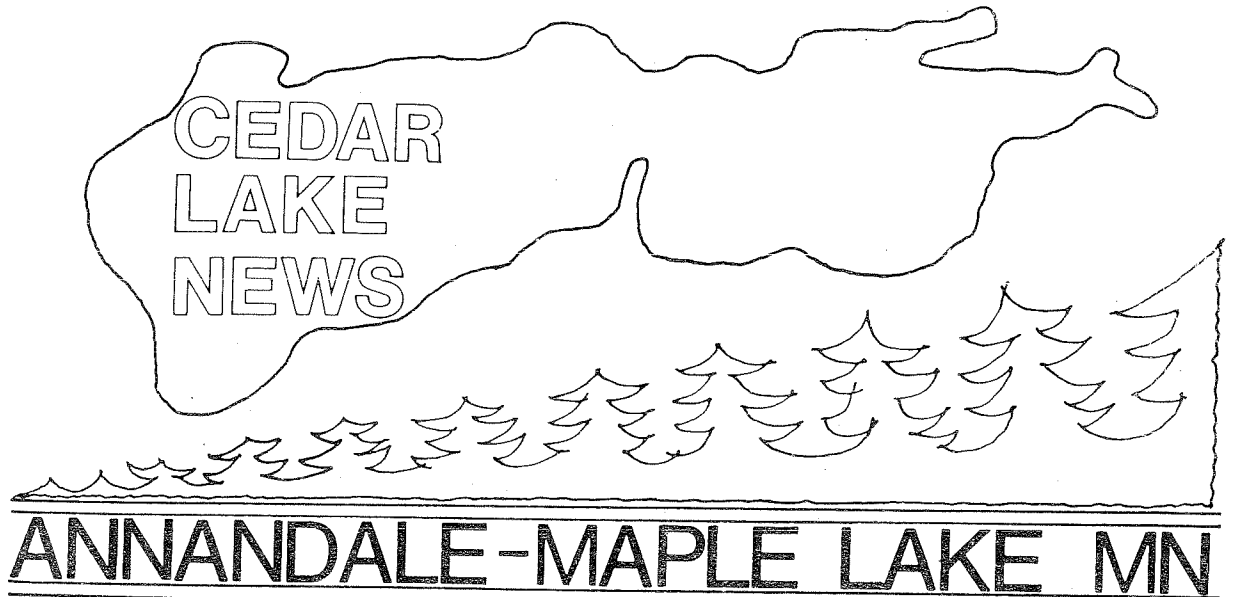

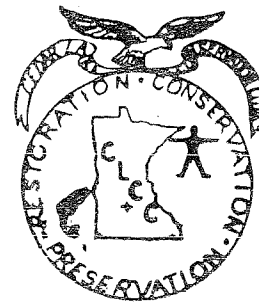

A FEW AROUND WHO REMEMBER AND APPRECIATE ALL HE DID.

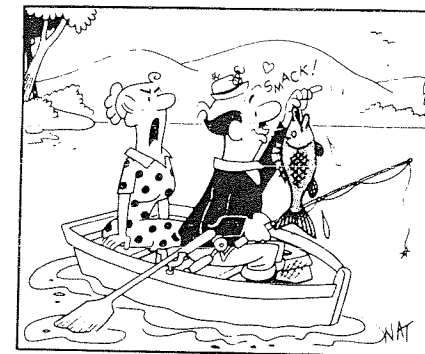
HE WAS ALWAYS A FISHERMAN AND IF NO ONE ELSE HAD FISH, ART ALWAYS HAD

MINUTES FROM THE JUNE 25TH MEETING OF THE C.L.C.C.
HELD AT THE CORRINA TOWNSHIP HALL - 21 IN ATTENDANCE

THE TREASURERS REPORT WAS GIVEN FOR THE PAST YEAR, AND WAS APPROVED AS READ. MR. AND MRS. CLARENCE HEGG VOLUNTERED TO AUDIT THE RECORDS.

A CREEK REPORT WAS GIVEN BY CLARENCE HEGG IN WHICH HE SUMMARIZED HIS DISCUSSIONS WITH MR. MOONEY. THE CLUB GAVE MR. HEGG AUTHORIZATION TO FURTHER CONFER WITH MR. MOONEY REGARDING THE CLEANING OF THE CREEK AT THE SOUTH END OF THE LAKE.

REYES FOUND OUT THE DAM IS UNDER STATE JURISDICTION, AND THEY HAVE BEEN NOTIFIED OF THE PROBLEM AND ASSURED MR. REYES THE DAM WOULD BE CHECKED OUT.)

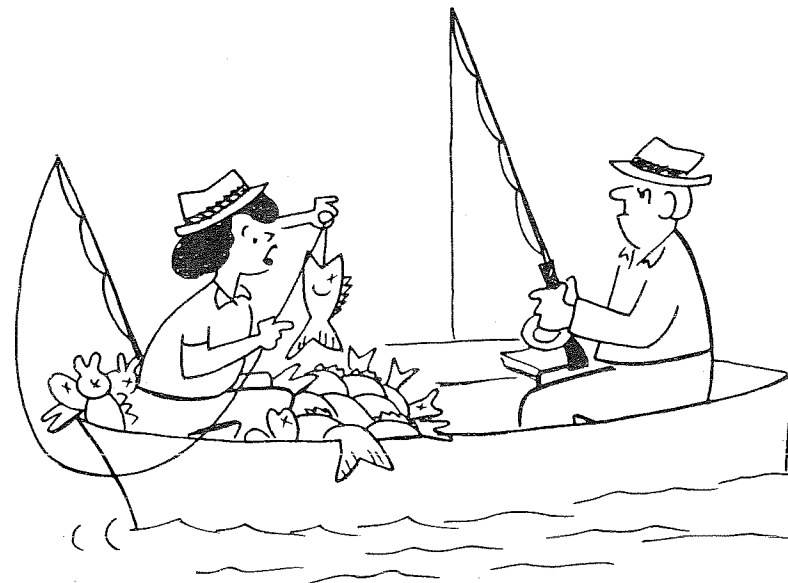

MAJOR FISH AND WILDLIFE BILLS PASSED AT RECENT SESSION

SEVERAL IMPORTANT FISH AND WILDLIFE BILLS WERE PASSED INTO LAW AT THE RECENT LEGISLATIVE SESSION, ACCORDING TO OFFICIALS AT THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES.

FISH AND WILDLIFE DIRECTOR DAVE VESALL SAID MAJOR ADVANCES WERE MADE IN THE DNR'S WILDLIFE PROGRAMS, MAKING THE RECENT SESSION "ONE OF THE BEST IN MANY YEARS FROM THE STANDPOINT OF THE SPORTSMEN."

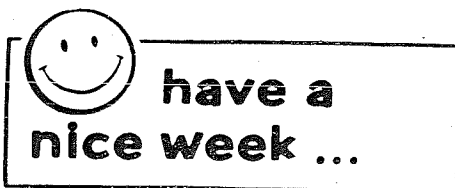
FOLLOWING ARE SOME OF THE HIGHLIGHTS:

COMMISSIONER IS DIRECTED TO ISSUE A "SPORTSMAN LICENSE" BY MARCH 1, 1978. THE \$9 FEE WILL INCLUDE THE SMALL GAME LICENSE AND ANGLING LICENSE WHILE A \$12 FEE WILL COVER SMALL GAME AND COMBINATION HUSBAND AND WIFE FISHING. THERE IS AN ADDITIONAL \$2 SURCHARGE (ADDED TO THE COST OF ALL SMALL GAME LICENSES) AND STATE AND FEDERAL WATERFOWL STAMPS WILL BE REQUIRED IF THE LICENSE HOLDER WISHES TO HUNT MIGRATORY WATERFOWL.

NEW STATE MIGRATORY WATERFOWL STAMP WILL BE REQUIRED OF ALL WATERFOWL HUNTERS OVER 18 YEARS OF AGE AND UNDER 65.

ALSO PASSED (AS PART OF THE RESOURCE 2000 BONDING BILL) WAS AN APPROPRIATION OF \$1,008,000 FOR ACQUIRING LAND TO PROVIDE ACCESS TO PUBLIC WATER FOR FISHERMEN AND FOR SPAWNING AREAS.

ALLOWS THE COMMISSIONER TO ESTABLISH A SEASON FOR TAKING DEER AND BEAR BY BOW AND ARROW AND MUZZLE LOADING FIREARMS ANYTIME BETWEEN SEPT. 1 AND DEC. 31 IN SUCH AREAS OF THE STATE AND ON SUCH DATES AS THE COMMISSIONER DESIGNATES. A SPECIAL MUZZLE LOADING FIREARM SEASON FOR DEER WAS AUTHORIZED FOR PUBLIC LANDS ONLY, AND AT SUCH TIMES AS THE COMMISSIONER MAY PRESCRIBE.



PICKELED FISH

FIRST DAY:

CUT FISH INTO $\frac{1}{4}$ TO $\frac{1}{2}$ INCH SQUARES
SOAK 24 HOURS IN SALT SOLUTION

SALT - 1 CUP
WATER - 2 QUARTS

SECOND DAY:

DRAIN OFF SALT WATER
SOAK 24 HOURS IN CLEAR WHITE VINEGAR

THIRD DAY:

DRAIN OFF VINEGAR

PUT FISH IN JARS ALTERNATING WITH ONIONS & PICKELING SPICES

1 LARGE ONION FOR 2 QUARTS
1 TEASPOON PICKELING SPICE PER QUART

PUT $\frac{1}{2}$ CUP OF WHITE MUSKATEL WINE ON FISH IN EACH QUART JAR

THEN FILL TO TOP WITH WHITE VINEGAR
SEAL LET STAND THREE WEEKS OR LONGER

COMPLIMENTS OF WILBUR LIGHT
