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The End of an Era

The Final IC4A Paige for Don

There will be many happy runners this weekend at the IC4As. The hurricane, which has hit the eastern track record books for the past five years, is finally leaving.

First place will be at stake once more. This is the last page of Don Paige's glorious career.

The All-American with the looks and personality of a Jack Armstrong and the graceful strides of Jim Ryun -- through he shuns the comparison -- will wear his Villanova thinclads at the NCAA Championships in Austin, Texas the first week of June. But, for all intents, his IC4A career will reach its dramatic conclusion on Sunday.

He's been the top middle distance kicker in college the last two years. The name everybody has gone for, and, with few exceptions, everyone has failed to dethrone.

Paige, his determination and drive yet to peak, is as excited about his Franklin Field finale as he probably was when he ran his first big race in college -- the United States Track and Field Federation Relays at Dartmouth -- where he startled onlookers and teammates with a 4:01.6 second leg en route to a world-best 16:19.0 in the four-mile relay.

Back then, here was this tall, scrawny kid who had pleaded to Villanova coach Jumbo Elliott to mold him after running his best high school mile in 4:11, in upstate New York.

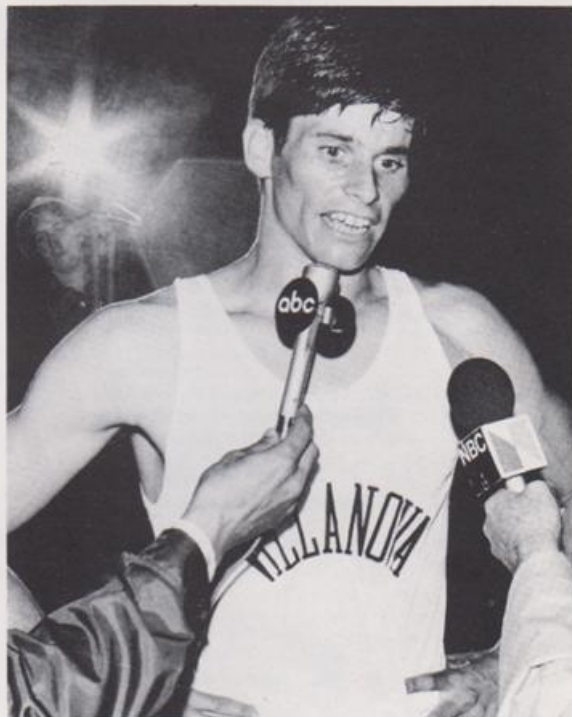
Even then, however, Paige had developed a habit in his racing which was unmistakable. He'd stay back within a pack of competitors like a cobra ready to strike. His late-arriving sprint and smooth take-off simulated an Amtrak metroliner run from Washington to Boston. The results were also unmistakable: two undefeated indoor seasons and five individual NCAA and IC4A titles.

"All through high school, I would lay back," began Don, "but it was more because I was never really fit.

"Now in college, I am in better shape, but I'm running against better caliber athletes. I'm not a leader, I'm a kicker. Strong runners take out the pace. I don't intentionally try to run from far back.

"When I compete against world-class athletes, they're just as fast or faster than I am. Mr. Elliott wants me to stay closer to the pack.

"It's a habit you have to break."

As Don became the terror of the IC4As, his reputation was still not world-wide until last June 2nd. That was the day of the Delany double.

"I didn't truly know if I could do it," the 6-0, 150-pound senior reflected. "In fact, I didn't know until the day before the meet.

Villanova's chances for the team championship were remote, especially with NCAA 600-yard champ Anthony Tufariello out because of injury. Don, the consummate team man, strategized with Coach Elliott by phone.

"He wasn't telling me and I didn't ask him," Don chuckled, after the fact. "He brought it up to me. He said, 'What do you think about running the 800 AND the 1,500?' ... there was a long pause... I said, 'What?'"

"I ran to win the 1,500. To win by the smallest margin possible. I sprinted with 100 to go. Then when I crossed the finish line, I felt pretty good. When someone told me I had run 53-point in the final quarter, I said, 'You've got to be kidding'."

Don had defeated Baylor's Todd Harbour by .07 of a second, but the winning time of 3:39.20 was the equivalent of a 3:56 mile, a tolling pace. The next race, the 800, was only 25 minutes away. Don's mind went to work in those two laps of tortuous pain.

"With 250 meters to go, I was trying to figure out team points," said Don, whose goal of a victory at that point was almost an after-thought. "If I got fifth place, we'd get so many points. But I forgot how many points we'd get and how many we needed to catch UTEP (Texas at El Paso). Finally I said, 'Forget it.'"

"With 150 meters to go, I was in fifth place. It was a stringy fifth. If I had to catch a pack, I don't know if I could have done it. But I decided to catch one runner, and then, another. I kept saying, 'Try for one more place.'"

"When I was in second place with 70 meters left, I just said to myself, 'The sooner I get to the finish line, the sooner I can rest. And when I got there, I rested.'"

Villanova might have been 16 points from catching UTEP for the NCAA championship, but Don had won the second race in 1:46.18, a personal best for him at that time, and had accomplished a seemingly impossible task of winning two individual races against a national collegiate class of fresh runners. It was done by Ron Delany in 1958. Delany, the 1956 Olympic 1,500 gold medalist from Ireland, did it for Villanova.

A man talents were tested to the limits. A natural for Ripley's Believe-It-Or-Not. And Don admitted he was thinking of team score more than individual achievement in a sport where egos reign supreme.

In a sense, this is what Don will be missing most when he wears a different color uniform this time next year. "I'll be able to do the things, I want to do," said Don, looking ahead in his future. "I can lead a race if I want to and employ different strategies. If I lose, I can write it off to experience. I won't have to worry about letting the team or the coach down.

"But I'll miss the team. The joking around, the unity, the spirit, the pressure."

Don's career is far from over. And just for added incentive to improve, he'll stay around the Philadelphia area. The finance major most probably will be studying for his master's degree, and will split his time by training.

"Running against other college runners doesn't bother me," he says, gazing into his imagination. "But I'll probably feel guilty or scared when I see a Villanova uniform next to me.

"I'll see someone who is under Jumbo now and that will make me worry and keep me training. I know I'll have to be in shape."

Part of that conditioning for Don over the past five years has been running on an antiquated banked-board track that is Villanova's indoor oval. Don suffered from leg stress fractures causing him to miss his first two outdoor seasons. Instead of cursing the hard, cold boards, he's blessed them and says, "I've enjoyed the indoor circuit. It's been a lot of fun. The fans are closer to the track. There's more electricity. If you lose a race, it's not a big letdown.

"Even though I complained over the past five years, and I don't have to, watch out next year, I'll go out there again. People will say, 'Look, you're going out for more punishment,' and I'll say, 'Yeah.'"

"I'm planning on running for two more years. I haven't reached my full potential. I'll go to grad school and ease up on my credits if I feel I'm peaking."

"You can always come back to get a job or an education, but you can't always train to peak. I don't want to miss my maturity."

"I've stepped up my training the past three years. I want to be the best I can be. If I feel I've reached my potential, than that's it. If I wake up and say track's a big hassle, then that's it."

This hurricane has whipped by Eamonn Coghlan and John Walker. He's blown away enough competitors to be part of seven IC4A championship teams and win 10 Penn Relays watches. He's stood on top of the mountain to claim three world records.

Track has been a way of life for Don Paige through the '70s, and the IC4A historians will mop up the records for some time when the wreckage of his latest wind-sprints come to rest this weekend. Though he has been running track to a calibrated routine over and over again, this All-American will not be ruled by the sport which has given him his fame.

Which says a lot about Don Paige, the person. Somehow you get the feeling that after this weekend, Don will be casting his fate to the wind.

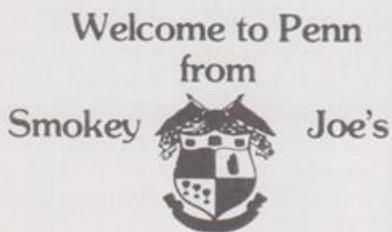
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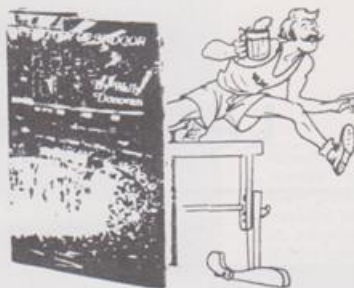
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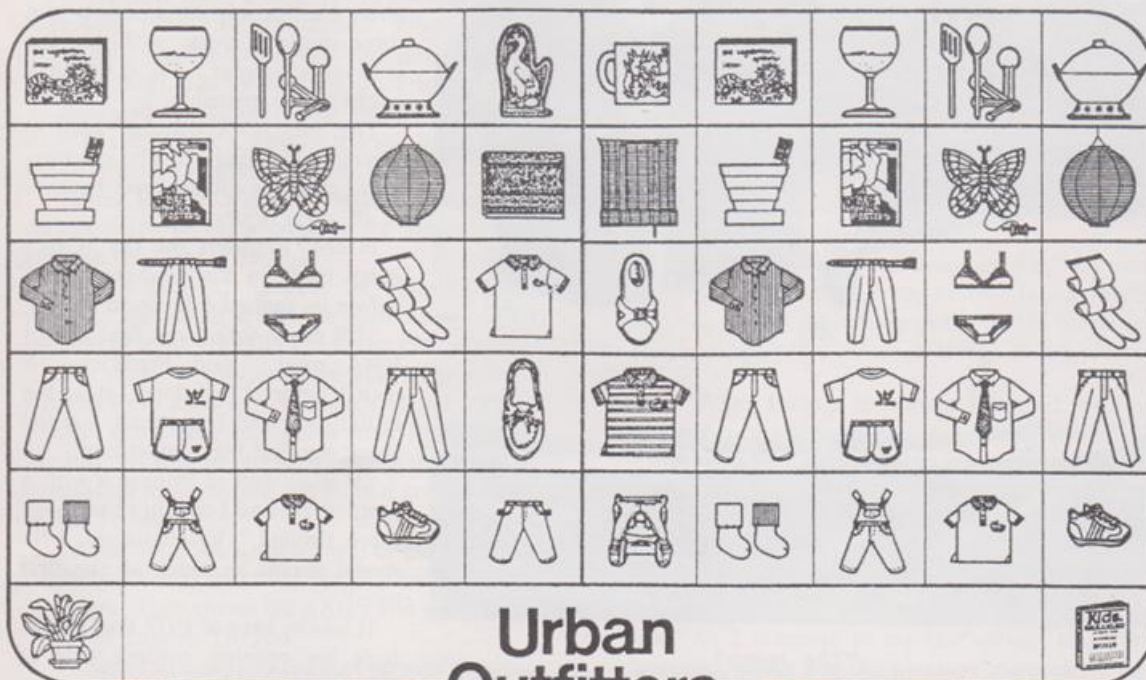

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Perfect Record in High Jump

Franklin Jacobs — Leaping for 7th IC4A Title

"The Jump"

Success never has been a problem for Franklin Jacobs during his illustrious high jumping career at Fairleigh Dickinson University.

Over the last four years, the 5-8¼ jumping jack has captured over 60 championships, and his amazing leap of 7-7¼ set a world indoor record in January of 1978 at the Millrose Games at Madison Square Garden.

The Paterson, N.J. native has earned crowns at the World Cup II, NCAA title meets, the Pan American Games and the AAU's.

However, despite all of his past laurels, Jacobs still holds a special place in his heart for the IC4A's. That's why he'll be out to turn in a superb performance in his last collegiate appearance at Franklin Field this weekend.

Jacobs, first of all, wants to keep his streak of victory in the IC4A's alive. He has won three indoor and three outdoor titles, with his top showing a jump of 7-5¾ at the 1978 outdoor championship.

The only IC4A title he failed to win came last year when he was forced to miss the indoor meet because of an ankle injury.

Jacobs' fondness for the IC4A's dates back to his freshman year, before he vaulted into world fame.

"I'll never forget my first indoor IC4A meet," said Franklin. "A month before I had done 7-0 for the initial time and I was really excited about my first big competition.

"Well, I won at Princeton with a jump of 7-1 and I couldn't have been more thrilled," he continued. "No medal means as much as the first one."

It was in May of 1977 that Jacobs took his opening outdoor title at 7-2¼.

"That was the meet that truly convinced me that I could go on to

bigger and better things," added Franklin. "I won at 7-2¼, but I had three good jumps at 7-4. I just felt inside that I would be going higher in a hurry."

Jacobs's self prognosis couldn't have been more accurate. That spring he leaped 7-5½ at the AAU outdoor meet in Los Angeles. Less than a half a year later he was world champion at age 19.

"I am kind of sad that this is my last IC4A," said Franklin. "It means an era in my life is coming to an end. I'll still be able to compete, but I'll miss not being a part of the FDU program."

"We have come a long way in the four years I have been here," he continued. "When I was a freshman I was the only one on the team to score at a major meet. Last winter we came in second to Villanova at the IC4A indoor meet and we were sixth at the NCAA's. I can't tell you how proud I am to witness the growth of our team."

Russ Rogers, FDU's first-year head coach, credits much of the growth of the Knights' program to the feats of Jacobs.

"Let's face it, he gave us visibility," said Rogers. "People all across the world knew of FDU because of what Franklin did in the high jump pit."

"Thanks to him we were able to recruit top athletes from all over," the coach added. "People want to come here because of what Franklin did. We just owe him so much. Anything that FDU accomplishes in the future will be in a great part due to Mr. Jacobs."

After the IC4A's, Jacobs will be performing at the NCAA's next month at the University of Texas at Austin. Then comes the AAU's and the Olympic Trials in Eugene, Oregon.

"Sure I'm disappointed that we won't be going to the Olympics," said Jacobs. "But I'm an American just like everyone else and I support my country's position. What the Russians did was

wrong and there was no way we could have sent a team there.

"I still don't plan to stop trying because there won't be any games, however. I still have my pride and my personal goals to shoot for in the meets ahead. They will pick a United States national team for the Trials in Eugene and I still have plenty of incentive to do well. I want to get the world outdoor record (7-8) this year and that will give me all the drive I need."

Jacobs' most immediate objective, however, will be to surpass 7-5¾ this Sunday.

"There are plenty of super young jumpers coming around," said Franklin. "I know 7-5¾ isn't going to stand for a long time. I'd love to jump 7-6 or even 7-7 so I can keep my name in the IC4A record book for a few years at least. I'll be giving it my utmost, you can count on that."

Jacobs is hoping to do well at the IC4A's and all the upcoming championships not just for his own personal satisfaction.

"I owe so much to so many people," he went on. "First of all, there is my mother Jannie Jacobs and our family. They have given me the moral encouragement to go on when things didn't look so bright."

"When I was a freshman, I injured my knee and my career seemed in jeopardy," he continued. "But my family stood behind me and let me know that I could come back and I did."

"I know a lot of kids in my situation might not have been so lucky. They might not have received the advice I was fortunate enough to receive and they might not have gone to college to get an education. As I compete in my last college meet this weekend, those are the pleasant memories I will take with me as I approach the high jump bar. I wonder where the time went. It certainly has been a wonderful four years..." Hasn't it?

It Should Be Villanova ... Barring Divine Intervention

It won't be the same. It can't be. Without Renaldo Nehemiah the IC4A outdoor championship can't possibly have the same lustre, the same charisma as in previous years. Of course, the meet will survive just the same. There will be other athletes like Villanova's Don Paige and Sydney Maree and Fairleigh Dickinson's Franklin Jacobs to compensate for Skeets' absence.

And yet it seems that no matter how many national and world class runners and jumpers may try, none may fill the substantial void left by Nehemiah, who left Maryland's track team this spring after being caught in an emotionally draining tug-of-war between Maryland Coach Frank Costello and the D.C. International Track Club. Skeets was the loser.

But then, so was the IC4A meet. The dynamic Nehemiah may be as easy to replace as Johnny Carson on The Tonight Show. "Of course, we're going to miss Nehemiah," said Villanova track Coach Jumbo Elliott at the recent International Freedom Games at Franklin Field.

Jumbo won't miss Nehemiah nearly as much as Costello, who counted on the versatile athlete in the sprints, hurdles and relays. His team may have been devastated by Nehemiah's departure. In recent years, the quest for a team championship has evolved into a two-horse race between Maryland and Villanova. A year ago the meet wasn't decided until the final event, the 1600-meter relay.

Now, Maryland may be joining the rest of the field, yapping at the heels of Elliott's awesome stable of thoroughbreds. Villanova, barring Divine intervention, is heavily favored to win its sixth straight IC4A title and 14th in the last 24 years. It may have been different with Nehemiah.

"It's going to hurt tremendously," Costello said. "Nehemiah was worth 30 to 40 points, but that's life. If he were sick or hurt, we couldn't run him either. Villanova's absolutely a heavy favorite. Villanova can't be beaten. They've got it in a cakewalk."

The ever-cautious Elliott, a master at juggling his athletes in such team competitions, has indicated that his Wildcats might be "peaking for one of our best performances of the year."

"But you just can't tell," he added. "Every individual has to work and put it together as a team. Maryland still has a better balanced running team."

Still, by the time the 1600-meter relay is run, Villanova should have safely tucked away another title. After that it could be Maryland or Fairleigh Dickinson.

Villanova appears capable of removing any drama that might have characterized last year's down-to-the-wire finish. Don Paige is back in an attempt to repeat his amazing double in the 800 and 1500, the first time that had been accomplished at an IC4A meet in 20 years.

Sydney Maree, the defending 5,000 meter champ, is expected to repeat. Amos Korir, who won both the steeplechase and the 10,000 last year, should at least get a first in the steeple, although he doesn't expect to run the 10,000, relinquishing that duty to rapidly developing teammate Carey Pinkowski.

The only question marks appear to be with defending 400 winner Keith Brown and Anthony Tufariello, both coming back from injuries. But the addition of freshmen Rodney Wilson, the nation's top schoolboy hurdler a year ago, and sprinter Carlton Young may make the Wildcats even stronger.

Maryland is relying heavily on the jumping events and the pole vault to pick up points. FDU, a burgeoning Eastern track power, not only has Jacobs in the high jump, but Solomon Chebor in the steeple and 5,000, Richard Ouma and Oliver Alves in the 800, Paul Steeds in the 1500 and Randy Smith in the hurdles.

In the 100 and 200-meter dashes, Young's competition will inevitably come from Adelphi's Ron Clarke, and Morgan State's Neville Hodge. Brown would have been favored in the 400, if he appeared fully recovered from a hamstring injury. Now, it will be difficult to beat the likes of Boston University's Glen Cohen, Seton Hall's Derrick Peynado and Brian Denman, Navy's Jeff Colvin and Glassboro State's Dave Hadley.

The 800 is the meet's glamor event this year, with Paige, Iona's Billy Martin, Manhattan's Sam Summerville, Alves, Ouma and Villanova's Mike England and John Hunter. For Paige to double in the 1500, he would have to knock off Richmond's Sosthenes Bitok, St. John's Ross Donoghue or Georgetown's Jim DeRienzo.

Korir's competition in the steeplechase will come from Richmond's Hillary Tuwei, Chebor and Georgetown's John Gregorek.

"Gregorek's so strong," Korir said, "I can't underestimate him by running in two events. Besides, there's no need really this year. Last year I did it mostly because of the points."

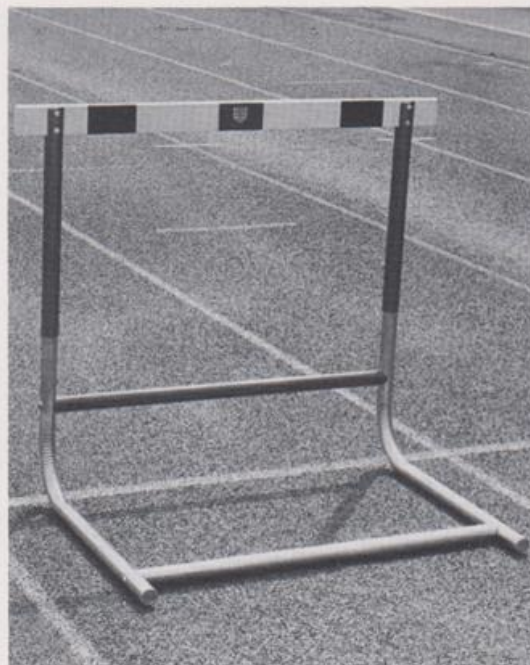
Chebor and Bitok will both try to chase down Maree in the 5,000. In the 10,000, if Providence comes, Dan Dillon and Ray Treacy could both score heavily.

Villanova's Wilson, perhaps the successor to Nehemiah, is the 110-hurdle favorite, while St. John's Tim Hanlon and Keith Allen and Maryland's Chris Person appear to be the strength of the intermediate hurdles competition.

The high jump winner should not be a surprise. Jacobs is easily the class of the field. But Maryland expects to pick up some points there as well as in the pole vault, along with Rhode Island, and long jump and triple jump with Cornelius Cousins. Manhattan's Tony Harlin would have been the favorite in the shot, until he left school. Now it will be Iona's Steve Dobson.

Other weight event favorites include Northeastern's Ron Melkonian in the discus, Manhattan's Manny Silverio in the hammer and Glassboro State's Mike Juskus in the javelin.

Adelphi, Seton Hall, Villanova and Morgan State are closely matched in the 4x100 relay. But the Wildcats, who won the 4x400-meter relay a year ago to capture the championship, aren't even entered this year. By almost everyone's calculations, Jumbo won't miss that team nearly as much as Maryland will miss Nehemiah.
