



You may have noticed a foul smell near your lakeshore among floating vegetation. This is blue-green algae. It is caused by an inflow of phosphorous mixing with available nitrogen from the atmosphere. Algae blooms could be due to lake destratification or a rapid influx of phosphorous from land sources. We have been in contact with Freshwater Science and were told it should dissipate soon. These algae may reappear throughout the summer. It is naturally occurring and will not be treated. Our advice is if it smells bad, don't go in. **Keep children and pets away and do not let them drink the water.**
