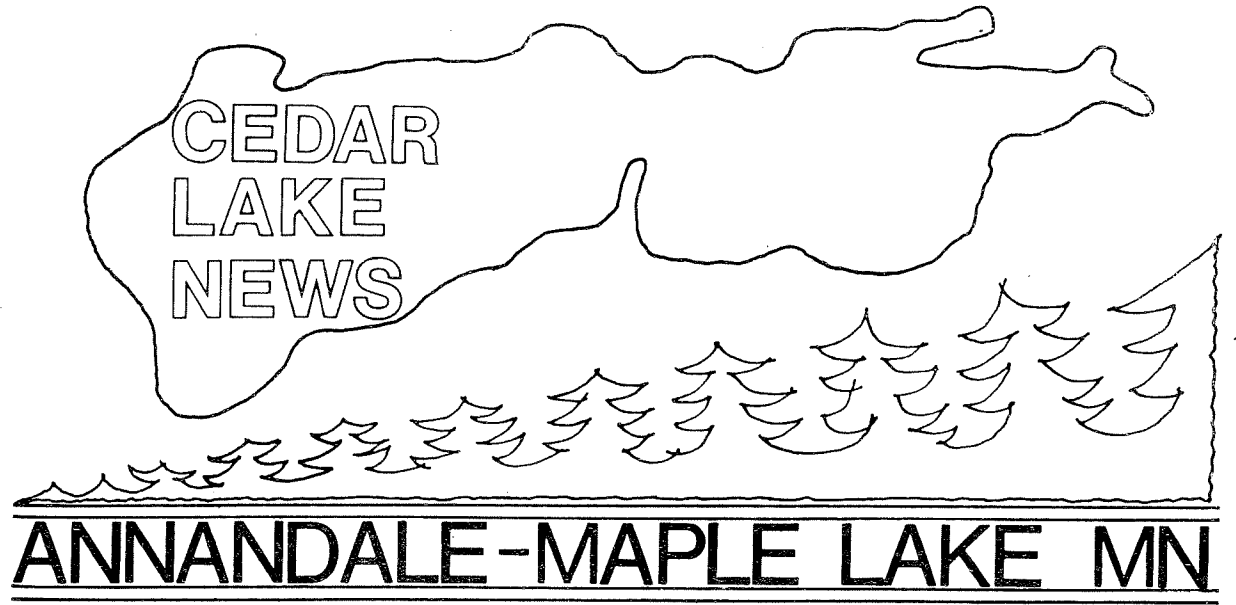

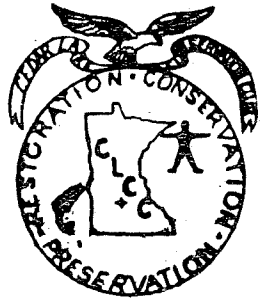

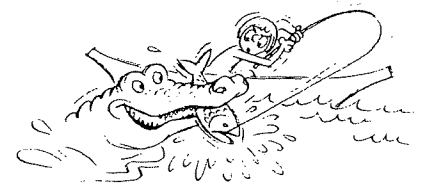
FISHING CONTEST 1976

CONFUSION ON LAKESHORE RIGHTS

THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES SAID TODAY THAT SOME PERSONS HAVE MISTAKEN IDEAS ABOUT THE OWNERSHIP OF LAKESHORE PROPERTY IN MINNESOTA AND THE PUBLIC'S RIGHT TO USE SUCH LAND.

THE DNR DIVISION OF WATERS HAS RECEIVED NUMEROUS CALLS THIS SUMMER FROM PEOPLE WHO ARE UNDER THE ILLUSION THAT THE STATE OWNS A STRIP OR CORRIDOR OF LAND AROUND ALL LAKES AND STREAMS.

SOME CALLERS SAY THEY THINK THE WIDTH OF THIS IMAGINARY CORRIDOR IS FIVE FEET. OTHERS SAY THEY UNDERSTAND IT IS 10 OR 20 FEET.

EITHER WAY, THEY ARE WRONG, SAID OFFICIALS.

THE STATE DOES NOT OWN ANY SUCH STRIP OF LAND AROUND LAKES AND STREAMS. THE ONLY LAND THE STATE OWNS IS LAND IT HAS ACQUIRED OR LAND THAT WAS NEVER SOLD FROM THE TIME THE STATE ENTERED THE UNION.

WHILE IT IS TRUE THAT SOME LAKESHORE IS OWNED BY THE STATE, FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, COUNTIES, MUNICIPALITIES OR OTHER LEVELS OF GOVERNMENT, MOST OF THE LAKESHORE IN MINNESOTA IS IN PRIVATE HANDS.

THE LANDOWNER GENERALLY OWNS ALL OF THE LAND TO THE WATER'S EDGE AND THE PUBLIC HAS NO MORE RIGHT TO USE SUCH LAND THAN THEY HAVE TO USE THE LANDOWNER'S LIVING ROOM.

ALTHOUGH THE WATER IN MOST LAKES AND STREAMS IS PUBLIC PROPERTY, THE ADJACENT SHORELINE IS MOST OFTEN PRIVATE.

OFFICIALS POINTED OUT THAT THIS FACT IS ONE REASON WHY THE DNR HAS AN ACTIVE PROGRAM TO ACQUIRE PROPERTY ON LAKES AND STREAMS FOR PUBLIC ACCESS PURPOSES. PUBLIC ACCESS SITES ON LAKES ARE POSTED WITH SIGNS.

OFFICIALS SAID PROPERTY OWNERS WHO ARE TROUBLED BY TRESPASSERS SHOULD CONTACT THE LOCAL POLICE OR SHERIFF'S OFFICE.

HUNTERS REMINDED OF CHANGE IN FIREARMS LAW

ENFORCEMENT OFFICIALS AT THE MINNESOTA DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES HAVE ADVISED HUNTERS AND OTHERS WHO CARRY FIREARMS IN THEIR MOTOR VEHICLE THAT A CHANGE WAS MADE IN THE LAW DURING THE PAST SESSION OF THE LEGISLATURE.

PREVIOUSLY, THE LAW ALLOWED THE CARRYING OF AN UNLOADED AND CASED FIREARM OR BOW ANYWHERE WITHIN THE CAR, BUT THIS PROVISION WAS AMENDED AT THE DNR'S REQUEST.

UNDER THE AMENDED LAW, THE FIREARM OR BOW MUST BE UNLOADED, CASED AND CARRIED IN THE TRUNK OF THE VEHICLE. IF THE VEHICLE HAS NO TRUNK, THE BOW OR FIREARM MUST BE CARRIED IN THE "REAR MOST LOCATION" IN THE VEHICLE.

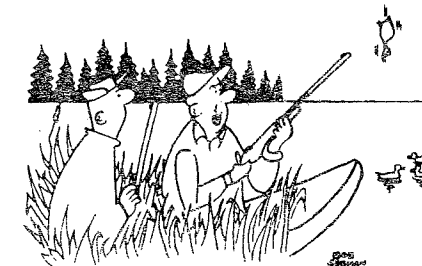
DON MURRAY, ACTING ENFORCEMENT CHIEF, SAID PURPOSE OF THE AMENDMENT WAS TO HAMPER DEER SHINERS AND OTHER POACHERS.

"IN THE PAST," SAID MURRAY, "POACHERS COULD SHOOT THE DEER OUT OF THE CAR WINDOW AND HAVE THE GUN UNLOADED AND CASED BEFORE THE CONSERVATION OFFICER COULD APPREHEND THEM.

"NOW, THE POACHER WILL HAVE TO GET OUT OF THE CAR, REMOVE THE FIREARM FROM THE TRUNK, UNCASE IT, LOAD IT, SHOOT, UNLOAD IT, CASE IT, RETURN IT TO THE TRUNK AND SHUT THE TRUNK LID.

"IF OUR OFFICER HAS THE PLACE UNDER SURVEILLANCE, HE WILL BE ABLE TO APPREHEND THE POACHER BEFORE HE CAN COMPLETE ALL THESE STEPS."

HE SAID THE CHANGE IN THE LAW SHOULD MAKE IT EASIER TO GET CONVICTIONS IN THE COURTS.

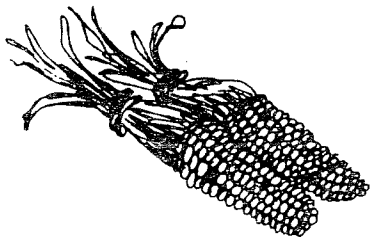
ACCORDING TO STATE OFFICIALS THE MALLARD HATCH THIS SPRING WAS UP 25% IN WRIGHT COUNTY.

THINGS TO DO AT YOUR SUMMER HOME
BEFORE YOU LOCK IT UP FOR THE SEASON

WRAP YOUR YOUNG TREES WITH PAPER UP ABOUT FOUR FEET. THIS WILL HELP PROTECT THE TREES SO THAT THE ANIMALS DON'T CHEW ON THE YOUNG BARK. CHECK YOUR CHIMNEY SO SQUIRRELS, CHIPMUNKS, AND BIRDS DON'T HAVE A WAY OF ENTERING. CHECK OPENINGS AROUND PIPES ENTERING YOUR HOME SO YOU DON'T HAVE A RODENT PROBLEM. REMEMBER YOU MAY PARTICIPATE IN OPERATION I D THROUGH THE ANNANDALE STATE BANK. BE SURE AND TAKE A FEW MINUTES AND STOP BY THE BANK, FILL OUT THE NECESSARY FORMS AND PICK UP YOUR OPERATION I D MARKER, IT MAY BE TO YOUR ADVANTAGE.

BATTER FRIED FISH - MRS. TED J. WRATKOWSKI

- 1 CUP FLOUR
- 1 12 OZ. CAN BEER
- 2 TSP. SALT
- 2 TSP. PAPRIKA

MIX TOGETHER - DIP FISH FIRST IN FLOUR THAN IN BATTER. DEEP FRY AT 350° - DRAIN ON PAPER TOWEL. WHEN FRYING PUT IN JUST A FEW PIECES TO KEEP EVEN TEMPERATURE. FRY UNTIL GOLDEN.

CHICKEN SALAD - ESTHER HEGG

- 1-4 LB. CHICKEN - SEASONED, COOKED, BONED AND CUT IN SMALL PIECES
- 3 C. COOKED SMALL ELBOW MACARONI
- 1 C. DICED CELERY
- 1 SMALL ONION, GRATED
- 1 C. GRATED CARROTS

MIX INGREDIENTS AND ADD THE FOLLOWING DRESSING:
MIX TOGETHER 1 1/2 C. SALAD DRESSING, 1/2 C. CONDENSED MILK AND 2 TBSP. SUGAR
PLACE IN REFRIGERATOR, COVERED, FOR 3 OR 4 HOURS AND JUST BEFORE SERVING ADD 1 CAN NO. 3 SHOESTRING POTATOES

CARROT BARS OR CAKE - FROM THE KITCHEN OF BILLY APPELGREN

BEAT EGGS, ADD SUGAR AND OIL, ADD FLOUR, SODA, SALT, CINN, AND VANILLA. BEAT WELL, STIR IN CARROTS, NUTS AND RAISINS. POUR INTO GREASED AND FLOURED PAN 13X9, BAKE AT 350° - 25 TO 30 MIN. - WHEN COOL FROST

CREAM CHEESE FROSTING

BEAT 1 PKG 3 OZ. CREAM CHEESE
2 TBSP BUTTER AND 1 1/2 C. CONFECTIONERS SUGAR, 1 TSP. VANILLA
BEAT UNTIL SMOOTH.
