New York, May 27— Three mighty men scored 25 points in the IC4A Championships to lead Yale to the title. With 17 more points, Yale won the meet with 42 points to 24 for NYU and Michigan State 22.

Each of Yale's great trio set a new meet record, and then placed high in another event.

George Wade, an erratic miler, ran his best race today, sprinting away from Bill Mack to set a new mark of 4:10.3, by far his best performance. Later he came back to place third in the half mile.

Jim Fuchs, as expected, set a new meet record in the shot with a put of 57'9 $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Then he threw the discus 156'10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " for second place.

Vic Frank, NCAA champion, set a new record in the discus with a throw of 171'. Frank was also third in the shot.

Another iron-man stunt failed when Andy Stanfield of Seton Hall pulled a muscle in winning the 100 in 9.6. He was forced to withdraw from the 220 and low hurdles, and had to be content with his broad jump of 23' 5/8" for 4th.

Stanfield appeared to be in top form and his 100 was a remarkable one under the conditions. He received a muscle cramp in his right thigh at the 90 yard mark and hobbled to the finish line.

One of the best races of the day was the 440 in which NCAA titlist Charlie Moore of Cornell barely held off Hugo Maiocco of NYU in a fast 47.3. Dean Noll of Manhattan was a surprisingly good third in 47.5, with NYU grabbing two more places as Reggie Pearman finished fourth and Dick Maiocco fifth.

Jim Gehrdes of Penn State was the meet's only double winner, taking the hurdles from Horace Smith of Michigan State in 14.4 and 23.2. Smith was also 5th in the 100.

NYU set the fourth meet record with a 3:13.7 relay.

Only five champions were able to defend their titles. In addition to Fuchs, Frank, Stanfield, and NYU, Art Sherman of Rhode Island State again shared the pole vault title, this time with George Appel of Yale at 13'6".

The field events provided three outstanding surprises. Bob Jachens of Trinity won the high jump at 6'6 3/8". Al Harnly of Albright won the javelin at 207'1 $\frac{1}{4}$ ". And Edgar Davis of Princeton broad jumped 24'7 1/8".

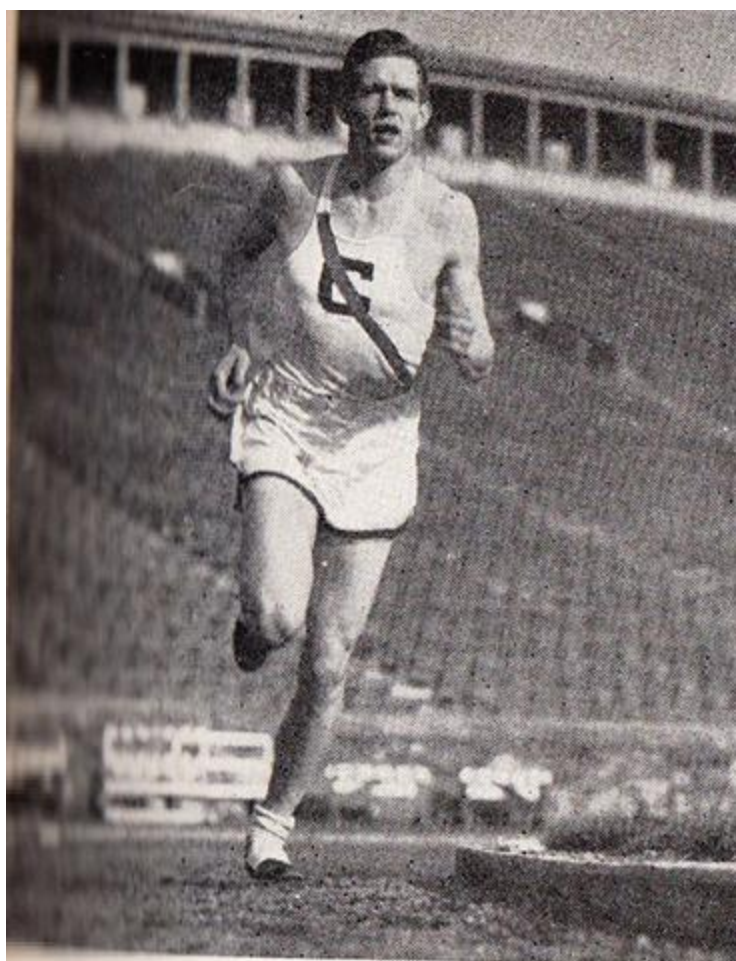
The mile was a humdinger with the surprising Wade soundly defeating Mack, Michigan State's indoor record holder. The latter's 4:12.4 was just good enough to edge his all purpose teammate, Warren Druetzler, with Syracuse's Bob Weaver a good fourth and Tom Kirwan of Penn a disappointing fifth.

Bob Black ran away from a good field to win the two mile in 9:16.7 as Dick Hart of Penn and Dick Church of Syracuse ran far below their best times.
