Anticipation.....the ice will soon release the dancing waters of Cedar Lake to another season of bustling activity. Ah, spring!

Some might think that winter is a quiet, inactive time for the CLCC board members, but truth is that there is a great deal of activity going on while the snow covers the land-scape—just as there is much going on beneath that thick ice. Included among the activities of CLCC this winter are aquatic invasive species (AIS) treatment strategies, Wright Regional Inspection Program (WRIP) expansion tasks, bylaw revisions, picnic planning, directory update preparation, website transition, and many more.

A major focus has been the process of expanding WRIP—which requires an inspection before launching a watercraft—to include Cedar Lake for a total of nine area lakes. The support of the Wright County Board of Commissioners has taken the decision to the doorstep of the DNR. Please see the article on page 3 for more information about recent developments.

Inspecting our watercraft for invasive species is critical to the goal of preserving and protecting the precious water of Cedar Lake. Much appreciation for the intense efforts of the Wright County Regional Inspection Coalition which represents the lake associations as decisions are made about the program. Cedar Lake resident Kathy Jonsrud serves as an officer for the Coalition.

CLCC Vice President Karl Leslie led the Board of Directors in a careful revision of the CLCC bylaws. A day of strategic planning in January resulted in clarification and definition of the structure by which we operate. All members will vote on adoption of these revisions at our annual meeting on September 7<sup>th,</sup> 9am, Corinna Township Hall (9801 Ireland Ave NW). Thank you to Karl for his expertise and time in this process.

A grand picnic is being prepared for you! The events committee is already underway, with new ideas to make the picnic a day of enjoyable community connection. New members have added pizzazz—see page 2! Gratitude for the willingness and enthusiasm of all the members planning. We look forward to celebrating with YOU on July 20<sup>th</sup>!

# Wright Regional Watercraft Inspection Program (WRIP) Waiting for DNR Approval to Open



The CLCC Board of Directors has signaled its intention to join the Wright Regional Inspection Program (WRIP). The cost for Cedar's participation in the program is \$18,000/year with a 3 year participation agreement.

The CLCC Board of Directors plans to use our Clearwater River Watershed District (CRWD) Aquatic Invasive Species project funds for the expense. See page 7 for more information about CRWD and their important role for Cedar Lake.

In 2018, lakes in the program were Sylvia, John, and Pleasant. The program requires free watercraft and trailer inspection prior to entering those lakes.

There was a great deal of activity over the winter to secure the program expansion and enhancements with the Wright County Commissioners and the DNR. A key enhancement for the 2019 program includes spot-checkers, scheduled for shifts, at the accesses in the program. The spot checkers will provide program education **and exit inspections**. Program rovers will continue to regularly visit accesses (see question to the right).

As of this writing, the program is in the final stages of securing DNR approval. On April 5th, the DNR communicated they would not approve the submitted 2019 Plan. In the past, the plan has been adjusted; the need to adapt processes in a new, complex program is not surprising. Collaboration will continue to seek DNR approval.

The CLCC Board of Directors is committed to keeping you abreast of the developments; please watch your email, newsletter, and website for WRIP developments.

#### Frequently Asked Questions

#### What does the inspection involve?

During the free inspection, an inspector will visually and tactilely inspect your watercraft and trailer for AIS. You may be required to undergo a hot water decontamination, which is also provided at no charge. After, you will receive a Certificate of Inspection to place on the



dashboard of the tow vehicle. Your watercraft will be zip tied to the trailer and after launch, the zip tie seal must be placed in the collection box at the landing.

## Will the entrance inspection requirements apply to me as a lake shore owner?

Yes, all inspection requirements will apply to lake shore own-

ers. To launch in the spring, an inspection of the watercraft + trailer must be performed. If your guests launch a watercraft, they will need to have an inspection prior to launch. In the fall, if you use an access to remove your watercraft, the trailer must be inspected before using the access.

Docks, lifts, other watercraft that are removed from the lake and stored on your property (not transported over public roads) do not need an inspection.

## Can I get my boat inspected ahead of time?

Yes! The Proof of Inspection and zip-tie are good until the zip tie is broken. Plan ahead to maximize fun time on the lake.

What are these "rovers" I hear about for the program?

As part of the process, the accesses in the program are checked regularly by a member of the WRIP staff. They check for compliance and gather the zip tie seals. Law enforcement is alerted of noncompliant tow vehicles.

Are there special provisions for fishing leagues?

Yes! If there are 10 or more boats needing an inspection, call 763-682–1933 ext. 3 **three business days in advance**. A best effort will be made to arrange for inspections at the access for the event.

Where are the funds coming from to run the program? Lakes in the program contribute money and a grant was awarded by the Initiative Foundation. State AIS Prevention funds (managed by Wright County) also help fund the pro-

gram.

Where is the Regional Inspection Station?

When it opens, what are the hours? The regional site is in the Annandale Business Park --1300 Business Blvd in Annandale (north on Annandale Blvd from HWY 55 and follow road to the end).



Where: Annandale Business Park 1300 Business Boulevard

Hours: 7 days a week 1/2 hour before sunrise to 1/2 hour after sunset

#### Spring is on Its Way

It has been a very long winter for us who don't migrate south. But we can now walk outside and see and hear the lake coming to life. We are very lucky to be on a lake that so many of you care about--water quality, wildlife and our fisheries are on just about everybody's radar. Now is the time to get out there and tend to our wood duck, bluebird, and purple martin houses. Maybe this is the year you have decided to plant some native grasses and wildflowers along your shoreline. Whatever you do, whether big or small, you can make our paradise just a little better!

#### Loons | Adding a New Platform

This year we will be adding a new loon nesting platform. The committee is in the process of constructing it. We usu-

ally get the platforms and nesting buoys out shortly after ice out. In the past, we have seen the loons patiently waiting for the platform

installation and then delight when they jump up on the platforms while we are still in the area. This will give us a total of four nesting platforms on the lake. Please watch for the loon awareness buoys as a platform is always nearby. And just a reminder to you and your friends to keep your distance from our loons (at least 100 feet) during the nesting period and after the hatching of the chick(s).

#### **Purple Martins**

We expect the purple martins to return to Cedar Lake in April. Purple martins can be seen all over Cedar Lake. This is a rare site in many other areas. Their

song and flying acrobatics dazzle all! They are one of the few birds that depend 100 percent on human constructed housing. We now may have one of the largest colonies of purple martins in the area. Two of our sites—at Camp Courage/True Friends and Schroeder Park—are managed by the CLCC Fish and Wildlife Committee.

Take a moment to check-out these sites; listen to the vocalization and enjoy the aerial acrobatics of the largest of all swallows. Purple martins are kind, smart, and important and have a wide range of bewitching songs. Dragon flies are their favorite food, and Cedar Lake, with our excellent water quality, is a great hunting ground. The numerous martin landlords on Cedar do an awesome job of caring for these birds. If you are interested in hosting a colony, feel free to contact the committee and we can get you the information you need to be a successful landlord.

#### Walleye Stocking

Cedar Lake has a long tradition of successful walleye stocking. With your generous support, we stock walleyes every other year coordinating with the DNR stocking. We look forward to stocking again in the fall of 2020. The DNR is scheduled to stock this fall. Currently we have ~\$1,300 in the Walleye Stocking fund. Our goal is \$8,000 which gets us approximately 8,000+ fingerlings. #### **DNR Fisheries on Cedar**

DNR Fisheries is planning to be on Cedar Lake this summer. First, an early spring assessment of our walleye and pike population, along with a crappie and bluegill evaluation. Then a regular lake survey (gill and trap nets) is scheduled the week of July 8th. We have a strong relationship with DNR Fisheries and will look forward to sharing the results of the DNR's work.

## Zebra Mussels on Cedar What to Expect and Stewardship Practices by Glenn Baird glennabaird@gmail.com | 612-599-4639

Late summer in 2018 we confirmed the presence of zebra mussels at multiple locations on the lake. Given the lakewide infestation, with current chemical treatment strategies, we are not a candidate for treatment. Most of the zebra mussels were found on docks and lifts, though some have been discovered on monitoring devices.

Most of the zebra mussels were 1/4" to 1/2" in size—about 1 to 2 years in age.

In a comparable search on Sugar Lake in 2018, a similar zebra mussel infestation was identified.

#### WHAT TO EXPECT

The zebra mussel infestation on Cedar will continue to grow. How fast? Only time will tell. Zebra mussels disrupt the ecological food chain and the long term impact to lakes is difficult to predict. Given Cedar's low phosphorus level (food for zebra mussels) the infestation will take three to five years to fully understand. Thereafter, the infestation may move into an ebb and flow pattern.

We can expect the phosphorus level in our lake to decrease, and water clarity will more than likely increase. The increasing water clarity can promote native vegetation. Invasive aquatic vegetation seems to take particularly quick

advantage of increased water clarity, so our management practices of curly leaf pondweed and eurasian water milfoil must remain vigilant.

Now that we face this infestation, here are some important stewardship practices we all must do and remain eyesforward for new science.

Zebra mussels are attracted to darker, quiet areas; docks, lifts, and sea-legs tend to be favorite spots. If you sell your equipment, seriously consider doing so only after it has over-

wintered. The one sure method for killing zebra mussels is freezing. If you need to sell equipment in the summer months, it must (by Minnesota law) be out of the water for 21 days before installing in a new lake. Plan to do a high pressure hot water decontamination at the free service at the Wright Regional Watercraft Inspection site at 1300 Business Blvd, Annandale, MN (April to October).

- If your watercraft is "resident" to Cedar Lake (e.g. in the lake all summer) there is a good chance it will have zebra mussels. Given this knowledge, and the difficulty and time for a complete decontamination, consider not visiting other lakes with your watercraft.
- New zebra mussel management strategies are emerging from the Minnesota Aquatic Invasive Research Center (www.maisrc.umn.edu). New studies of "spot" treatment for heavily infested zebra mussel areas are being researched.

### CLCC Committees | Is this your year to step up?

#### 2019 Control of Curly Leaf Pondweed and Eurasian Water Milfoil



The Water Quality Committee, with oversight by the CLCC Board of Directors, has plans well in place for 2019 treatment of curly leaf pondweed (CLP) and eurasian water milfoil (EWM).

Here is a summary of CLP and EWM 2019 planned treatment.

#### **Curly Leaf Pondweed**

- $\Diamond$  21.2 acres to treat, with treatment likely in late May.
- We are exploring using a less expensive chemical (diquat) with the DNR. This is used in the metro area for CLP treatment.

#### **Eurasian Water Milfoil**

- ♦ 5 acres to treat, with treatment likely in early July.
- ♦ There are new areas on the southwest side to treat.
- ♦ CLCC received a \$2,275 grant from Wright County to treat EWM.



#### What can we do?

- ♦ If you must take your watercraft to a lake with starry stonewort it is imperative to do a decontamination before going to another lake. THOROUGHLY inspect bunk trailers as it can be spread by fragments.

- ♦ Watch the lake carefully for changes in vegetation. Report any suspicious vegetation to Glenn Baird (glennabaird@gmail.com).


## 2018 Water Quality Numbers Are Great

The results are in! Samples are regularly taken from our lake during the summer months by the Clearwater River Watershed District to monitor water quality. Analysis is done by a laboratory.

We again had outstanding water quality values on Cedar in 2018. We have enjoyed consistent water quality, even with some unusual years of high precipitation and heat. Clearly, our Clearwater River Watershed District project implemented in 2006--and with recent enhancements--is delivering results.

Here's a summary of our 2018 values:

- The gold standard for monitoring lake water quality is the phosphorus level. A good lake is considered to have a level less than 40ug/l. The average 2018 phosphorus level in Cedar was 19.5 ug/L, achieving our project goal of 20ug/l.
- The secchi depth (clarity) reading was an average of 9.1 feet. This is a bit lower than last year and certainly within expected year to year variations.
- The chlorophyll was 6.2 ug/L which indicates limited \_\_\_ algae blooms.





#### **Phosphorus Level**

The lower the phosphorus level, the cleaner our lake is. The primary phosphorus source for our lake is the south inlet. Clearwater River Watershed projects (fish barriers, buffer management, and retention ponds) reduce the amount of phosphorus into our lake.

### **Secchi Depth (Clarity)**

A measurement that we all can identify with is the clarity of the water. A secchi disk is a disk with alternating black and white areas that is lowered into the water until it can no longer be seen from the surface.





#### Chlorophyll-a

Chlorophyll-a usually goes hand in hand with the phosphorus level—the lower the better. In general, the chlorophyll-a level rises with the presence of algae blooms.


## HWY 55 Road Construction | Will impact Cedar Lake

Hwy 55	Detours, traffic impacts
Stage 1 begins late-April: Annandale to Maple Lake	About six weeks. Road closes to traffic between Annandale Blvd and CR 7/37. Detour uses CR 5 and CR 37.
Stage 2 begins early-June: Maple Lake to Buffalo	About five weeks. Road closes to traffic between CR 8/Oak Ave and Hwy 25. Detour uses CR 8/Oak Ave, CR 37 and Hwy 25. Temp signal at CR 8 and CR 37 in Maple Lake. Stage 2 begins after June 1, when school season ends.
Stage 3 in July: Maple Lake	About two weeks. Lane closures with flaggers between CR 7/37 and CR 8/Oak Ave.






