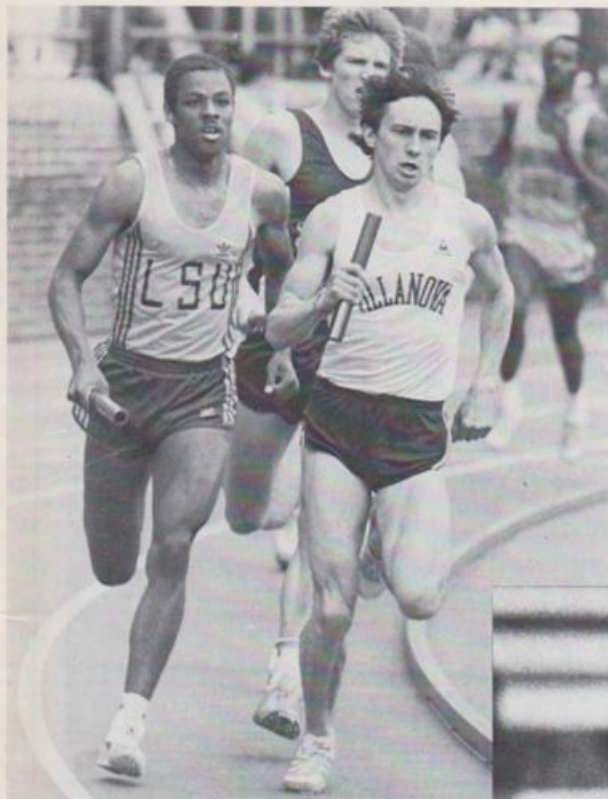

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BU's Nick Saunders Eyeing Olympic Gold

Boston University's world class high jumper, Nick Saunders, has a legitimate chance at becoming a national hero after the 1984 Summer Olympic Games in Los Angeles.

In 1980, Clarence Hill made history when he won a bronze medal in boxing to become the first Bermudan ever to win a medal in Olympic competition. Now, in the upcoming games, Saunders will make history when he becomes the first athlete to represent Bermuda in the high jump, but even more impressive, "he could very likely be their first gold medalist," according to Boston University's head coach, Kevin Coyne.

Saunders, a 20-year old from Paget, Bermuda, proved why he is considered one of the nation's premier high jumpers when he jumped 7-5½ to win the NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships last March in Syracuse which made him the first Boston University male athlete to win a national indoor track title. He was first recognized as a world class high jumper in 1983 when he established the IC4A record with a leap of 7-6½. He reinforced his world ranking by placing third in the NCAA Indoor Championships with a jump of 7-4¾ and second in the NCAA Outdoor Championships with a jump of 7-4¼.

A week before he won the NCAA high jump title, he leaped 7-4¼ to capture the IC4A indoor title. Also, during this past indoor season, Saunders was victorious in every meet he competed in; however, he believes that he has not even come close to reaching his peak. "In the upcoming outdoor season, my jumps should progressively become better," Saunders says.

Saunders has only been jumping in the 7-2 to 7-4 range and will need to jump higher than that if he has any hopes of win-

ning a medal in L.A. "Nick's jumps will definitely become consistently better as the Olympics draw near," says his jumping coach, Bill Thierfelder who, incidentally, will be competing in the high jump for Ireland in the Games. "His training has been more geared towards preparation for the Olympics and basically that is why he has not yet peaked."

Saunders, a junior, is definitely a strong candidate for breaking a world record, which is 7-9¾. "Last year, he cleared 7-9. However, as he was falling to the mat his calves skimmed the bar to knock it down," explained Thierfelder.

An interesting fact to note is that Greg Wessig of East Germany, the 1980 gold medalist in the high jump, had only qualified for the East German team two weeks earlier when he won the national championship with what was his personal record of 7-6½, which is Saunders' best. In the Olympics, he improved by over two inches with a leap of 7-8¾, making him the first man to set a world record in the high jump during Olympic competition.

As a youngster growing up in Bermuda, Saunders did not have dreams of breaking high jump records or, for that matter, of going to the Olympics as a high jumper. His dreams consisted of scoring goals and making the big plays on the soccer field, as he did when he was chosen to play on the Bermuda National Team. "Soccer was my first love," vows Saunders.

However, Clive Longe, the coach of the Bermuda National Track Team, believed he could be more successful as a high jumper. After many years of persuasion, he convinced Saunders that his sport was indeed high jumping.

After high school, he did not receive any college scholarship offers like many of his teammates did. The following year he competed in the Carifta Junior National Games. Saunders cleared 7-2 to win the event.

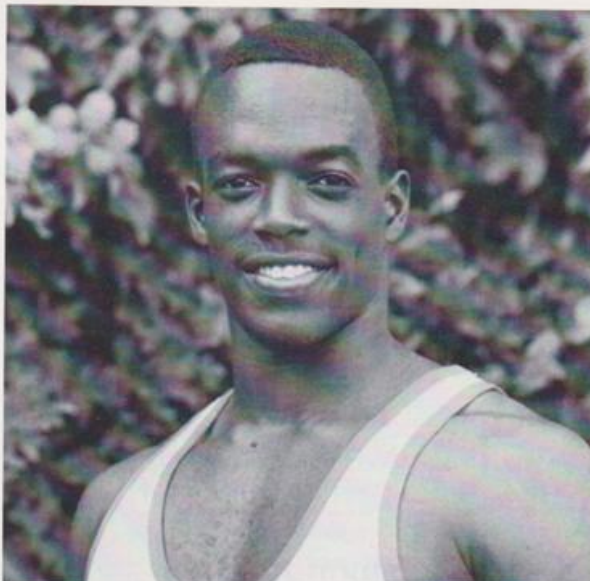
Once again the old saying "being in the right place at the right time" prevailed this time for former Boston University head track coach Dave Hemery, who called Longe the day after the Carifta Games to inquire about a female sprinter. Longe told Hemery about Saunders' accomplishments in the games because the sprinter would be unable to attend college the following year. The next week, Hemery went to watch Saunders compete and was so impressed with his "extraordinary talent," as Hemery puts it, that he immediately offered him a scholarship to attend Boston University.

Saunders, an Occupational Therapy major with a grade point average of 2.85, has enjoyed his three years in Boston and would like to stay after graduation. Nevertheless, the slender, dark-skinned and charismatic athlete is undecided on his future plans, just like many other students his age. "I have narrowed it down to either graduate school or to seeking a job within my major."

The 6-2, 175-pound Saunders is the second high jumper from Boston University to participate in the Olympics. The first was John Thomas.

A 1960 graduate of Boston University, Thomas won the high jump at the 1959 Millrose Games with a leap of 7-0 and became the first man ever to clear that height in the high jump. Thomas went on to win a bronze medal in the 1960 Olympics and a silver in the 1964 Games for the United States. He held the school's high jump records until Saunders surpassed them last year.

The list of accomplishments began for Saunders as a freshman when he swept three events — the high jump, triple jump and 55-meter dash — at the 1982 Greater Boston Indoor Champion-



ships. He also won the New England title in the 55-meter dash that winter.

Last year, Saunders won the GBC indoor high jump title with a record setting leap of 7-6. He also won the New England Indoor and Outdoor high jump titles and earned All-America honors at the NCAA Indoor and Outdoor Championships. In April, he was named the University's top male athlete by the Terrier coaching staff.

In a very modest and soft-spoken manner, Saunders says, "what ever I did in the past is not really important at this time. I must work hard each and everyday and only concentrate on the present because past victories will not win my next meet for me."

IC4A Heritage & Tradition — It All Started in 1896

It would seem unlikely that any organization could rival the Olympic heritage that the Intercollegiate Association for Amateur Athletics of America (IC4A) boasts. Founded in 1876 as a side-show of sorts for the prestigious rowing regattas at Saratoga, NY, the IC4A Championships have grown into the oldest multiple intercollegiate track and field organization in the world.

With that background material in mind, it should really come as no surprise that no fewer than 144 IC4A champions have gone on to capture Olympic medals. More precisely, in the 19 Olympiads of the modern era, there has been at least one IC4A champion in competition for Olympic gold. A definition of the modern era would encompass each Olympiad from the 1896 Athens Games through the 1980 Moscow Games.

Even more impressive, however, is the fact that with the exception of Montreal in 1976, and Moscow in 1980, IC4A champions have managed to capture at least two medals in each Olympiad of the modern era. Not a bad record for a regatta side show.

One athlete who stands out in all Olympic records is James Connolly. It seems that Connolly became the very first athlete to establish a long tradition of track and field excellence associated with IC4A athletes. Connolly, a student at Harvard, found his specialty to be the hop, skip and jump. The forerunner of today's triple. An event not contested in the IC4A championships, Connolly never won an IC4A crown. In fact, Harvard would not even grant him leave to attend the 1896 Olympics in Athens.

But Connolly, in search of a championship, became one of about 25 American athletes to venture to Athens, paying all his own expenses. Scheduling, or fate it would seem, scheduled the hop, skip and jump as the first event and Harvard's James Connolly became the first gold medalist in what now has become known as the modern Olympic era.

Looking over the IC4A and Olympic records, it's hard to ignore the impact that Midwestern and Western schools had on the competition. Although originally founded as an association of Eastern schools, the University of California, Southern California and Stanford broke the Eastern only barrier in 1921. Over the next 20 years, those three schools alone would capture 16 team titles and account for 26 Olympic medals.

Bill Miller, a gold medalist in the 1932 pole vault, explains why the Western schools made the trip East each year despite less than favorable travel conditions. "There were NCAA championships then," he explains. "But for us at Stanford, the IC4A meet was still a very big one." Big enough for the Californians to endure a four to five day train ride from San Francisco to New York.

"I had hoped to make the Olympic squad in 1928," Miller remembers. "I was only in high school though and never qualified. Therefore, I really set my sites on the 1932 games. We trained liked football players. Personally, I concentrated on distance running and rope climbing to build up my arms."

You would assume that having the 1932 IC4A championships in Miller's home state of California would be a big advantage over traveling across the country by train, but Miller would not agree. "Our outdoor season in California was long and hard. I used to use the train ride as a rest, or vacation, and really give my body a chance to get the rest that it needed," he adds. Despite his claims, Miller managed his best IC4A vault in 1932, in California, clearing 13-10. A year later, after capturing the Olympic gold with a jump of 14' 1.9," Miller won his second IC4A crown with a vault of only 13'6" in Cambridge, MA.

Another Californian who would disagree with Bill Miller on the subject of travel is Bob Van Osdel, a silver medalist in the 1932 games and IC4A high jump champion. "Our trips took about four days. We took our time, though; normally we got back East about a week ahead of time to give us time to prepare," he remembers. And just to make sure that everyone

ran well, "we even brought along our own water because it's not easy to perform when you're not feeling well."

Van Osdel was also faced with another problem — he did not have the luxury of training as do today's athletes. "I was enrolled in dental school at USC and stood on my feet all day. I trained from December until summer, but most of my time was taken up by school. I took three weeks off before the trials, and two weeks off before the games. And, naturally, after the competition I was right back in school."

One point where Van Osdel and Miller do agree, however, is one the significance of the IC4A championship. "At USC, we considered them one of our national meets. I know the team was quite enthused about competing. And in an Olympic year, the IC4A's were just another opportunity to run against great competition."

One athlete who didn't have to worry about travel between the East and West coasts was current Villanova head coach Charles Jenkins. Jenkins has the distinguished honor of earning two Olympic gold medals in the 1956 Melbourne Games. Jenkins became the first in what would be a long line of Villanova Olympic medalists when he captured gold in the 400 meter run and ran on the 1600 meter relay.

Oddly enough, in that 1956 season, despite earning the unofficial world champion title with his Olympic gold, Jenkins did not win the IC4A nor NCAA 400 meter crown. Looking back, Jenkins, the 1955 and 1957 IC4A 440-yard champion, sees the timing of the 1956 summer games as working to his advantage.

"I always considered myself a better indoor runner. During that year I really rested up during the summer. Going to the Olympic camp I was not considered a hopeful for the Olympic gold medal. However, I knew that with work I would be fine. About three weeks prior to the camp I began to exercise and work out and the games themselves allowed me to peak for what would normally be my indoor season."

While Jenkins considered the Olympics a goal to strive for, John Woodruff, a gold medalist in the 1936 Berlin games, was taken by surprise. "I made the Olympic team in my freshman year," he explains. "I was attending the University of Pittsburgh and could only compete in freshmen meets. To be honest, being in the Olympics never really entered my mind, yet winning a gold medal."

Woodruff went on to explain that in the 30's there was a system of qualifying meets and after entering, he eventually ended up as a member of the Olympic team. "I ran in a meet called the Allegheny Mountain Association Meet. That was a quarter-final qualifier. From there I moved on to Randall's Island and the semis, it all really took me by surprise."

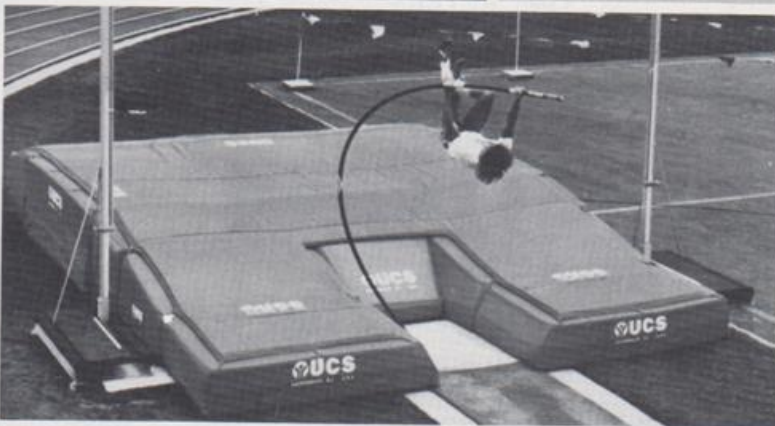
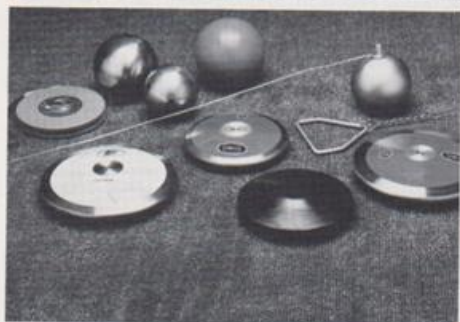
