## Woman dies in marital dispute

The fatal shooting of a 33-year-old Howard woman Sunday was apparently the result of a marital dispute, a spokeswoman from District Magistrate Robert Shoff's office said yesterday.

Elizabeth J. Young Bryan, RD 3, Howard, was pronounced dead at the scene of the shooting by county coroner Robert Neff. She died of a single gunshot wound to the head, Neff's spokeswoman said.

The woman's husband, Paul William Bryan, 62, was charged with criminal homicide and aggravated as-

sault in the incident, which occurred in the couple's home at 1:45 a.m. Sunday, State Police said.

Police said Bryan used a 12-gauge shotgun. He was arraigned before Shoff and is being held in Centre County prison in lieu of \$100,000 bail. A preliminary hearing is scheduled for 10 a.m. tomorrow.

Shoff's spokeswoman said Bryan called a neighbor after the shooting and told him that he just shot his wife. The neighbor then called Rockview State Police.

## Thefts at Pattee create sad endings

To cut down on the recent surge of thefts at Pattee, officials have placed a sign in the library lobby warning students not to leave books and personal property unattended, a library official said yesterday.

James Neal, assistant dean of reference and instructional services, said library officials were unaware of the magnitude of the thefts in the library — about 20 in the past two weeks — until University Police Services informed them of the problem.

Neal said that although the library

is not responsible for security within Pattee, library officials decided to make an effort to warn students about leaving back packs, purses and other personal items unattended.

"With the number of people coming into this building, it is inevitable that

thefts will occur," Neal said.

Neal added that thefts in the library as well in other buildings on campus are not unusual, especially at the end of a semester and around the holidays.
