## AVC Letter to Milholland

TO THE EDITOR: The following is a copy of the letter sent to Acting President James Milholland by the Centre County Chapter AVC protesting the co-op decision of the Board of Trustees:

"We of the American Veterans Committee strongly endorse the 'Collegian' editorial deploring the Board of Trustees' rejection of the proposed student co-operative store.

"We feel the action of the Board of Trustees to be unjustifiable discrimination against the students of this college and a subservient catering to private interests in the community. A great many of the Penn State students are peculiarly distressed under the present inflationary conditions and feel that this action of the Board of Trustees unnecessarily imposes continued hardships upon them.

"We respectfully urge you to use your influence toward securing a reconsideration by the Board of Trustees of the co-op proposal at the earliest possible moment."
