Jadwin Gym, IC4A's ...A Perfect Match

Last year, it was the ECAC's turn...This year it's Jadwin Gym's. The Eastern College Athletic Conference, as you might already know, celebrated its 50th birthday in 1988. On the heels of that memorable occasion comes one of the conference's premier events. This year's ICAAAA Indoor Track and Field Championships once again are held here in Princeton University's Jadwin Gym, a facility that turned 20 this past winter.

Although the Pennsylvania-Princeton basketball game christened this magnificent building on January 25, 1969, the official dedication of the gym coincided with the Harvard-Princeton-Yale track and field meet on March 1. The structure culminated three years of arduous planning, patience and performance.

It is named for a great Tiger track and field athlete of the 1920s, L. Stockwell Jadwin. A football, track and golf team performer at the Hotchkiss School, Jadwin turned his attention to his favorite sport - track and field - upon his arrival at Princeton in 1924. As a sophomore, he travelled to England for the traditional meet between the combined teams from Cornell and Princeton, and the combined squads from Oxford and Cambridge.

Later in his career, he tied the world indoor record in the high hurdles during a meet at Madison Square Garden. His crowning achievements occurred during his senior year when, first, he was elected captain of the 1928 team and, second, won the high and low hurdles in the Yale meet. He also won the Keene Fitzpatrick Medal for his combined scholarship, athleticism and leadership.

Employed by the John F. Murray Advertising Agency in New York City following his graduation, Jadwin died tragically in an automobile accident on February 10, 1929.

His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Stanley P. Jadwin, and other donors made the building a living tribute to the younger Jadwin's life. "It is appropriate to symbolize Princeton's concern for the individual student by naming this unique extension of our educational program in memory of one of them, L. Stockwell Jadwin '28," said Robert Goheen, then the President of Princeton.

Those of you here for the first time should take the time to tour the facility. The elevator located on the main floor takes you down to the "other" worlds of Jadwin. C-level contains a spacious fencing room and the spectators' galleries for several squash courts. The United States Squash Racquets Association Championships, one of countless national or regional events held in Jadwin over the years, were held here just a few weeks ago.

The bottom floor, or E-level, houses a large wrestling room, a weight room, six indoor tennis courts, and a large dirt area where today's "throws" will be held.

The basketball floor and indoor track on the main level have seen their share of outstanding performances over the years. This meet, in particular, has given fans an unending number of memories. Just three years ago, the grace and power of Pittsburgh's Lee McRae covered 55 meters down the Jadwin straightaway in a new IC4A and gym record of 6.13 seconds.

Nick Saunders, the brilliant high jumper from Boston University, cleared the bar at 7-feet-6 1/2 inches in the 1983 meet on this infield.

And Princeton's own Augie Wolf, who captured fourth place in the 1984 Olympic Games shot put in Los Angeles, set a meet record with a 64-feet-10-inch effort back in the '83 meet.

No doubt, today's meet will provide another set of memories that has made the IC4A-Jadwin combination such a special one over the years. For the ECAC and this beautiful athletic complex, the old adage, "You're not getting older, you're getting better," truly applies.

May the association continue, and hearty birthday wishes to both!

Returning Champs in 9 of 17 Events in the 68th IC4A Indoor Championships

The 1989 ICAAAA Indoor Track & Field Championship at Princeton's Jadwin Gym, March 3-5, will feature a host of familiar faces, as defending gold medalists return in nine of the 17 individual events. Willie McNeill (East Carolina), Vincent Smith (Princeton) and Maury Bonner (Holy Cross) finished 3rd, 4th and 6th respectively last year in the 55 meter dash and are having good 1989 seasons, but the sprinter who has drawn most of the national attention is the Notre Dame freshman football sensation, Raghib "The Rocket" Ismail, who recently posted an IC4A list leading 6.29.

Defending 55m hurdles champion Eric Cannon of Pittsburgh and recent winner of the Big East, returns along with Panther teammate Elbert Ellis Andre Dean-Nel (Seton Hall), Bart Bailey (F.D.U.) and another great yearling, Qadry Ismail of Syracuse. Ismail is last year's #1 ranked US Scholastic Hurdler, winner of the Golden West High School Meet and the brother of Notre Dame's "Rocket".

It's only the second year the IC4A has run a 200m dash but this event should see three of the fastest collegiate sprinters go head to head. Defending champ Willie McNeill, who established the year old mark of 21.53, will be racing against the outdoor IC4A 200m champ Michael Timpson (Penn State). A new face on the track will be Salaam Gariba, a Villanova freshman from Ghana who clocked 21.52 in his recent win of the Big East title.

The 400m race returns another defender Howard Burnett (New York Tech). This will be an exciting race to see with the 2nd place finisher and outdoor 400m champ Terence Sheppard (James Madison) returning. Tim Hesse of George Mason and Donald Thrower of Maryland also had impressive times this winter. It will also be interesting to see if the defending champ of the 500, Bruce Phillip (Manhattan) will hold his crown or if contenders such as Burnett (400m), Efreem Venters (Navy), Doug Read (Rhode Island) and Ernest Barrett (George Mason) will remove him from his reign.

Host school Princeton's Keese Clemons is the defending champion of the 800m. He will be up against another champion: 1500M Olympic Gold Medalist Peter Rono (Mt. St. Mary's). Rono was the actual winner in last year's 800m but was disqualified for cutting in too soon. Both of

these top notch runners will also have to worry about some other strong performers such as John Cook (George Mason), Paul Rowbotham (Villanova) and Robert Lesko (Yale). Lesko may also be competing in the 1,000 and waiting for him will be Paul Vandergrift of William & Mary. The sophomore has already posted times under the IC4A Meet Record this season.

When it comes to the mile run it seems that many of the competitors will 'sit out' this race in order to rest up for the NCAA's but John Trautman (Villanova), winner of the Big East mile and 5000m, appears to be the best of the group. Some of the other longer distance races (3000m and 5000m) may have some of their top runners resting up for the NCAA but it may be possible to find Greg Whiteley (Brown) and Ken Frazier (Penn State) on the track.

The field events also have a number of returning champions. There are five high jumpers that have leaped over the 7'0" mark. Boston College's Ken Moody is the defending champ from last year but the leader so far this season is Tony Barton (George Mason) who has cleared 7'2 1/4". Charles Forlidas (Princeton) and Tim Corbitt (Connecticut) have reached 7'1" this season while Zon Thompson (St. John's) is at 7'0".

Two time defender John Finney (Maryland) seeks his third consecutive title at the Pole Vault. He has already gone over 17 feet this winter. A newcomer to the IC4A is freshman Istvan Bagyula (George Mason), a consistent 18-footer and the World Junior Champ, but he will pass up the IC4A this year for a chance at the World Indoor Championships in his native Hungary. Other contenders are Gene Laykhtman (Manhattan) and Steve Keating (Rutgers) who are both over 16'6".

Both the triple jump and the long jump are events open to just about anyone while the shot put returns two time champion thrower C.J. Hunter (Penn State) who has already shot an impressive 63'3" this winter. Rob Graham (Iona) and Tony Washington (Syracuse) should go 1-2 respectively in the weight throw since both are throwing over 64 feet.

All meets must come to an end and what better way to end a meet than with the relays. Manhattan seems to be leading the 4 x 400m pack this season clocking 3.09.25 as its best while it, again, is anyone's race in the 4 x 800m, as well as the Distance Medley.

Olympic Gold Medalist Peter Rono: What will he do for an Encore?

PETER RONO . . . his name was overlooked time and time again as he joined the 11 other runners at the start of the finals in the 1,500-meter run at the Summer Olympics in Seoul, South Korea.

Such names as Steve Cram, Peter Elliott and Steve Scott were mentioned as pre-race favorites. But for Pete's sake, no mention of Rono, a sophomore at Mount Saint Mary's College in Emmitsburg, Maryland, USA.

That is . . . until after the race. Peter Rono shocked the sports world by capturing the gold medal with a 3:35.96 clocking. During the race, he hung back in the rear until the 700 meter mark (about half way) then took the lead and held off the pack with a kick on the final lap heading into the homestretch.

Moments after the race, Rono said, "it was easier to win in Seoul than it was in Kenya," as he alluded to the intensively competitive Kenyan trials. At the "Games," Rono won his heat with a time of 3:37.65, then placed second in semifinal II with a 3:38.25 clocking on the eve of the final.

Once in the final, this diminutive runner --all 5-foot-7 and 127 pounds of him -- didn't figure to be one of the medal favorites, according to the experts.

As the NBC cameras focused on the field, the only mention made of a Kenyan was of one of Rono's teammates, when commentator Frank Shorter reported a rumor that one of the Kenyans would be a "rabbit" (pace-setter) for his fellow countrymen that was "sweeping the stadium."

Mountaineer track coach Jim Deegan, in Seoul as personal trainer to the Mount athletes, took credit for the rumor at a celebration held in his and Frank Zarnowski's honor after their return. Zarnowski, on sabbatical from his position as a Mount St. Mary's economics professor, was working as an analyst for NBC Sports in Seoul.

Kenyans are known for their willingness to sacrifice themselves for the team, he explained, adding it was all part of the strategy.

That the rumor was false was apparent right from the start, when all three Kenyans, including Mountaineer Kip Cheriuyot, who finished seventh in the race (3:37.94), lingered in the rear.

Moments later Peter Rono was standing on the victory podium with a gold medal draped around his neck.

The article, "Yale and its 112 Years..." by two members of the Yale Sports Information Department, referred, in part, to the development of the first "non-sawdust" pole vault pit by members of the Yale athletic staff.

It has been brought to our attention that a long-time "volunteer" field event coach for the Eli's, Mr. J. "Moose" Miller was, in large part, the party responsible for the development and introduction of early versions of the rubber, portable, and subsequently inflatable pits during the late 50s and early 60s. At present, Mr. Miller is president of Eureka Company, a firm that is involved with the production of a line of safe and functional pits, and that utilizes the talents of numerous disabled employees.

We apologize for any "slight" toward Mr. Miller, and we wish him well in all future endeavors.
