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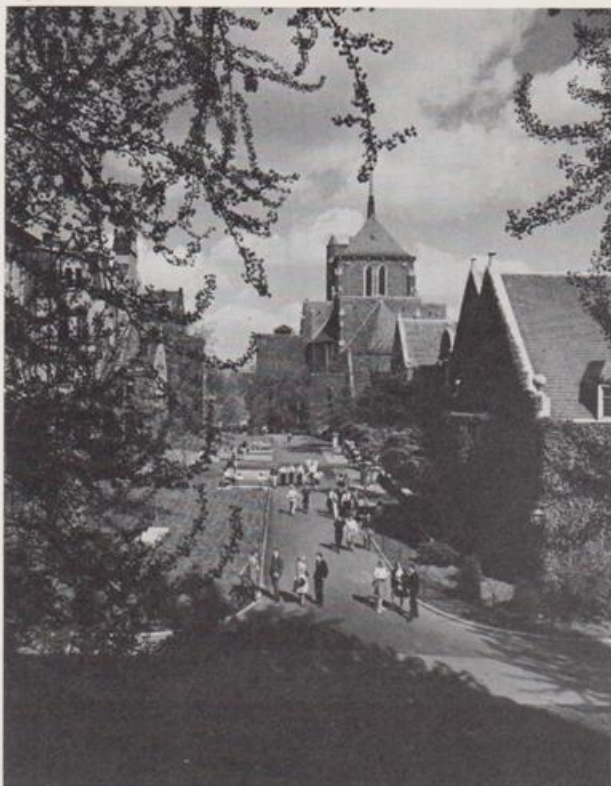

General Information

N.C.A.A. RULES OF COMPETITION WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED BY REFEREE AND OTHER OFFICIALS.

Track measures four laps to mile.

All events are scratch, i.e., none is handicap.

Firing of revolver denotes beginning of final lap in all races.

In all races there is no penalty for first false start, but competitor is disqualified for second false start. However, starter's recall no longer nullifies false start by any competitor.

In hurdle races competitor is not disqualified for knocking down hurdles.

In all relay races baton must be carried in runner's hand and must be passed to next succeeding teammate within clearly marked 20 meters zone, extending 10 meters in both directions from leg finish line.

Governing rules provide that, in races around turns, any competitor willfully jostling, running across or obstructing another competitor so as to impede his progress, shall be disqualified. If in any race competitor is disqualified for any of these reasons, Referee shall have power to order race to be rerun with disqualified competitor excluded or, in case of heat, to permit any competitors affected by act resulting in disqualification, other than disqualified competitor, to compete in subsequent round of event.

Any competitor may be disqualified if, in opinion of Referee, he has in any way been aided by coach, teammate, or anyone connected directly or indirectly with team concerned, such as, running along-side of teammate, being stationed at various points near track, or located nearby any of field events for purpose of aiding or coaching competitor after race or field event has officially been started.

Each member college is limited to following numbers of actual participants in various events in the Outdoor Championships:

One Mile Run	2*
Three Mile Run	2*
One Mile Relay	One Team
All other events	5

Nominee or qualifier who fails to compete in any running or hurdling event for which he has been nominated or has qualified will be ineligible for any further participation in meet.

In four weight events (shot, discus, javelin, and hammer), broad jump, and triple jump, each contestant shall be allowed three preliminary trials. The first six men in the standing at the completion of the trials will qualify for the final. Each finalist will then receive three additional tries.

All performances made in field event trials in one-, two-, or three-day meets shall be counted with performances in final in determining final place winners. Each competitor shall be credited with best of all his efforts.

Competitors must be on time, field contestants entering enclosure five minutes before scheduled start of their event, and track contestants entering enclosure upon completion of race next preceding theirs. As soon as their event is over, competitors will kindly leave track and infield without delay.

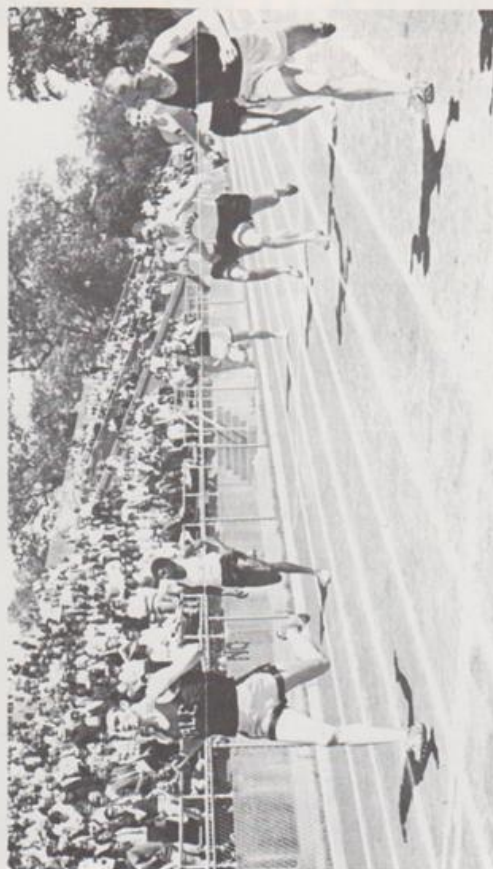
In each event 16 points are scored: 6 for first place, 4 for second, 3 for third, 2 for fourth, and 1 for fifth.

*(Plus 1) one more upon approval of Games Committee, provided all three representatives of affected college are of championship calibre).

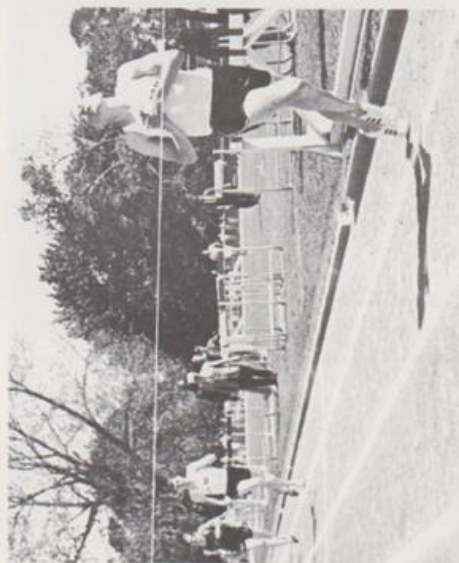

FRANKLIN FIELD REVISITED

AMONG THE HUNDREDS of athletes from 65 colleges assembled here this weekend for the 92nd annual I.C.A.A.A. championships, no one, I daresay, had started his formal schooling when the title meet was last held at Franklin Field.

In short, a generation has passed since the I.C.A.A.A. championships were last decided on Franklin Field 17 years ago.

It is a homecoming of sorts. Pennsylvania's famed stadium was the first campus site of the I.C.A.A.A. championships, which were a 29-year-old classic when it came to Franklin Field for the first time in 1904. The championships, an outgrowth of the college footraces held as a sideshow to the intercollegiate boat races at Saratoga, N. Y., had their first running at the New York Spa in 1876. For the next 27 years they were conducted on New York tracks—the Mott Haven grounds, Manhattan Field and Berkeley Oval.

Franklin Field became the more or less permanent home of the I.C.A.A.A. outdoor championships, alternating with Harvard's Soldiers' Field until 1936, except for the year (1932) when the I.C.A.A.A. made its transcontinental venture to California.

With the building of Triborough Stadium (now Downing Memorial Stadium) on Randalls Island, Franklin Field became a rarely visited site for the East's blue-ribbon varsity meet. The championships were held here in 1944, 1947 and 1951.

The prime reason for their return here is Pennsylvania's \$200,000 Tartan track, built in late 1966 and formally launched with the 1967 Penn Relays. Penn now had a modern track to serve as a showcase for the I.C.A.A.A. championships.

Some changes have taken place in the I.C.A.A.A. championships since their last visit in 1951. The 16-event program is now a 19-event program. The 440 hurdles replaced the 220 low hurdles in line with the international program; the two-mile has become a three-mile; the triple jump and steeplechase were added. This year, for the first time, a 440-yard relay is on the program.

Other firsts to be noted here: Qualifying standards are in force for the first time to control the size of the entry; semi-finals are scheduled in the 880; trial heats are being run in the mile; all field events (not only the high jump and pole vault) will start and finish the same day, and four of them (long jump, discus, javelin and hammer) will be decided the first day. This is the first time any finals will be decided on the first day, hitherto given over to trials.

These are the first I.C.A.A.A. championships to be decided on an all-weather composition track. The benefit to the athletes is obvious. Come rain or high water, the track will provide sure footing for the runners and will be the same from first heat to curtain-closing finale.

Barring strong winds, the top quality performances posted by I.C.A.A.A. competitors this spring should bring a wholesale revision of the I.C.A.A.A. record-book.

Only two of the championship records which stood at the end of the 1951 meet on Franklin Field are still alive. One of them—the oldest record in the I.C.A.A.A. book—is almost certain to be eclipsed. The vintage mark is 14.1 seconds in the 120-yard high hurdles, and you can appreciate the speed of Ed Dugger of Tufts who set the record in 1941. Three have tied it—Duke's Joel Shankle in 1955, Boston U's Dave Hemery in 1966 and Villanova's Erv Hall last year. Hall, a 13.5 man, is ticketed to erase the Dugger figures, though Duke's Jeff Howser (13.7) and Hemery (13.9) have dipped under 14.1 in earlier meets this spring.

The other vintage record, established the last time the I.C.A.A.A. meet was staged here, is 25 feet 9¾ inches, held by Meredith (Flash) Gour-dine, of Cornell, who made the leap of his life to beat Seton Hall's Andy Stanfield in a memorable duel as they topped a 20-year-old record by half a foot. Gour-dine's record may last as long, even though Manhattan's Del Benjamin, hero of last-jump triumphs as the I.C.A.A.A. indoor and outdoor champion, posted a best-of-his-life 25-7½ on this runway a month ago in the Penn Relays.

The aforementioned changes in the I.C.A.A.A. program indubitably were effected for the benefit of the athletes. But something has been taken from the meet, too, by the altered time schedule, the mile heats and 880 semi-finals. As a result, Villanova's Dave Patrick, for one, can forget about winning the mile and 880—heretofore a double assignment that was a traditional challenge for the superior miler.

Only eight men in the 91 years of the I.C.A.A.A. successfully achieved the mile-880 double—a total of 11 times. J. F. Cregan of Princeton was the first in 1898, then Penn's Guy Haskins in 1907. Cornell's John Paul Jones, the Jim Ryun of his day, did it twice, though needing a dead heat in the mile (the only dead heat in I.C.A.A.A. history) in 1912 when he was a junior. Twice he set a world mile record in this meet—4:15½ in 1911, 4:14½ in 1913, when he lost the 880 to Yale's G. E. Brown.

PATRICK HAS TRADITION GOING FOR HIM, TOO

ARMED WITH SOUND LIMBS, total dedication and long odds, the opposition tries to chase down Dave Patrick for the sixth and final time in the I.C.A.A.A. mile Saturday on Pennsylvania's drip-dry running track. Tradition, that haunting adversary, weighs heavily against their cause.

Patrick's hold on I.C.A.A.A. mile titles is remarkable enough so as to create amazement if he loses this one. The Villanova Golden Boy has run in five previous mile races and won five.

Last March, Patrick unleashed another of his blazing finishes to win the I.C.A.A.A. indoor mile in an eased-up 4:06.1 by 12 yards from Frank Murphy, his Dublin-born teammate and Villanova's most publicized girl-watcher. It was Patrick's third indoor bauble.

Murphy, along with Englishman Jim Baker, of Harvard; Jack Fath, of Fordham; Brian Kivlan, of Manhattan; Byron Dyce, of N.Y.U., and Royce Shaw, also of Harvard, are entered against Patrick in this year's outdoor mile. A certainty is that the I.C.A.A.A. record of 4:04.9, held by Patrick, will be wiped out.

"Most likely this will be the toughest mile field I've ever faced in the ICs," claims Patrick. "Harvard has strength in there and Murphy is in great shape. And then there's Fath, too."

Patrick flatly declares that Murphy, who ran a 4:01.8 outdoor mile last summer in Ireland, will be his strongest rival. The pair dueled in a triangular meet this season and Patrick won, 4:02.2 to Murphy's 4:03.3. Maybe it proved something and maybe not. Murphy earlier that week had ripped off fifteen quarter-miles one day and forty 220-yard sprints the next and turned up leg-weary when it came time to kick home.

"I'm in shape to run a sub-four-minute mile," Murphy insists. "But I didn't rest for that meet. I was plain tired at the end. But I'm in shape to go under four."

Oddly enough, Patrick has yet to run under four minutes outdoors. He tossed a 3:59.3 indoor mile at his rivals two seasons ago and has clocked 3:58.9 on a relay leg. As a sophomore, he was good enough to run 4:02.1 and win the NCAA outdoor title.

Actually, Patrick's most memorable moments have come when he stepped down to the 880, a distance at which he holds the world indoor record of 1:48.9.

"I like the mile better," Patrick says. "The half rates a close second. You can run the 880 and win on one quality—speed. But running top miles takes both stamina and speed, more than one quality. And you can't overlook the glamour of the event, either."

Patrick views his competition with Murphy as a kind of phantom rivalry. "We know the other's feelings and we know the kind of shape we're in,"

Patrick says. "We're not really racing against each other. It's hard to fire yourself up for competition of this kind. Murphy is in good shape. I think he's gotten more serious about it."

However, Patrick is quick to point out that day-in, day-out track can be pure punishment. "Like myself, I look to diversifying my life," he says. "I try to look at track as something not strenuous and hard. I try to enjoy it when I can."

Actually, Patrick has been worn to a frazzle in just about every meet of his Villanova career which ends this year. As a junior in the I.C.A.A.A. indoor meet, he qualified for the mile with a 4:11.9 effort, then got the Wildcats into the two-mile relay final with a 1:53.8 anchor half in the prelims. Later the same night, Patrick kicked from 400 yards out to win the mile final in 4:09.4, strolling the final 25 yards, and tacked on a 1:51.7 anchor half that was useless against a 35-yard lead Manhattan had built up on the first three legs.

It is clearly Patrick's unselfish doubling and tripling in relays that has won him more acclaim than any individual titles. But another I.C.A.A.A. mile medal would perhaps bring Patrick more satisfaction than any other feat accomplished by his sturdy legs.

"I don't think I'm going to double in this year's ICs," Patrick notes. "We have such good half-milers it won't be necessary. And they have added trials in the mile and semi-finals in the 880. The record in the mile? It's gone, believe me it's gone in this meet."

Murphy's credentials going into the meet include an amazing 2:53 three-quarter leg on Villanova's distance medley team (the equivalent of a 3:58 mile). Baker, a senior from Northfleet, England, ran 4:05.9 indoors and 4:02.2 outdoors this year. Fath has posted a 4:04.1 outdoors and continued bugging Patrick with his outspoken manner.

"He's a little loquacious," Patrick shrugs. "He likes to remind me that he beat me twice last year in relays when I was sick. But he hasn't beaten me in a race."

Shaw's best this spring has been 4:04.2, but the powerful runner has done 4:02.8 despite a wild hair-do that flutters in the breeze when he strides.

Should Patrick bolt to another I.C.A.A.A. mile triumph, he will become the first runner since Les MacMitchell, New York University's noted miler, to win six indoor-outdoor titles. MacMitchell reeled off six mile victories during 1940-42. Villanova's fabled Ron Delany never lost an I.C.A.A.A. mile either, but he competed in only four races at that distance, switching to double wins in the 1000 and two-mile indoors in his junior and senior years.

Of Patrick's rivals, Shaw, Kivlan and Murphy are the lucky ones. They return next year for further I.C.A.A.A. mile competition. Fath and Baker, as well as Patrick, are out after this mile.

VILLANOVA'S GREATEST RUNNING TEAM

LOP THEM ALL TOGETHER—the sprinters, hurdlers, distance men and relay runners—and Jumbo Elliott is moved to call his present Villanovans “My greatest running team of all time.”

It's an incredible statement when you consider the Olympians who have gone before them—Ron Delany, Don Bragg, Paul Drayton, Phil Reavis, Charlie Jenkins, and others.

But the Villanova track story is an incredible one to begin with—one that has brought more world wide publicity to that fine institution than all other sports there combined. But it wasn't always this way.

Villanova did not become a member of the Intercollegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America until 1941. And even for years after they had joined, the pickings were slim. The Mainliners would score a point or two, maybe six or seven, but that's all.

Yes, Elliott was the coach, then, too. “We knew what poverty was,” remarked Jumbo.

Things started picking up, until in 1956 Villanova came within $2\frac{1}{2}$ points of winning the outdoor championship from Manhattan.

“We were a hungry team then,” recalled Elliott. “We were getting beat by a point or two and we couldn't win the team championship. I remember an indoor meet when our mile relay team was disqualified and we lost the meet to Yale by a half-point. That was the most disheartening thing that ever happened to us.

“Other times we were one man shy on the relay team, or we had to double up several boys in hopes of getting enough points, just asking them to do the impossible. It goes to show, you have to finish second a long time before you get on top.”

It wasn't until 16 years after Villanova joined the I.C.A.A.A. that the Wildcats cracked on top and won their first championship in 1957. Delany doubled in the mile (4:08.4) and the half-mile (1:49.5) to help pile up 48 points, the biggest haul up to that time.

Since then, the Cats have won eight of eleven championships outdoors and have dominated the nation's oldest track meet.

Jumbo still harks back to his stars of the past, and despite the collective greatness of the current running machine, he singles out many of his former athletes as his best—such as Delany in the mile, Jenkins the 440, Frank Budd and Drayton in the 100 and 220, Reavis in the high jump and Bragg the pole vault.

“Delany was my best miler of all time, without a doubt,” said Jumbo of his Irish import. “His career was remarkable through the 40-odd races he won in a row indoors to the Olympic 1500 meters championship in 1956.”

“Jenkins won the 400 meters in 1956,” he went on, “but the race I'll never forget occurred in a driving rain at Quantico, Va. He ran through four inches of water—you couldn't even see the track—in :47.5.”

Bragg is only third on the all-time list of pole vaulters at Villanova. Rolando Cruz ($16-4\frac{1}{2}$) and Vince Bizzarro ($16-7\frac{3}{4}$) have both gone higher. “But,” said Jumbo, “I feel that Bragg's performance on the steel pole put him in a class by himself.”

Drayton was the National AAU 220 champion. Budd raced to a clocking of :09.2 in the 100-yard dash one damp afternoon in New York and became the world's fastest human.

“As Jenkins brought out, they were No. 1 and No. 2 in the country, so you couldn't beat that,” said Elliott.

Reavis, who scaled 6 feet, $10\frac{3}{4}$ inches, stands alone among the Villanova high jumpers.

Earl Horner, who won an NCAA championship in the furlong; half-milers Noel Carroll and Tommy Sullivan and the present quarter-mile phenom Larry James have created a lot of excitement for racing fans.

James stunned the track world with his :43.9 relay quarter-mile in the Penn Relays here earlier this spring. Only Tommie Smith's :43.8 for a 400 meter split (a projected 44.1 for 440 yards) approaches that unofficial world mark.

But James, who gives promise of exceeding Jenkins and any other quarter-miler in history, still has to make it over the long run. He's only a sophomore.

And what about Villanova's other present athletes like middle distance star Dave Patrick, 120-yard hurdler Erv Hall, two-miler Dick Buerkle, 440-yard intermediate hurdler Harry Nichter and javelin thrower Jim shillow.

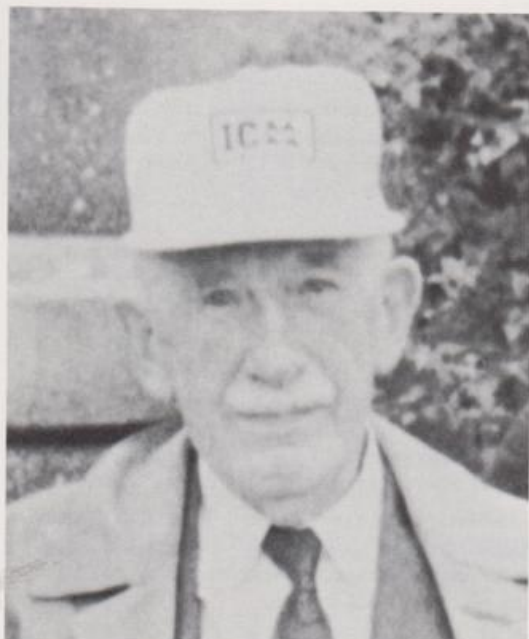
Jumbo considers them all the best at their “trade.”

“Carroll ran some good half mile races,” said Elliott, “and he ran some that were not so good. So Patrick has to be my best half-miler. He holds the world indoor record (1:48.9).”

Pat Traynor and Vic Zwolak were strong two-

JAMES A. TAYLOR OF THE I.C.A.A.A.A.



THE INTERCOLLEGIATE ASSOCIATION of Amateur Athletes of America, formed by undergraduates of twelve Eastern colleges in 1875 and sponsor of its first outdoor championships in 1876 at Saratoga, N. Y., is the oldest organization in track and field in this country and the oldest, in any sport, in the colleges.

Organized by undergraduates and administered, for the first 62 years of its existence, by undergraduates with the advice and counsel of dedicated alumni, the I.C.A.A.A.A. has had a tremendous influence in the development of track and field. Through its members and its Advisory Committee, this influence has extended far beyond the campus scope of the I.C.A.A.A.A.—to the Amateur Athletic Union, the National Collegiate A.A., the Public Schools Athletic League of New York, the United States Olympic Committee and to the Olympic Games.

Obviously, hundreds of men have been involved in the history of a 92-year-old organization. One who had a most intimate part in the development and operation of the I.C.A.A.A.A. was James A. Taylor, for Jim Taylor was the man who ran the office of the organization, managed its indoor and outdoor and cross-country championships, edited its programs, checked eligibility, compiled its souvenir volumes and kept its affairs in order for a period of 15 years—from 1923 to 1937.

Jim Taylor, a man of firm convictions on amateurism, with a love of track, a gentleman of the old school—courteous, self-effacing and soft-spoken—was 86 years old when he died on May 4 at his home in Glen Ridge, N. J.

Born in New York, Jim Taylor was a Columbia graduate of the Class of 1905, a graduate of its Law

School in 1907. He was a track man in college, captained the Light Blue and ran the middle distances. He never scored in the I.C.A.A.A.A. championships—other Taylors did in each of his varsity years—but the month he was graduated from Columbia he ran a leg on the Irish-American A.C. two-mile relay that posted a world record of 7:54.8 on Travers Island's fifth-of-a-mile-clay track.

He retained a lifelong interest in the sport and his trim figure attested to his devotion to physical fitness. He was an expert. I never doubted it from the night at the West 168th Street State Armory in 1928 when the I.C.A.A.A.A. held its seventh annual indoor meet. As a special added attraction Lloyd Hahn of the Boston A.A., the premier half-miler and miler of his day, set out to break the half-mile record.

Sitting at trackside, Jim Taylor closed his eyes, listened intently and said, "Hahn is running a world-record pace; I can tell by the beat of his steps on the boards."

You couldn't challenge it as expert testimony. Hahn's 1:51.4 clocking was the fastest 880 ever run, indoors or out, at that time.

When the I.C.A.A.A.A. decided to add an indoor meet in 1922 to its outdoor meet and cross-country run, with New York as a permanent base for the indoor meet, Gustavus Town Kirby, chairman of the Advisory Committee from 1897 to 1937, and his colleagues decided the organization needed a year-round administrator.

Taylor accepted the assignment and was the only man who ever had the job, cooperating behind the scenes with the parade of undergraduate officers who changed year after year.

Taylor's I.C.A.A.A.A. office was the first floor of a brownstone on 56th Street just east of Madison Avenue. That the I.C.A.A.A.A. history and files and records are in such impeccable condition today is a tribute to his stewardship as the man who made undergraduate control of the I.C.A.A.A.A. effective. During his management, the I.C.A.A.A.A. was the most prestigious college track meet in the country. Though it never conceived itself as a "national" body, the I.C.A.A.A.A. attracted Southern California, California, Stanford and U.C.L.A. as members in Taylor's time.

Taylor's role as the I.C.A.A.A.A. executive administrator ended in 1937 when the colleges decided to coordinate all sports under a Central Office for Eastern Intercollegiate Athletics (later evolving into the Eastern College Athletic Conference). Jim Taylor continued to serve as an official at I.C.A.A.A.A. meets.

The I.C.A.A.A.A. retains much of its independence as the country's largest regional track group—and all of its traditions—thanks to the years Jim Taylor gave to the organization. He had joined the Empire Ornamental Glass Company of New York after his I.C.A.A.A.A. tenure, and was its president when he retired in 1966.

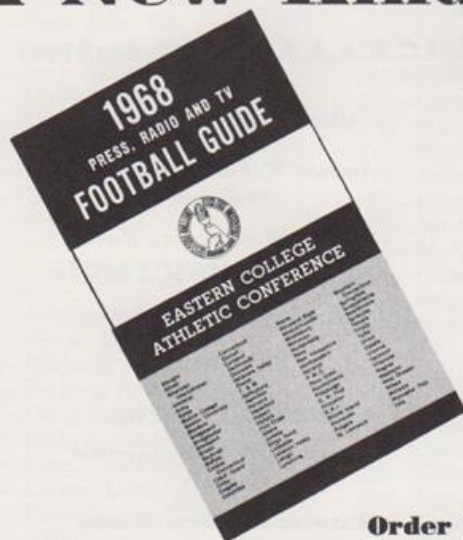

Victors in 1963 and 1964, outdoors, and 1964, 1965 and 1967 indoors the talented Wildcats dethroned Maryland after the Terrapins had held the outdoor crown for two successive outdoor seasons, 1965 and 1966.

Coach James "Jumbo" Elliott's squad holds three legs on the current I.C.A.A.A.A. outdoor cup. Cup No. 6 was retired by the Wildcats in 1962. Villanova had won previously in 1957, 1958, 1960, and 1961.

The cup had been in competition from 1933. Of five former cups, two were won by Harvard, and one each by Yale, Cornell and Southern California.

Princeton's Bill Bonthron tried the double twice and brought it off—at metric distances in 1933-34. Villanova's Ron Delany tried it three times and won the double twice after losing the half to Pitt's Arnie Sowell in his sophomore year. Others in this special I.C.A.A.A.A. Hall of Fame are NYU's Leslie Mac-Mitchell (1941), Dartmouth's Don Burnham (1944) and Penn State's Ed Moran (1959).

Moran may go down in I.C.A.A.A.A. annals as the last to achieve the mile-880 double. Patrick had his shot as a sophomore. He won the mile, but ran third to Georgetown's Ricardo Urbina and Seton Hall's Herb Germann in the 880.

Patrick might have done it last year—if he had been 100 per cent. But bad tonsils (subsequently excised) and recurrent ailments set him back. He was strong enough to set an I.C.A.A.A.A. mile record of 4:04.9, but Jumbo Jim Elliott didn't ask him to run the 880.

Now, with the schedule change, Patrick can't even try it. Friday's schedule calls for 880 heats at 4:15, mile heats at 5:15 (a reasonable rest period) but 880 semi-finals at 5:30 preclude the double. No one can run a mile and an 880 within 15 minutes—not in a championship meet of this caliber. Saturday's schedule, as far as the mile and 880 are concerned, provides the same 70-minute gap between them—the mile at 2:50, the 880 at 4 p.m., but it's Friday's schedule which ends, as long as this timetable prevails, this double assignment.

For the spectator, though, this change can be beneficial. Limited to one race, Patrick surely will be thinking of a mile starting with the "3". When Patrick ran 4:02.2 on his own cinder track, Elliott noted: "This isn't a Four-Minute track; we'll try again on the Tartan track."

There'll be a niche in I.C.A.A.A.A. history for Patrick if he wins his sixth straight I.C.A.A.A.A. mile (indoors and out) against the opposition of such as Fordham's Jack Fath, Harvard's Jim Baker and others. No one except MacMitchell (1940-41-42) ever swept all the I.C.A.A.A.A. miles in three varsity years. Delany did not try; he ran other races indoors.

One last thought on the homecoming to Franklin Field: Up to 1951, Villanova had won only one I.C.A.A.A.A. title—George Guida taking the 440 in 1947 at Franklin Field.

In 1951, the Wildcats had three champions—Fred Dwyer in the mile, John Joe Barry in the two-mile and Cummin Clancy in the discus. It opened the I.C.A.A.A.A. floodgates for Elliott's unending parade of winners—now totalling 56½, exclusive of the eight team titles won in the last 11 years.

For Villanova, you might say, it all started here at Franklin Field. The end is not in sight.

milers at Villanova but in one swoop, Buerkle this spring came out of nowhere to run the fastest time for that distance in Wildcat history (8:46.5).

Jumbo, as he approaches James' stunning beginning including a world indoor record :47.0, refuses to go overboard on Buerkle. Sometimes he has difficulty curbing his enthusiasm.

"Anybody can flash a good two-mile," he said. "Coming back week after week is the mark of a great runner. But I must say Buerkle has an economical stride as far as distance runners go, and this is only the first year he ran."

"He came to us as a 4:39.6 miler out of Rochester. I haven't had anybody in 20 years who has made such remarkable progress. He has two more years of competition, but because of his good scholastic record he may graduate sooner."

Elliott, who cannot be under-estimated for his craftiness, is more likely to give his seniors full praise, seniors like Hall who has run 13.6 and who he considers "in a class by himself." Nichter, who he calls "the best I've ever had, He's a great boy," and Shillow, who flung the spear over 240 feet for a Villanova record this spring.

These are the boys—plus Patrick, James, Buerkle, middle distance runners Frank Murphy, Ian Hamilton, Tom Donnelly and Charlie Messenger, quarter-milers Hardge Davis and Ken Prince, Bizzarro and half-milers Andy O'Reilly and Craig Nation—who Elliott will count on to haul in Villanova's ninth IC4-A outdoor title in the last 12 years this weekend.
