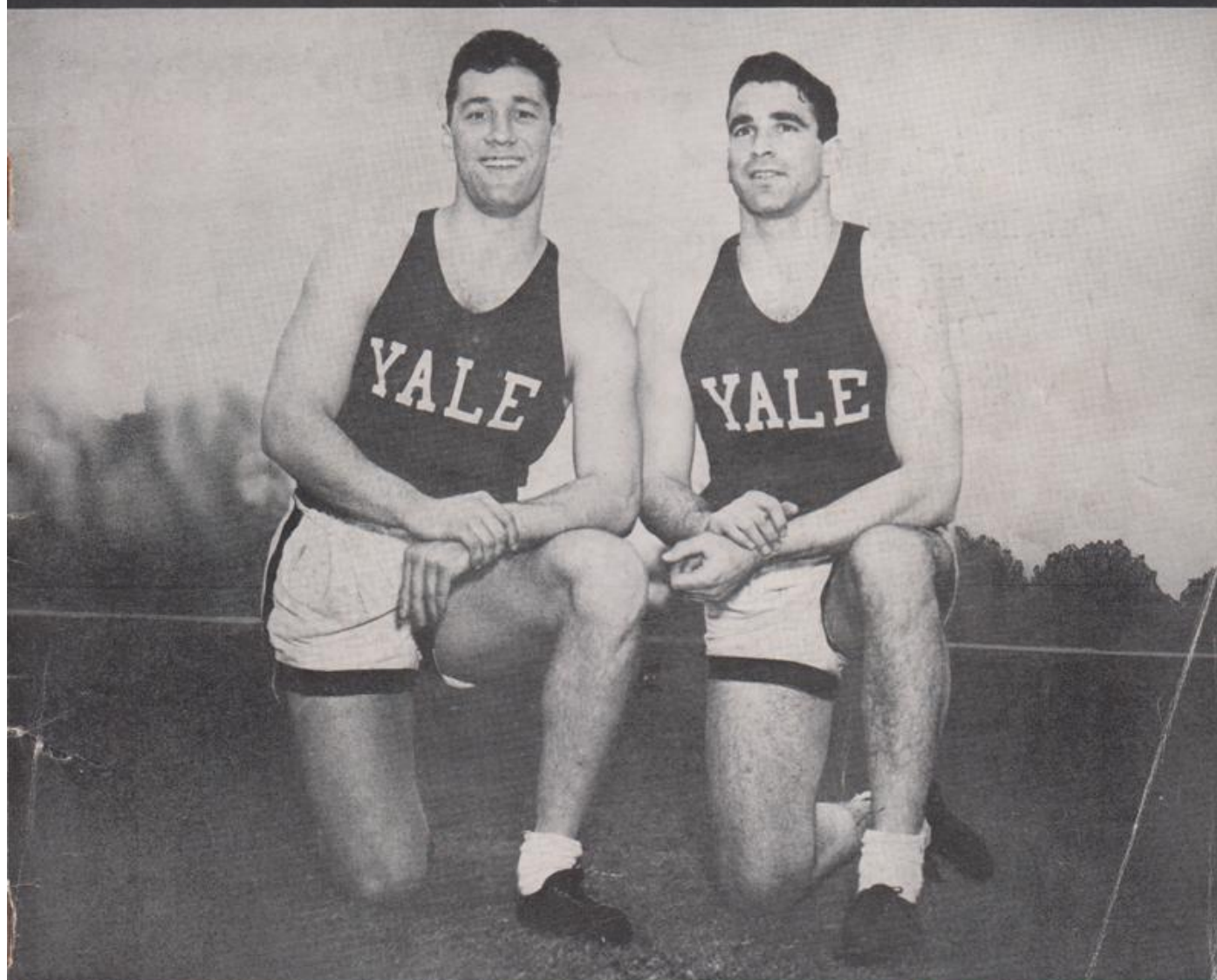

Moakley of Cornell—A Fifty Year Saga

IN 1899 the business branch of the Cornell Athletics Department was not quite as well regulated as we like to think it is now, but it was enterprising and shrewd and evidently figured winning was a sensible endeavor for athletic teams. It also fairly concluded that good coaching might help the cause. Thus in the Fall of '99 it hired Percy Haughton of Harvard to coach football and Jack Moakley of Boston and coach at Wisconsin to handle cross country and track and train the footballers. A pretty good haul.

Haughton did all right but he did not stay long. His 1899 football team won seven, lost three. The 1900 team won nine and lost two. Then he left; later for nine years at his alma mater, Harvard, to achieve the greatest record in its gridiron history. Jack Moakley has done all right too; and stayed longer.

Just as a tip-off on things to come, Cornell won its first ICAAAA Cross-Country Championship at Morris Park his very first year and its first ICAAAA track and field title in 1905. Since then seventeen cross-country banners (more than any other school) and ten track trophies (only Harvard with twelve, Yale with eleven, have more) have come to reside in Schoellkopf trophy cases.

During a half century of devoted service Jack Moakley has contributed so many fine things to Cornell that it seems petty to even mention the record of his teams. Actually, however, his best contributions have come because of his success in building winners and as a result the influence this has had in attracting boys out to follow a wholesome routine and to build their bodies and their personalities. No one who ever worked under Jack Moakley could easily escape being a better man for it.

His honesty and basic philosophies are sound and indestructible. He holds to them regardless. Affectations are not countenanced by him and his treatment can be a little brutal when dealing with a "phony." He never picks soft spots for his teams nor does he in his personal dealings. His strong convictions are highly respected by all who know him. "Building character," for good reason, fails to be a bantering cliché when speaking of Jack Moakley's coaching.

On his 60th birthday on December 11, 1923, the Ithaca Journal editorial page spoke as follows:

"The best part of Jack Moakley's life has been devoted to the interests of Cornell University, not only in building winning track and cross-country teams, a great achievement in itself, but in building character. Thousands of young men have come under his guidance since he began coaching here, and from all corners of the globe there have come, and still keep coming, testimonials that that influence has

always been a good influence, helpful, kindly, sympathetic, constructive. No teacher and leader of men anywhere has a more devoted, loyal, enthusiastic following than Jack Moakley. When even alumni gather in Ithaca, no man is more sought after, none receives a warmer greeting . . . No man has done more for Cornell than this man the University community and his fellow citizens of Ithaca honor today."

Twenty-five years later the words still ring true. He has done much to make Cornell the great University it is today.

So let's gather 'round and toast Jack Moakley in this 50th year of his Cornell career with that old training table song:—

"Oh, there is Jack Moakley; he stands over there.
He feeds us on zwieback and roast beef so rare.
He looks very fierce, and he carries a gun,
And he's always teaching us dubs how to run."

Chorus:

"Oh, it's one, two, and three, four, we'll all fall in line.

To the tune of Jack Moakley, we'll always keep time.

It's run like a Turk till your legs ache like hell.
It's a grand institution, this track at Cornell."

In his 50 years at Cornell, Coach Moakley's teams have won 17 I.C.4-A. cross country titles, 10 I.C.4-A. outdoor track titles, and won 2 and tied a 3rd indoor I.C.4-A. title. In the outdoor I.C.4-A. championship meets, 43 men have won or shared 59 titles in every event except the javelin and mile relay.

Among his outstanding performers in the outdoor I.C.4-A. were:

John Paul Jones—winner of the mile in 1911 and 1913 and co-champion with Norman Tabor in '12 and winner of the 880 in 1911 and 1912. His 4:14.4 mile in 1913 was a new world's record.

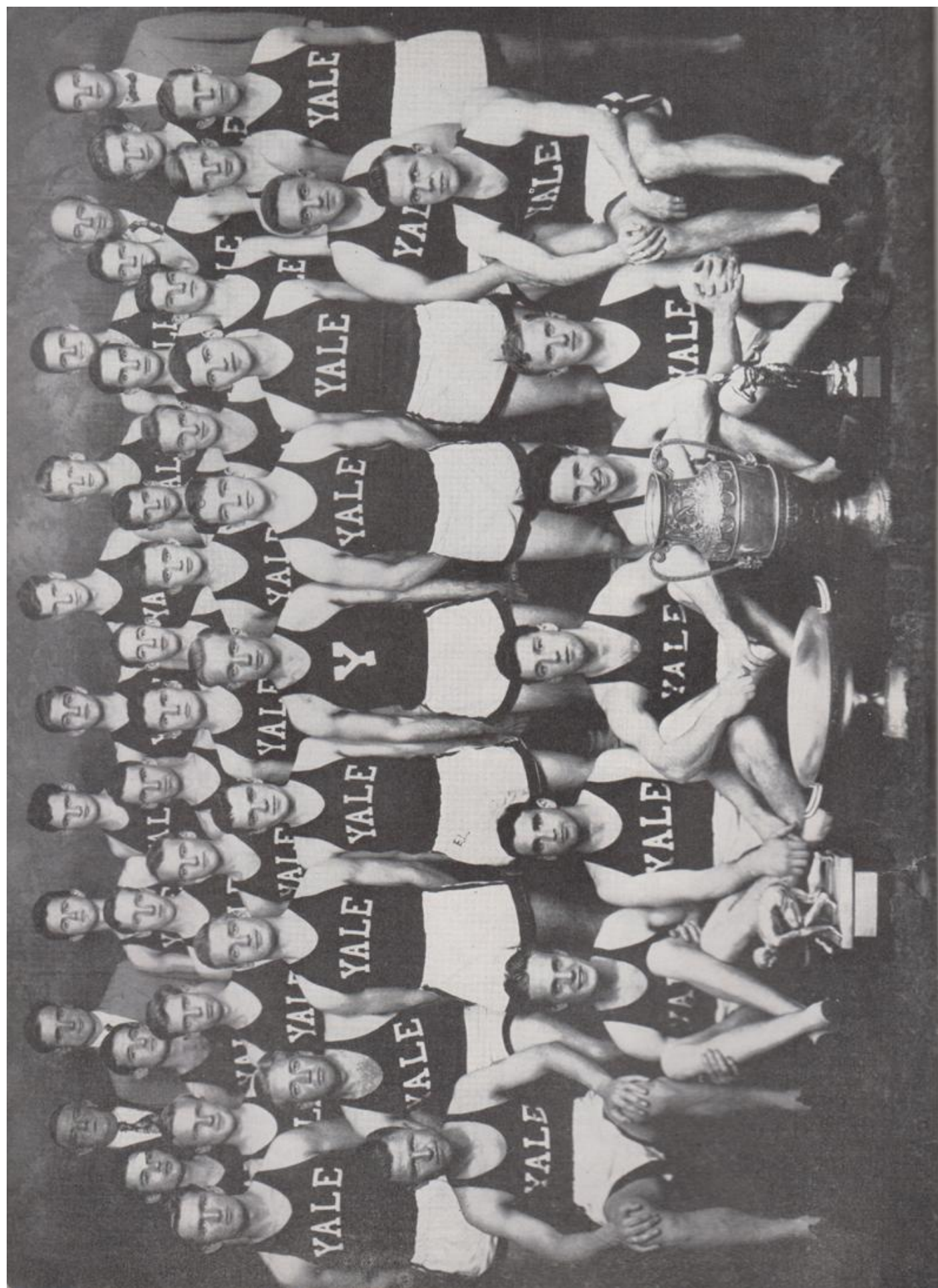
Tell Berna—winner of the two mile in 1910 and 1911, setting I.C.4-A. record in 1911.

Kurt Mayer—winner of the 440 and 880 in 1919.

Henry Russell—winner of the 220 in 1925 and the 100 and 220 in 1926.

James Hucker—winner and record breaker in the low hurdles in 1935 and again in 1937.

This year he brings to Triborough Stadium his best collection of Cornell record-holders in years: Charles Moore—440 (47.2), Robert Mealey—880 (1:52.3), Walter Ashbaugh—120 high hurdles (14.7) co-holder, and the Mile Relay team—3:14.9 (Seider, Greenfield, Moore and Mealey).



Michigan State Eyes Triple Crown or Confessions of a Handicapper

SINCE the Intercollegiate A.A.A.A. inaugurated its first indoor meeting in 1922, only one member of the lodge has cleaned up all three IC4A championships in one bright college year. That was Brother Von Elling's New York University team which swept over hill and dale, boards and cinders in November, March and May of 1946-1947. In took the IC4A a quarter of a century to produce a Triple Crown champion. Obviously it is no mean achievement.

This week-end in Triborough Stadium, the IC4A may salute another Triple Crown champion, that is, if this and fellow seers read the signs correctly. This would have to be Michigan State of East Lansing, Mich., newly inducted into the Western Conference but still—and maybe for many years more—a member in good standing of the IC4A.

Of the forty-six colleges entered in the outdoor championships, Michigan State is the only Triple Crown candidate. The Spartans, quite awesomely formidable, won the cross-country championship at Van Cortlandt Park last November with an entry of Warren Druetzler, Bill Mack, Tom Irmen, Walter Atcheson and Bob Sewell that tallied a low score of 51 points, all five finishing in the first eighteen.

Mack and Druetzler contributed handsomely to the indoor track triumph in Madison Square Garden three months ago. And now the same group, headed by Horace Smith, Fred Johnson, Jack Diannetti, Mack, Druetzler, Capt. Tom Irmen, Bob Schepers, Francis Bowerman, Mayo Arndt, Paige Christiansen and company, is back again for a shot at the outdoor championship.

Indoors, Karl Schlademan's lads in forest-green were making their first bid for the IC4A championship. And hit the jackpot. Outdoors, however, the Spartans have been trying to win ever since they joined the IC4A in 1927. They have been as close as second in two years—in 1938 when they were run-

nersup to U.S.C., again in 1947 when they trailed only N.Y.U.

For this try, the Spartans are well heeled. They have not only seven point scorers from the team that scored 21½ points last year, but additional point scorers from the 1947 meet, plus such talented newcomers in the outdoor Intercollegiates as Hurdler Smith, Miler Mack and Jack-of-all-distances Druetzler who conceivably could score in anything from the 880 to the two-mile.

No guarantee, of course, goes with this prediction. Sure thing winners have been upset in the Intercollegiates

before this. Michigan State was a solid favorite for the indoor IC4A title—Brother Lou Miller alone of the Track Handicappers Guild dissenting. Michigan State won in formful, solid style, 35½ points to Yale's 26½ points.

In the 1000-yard semi-finals Druetzler of Michigan State bagged the second and last qualifying place in Heat 2, nosing out George Thompson of Villanova by inches in a photo finish. The only reason Thompson did not shut out Druetzler was that he could not get through on the narrow track. Thompson charged up the stretch so fast, running over the leaders, that he ran right into Druetzler and Manhattan's Tom Comerford, trying vainly to find elbow room between them. Druetzler went on to get second place and four points in the final, four points the Spartans wouldn't have had if Thompson had found room for his stretch wallop.

In the pole vault two Michigan State entries tried for third and scored 2½ points. Scrambling desperately over the crossbar on their third tries at 12 feet, 12 feet 6 inches, and 13 feet, they were on the verge of elimination time and again, pulling one Hairbreadth Harry feat after another.

In the high hurdles Jesse Thomas, of Michigan State, narrowly won a runoff that gave him a point in the final.

For its part, Yale lost a similar runoff in the sprint, and if the Michigan State vaulters hadn't been so lucky the Eli vaulting total would have almost doubled. All of which could easily have resulted in a Yale victory instead of second place.

This isn't offered as an alibi for Yale, which is defending today's team title and can speak for itself. It is merely one example of the small margins in many events which add up to victory or defeat.

Yale itself was a mite lucky, or N.Y.U. unlucky, in the Intercollegiates a year ago. Ira Kaplan, of N.Y.U., hot enough for second place in the 100 was running second in the 220 final when he pulled a

"Moon" Mondschein, N. Y. U.'s Stellar Champion, Has Compiled Great Record

EVEN the heavens are aware of the fading of one of the brightest of all IC4A lights. The seventy-third annual outdoor Intercollegiate open in the dark of the moon.

This weekend's merry scramble for team points and titles winds up the varsity career of Irving (Moon) Mondschein of New York University, a husky, hustling, happy youth who undoubtedly got his nickname because he always set his sights high and generally hit the target.

There have been various versatile chaps, like Barney Ewell of Penn State and Boo Morcom of New Hampshire, who have bagged more IC4A titles and scored more IC4A points than N.Y.U.'s Moon Mondschein.

But no one, past or present, overshadows the brawny Brooklynite as the prototype of a "winning" athlete.

The sighs of relief escaping from opposition coaches like Yale's Bob Gegengack, Michigan State's Karl Schlademan and Manhattan's George Eastment when the "Moon" goes down for good on Saturday night will raise whitecaps on the river of tears flowing from the eyes of Emil Von Elling, bereaved mentor of the Violets.

The rundown on Mondschein's IC4A activities, interrupted by nearly four years of Army service, including duty in the Pacific Theatre, shows that Moon has scored 39½ points in five varsity meets, indoors and out, as follows:

1943 Indoors—Second in high jump, third in broad jump (7 points).

1947 Indoors—Won high jump, set indoor championship record of 6 feet 7¼ inches; third in broad jump (3 points).

1947 Outdoors—Second in high jump, third in broad jump, fifth in shot put (3 points).

1948 Indoors—Tied for first in high jump, third in broad jump (7½ points).

1948 Outdoors—Won high jump, set outdoor championship record of 6 feet 6⅞ inches; second in broad jump (9 points).

Impressive as it is, this recital of individual accomplishment merely emphasizes what is well known to all track and field devotees—that Moon Mondschein, also three-time National AAU decath-

lon champion, two-time NCAA high jump champion and 1948 Olympian, is a consistently brilliant performer.

However, there is another phase of his record that should be stressed in order that the full worth of this remarkable athlete may be fully appreciated.

To my way of thinking—and Von Elling and many rival coaches will agree, I am sure—the big thing about Mondschein is that, in four of the five meets he disported himself so capably, N.Y.U. won the team title. It goes without saying that Moon's valiant efforts were largely responsible.

The lone exception was last year, when even his personal high yield of nine points could not quite swing the balance for the Violets against the surge of Yale.

One of the most captivating features of the IC4A classic is the proper emphasis that is put upon the team phase of the competition. Individual winners receive the lions' share of the glory, naturally. But, in this stirring vehicle of "the old college try," all who score so much as a single point for dear old Alma Mater also are heroic figures.

When team trophies are at stake, men of the Mondschein stripe are worth their 6 feet and 195 pounds in gold.

Even more than his record shows, Moon is a real team man. With his high jumping ability (note that he holds both indoor and outdoor IC4A records), Mondschein might well have swept all the available titles in that event, had he specialized.

However, team men don't figure that way. A horse for work, with such an unquenchable zest for competition that only lately he turned his talents to football, too, the self-sacrificing Moon has always put N.Y.U. first and Mondschein second.

Whenever the Violets have a track meet, Von Elling's biggest problem is restraining Mondschein. If his coach would only flash the green light, Moon would enter all the field events and try his luck on the track, too. He's not happy unless he's wearing himself into the ground to help his team—which could have cost him the Olympic decathlon title.

On occasions of lesser consequence than this, the

John Y. Woodruff of Pitt Has First Claim to All-Star Honors

ANYTIME you want to get yourself called ridiculous or just plain dopey, merely broadcast your choice of an all-time star or team. So, let's start the argument rolling. We'll lead off by stating that John Youie Woodruff, Pittsburgh U., '39, was the greatest runner ever to kick up his heels in the IC4A Championships.

We could limit that proclamation. We could hedge by calling Long John the most spectacular hoofer in the last dozen years—just in the 440 and 880. But we'd rather be more sweeping and all-inclusive. There'd be little argumentation, otherwise.

The brief in behalf of Woodruff isn't based solely on his 440 and 880 doubles, scored in 1937, '38 and '39—terrific as they were. It's founded more on the belief built up in marveling onlookers that no matter how fast his opposition went and no matter who ran against him in the quarter-mile or half, Old Seven-League Stride would have had enough to beat 'em all. That went for Ted Meredith, Bill Carr, Ben Eastman and the rest.

The dusky, elongated boy from Connellsville, Pa., proved unquestionably the best of his time when, as a raw freshman, he ranged all over the track, like a collie dog herding sheep, and still had enough to come on and win the Olympic 800 meters in Berlin in 1936. What happened the next few years merely cemented his claims to all-time greatness.

In the IC4As of 1937, Woodruff won the 440 in 47 seconds flat. That tied the record set by Carr in 1932, the year the U. of Penn smoothie went on to the Olympic 400-meter crown and record. After the quarter, the Pitt giant took the half in 1:52.1. His triumphs helped Coach Carl Olson's squad win the team title with 30½ points as Columbia, with 30; Cornell, 23, and Michigan State, 20½, filled the next places.

Mighty Southern California and the U. of California came East for the IC4A squabble of 1938. After the smoke had drifted, Southern Cal had scored 46¼ points, Michigan State, 25; California, 22½ and Pitt, 20. But John had scored his double again. Trailing him in the quarter were Southern Cal's Erwin Miller, NYU's Jim Herbert, Fordham's Wes Wallace and Boston College's Dick Gill. In the half, Manhattan's Howie Borck was closest.

Southern California boosted its winning total to 71½ in '39. Then came Pitt, 26; California, 16; Michigan State, 15, and Columbia, 14½. But for the third straight year Long John tied the 440 meet mark, beating Howard Upton and Miller, both of Southern Cal. An hour later, Woodruff romped

to a new IC4A standard of 1:51.2. NYU's Curt Giddings, nearest pursuer, was all of 20 yards back, although subsequently disqualified for a phantom foul.

Fastest 880 yards ever run anywhere in the world was the 1:47.8 turned in by Woodruff in a paced race on the big indoor track at Dartmouth in 1940. It was the second time he had hit that identical clocking. In 1937, he had done it in the process of handing a fearsome lacing to Elroy Robinson of Fresno State, holder of the world outdoor record of 1:49.6 at the time. That feat of John's never made the blue book, however, as re-

measurement of the course at Dallas showed it a bare five feet short of the full distance. Current world outdoor standard for the half is the 1:49.2 by Sid Wooderson of London in 1938.

As this is being written, we can see old timers begin smarting. They're just straining to sound off in behalf of a slew of multiple IC4A winners.

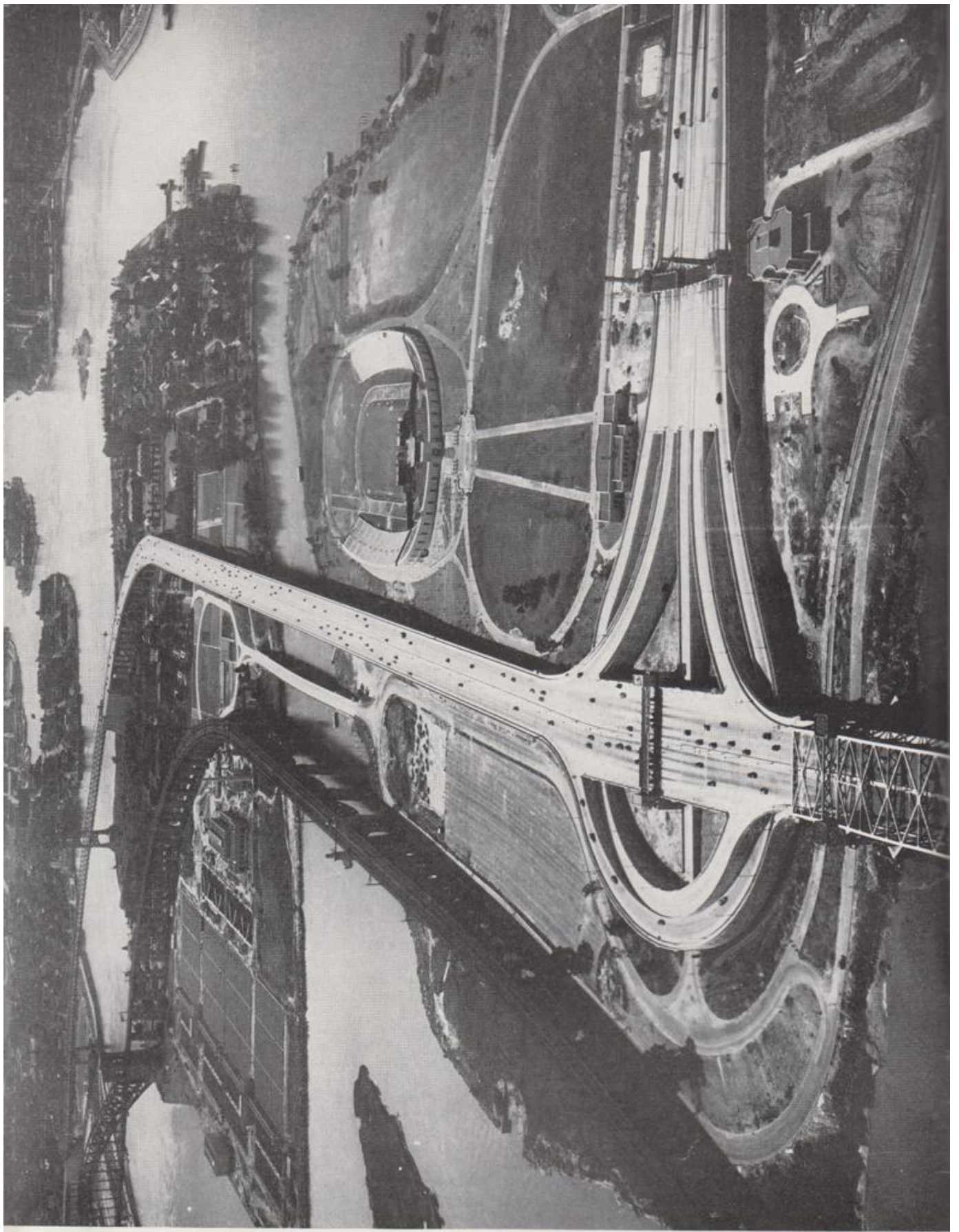
Among the sprinters alone, they can present such strong cases as Penn State's Barney Ewell, who won three triples with triumphs in the 100, 200 and broad jump in 1940, '41 and '42; Southern Cal's Frank Wykoff, who took the century in 1930, '31 and '32; Penn's Nate Cartmell, who hit the 100 and 220 double in 1906, '07 and '08, and Yale's C. H. Sherrill, who won the 100 four times.

In the quarter and half-mile group, there was Meredith, Olympic 800-meter champion in 1912, who won the 440 three times and the 880 twice.

Among the milers, NYU's Leslie MacMitchell took the title three times, Princeton's Bonny Bill Bonthron doubled in the 1500 and 800 meters twice, and Cornell's John Paul Jones won the mile and 880 in 1911, tied Brown's Norman Taber in the eight furlongs the following spring as well as repeating in the half, then won the mile the next year.

It won't do supporters of other heroes any good to claim that Wykoff, for instance, could beat our man in the 100 and that Bonthron could do the same in the mile. We're convinced Long John not only was the best 440-880 galloper ever, but that he also might have been the best up and down the remainder of the distance scale if trained for other events.

There are some real swifties competing in the ICs here at Randalls Island today. NYU's Reggie Pearman, Seton Hall's Frank Fox, Michigan State's Jack Dianetti, Yale's George Wade and Penn State's Horace Ashenfelter are just a few who could be cited. It may be another three-quarters of a century, however, before the likes of Long John Woodruff pops onto the IC4A scene again.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Track measures four laps to mile.

All events are scratch, i.e., none is handicap.

Firing of revolver denotes beginning of final lap in all races.

In all races there is no penalty for first false start, but competitor is disqualified for second false start.

In hurdle race competitor is not disqualified for knocking down hurdles.

In each event 15 points are scored: 5 for first place, 4 for second, 3 for third, 2 for fourth, 1 for fifth (for score sheet, turn to page 48).

Each college is limited in actual competitors to one team in One-Mile Relay, two representatives in One-Mile and Two-Mile Runs, and five representatives in all other events.

Competitors must be on time for their events. They will be permitted on field ten minutes before their events are scheduled, but will be asked to leave immediately after their competition is finished.

All rules of competitions as set forth in I.C.A.A.A. Official 1947 Handbook will be strictly enforced by Referee and other officials of the meet.

Incidentally, Moon also won the broad jump, tied for first in the pole vault and took second in the high jump, his specialty.

It made quite a story, even though Mondschein had written it, details different, result the same, many times before.

And now this gallant competitor bows out. It is indeed the dark of the moon when the IC4A loses such as Moon Mondschein.

tendon. Reggie Pearman, of N.Y.U., won the 440, then failed to get anything in the 880 in which he was defending champion. And it wasn't that he was tired, for he returned to the track for a third chore and anchored the Violet to second place in the mile relay.

Handicapping a track meet can be good, clean fun.

However, some take the form chart too seriously. One runner a few years ago wasn't picked to score in the IC4A championships. He hadn't done anything that season to commend himself as a scorer. Yet he told his coach: "I'll win the race just to show that so-and-so." He did, too. Another year, a runner picked for second won the IC4A 600, and, without drawing a deep breath, ran upstairs to the Madison Square Garden pressbox to taunt the hapless handicapper.

In 1928, Cornell, picked for one point, won the indoor Intercollegiates with 21. The handicapper's only excuse, if any, was that Cornell athletes had been kept under cover by Jack Moakley, not by design but merely because Cornell had no earlier competition that year to tip off the misguided handicapper.

Fortunately, amateur track handicappers don't make a living from picking winners. You could die broke.
