

Linksmen Down Colgate, 5-2, Boost Seasonal Record to 7-4

The Penn State golf team put the finishing touches on another winning season with a 5-2 victory over Colgate on the home links yesterday. The win boosted the Nittanians' final record to 7-4.

The veteran Lions, with five seniors closing out their college careers, coasted to the win despite Dick Burgoon's third dual-meet loss of the campaign.

Colgate captain Don Allen spoiled Burgoon's farewell by downing the Nittany captain, 4 and 2. Allen roared around the Lion links in 71 strokes.

Big Bob Devine, the Nittanians' number two man, wrapped up medalist honors with a 70 when he stopped former New Jersey amateur champion Lloyd Monroe, 5 and 4.

Roy Altman grabbed the Lions' second victory of the meet in the closest match of the day.

Altman was pitted against Maroon veteran Terry Van Houten and the match wasn't decided until the 20th hole which Altman parred to win 1-up.

Colgate coach Jim Dalgety went with promising sophomore Stu Benedict in the fourth match against Ed Kormos. Benedict responded with a 4 and 3 win to knot the meet score, 3-2.

But superior depth told the story as coach Joe Boyle's Lions swept the last three matches without too much trouble.

Junior John Morton broke the tie in the fifth match with Colgate junior Bill Weatherwax. Weatherwax was never in the match as Morton breezed home, 9 and 8.

Haydn Thomas bowed out with a win in the sixth match. The Lion letterman was never pressed on his way to a 5 and 3 win over Tom Drucker.

Lanky junior Bob Rutherford took the final point for the Lions in the seventh match with a 3 and 2 win over Frank Gundlach.

IM Track Qualifiers Set Moore Favored For Title Bid Tomorrow

In Besmanoff Fight Tonight

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — Archie Moore, the venerable king of the light heavyweights, will carry about 200 pounds and 2 to 1 favoritism against German's transplanted Willie Besmanoff in a 10-round non-title bout tonight.

Moore's manager Jack "Doc" Kearns, says the 175-pound champion is "heavy, but not fat" for the heavyweight match, which will attract an estimated 8000 into the State Fairgrounds Coliseum and produce a gross of about \$60,000.

The round Moore claims he is not rusty, even though his last start was last Aug. 12, when he pole-axed Yvon Durelle in three rounds of a title bout.

Besmanoff, 27, who also weighs close to 200, is a native of Munich, Germany, but now fights—in journeyman fashion—out of Milwaukee. Some 16 or 18 years younger than Moore, Besmanoff dropped a 10-round split decision to Archie May 2, 1958.

That fight was part of the Kentucky Derby activity and, according to Kearns, Moore's chief preparation was merely talking off his hat and entering the ring.

The three-day IM track carnival started at Beaver Field last night with some fast action in the qualifying round of the sprints. The championships in the field events will be decided tonight, with the sprint titles being decided tomorrow.

The top six men in each division qualified for the finals in the 100 yard dash, 440 and the 880 relay.

Ted Steinman of Zeta Beta Tau, who won the 100 last year in 10.5, ran a 10.4 and Bob Klein of Delta Upsilon was second with a 10.6.

Omega Psi Phi (1:36.5) and Delta Upsilon (1:37.5) will battle it out for the 880 relay championship. The IM record in this event is 1:35.7 set last year by Delta Upsilon.

In the independent class the Penn State Athletic Club won the 880 Relay title in 1:40.3.
