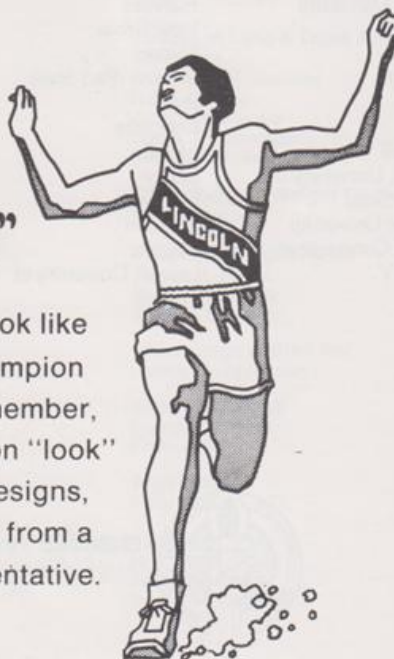

PROGRESS TURNS BACK THE CLOCK ON SPRINTERS AND HURDLERS

Progress is not only the most important product of G.E., as its TV ad tells us; it is most vital to the sport of track and field, where progress improves the breed as accurately recorded, meet after meet, year after year, on the stopwatch and metric stick.

Vaulters moved onward and upward from hickory poles, added the vaulting box for a precise plant, went to bamboo, then steel and finally found fiberglass slingshots... High jumpers, with less equipment, evolved from the scissors kick, the Eastern and Western roll, the belly straddle until they found the Flop in their rise from 5 feet plus to 7 feet 7 $\frac{1}{4}$... Parry O'Brien turned his back to the direction of the shotput and first took the whales past 60 feet... Refinements in the discus and hammer throwing circles, plus anabolic steroids lifted records to distances beyond the wildest imaginations of earlier practitioners.

All of this was progress, but note that progress stopped dead when steroids were banned and drug tests kept all the muscle men from matching their personal bests in the Montreal Olympics.

Footracers too found ways and means of generating more and more speed. William Curtis, called Father Bill, who organized the first track meet in the U.S., imported spiked shoes from England, and all who wore spikes won. Yale's Charley

Sherrill used the crouch start when he dominated the I.C.4A 100 in the late '80s. Others dug holes in the track, which led to starting blocks. The running surface, dirt, clay, cinders, gave way to artificial surfaces impervious to wear, tear and weather. Bob Hayes, on rubberized asphalt in St. Louis, felt as though his feet never touched the ground when he posted the first 9.1 at 100 yards. Progress was achieved in man's quest for Citius, Altius, Fortius.

Would anyone want to interrupt this progress? Well, there have been suggestions that the discus, javelin and hammer throwers, whose records now rest beyond 232, 310 and 260 feet, respectively, can be restrained by making the discus and javelin heavier, the hammer handle shorter.

It's a known fact that weight, enough of it, will stop a racehorse; added weight of implements certainly would drastically restrain the weightmen. What's behind this idea? Safety? The size of stadiums?

Mac Wilkins, the Olympic discus champion and world recordholder, took a contemptuous view of such restraints.

"Oh, sure, they can fix it so that the shotputters, discus, javelin and hammer throwers will all throw 22 meters," Mac said recently. (22 meters equal 72 feet 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches).

There is no immediate prospect of the rule-

makers doing that to the hardware heavies. But they already have managed to slow down the sprinters and hurdlers, all the way to 400 meters. The speed boys may be running as fast as ever; only their times have slowed drastically, putting them back a couple of decades or more. Progress took care of this by developing and refining to acceptable accuracy and reliability the electric, fully automatic timing device, like Accutrack, which Princeton is using at these Intercollegiates. It is both a timing and photo system.

Henceforth, only fully automatic electric timing will be recognized for approved records, and such records now exist, since such timing devices operated at all the Olympic Games since 1968, and in 1976 at all major meets including the AAU, NCAA and IC4A outdoor championships. With this meet, the IC4A indoor championships go fully automatic as well.

You may or may not be skeptical of the hand-timing that credited Ivory Crockett and Houston McTear with 9 flat for 100 yards. The question is now academic. The IAAF no longer recognizes any hand-timed records up to 400 meters, and no longer, in addition, approves records at yardage distances with one exception. As a sentimental gesture to the English system, dead as the dodo, virtually everywhere except the backward U.S., the IAAF recognizes records at the classic mile, which is approximately 110 meters more than the equally classic 1500 meters. Even in the U.S., the AAU, NCAA and IC4A have gone metric in their outdoor championships. Why not indoors?

Human timers were all but invisible at the Montreal Olympics, though a small backup crew is needed in the event of failure of the automatic timing device. It's been known to happen. Machines do fail.

Parenthetically, the IAAF rules do not apply to indoor competition since the venerable IAAF simply can't make a decision on recognizing indoor competition. The AAU always has recognized indoor track. It is left to track writers and the Track and Field News to keep tabs of "world indoor records" for the track community.

Until all track meets, including dual meets, can afford fully automatic timing, there's bound to be a profusion of confusion brought on by the discrepancy between electric and hand timing.

For comparative purposes in evaluating qualifying standards for its championships the NCAA arbitrarily uses .15 as the equivalency. That is, if the qualifying standard for the IC4A 60-yard sprint is 6.4, as it is, then an electric time of 6.55 seconds is acceptable to the seeding committee.

All this discussion about times, splits, etc. was utterly baffling, even before the advent of electric timing, to the Gentleman from The Times when he was assigned to the track beat 30 years ago.

"For gosh sake, throw away the stopwatches," he complained "and let's enjoy the racing."

He did have a point and it can be appreciated in a highly competitive meet like the IC4A. The athletes and their coaches and their followers are here more concerned with who wins, who places, who beats whom, computing the points (6-4-3-2-1 for five places) which will decide the team standing.

So, if the electric timing in the 60, hurdles and 440 comes up slower than you expected from hand-timed results, remember the timing system has changed, and it's a fresh start with a new set of records.

In the sprints, at least, progress in timing has managed to slow the improvement of the breed. For a while, anyway.

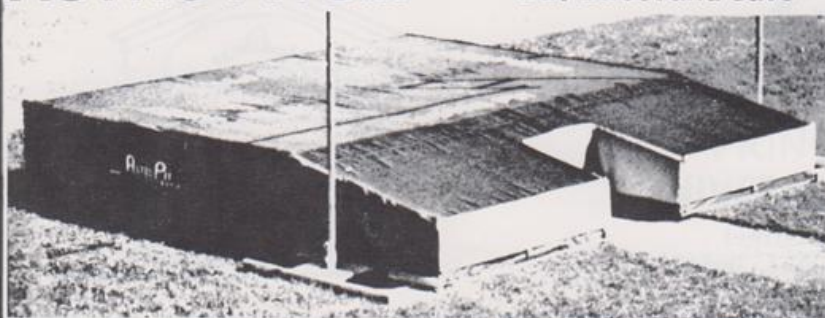
