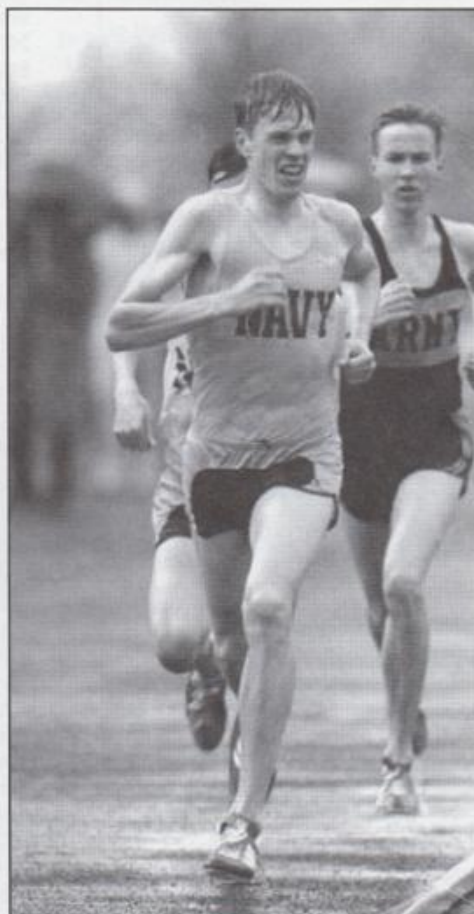

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EASTERN COLLEGE ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

The Nation's Largest Athletic Conference

65 Years of Tradition, Diversity and Service

Since its foundation 65 years ago, the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) has emerged as the nation's largest athletic conference. The ECAC has grown significantly from its charter membership of 58 to 315 member schools in Divisions I, II and III, ranging in location from Maine to North Carolina. During the 2002-03 academic year, the ECAC will host 113 championships in 35 men's and women's sports for over 5,800 varsity teams and 121,200 male and female student-athletes.

HISTORY - The ECAC was founded as the Central Office for Eastern Intercollegiate Athletics in 1938. In 1983, one of the most significant events in ECAC history occurred as the Eastern Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (EAIAW) was consolidated into the ECAC. With the addition of women's sports, the ECAC doubled its number of championships and greatly increased its membership.

Through the years the ECAC has been a leader both regionally, and nationally. Comprising more than 32 percent of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) membership, the conference plays an active role in national collegiate athletics policy and legislation. The conference continues to address many of the same issues affecting college athletics in the past while striving to be an industry leader in the 21st century.

LEADERSHIP - Inaugural commissioner Asa S. Bushnell molded the organization from its formation in 1938 to his retirement in 1970. George Schiebler succeeded Bushnell as commissioner from 1970-72, followed by Robert M. "Scotty" Whitelaw (1972-1989) and Clayton Chapman (1989-98). Current commissioner Phil Buttafuoco assumed chief administrator duties on July 1, 1998. Under Buttafuoco's leadership, the ECAC is committed to becoming the nation's leader in conference services and to setting the standard by which all others are measured.

LOCATION - The ECAC's headquarters, the Asa S. Bushnell Center, is located in Centerville, Massachusetts on Cape Cod. The picturesque Cape is the site of the annual fall convention and honors dinner as more than 300 athletic administrators attend membership committee meetings, professional seminars, and tournament and affiliate meetings. The remainder of the year, the Bushnell Center is the hub of daily activities focused on championships, officiating, public relations and recognition awards, legislative services, sponsorship, special events and television productions.

CHAMPIONSHIPS - The ECAC administers 113 preseason and post-season events, including the ECAC Collegiate Rowing Series, men's IC4A cross country and track and field, IFA fencing, EIWA and men's EIGL championships. From 1997 to 2001, the ECAC sponsored conference championships in "endangered" (men's gymnastics, men's water polo) and "emerging" (women's synchronized swimming, women's water polo) sports with funding from the USOC as well as men's wrestling and men's and women's fencing.

OFFICIATING - The ECAC assigns officials in 15 sports in Divisions I, II and III, including baseball, men's and women's basketball, fencing, field hockey, football, men's gymnastics, men's and women's ice hockey, men's and women's lacrosse, men's and women's soccer, softball and wrestling. In addition, the ECAC officiating bureaus provide clinics and workshops, improving the level of officiating and attracting the most qualified collegiate officials. The bureaus assign for both conference and NCAA championships and totaled over 40,048 assignments for over 5,100 officials last year.

PUBLIC RELATIONS/RECOGNITION AWARDS The ECAC publicizes the achievements of its member institution's student-athletes through weekly and postseason awards. Over 700 student-athletes are

honored in the fall, 1,300 in the winter and 400 during the spring through the player of the week program. Annually, the publicity bureau recognizes more than 3,300 student-athletes. The recognition awards program honors student-athletes, administrators and officials at the fall convention.

CONVENTION and MEETINGS The business of the ECAC is conducted at the annual Fall Convention as well as meetings held each spring and summer, providing the membership opportunities to discuss and vote on conference-wide issues and concerns.

INTERNSHIP PROGRAM The prestigious Asa S. Bushnell internship, named after the ECAC's first commissioner and established in 1976, offers students from ECAC institutions hands-on experience in all areas of operation of the nation's largest athletic conference. Former interns proudly represent the ECAC in all fields of the sports industry as directors of athletics, commissioners, broadcasting executives, professional franchise front-office positions, sports information directors and coaches.

LEGISLATIVE SERVICES The ECAC maintains a legislative and compliance service to assist the membership with the application of NCAA and ECAC regulations. The conference sponsors workshops and seminars, processes hardship waivers and facilitates the Collegiate Commissioners Association National Letter of Intent program.

SPONSORSHIPS - The ECAC actively pursues the development of sponsorships that garner financial support of corporate and individual entities. Through sponsorship, the ECAC enhances championship events for participants while supplementing associated event operation expenses. Conference sponsors may receive, but are not limited to official access to the membership, television exposure, event signage, event entitlements, tickets and hospitality, and the opportunity to promote volume incentive buying programs.

TECHNOLOGY - The conference's two Web sites feature real-time management and cutting-edge technology. The nation's leading online officiating system site is a password-protected extranet that allows for real-time access to its membership and officials as changes occur to their schedules. The Conference's main Web site is managed by a custom developed auto-content management system, giving the staff the ability to release conference news as it happens. The site also offers interactive polls and features for the fans. The ECAC is also on the forefront of other Web-based technology including creating a bid-generation Web site for membership travel needs as well as an officials' payment service.

TELEVISION - ECAC Productions coordinates with institutions, television vendors and broadcast partners to produce and obtain clearances of quality sports programming to promote the conference and its members. Televised sports events include football, men's gymnastics, men's and women's ice hockey and wrestling. These events are aired through partnerships with regional sports networks including the New England Sports Network (NESN), the Yankee Entertainment Sports Network (YES) and Leafs TV.

SPECIAL EVENTS - The ECAC hosts events such as the Eastern College Football Awards Banquet, the ECAC Division I Women's Soccer Classic on Cape Cod, three conventions and a trade show. The ECAC also hosted the NCAA Division II Indoor Track and Field Championships at the Reggie Lewis Center and the NCAA Division III Baseball Regional in Harwich, Massachusetts in 2002. In 2001, the ECAC hosted four NCAA championships including the Frozen Four, the Division III Baseball Regional, the Division I Swimming and Diving Championships and the Division II Indoor Track and Field Championships.

The 2003 IC4A ECAC Outdoor Track and Field Championships Program is dedicated to the memory of Commander William "Willie" C. McCool, U.S. Navy.

McCool, 41, was a former test pilot. He served as pilot for STS-107. He received a bachelor of science in applied science from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1983, a master of science in computer science from the University of Maryland in 1985, and a master of science in aeronautical engineering from the U.S. Naval Postgraduate School in 1992. McCool, as a member of the Blue Team, worked with the various experiments including: European Space Agency (ESA) Advanced Respiratory Monitoring System (ARMS); ESA Biopack (eight experiments); Mediterranean Israeli Dust Experiment (MEIDEX); and the Physiology and Biochemistry Team (PhAB4) suite of experiments, which included Calcium Kinetics, Latent Virus Shedding, Protein Turnover and Renal Stone Risk. He was also responsible for maneuvering Columbia as part of several experiments mounted in the shuttle's payload bay.

The Race

I ran a cross country race today; something I have not done for many, many years. It was a good day and course for a cross country race - chilly, muddy, and shrouded with the type of heavy mist-like precipitation that gets you damp, but not soaked. It was a day and setting that involuntarily invokes the playing of the theme from "Chariots of Fire" in the head of any real - or kindred spirit - distance runner. It seemed like a typical, fall cross-country-type of day, but it was neither a typical nor a fall day. It is 1 February 2003.

If anyone happened to look out from the fire station or the Navy Lodge next door and noticed the race, what he or she, in reality, saw, I suppose, was one solitary figure dressed in blue and gold...and black, wearing a blue and gold knit cap with "Navy" on it. Not a totally unusual sight, I guess, given that this solitary figure dressed in blue and gold and black was running on the Navy cross country course, which was wet, muddy, and silent.

While that may have been what the casual observer saw, it was not what I saw, heard, and felt. There were, in my mind's eye, hundreds of spectators, with many wearing blue and gold - no black - and balloons of blue and gold, as well. It was noisy, with the Pep Band charging the air with excitement, as it played and upbeat version of "Anchors Away." The race, as best it could be navigated, was run on the old Navy cross country course. The one used in the early '80s

before the course was altered a bit by new buildings. At the start I felt fresh and excited, having been inspired by just standing for a few pre-race moments beneath "The Tree" just off the starting area. There was - can you believe it - a false start, so we had to re-set and do it again. A false start in a cross country race...not a typical day or race.

Early in the race, at various key spots along the way, as I ran, I shouted out loud the key words and phrases appropriate for that particular part of the race:

"Stay together."

"It's your course; make 'um pay the price for the privilege of running on it."

"Look up; go get somebody!"

"Go Navy!"

It was there once again. The excitement, the atmosphere, the balloons (being held by Balloon Man, to help the crowd navigate to the best observation spots during various portions of the race), all the colors (predominately blue and gold), the crowd (even the Cleveland Browns were there), the noise, the course...But it wasn't the same. I do not believe I ever cried before while running a race, like I did today, when I pass the Monument and thought...Al's going to have to plant another tree now.

I was more subdued during the second half of the race, especially in the traditionally more isolated and lonelier parts of the course, I didn't shout out loud the second time up "Big Bertha" as I had done the first go-round, and the "roller coaster" was ridden with more pensive reflection about why I had come to run this race on 1 February 2003, on a cold, wet day on a muddy Navy cross country course.

I came and I ran at this time on this particular course, because there seemed no better or more appropriate place to go to honor and to mourn the tragic passing from this Life of a special man and his shipmates. Later there would be church, but for now this place was where the bond, the connection, was the strongest. I could try and explain it, but you can't just read about it, you have to feel it. You have to have some history.

I regained my spirit and composure a bit and got my head back in the race in time for the final few hundred meters. I kicked past the Navy Lodge and the fire station and through the finishing shoot, with all the blue and gold flags only I could see fluttering in the breeze. As I finished sucking in enough air to kick-start the brain again, the reality of reality hit me again. I looked over toward the Monument and the

trees of four and saw a blue and a gold balloon flying proudly in the wind. They were secured by a blue and gold string to a branch of one of the four trees. I slowly walked over and saw a note attached to the string. I read, quite simply and very eloquently: "God Bless America. Thank you, Commander McCool for your dedicated service to our Country. Go Navy Cross Country." I walked a few more yards to the Monument and the plaque that I have read dozens of times. I sat down on the wet grass and thought: Al's got one great fifth man up there now...

Willie, may you and your Shipmates rest forever more in God's loving arms; and may He bless and help your family and their.



Remembrances

Commander Willie McCool, United States Navy, was many things: devoted family man, scholar, Naval aviator, leader, distance runner, fierce - but quiet - competitor, astronaut. But what I will associate most with memories of Willie is that he was - always - kind, thoughtful and generous, particularly with his time. He had a wonderful gift in his ability to make a person feel good about themselves.

My family and I became very close to Willie during his last there years at the Naval Academy, which coincided with my tour of duty there. In addition to my teaching, Coach Cantello was kind enough to let me help out with his distance runners. I also was the Officer Representative for the cross country team, and thus, my family and I spent a lot of time with the distance runners, who were regular visitors to our house just across the street from Gate 8. After we both

left the Academy and went on with our careers in the Navy, Willie and I didn't keep in direct touch, but that wasn't really necessary to remain friends. I kept close track of him, as he sailed smoothly from one challenge to the next, ascending from one significant achievement to the next. I saw him from time to time over the ensuing years and always at the same place...on the Navy cross country course. Whenever he was near Annapolis in the fall, he would always come home...to the course, to watch Navy Cross Country. (Why that is so important to and part of the individuals who were once part of the tradition that is Coach Al Cantello's Navy Cross Country is a story for another time. But take my word it is and remains a very important part of them the rest of their lives, and I imagine, even beyond.) Each time I would run into Willie, we would talk for a few minutes and catch up on careers and family, but mostly we spoke of families. He enjoyed talking more about his boys than his personal achievements. Typical Willie McCool, always interested and considerate of others first and foremost.

When I heard the tragic news this morning, after I thought about and said a prayer for Willie and his shipmates and their families, a few personal moments replayed themselves in my mind's eye. And when they were done, I drove over to the Navy cross country course as a tribute and to mourn the loss of seven good people; but especially one.

I have a lot of memories of Willie, because, as I said, my family and I saw him a lot in his Midshipman days. My two daughters, then about 9-12 and 5-8, definitely had crushes on Willie. He knew that and always paid attention to them, taking them seriously, regardless of whatever silliness they might impose on him. When my oldest daughter, Lill, got a part as one of the street kids in a local theater group's production of "Oliver," she asked Willie to come see her. He did; on a Saturday night with his date, although I know he would have rather been a lot of other places with his date on a liberty Saturday night. Not only did he go to the play, he came over to the house afterwards for dessert and to tell Lill how great she was in her performance. Lill graduated from the Naval Academy as a member of the Class of 1993. I know Midshipman Willie McCool's positive impression and influence played a role those many years later in her decision to go to the Academy.

I have a picture of my youngest daughter, Jean-Ann, when she was 7 or 8 years old, with Willie at the wedding reception of Leo Williams, the great Navy high jumper. Jean-Ann had been sitting at the table feeling very neglected when Willie saw her and came over. He asked her to dance. When she excitedly accepted with a resounding "Yeah!" he picked her up in his arms and off they went, dancing away. Later, he let her stand on the tops of his shoes while they danced some more. I remembered that picture a few days ago and decided to find it and get it enlarged. I was going to send it to Willie when he got back and ask him to autograph it for Jean-Ann.

The final memory of Willie that flashed through my mind when I heard the news this morning involved an incident



when Willie was a Second Class Midshipman. The specific details, while interesting, are not necessary to make the point. A Lieutenant Commander (LCDR) at the Naval Academy accused Willie of directly disobeying an order and was going to write him up. Willie told me the circumstances and I went to talk to the LCDR. I was also a LCDR at the time. Whether or not Willie, in fact, had disobeyed the LCDR's order hinged on the way Willie had interpreted what the LCDR had told him to do. Willie told me what he heard and his thought process in interpreting it. When I relayed what Willie had told me to the LCDR, he said Willie was being less truthful and that he still intended to go forward with putting Willie on report. I knew Willie would not lie. I told the LCDR, as I took off my shoulder boards and put them on the table, that if he wrote up Willie I was going to attend the disciplinary hearing and ante up my shoulder boards to illustrate how much faith I had in Willie and his word. I asked him if he believed strongly enough in the merits of his accusations to also put his shoulder boards on the table. I don't know the impact, if any, I had on the LCDR, but he did not put Willie on report. In 30-plus years of Naval Service, I would like to think that from time to time I have helped out a few deserving individuals, but I take the most satisfaction from that moment. I have never again taken off my shoulder boards for anyone else.

A few days ago, I learned that one could go to the NASA web site and email Willie, who was answering questions from earth. I looked at the questions and answers already posted on the site and realized that they were all very serious scientific questions that were being asked of Willie. I'm not nearly smart enough to ask that caliber of question, so I logged off without sending an email. Then I decided what

the heck, Willie's in space, he's working hard, and he might really appreciate an easy (read that as "dumb") question about now. I went back to the NASA web site and wrote an email for Willie, which read: "Can you see Big Bertha from space? Best wishes. Go Navy Cross Country." I hit the send button, but several minutes later a message came on the screen telling me the site was currently overloaded, and that I should try again later. I never tried again later; I figured that I would just ask him when he got back. I'm sorry I didn't try again.

When I was working with the Navy cross country team, I took pictures at all of the races. After three years I had a lot of pictures, so I worked up a slide show, with accompanying music, to try to tell the story of Navy cross country. The music I used with the pictures featuring Willie was Barbara Streisand's "Space Captain." All the runners, including Willie, thought it was funny. They did not realize, nor did I, how prophetic it would prove to be.

I think I will put on an old Barbara Streisand album, look through that old box of pictures, and remember other days and other times...

Goodbye, Willie; and Thanks. See you on the course.
