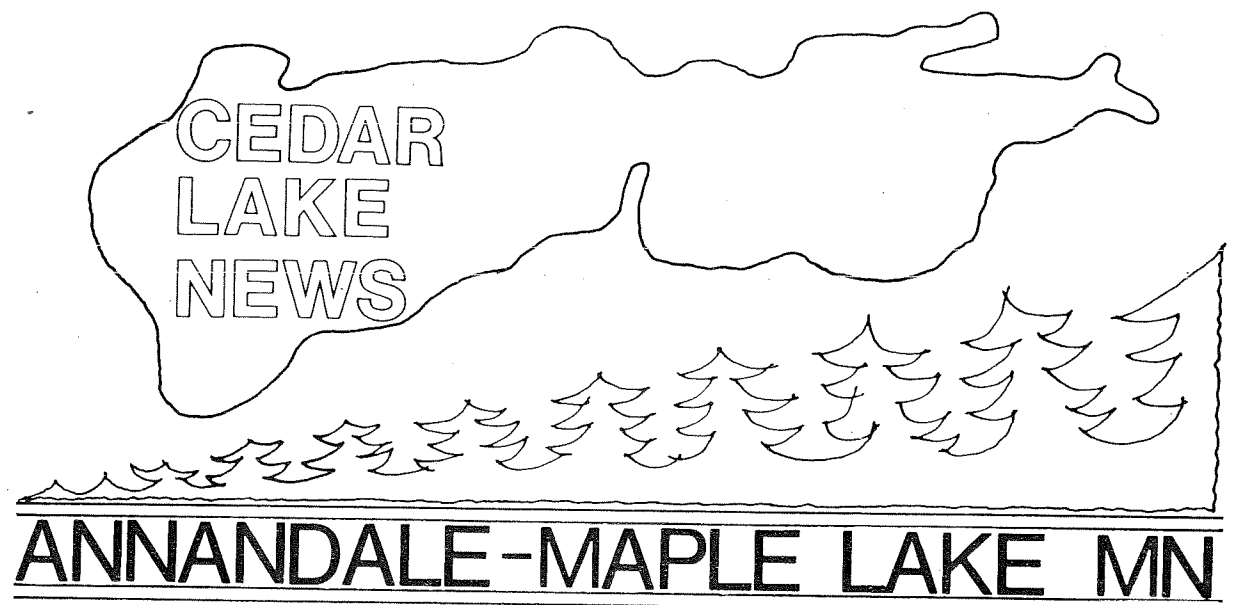

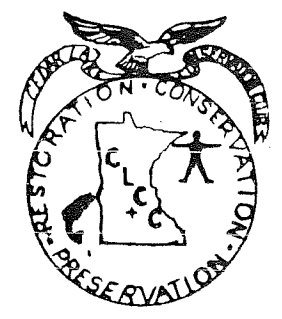

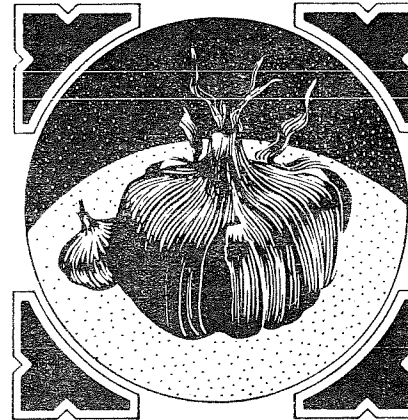
NEWS FROM TURTLE BAY - MRS VINCE KITTOK REPORTED

GLADIOLUS

Gladiolus corms (bulbs) are tender and should be dug in fall for storage indoors over winter. Dig as soon as foliage yellows. Shake off soil and cut off tops. Lay corms in an airy place to cure before putting them in storage. When digging, you will probably find many small corms clustered around the "mother." If you wish, save these to increase your gladiolus supply. In spring, soak them first, then sow like seeds in a special shallow row. They will grow to blooming size in two years, and will be exactly like the parent.

BULBS IN GROUND COVERS

A good place to plant daffodil and crocus bulbs this fall is among ground cover plantings of pachysandra or *Vinca minor* (myrtle). They bloom in spring giving a burst of color amid the green of the ground cover; later when bulb foliage must ripen and die during its "awkward stage," the ground cover foliage conveniently hides it. Bulb roots are deeper than those of the ground covers, so there is no competition, and the partners can live peacefully together for years.
