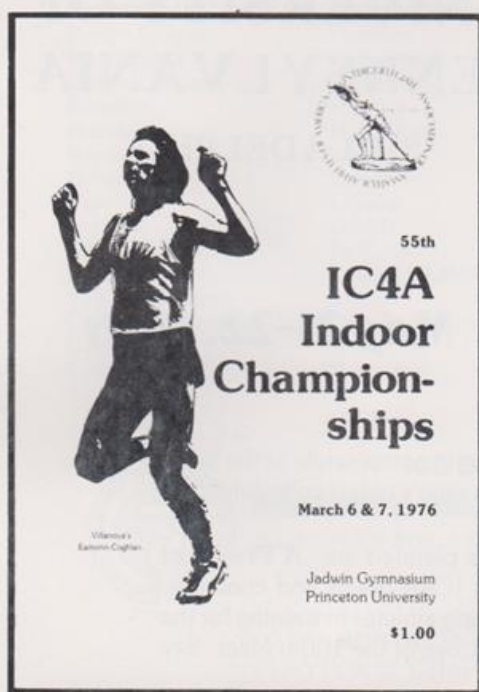

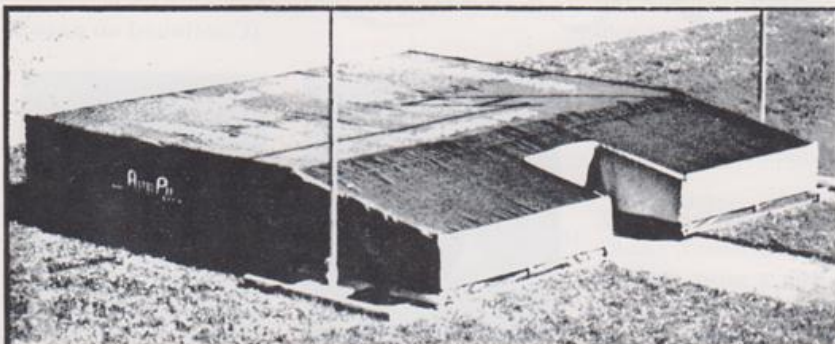

VILLANOVA GUNNING FOR ANOTHER TITLE

There really is no mystique connected with Villanova University's success story in the IC4A championship track meets.

Total dedication is the reason the Wildcats have walked away with 31 championship trophies, 13 of them for indoor team titles, since Olympian Gold Medal winners Ron Delaney and Charlie Jenkins lit the spark in 1957.

James Francis "Jumbo" Elliott, Villanova's head coach since 1935, builds his teams around the ICs and lets things such as world records, NCAA championships and Olympic competition fall in accordingly.

"That week before the ICs is unreal," former Villanova captain Andy O'Reilly explained a few years ago. "Jumbo turns into a tiger. (Assistant coach) Jack Pyrah turns into a tiger, and everybody jumps.

"Everybody knows this is the big one, and, somehow, everybody comes through. I think we work a little harder for it than anybody else."

Elliott discovered back in '57 that he could win it all with a handful of blue-chip performers giving 100 percent plus and he has used that formula ever since.

Running for gold has given Villanova an incredible 223 IC4A champions, 117 indoor, 102 outdoor and 4 in cross-country.

Impossible double assignments, dramatic upsets and championships became synonymous with Villanova in IC4A competition.

Many times Villanova athletes gathered for the team championship picture while the more talented favorites gathered their equipment and headed for home an also-ran.

Two years ago, the Wildcats shocked Navy, Seton Hall and Manhattan. This weekend, Elliott's gang will try to do it again with a super stable of race horses plus one.

The addition is Nate Cooper, a freshman from Athens, Ga., who could give Villanova its first triple jump points in memory. Cooper shattered the University TJ record with a 50-8 effort in his very first meet and adds an extra dimension to the Wildcat attack.

Eamonn Coghlan, the current Irish contribution to the Villanova story, will get the crucial double assignment. The soft speaking senior from Dublin, the IC4A and NCAA mile champion last spring, will bypass his specialty in an effort to add team points.

"It's a Villanova tradition," said Coghlan, who ran a 3:53.3 in that King Games super mile last June. "I'll be running the two-mile and coming back to anchor the distance medley."

Coghlan already has earned five IC4A gold medals and if he can make it seven, Villanova would be the team to watch here this weekend. Senior Kevin McCarey, the IC4A six-mile champion, will try to give the Wildcats a 1-2 finish in the two-mile.

VILLANOVA GUNNING (Continued)

With Coghlan vacating the mile, the honor of maintaining Villanova's tradition in the glamour event falls to junior Phil "Tiny" Kane.

Tiny has been the big surprise on the Main Line campus this winter. He already has helped Villanova set a pair of world relay records, running a 4:03.3 anchor leg on the four-mile unit and a 2:56.7 three-quarters for the distance relay team.

The middle distance chores are in good hands with freshman sensation Don Paige and Mark Belger, who was the frosh flash a year ago.

Paige made his debut in the Philadelphia Classic by defeating internationalist Tom McLean and Mark Robinson with a 1:51.5 in the 880, then overtaking Keith Francis on the anchor leg of the two-mile relay with a 1:49.7 split.

The Baldwinsville, N.Y. speedster turned in the fastest leg, 4:01.6, on the world record four-mile relay before being sidelined with tendinitis of his ankle.

Belger, slowed by a virus in both the indoor and outdoor ICs, missed some early season competition with a muscle pull but has run well recently.

Last summer he won the King Games 800 meter in 1:47.1, the National AAU junior 800 in 1:47.5 and beat the Russians in the junior international match. He'd like to add an IC4A gold medal to his list.

Canadian Glenn Bogue, a 440 finalist outdoors; Greg Eckman, the National AAU junior champ in the 440 IH in '74; and Ed Takacs, the outdoor 880 champion, are headed for heavy duty in the relays.

Senior Jim Rhein, junior George Mackay, getting a lot of duty in the big relays recently, and freshman sprinter Tim Dale, an All-South Jersey basketball star, also will work the relays.

Coach Elliott and his Villanovans should add to their gold medal total before the championship is decided Sunday afternoon.

INDOOR TO OUTDOOR

If this program you are reading at the 55th I.C.A.A.A.A. Indoor Championships were a TV production, then this article would be a house commercial -- a pitch for the I.C.A.A.A.A. outdoor track championships scheduled at Pennsylvania's Franklin Field on Friday and Saturday, May 21-22, following the I.C.A.A.A.A. decathlon which will be held on the two preceding days, May 19-20, at the same site.

Everyone knows that this is the Bicentennial Year. Everyone who follows I.C.A.A.A.A. track should know that this is the Centennial Year of the Intercollegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America. The country's oldest track organization was founded in 1876 with ten colleges as charter members, and the first formal championships were held on July 20, 1876, at Saratoga Springs, N.Y. Ergo, we have a Centennial Year on two counts. It is 100 years since the first meet, and the outdoor championships in May will be the 100th championships as well because the I.C.A.A.A.A. skipped one, canceling the 1917 meet which was scheduled soon after the U.S. entry into World War I.

A Centennial Year and the 100th Outdoor Championships on an historic site certainly call for a celebration. Consider this house commercial, then, as a call to all I.C.A.A.A.A. alumni to celebrate in the meet which has been, and is, variously known to lodge brothers as THE INTERCOLLEGIATES, the I.C.4-A. or simply as the IC's.

Robert M. (Scotty) Whitelaw, the Commissioner of the Eastern College Athletic Conference (with which the I.C.A.A.A.A. is now affiliated) has set in motion plans for the Centennial commemoration. In the planning stage or completed are the following projects:

1. The I.C.A.A.A.A. Record Book, last edition published in 1970, will be issued in a new edition and available at Franklin Field. It will not only include all the winners and their performances of all the outdoor events, 1876 to 1975, but also all the winners in the Indoor Championships, 1922 to 1976, and Cross-country, 1908 to 1975.

The Record Book will also include a definitive history of the I.C.A.A.A.A. by Professor John Lucas, of Penn State University, sports historian and demon researcher, who coached track at Boston University and Penn State.

2. The Coaches and Officials Dinner on Friday, May 21, at Hill Hall on the Pennsylvania campus will have as special guests former I.C.A.A.A.A. coaches and athletes who have won Olympic Gold Medals or served as Olympic coaches.

3. A pre-meet parade on the field on Saturday, May 22, by all former I.C.A.A.A.A. participants -- athletes and coaches -- attending the championships. During the final session, too, all former I.C.A.A.A.A. athletes and coaches who won Olympic Gold Medals or served as Olympic coaches would be honored, since this is an Olympic Year as well as the I.C.A.A.A.A. Centennial. Marshal of the parade is Jack Saint Clair, Temple University coach. All 102 current member colleges and also former members of the I.C.A.A.A.A. are requested to send representatives to attend the dinner and join in the parade.

4. Invitation races for I.C.A.A.A.A. Alumni. With so many former I.C.A.A.A.A. athletes in training for the Olympic Games, a special 1500 me-

Seton Hall Looking for 2nd Straight IC4A Crown

DEFENDING CHAMPS "UPSET-MINDED"

Seton Hall reigns as defending champion going into this 55th annual IC4A Indoor Championships but the crown rests uneasy. Pirates' coach John Moon isn't at all sure his talented array of sprinters, hurdlers and middle distance runners can hold off the stable of powerful distance runners out of Villanova.

Outsiders might figure Moon is worrying needlessly. After all Seton Hall also won the outdoor IC4A title last summer and so far this indoor season has won championships at the N.J. Collegiate meet, the Princeton Relays and the Metropolitan Intercollegiates, all right here at Jadwin Gymnasium.

"All eyes in New Jersey will be focused here at Princeton," Moon asserts. "It's great for this state to

have this meet and it would be great for New Jersey track if a state school can win it.

"We'll definitely be in the top three but we might be battling for second place with Maryland. Villanova has everybody they had last year and more.

"However, somewhere in the back of my mind I keep thinking we can pull it out. Can Villanova make a mistake somewhere? Will Jumbo Elliott miscalculate? If something happens we'll be there to haunt them."

If that sounds negative you don't know John Moon. His approach to coaching is strictly positive and always optimistic. But he is realistic enough to realize that gone from his title team of last year are stars like Howard Brock, Al Daley, Charlie Joseph and Art Cooper. That is a lot to give away in any season. Brock alone ran 10 races here last year over the two-day meet.

6. And finally a post-meet and Centennial Reception for Auld Lang Syne.

"We don't have anybody that strong this time," Moon concedes. "In fact, with the possible exception of Orlando Green, we're a team without superstars."

Nevertheless, Seton Hall has won everything it has gone after this season. "I make my team believe in themselves," the coach says. "They know its going to have to be a team effort to win here and each guy will be trying to put out his best effort."

Moon points out that the power of positive thinking can work wonders. "Take Larry Bunting," he says. "With little experience and just on pure motivation he won the triple jump at the N.J. championships and did well enough in that event to be a big factor for us in the Mets."

Moon is counting on getting most of his points in the sprints, hurdles and shorter distance races. Some of his runners will double.

John Chambers, Calvin Dill, Reggie Blackshear and Joe Myatt will be in the sprints; Blackshear, Myatt and Bunting in the hurdles. Green will be a favorite in the half mile and Ben Fields is the man to beat in the high jump. But Moon figures a

couple of his lesser known athletes might steal a point here and there as well.

"Some of my guys will have to run eight races counting heats," Moon says. "It's difficult to talk about a dynasty. Guys have got to believe in you to come to your team. I have got to keep projecting my personality all the time. You don't always get the superstars but sometimes you get a guy who was overlooked but who has potential."

"The main thing I try to project is personal satisfaction in an athlete -- personal records. I tell each guy to go out and aim for his personal record and if he can improve that he has done his job."

Winning Indoor and Outdoor IC4A championships last season provided a big lift to Moon's program at South Orange. "Not only did it help our image," he says, "but the guys I have who were not as good last year have been motivated to put out extra effort because they know it can be done."

"I don't think we should be the favorites this year and if we pull it off it will be an upset. But my guys just might do it. We've been looking toward this one all winter."
