

MORE THAN ONE HALF MILLION WATERCRAFT ARE NOW LICENSED TO OPERATE IN MINNESOTA, THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES REPORTED TODAY.

THE DNR'S LICENSE CENTER IN ST. PAUL SAID IT WAS THE FIRST TIME THAT STATE BOAT REGISTRATIONS HAD REACHED THE HALF MILLION MARK.

ROBERT WELLS, LICENSE CENTER SUPERVISOR, SAID THE TOTAL WAS 503,344 ON JAN. 20TH. HE NOTED THAT BOATING REGISTRATIONS ARE CONTINUING TO CLIMB WHILE SNOWMOBILE REGISTRATIONS ARE SHOWING A DECLINE.


CHOCOLATE DATE ELEGANTE
