Peaches N Cream by Barb Thomsen

1 cookie pie crust mixture 1 1 pound can of peaches
1 tsp of lemon juice 1 cup whipping cream
3 cups miniture marshmallows

Drain peaches- reserving 1/4 cup syrup. Heat fruit and syrup. Then put in blender or mixer. In blender run on low speed until smooth, or in mixer until smooth. Add lemon juice and marshmallows. Again mix until smooth. Pour in bowl and fold in whipping cream. Pour in pie pan. Freeze 3-4 hours.
