Three hundred Air Force reserve second lieutenant appointments are open in the Air Weather Service for college men, both military and civilian, who can qualify for meteorology training.

Lt. Col. Jack W. Dieterle, professor of air science and tactics, explained yesterday that a baccalaureate degree with a year of physics and mathematics credit through integral calculus is required. He said that selected second lieutenant appointments for meteorology training will be ordered to active duty at the earliest possible date.

will be stressed.

He said that he wants AIM and the four member councils, Nitany, Pollock, West Dorm, and Town, to sponsor a program which will bring AIM and the councils closer to the men in their areas. He suggested this might be accomplished by sponsoring more competitive affairs.

Reese also asked for closer cooperation and work between AIM and Leonides.

Two amendments to the AIM constitution have been passed by the Board of Governors and the necessary three-out-of-four councils. Another amendment has not

received the approval of three councils.

The amendments passed change the date of the AIM elections from the first two weeks in May to the first two weeks in April, and make the AIM vice president chairman of the constitutional committee. The amendment that failed would have restricted the AIM presidency to a senior.
