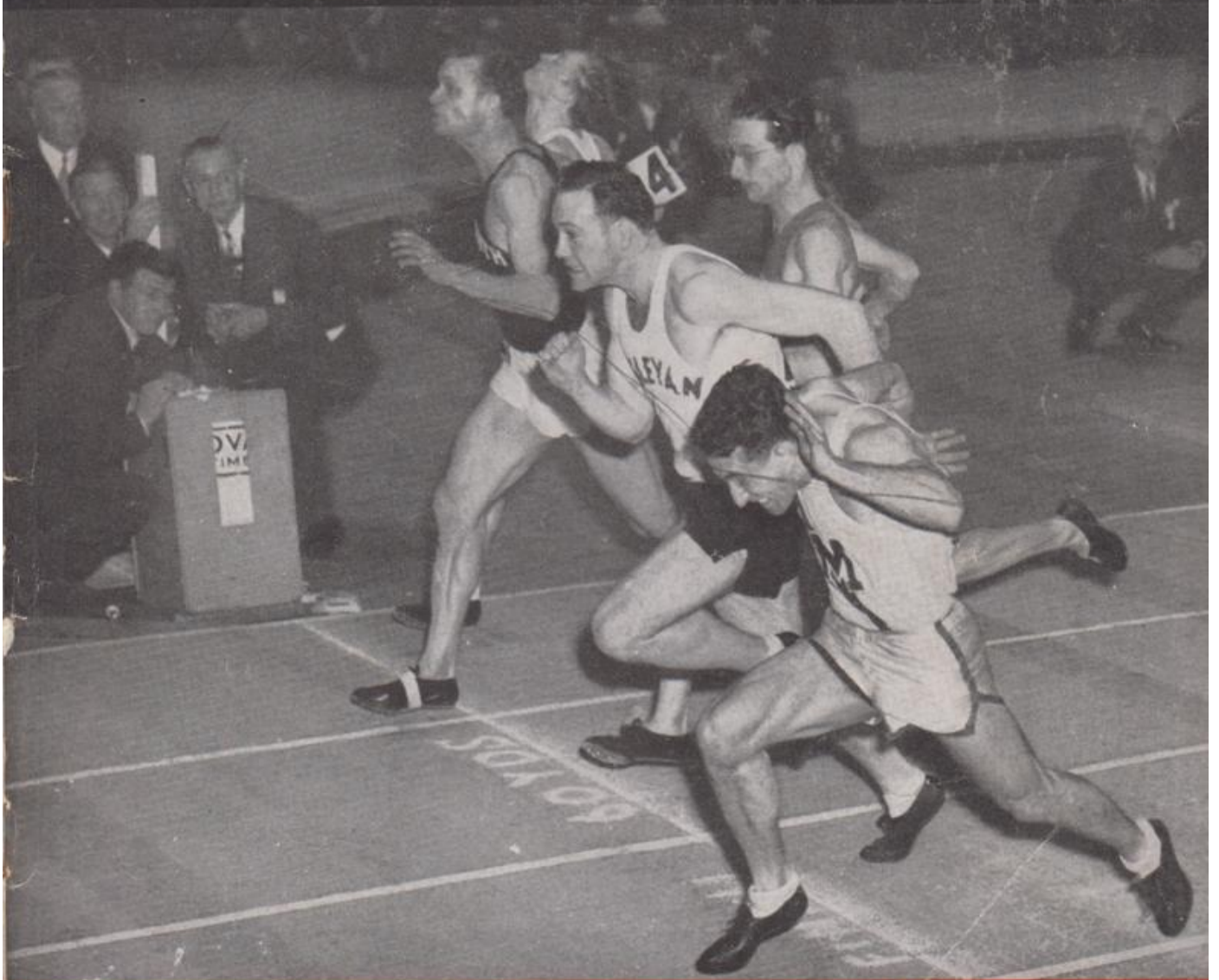

I.C.A.A.A. Stars Played Major Role in U. S. A. Olympic Team Triumphs

THE august and venerable Inter-collegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America (hereinafter referred to with respectful familiarity as the I.C.4-A) may be pardoned for feeling its oats a bit tonight, on the occasion of its twenty-eighth annual indoor championships.

It has come to light that member institutions of the nation's oldest and greatest college sports body produced no less than twenty of the sixty-five track and field athletes who wore the United States Olympic shield with such striking success at London last summer. So why shouldn't the I.C.4-A puff out its chest a bit?

No other conference or sectional group came close to matching this accomplishment. It is a ringing endorsement of the high principles, the vigor and the health of the I.C.4-A, organized in 1875 with fourteen charter members and flourishing today with an enrollment of sixty-five leading colleges and universities.

Twenty Olympians sounds like a lot for one outfit but the I.C.4-A's mass production came as no surprise to those who have followed the activities of this beloved old association down through the years. The I.C.4-A, for reasons that discerning railbirds readily appreciate, always will have more than its fair share of Olympic stars.

Champions are developed through competition and, in the whole sports realm, there is no fiercer or more fervent struggle than the free-for-all, no-quarter, all-out battle for titles and points that ensues whenever the I.C.4-A membership gets together—on boards, on cinders or over hill and dale.

Nine of the I.C.4-A Olympians went on to greater glory right from the 1948 outdoor championships at Randalls Island, and the rest were graduates who stayed in competition with the Olympic objective in mind and the nineteenth representative was a special case who illustrated that there is nothing an I.C.4-A collegian can't do if he puts his mind to it.

I.C.4-A varsity eligibles of last June who made the Olympic boat were Jim Fuchs and Vic Frank of Yale, Browning Ross and George Guida of Villanova, Irving Mondschein of N. Y. U., Herb Douglas of Pittsburgh, Sam Felton of Harvard, Jeff Kirk of Pennsylvania, and Ted Vogel of Tufts. Fuchs,

Frank, Ross, Kirk and Vogel are entered in tonight's championships. The league is so tough some of them may not even get into the money.

From the alumni group came Barney Ewell, Curtis Stone and Herman Goffberg of Penn State, Bob Bennett of Maine and Brown, Henry Dryer of Rhode Island State, Eddie O'Toole of Manhattan, Ed Conwell of N. Y. U., Boo Morcom of New Hampshire and Floyd Simmons of North Carolina.

Clyde L. Scott, former Navy track and football ace, and later a U. of Arkansas star, was another I.C.4-A "alumnus" on the American Olympic team. Scott, in 1945, won the outdoor

high hurdles for Navy and picked up second-place points in the low hurdles to aid the service champions. He later switched to Arkansas.

Our special case is Adolph J. Weinacker, Michigan State sophomore, who won himself an Olympic berth as a 50,000-meter walker, not despite the I.C.4-A, which dropped the heel-and-toe pastime from its program of events just before the turn of the century, but more probably because he was within the sphere of the I.C.4-A's spiritual influence.

Top performer of the I.C.4-A contingent at Wembley Stadium was Ol' Barney Ewell. It was this great athlete's bad fortune that the games of the XIIIth Olympiad were sacrificed to Mars but Barney refused to let himself slip over the hill and came out of the XIVth games with two strong seconds in the sprints and a shining gold medal for his part in bringing the U.S.A. home on top in the controversial 400-meter relay.

"Smackover" Scott of Annapolis and Arkansas fame placed second to W. E. Porter in the Olympic 110 Metres hurdles—his time was 14.2 sec.

Yale's mighty Fuchs, whose star still is rising, was third man in the clean United States sweep of the shotput. He beat the old Olympic record himself and, after the games, beat Moose Thompson, the champ, and Jim Delaney, the runner-up. He'll be in the dash as well as in his specialty tonight and look for him to scale the discus out of sight at Randalls Island this spring.

Bob Bennett, only man in history to win I.C.4-A titles for Maine in 1939 and 1940 and another for

Gala Field of U. S. and Olympic Stars Set for Zamperini Mile

It is a pleasant, and perhaps profitable, custom of the I.C.4-A, when the opportunity offers for an outstanding special attraction, to stage an invitation race at these annual Indoor Championships of the Association. It serves a double purpose. It supplements the program with a hand-picked field in a well-matched race. It is designed to lure into Madison Square Garden those star-conscious benighted track fans who may not have discovered before this that the Intercollegiates present the old college try in all-out competition for five places in every event. And the old college try, tied in with the all-important team championship, makes this varsity festival the most exciting and colorful of indoor track meets, with a sustained suspense maintained until the crashing mile relay finale.

However, for those who may feel short-changed by not seeing the best of the non-collegiate headliners who run in the invitation club meets and the A.A.U. championships prior to the Intercollegiates, the I.C.4-A is happy to offer this lagniappe to a full course of varsity fare.

This year it is the Louis S. Zamperini Invitation Mile, which was originally set up in 1945 as a memorial to the 1939 I.C.4-A outdoor mile champion, who was then missing in action in the Pacific and presumed dead. After forty-five days on a raft and a tortuous, harrowing experience in prison camps, Laughing Lou Zamperini came back alive, and subsequently presided, as official starter, over the mile race designed as his I.C.4-A track memorial.

It could also be called, this year, the International Potpourri Mile, for the starters will be Holland's Willy Slykhuis, famous in Europe as "King of the Finish," France's Marcel Hansenne, Sweden's Erik Ahlden and Ingvar Bengtsson—Olympians all—plus Fred Wilt, the swift F.B.I. agent representing the New York A.C., Curtis Stone, of the Shanahan C.C., the 1947 I.C.4-A outdoor two-mile champion and record-holder (9:11.8) when he was a Penn State student, and John Twomey, of the Illinois A.C.

Up to this year the United States had taken a dim view of foreigners prancing on our small indoor board tracks. Paavo Nurmi had been a sensation here in 1925, winning forty-six of his fifty starts, indoors and out, in his memorable tour. Many Europeans have been invited here in the wake of the Phantom Finn. Not all of them were what is loosely known as flops. Edwin Wide of Sweden was a two-mile winner, though beaten a yard in a 4:12.2 mile in the Garden by Lloyd Hahn in 1927. Dr. Paul Martin of Switzerland won the national

A.A.U. 1000-yard championship in a record 2:12.6 in 1930. Many others since then—Josef Mostert, of Belgium, Erik Ny, Rune Gustafsson and Gunder Hagg of Sweden, Miklos Szabo of Hungary, Hansenne (in 1946), and Taisto Maki, of Finland, to name the distance runners only, failed to produce their European cinder form on our planked boards.

The reason, as Slykhuis and Hansenne, Gaston Reiff, Ahlden and Bengtsson have amply proved this winter, was not to be found in the difference between cinders and boards, between fresh air and smoke-filled

arenas between sweeping turns and sharply banked turns. A champion racer can run well on anything from sand to grass. The Europeans who failed in the past owed their failures to conditioning alone. They simply did not prepare themselves for the caliber of competition they met here.

The Europeans with us this winter all put in months of training following the end of the European outdoor season in October. Some of them even found bicycle tracks or large gymnasium halls to work out on boards and get the feel of them. The answer has been Reiff's 8:56.1, 8:55.5 and 8:53.2 performances at two miles, Slykhuis's 4:09.5 and 4:09.2 miles, breezing, and Hansenne's 4:10.3 mile in his debut where he could not touch 4:16 three years ago.

It would have been more exciting if Americans had more to offer against the visiting milers and two-milers. Our best miler ran one race in the East, beat Slykhuis by a yard in 4:09.5 Wanamaker Mile and hasn't come back East. I doubt whether any other country would have permitted Don Gehrman, of Wisconsin, to waste his talents in practice runs while international competition was available. Wisconsin preferred to keep Gehrman at home for a dual meet instead of sending him against Slykhuis, Hansenne and Bengtsson in the Baxter Mile. And for what? A dual meet in which the other college refused to designate a miler to race against Gehrman. He ran a 4:10.8 mile against his own teammates, but what could he have learned from the experience?

The advantages of top competition are shown by the races of Wilt and Stone. Neither had ever run two miles better than 9:04.2 in American competition. Drawn out by the best, Wilt has run 8:57, 8:57.2 and 8:55.7 behind Reiff and Ahlden, while Stone has cut his two-mile time to 8:56.9.

If we are ever to improve our international stand-

I. C. A. A. A. Footnotes

Little Joe Cianciabella, of Manhattan (he's still the smallest in the meet, pending another census) will become the first to win three I.C.4A sprint titles in a row, IF he wins tonight, since James S. Daley won for Holy Cross in 1928-29-30. . . . Ben Johnson won three for Columbia, but turned the trick over a four-year stretch, 1935-36-37-38. . . . Jimmy Daley never won many other sprints, but he sure ran the I.C.4-A 60 like he owned the patent. . . . Carlos Fetterolf, representing Connecticut in the dash, is an All-America soccer player, of all things. . . . Soccer and running have much in common. Gaston Reiff came out of soccer to become Olympic 5,000 meter champion for Belgium. . . . Michigan State's Jack Dianetti didn't miss the Olympic boat by much. He went all the way to the 800 meter final tryout final, placed fifth after winning the I.C.4-A 880 in 1:53.2, the Central Collegiate Conference 880 in 1:53.3 and taking second in the N.C.A.A. 800 meters behind Mal Whitfield's 1:51.1. . . . Fred Johnson, his teammate, was hot on the wrong days last year. He won the I.C.4-A and National A.A.U. broad jumps (25 feet 4½ inches), but never hit the board for a fair jump in the final tryouts. No one except Olympic Champion Willie Steele beat his best leap in 1948. . . .

Chip Off the Old Block Department: Charles H. Moore, Jr., Cornell sophomore, is the son of Crip Moore who won the indoor I.C.4-A high hurdles in 1924-25 for Penn State, setting the 70-yard meet record of 8.6 seconds. . . . Young Moore was runner-up in both the junior and senior National A.A.U. low hurdles as a freshman and ran a 48 second quarter. . . . John Eustis, Yale's outdoor co-champion in the pole vault, fractured a kneecap stepping off a train while on tour with the Glee Club during the Christmas holidays. . . . Lanny Ross was more careful stepping off trains when he was a Yale quarter-miler—and a topnotcher, too. . . . As it is, Coach Bob Giegengack has only three 13-footers in the meet—Sophomores George Appel and Neil King and Senior Gordon Bensley. . . . Jim Fuchs, tossing the shot tonight, will be tossing the discus to a world record before he leaves Yale, is the feed-box information. . . . If Fuchs brings his pet stinging bee along into the Garden, who can blame him. He was stung by a particularly vicious Parisian bee in a post-Olympic meet in Colombes Stadium last summer. After getting medical treatment, he promptly proceeded to beat Olympic Champion Moose Thompson and Runner-up Jim Delaney, who had shoved Fuchs into third place at Wembley. . . .

We don't have a T-formation passer in action tonight, but you can look over the T-formation halfbacks: Wesleyan's Bill Brooks, Army's Jim Cain, Winfield Scott and Harold Shultz; Navy's Bill

Powers, Yale's Jim Fuchs and Charley Keller, Dartmouth's Bob Tyler and Michigan State's single-wing Horace Smith. . . . Their football ranking is debatable, but Brooks, New England intercollegiate 100 yard champion and I.C.4-A 60 yard runner-up in a photo finish last winter, seems to have the No. 1 spring rating. . . . If all the fast I.C.4-A teams this winter shot the works in the mile relay, without regard for team points, what a race it would be! Probably there never has been such an array: N.Y.U., 3:20.2; Georgetown, 3:20.4; Manhattan, 3:20.5; Seton Hall, 3:20.7; Cornell, 3:22.3; Army and Maryland, 3:23.3. Fastest I.C.4-A mile relay in the Garden was N.Y.U.'s 3:20.3 in 1939 with James McPoland, George Hagans, Harold Bogrow and James B. Herbert. . . .

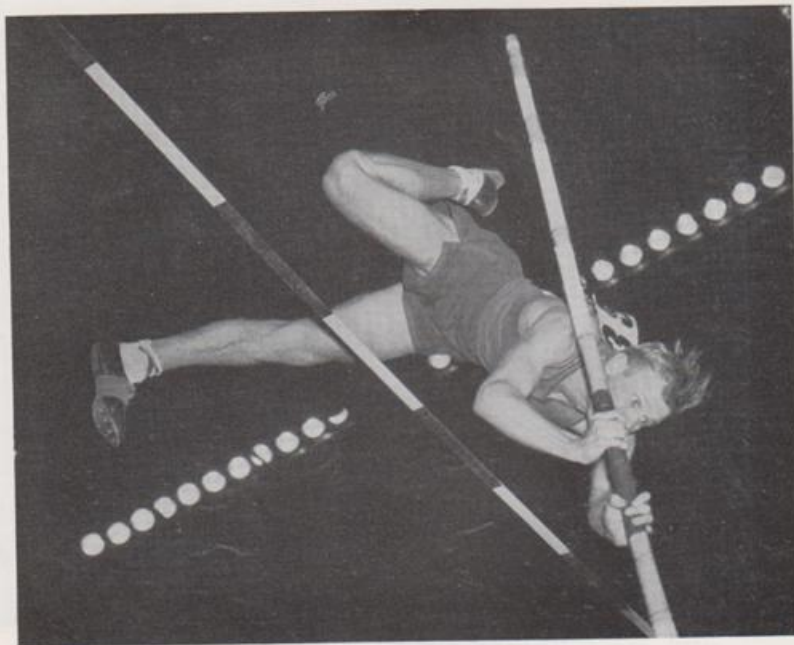
If Horace Ashenfelter of Penn State defends his two-mile title (and 9:14.9 record) it will mark his first race since he broke a bone in his foot in the I.C.4-A cross-country championship at Van Cortlandt Park in November. . . .

Four of the Michigan State runners—Jack Dianetti, Bill Mack, Warren Druetzler and Tom Irmen—were on the Spartan cross-country team that swept the I.C.4-A, N.C.A.A. and A.A.U. team titles last fall. . . . Geoffrey Tootell, Harvard shotputter, is the son of Rhode Island coach Fred Tootell, who retired undefeated as I.C.4-A, National A.A.U. and Olympic hammer throwing champion in 1924. . . . Jim Burnham, Dartmouth weight-thrower, is a brother of former I.C.4-A mile champion, Don Burnham. . . . Of the three Tobey brothers of Brown with the Biblical names, Joshua and Jonathan are twins and Joel is the youngest. All are members of the Bruin two-mile relay. Josh was retarded this winter by mumps. . . .

Chic Werner was a national A.A.U. hurdles champion at Illinois, but Jim Gehrdes is the first top-flight hurdler who has come Chic's way in the Nittany Mounains. . . . Ira Kaplan, sprinter, never ran a quarter-mile until he was inducted on no notice at all as lead-off runner on the N.Y.U. mile relay, which promptly proceeded to win its first race of the year. That pinch-hitting effort made Kaplan a mile relay regular on the team that returned 3:20.2 for the year's fastest.

HOW TIME FLIES DEPARTMENT: Ten years ago, in the I.C.4-A special, Glenn Cunningham ran the only major two-mile race of his career. Rating himself off the pace he out-kicked Don Lash, Greg Rice and Tommy Deckard in 9 minutes 11.8 seconds.

Brown in 1947, placed a good third in the hammer throw, with Harvard's Felton, on whom Dartmouth also has a wartime claim, three inches behind him in fourth place. Dreyer, an I.C.4-A champion way back in 1935 and a 1936 Olympian, made the final but fell just short of getting into the points.

Another third place winner was Douglas, who took four broad jump titles and a sprint crown in his I.C.4-A days. He missed second place in the Olympic jump by just a quarter of an inch. Simmons, who appears in the 1946 and 1947 I.C.4-A lists as a doubles hurdles scorer, enlarged his field of activity and captured third place at London in the classic decathlon. Moon Mondschein, whose enthusiasm for competition has no peer in I.C.4-A annuals, undoubtedly would have been a scorer in the ten-event test also had not he worked himself half to death in preparation.

The smooth-running Stone, whose 1948 achievements stamped him as America's best distancer since Greg Rice, placed sixth in the 5000-meter run. The worth of that accomplishment grows with first-hand observation of Gaston Reiff, Willy Slykhuis and Erik Ahlden, who were ahead of him, and not so far at that. What fast company that was!

Scoring sixth places also went to Guida, Villanova's current senior class president, and Morcom. Even though they got into the money, Lady Luck was not kind to these two stalwarts. Popping tendons that would behave only after the Olympic carnival, when he burned up the cinders again, kept Gentleman George from putting his best foot forward.

Morcom had assorted miseries, too. Boo can pole vault 14 feet blindfolded but he did not clear over 13 at London.

The amazing Ross, who'll give Villanova's mile relay team a sizzling leg one day and win a twelve-mile road run the next, made his Olympic bid in the 3000-meter steeplechase and barely failed to place after running with the leaders into the stretch of this gruelling test. Incidentally, he looks like the man to beat in the mile tonight.

Smiling Ted Vogel, who keeps himself in condition by running the eight miles from his home to the Medford campus of Tufts every morning, and who, like Ross will tackle any distance, was the first American finisher in the Olympic marathon, coming home fourteenth, less than eleven minutes behind the winner. Gritty Eddie O'Toole, the man who keeps going after every one else stops, was the best of the U.S.A.'s outclassed 10,000-meter men, beating Fred Wilt, who is cutting such fancy figures on the boards these days. Goffberg was not disgraced either.

The luck of the draw in his semi-final, which put Jeff Kirk in an outside lane in the fastest penultimate heat, was all that kept Penn's strong finisher out of the money in the 400-meter hurdles. Out in front on the stagger, Jeff misjudged his pace and was shut out of the final, even though his time of 0:52.5 was fast enough to have earned him fifth place in the championship race.

An attack of asthma laid Conwell low. Vic Frank, whose consistency was a byword on this side, had the inexplicable bad fortune to go into a tailspin abroad.

ing in the mile and two mile or 1500 and 5000 meters (Stone's sixth place in the 5000 meters was our only point in a distance race at London last summer) it is imperative for our runners to set their sights higher, and for more good college runners to train on after their varsity days—like Wilt and Stone.

Statistics show that most distance runners reach their prime at 28. Few of our top collegians carry on that long. Reiff, Ahlden, Bengtsson and Slykhuis are all about 28, Hansenne is 32. European distance runners keep at it longer. Unless we do the same we are going to be no match for the Europeans in the Olympic distance tests.

The mature European runners also stress versatility and range more than we do. Glenn Cunningham almost never ran two miles. Greg Rice, once he became our two-mile king, never ran a mile in fast company. The Europeans are different, and they profit thereby. Hansenne has run 800 meters in 1:48.3, 1000 meters in 2:21.4 (tying the world record) 1500 meters in 3:47.9, a mile in 4:08.2. Slykhuis has run 1500 meters in 3:50.4, a mile in 4:09.2, 3000 meters in 8:08.8 (second only to Gunder Hagg's world record), two miles in 9:02.2, 5000 meters in 14:14. Reiff has done 3:48.4 for 1500, 8:08.8 for 3000, 8:53.8 for two miles (indoors), 14:14.2 for 5000. Most topflight Europeans have this range of distances.

Slykhuis or Hansenne may crack Gil Dodds's year-old indoor mile record of 4:05.3 tonight. They have the ability; all they need is the pace. If either gets the record, more power to him. It would be worth while losing the indoor record if more of our American youths were inspired to get out and run the distances. The way things are going we will become a nation of sprinters, and who wants to watch a sprint race when we can see such two-mile races as Reiff, Ahlden, Wilt and Stone staged this winter?

Winners of past special invitation races sponsored by the I.C.A.A. at the Indoor Championships follow:

1928 (Eight-Lap Banked Track in 102nd Engineers Armory)—Lloyd Hahn raced 880 yards in 1:51.4, eclipsing all records, indoors and out.

1931 (Same Track)—Russell Chapman ran 880 yards in 1:51.5.

1939 (Madison Square Garden)—Glenn Cunningham, in his only major two-mile race, defeated Don Lash, Greg Rice and Tommy Deckard in 9:11.8.

1944—Gil Dodds, tying up badly in last quarter, ran 4:10.2 mile, defeating Ollie Hunter, national three-mile champion, and Les Eisenhart, national 1000-yard champion.

1945—Gunder Hagg, fifty hours off the boat after 23-day freighter voyage from Sweden, ran 4:31 and finished last in mile race won by Jim Rafferty by half a foot from Forest Efaw in 4:16.4.

1946—Leslie MacMitchell, who never had lost an I.C.A.A. mile or cross-country race, defeated Marcel Hansenne, of France, by twelve yards in 4:16 mile. Tommy Quinn, third; Efaw, fourth.

1947—Dodds, having won four straight mile races, moved up to the two-mile for a 9:10.1 victory over Quinn and Efaw. Dodds, in 1942, had run 8:53.6 and 8:53.7 behind Rice; he never broke nine minutes by himself.

Eddie Walsh, Manhattan graduate, won 1000 in 2:13.8, with Leslie MacMitchell beaten a foot and Sweden's Rune Gustafsson fifth.

1948—Tommy Quinn, fresh from his first National A.A.U. mile victory, upset Curtis Stone, newly crowned A.A.U. three-mile champion, by one foot in 9:11.1 two-mile. Efaw, third; John Twomey, fourth.
