCAA indoor three-mile championship last March, he believed. "most people never knew it."

.....

Memorial Stadium, on that Saturday night last June, was like an oven. Preheated to 100 degrees, it was a slice of Kenya right there in good ol' Austin, Texas. As he entered the final lap of the NCAA 5,000 meters, Chebor was determined to make the race heat up, too. Never mind that Suleiman Nyambui had 10 meters on him and everyone knows you simply don't outkick Nyambui unless your name is Miruts Yifter and you're running in the Olympic final. The undaunted Chebor would begin driving on the backstretch. Coming off the last turn, he was on the Tanzanian's right shoulder. "He must have felt me there," Chebor recalls, "because he just went **woosh**."

Moments after burning to a three-second victory in 13:44.43, Nyambui turned to the second-place finisher and said, "My God, where did you come from?"

"You're lucky," Chebor replied, "because I started (kicking) very late."

Chebor, of course, knew better; he knew it was more than just bad timing. It isn't that he had a weak kick—not when he had devastated a pretty classy field on the gun lap of the NCAA indoor three-mile (13:21.0). It's just that his kick lacked ... well, woosh. So, figuring that there could be no better place to develop a ferocious kick than Kenya, Chebor went home for the first time in three years.

"I went to climb my hills," he says. "I love my hills."

He returned to Teaneck, N.J., last fall ready to peak for the IC4A and NCAA Cross-Country Championships. First, in October, he ran away from the field to win the IC4A Cross-Country Championship at Van Cortlandt Park. Then came the NCAAAs. Five miles into the 10,000-meter race on that brisk November day in Wichita, Kan., there was no doubt in Chebor's mind that he could beat Nyambui, he of the silver medal and the golden kick. But by the time the Texas-El Paso junior went **woosh** with 600 meters to go, Chebor, already hampered by a stomach cramp for more than a half-mile, was just hanging on for third.

Just after the race, Nyambui didn't ask Chebor where he had come from; this time, he asked why Chebor had not extended the challenge through that final straightaway.

Solomon Chebor had arrived. Finally.

For a long while, Chebor seemed to have broken the promise he showed in the summer of 1976, when he earned a scholarship to Wyoming with the 13:45.7 he ran to win the 5,000 at the Kenyan national championships. ("Believe me, it is tough—just like the Olympics"). For a long while, he seemed to have lost all the confidence he had built during that freshman cross-country season.

After surviving his first snowfall and several uncommon colds ("Would you believe," he says of the NCAA meet, "it was 15 degrees below zero?"), Chebor quit the team that winter after what he calls "a very big misunderstanding" with his coach over training methods. "It was a lot of frustration," he says, "especially when I was so far away from home. But I told myself, 'The only thing I need is education.' I used any means of getting assistance."

So he transferred to Essex County College in Newark, N.J., and began training again under Russ Rogers. "It was," Chebor says, "one of the hardest things I ever experienced." On the plane back from the national junior college cross-country championships, in which the favorite had finished a

disappointing 11th, Chebor told Rogers that he never wanted to lose like that again.

And he hasn't, really. After capping an impressive track season at Essex by setting the existing national junior college 3,000-meter steeplechase record of 8:38.4, Chebor was ready to follow Rogers to FDU. That fall, his 13th-place finish in the NCAA Cross-Country Championships erased the remaining doubts, even if he did finish right behind (who else?) Nyambui. "That's when I told myself, 'I think I can run with these guys,'" Chebor says. "And then I started doing it."

Now, the frail-looking business major—he is so skinny at 5-7½ and 120 pounds that teammates nicknamed him Chicken Legs—looks forward to finally winning an IC4A track title to go along with his IC4A cross-country crown. "This time, I want to make sure I do very well." He does not look much beyond the NCAAAs next weekend, though — except to say he plans to use his remaining indoor and outdoor track eligibility next year, train for the 1984 Olympics and, of course, beat Nyambui someday soon.

But unlike Nyambui, who is pushing 30, Chebor is only 22. He sees many red-letter days ahead. "I'm young," he says. "I'm still on my way."

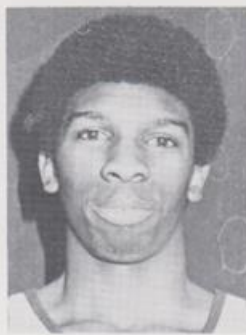

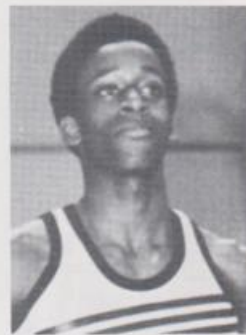
