DNR SAY BLUEBIRD RESTORATION HAS HIT RECORD PRODUCTION IN MINNESOTA

MANY MN HIGHWAYS AND FARMLANDS ARE NOW DECORATED WITH NEST BOXES PERCHED ON FENCE POSTS. THESE BOXES ARE THE HOME OF THE EASTERN BLUEBIRD. MUCH OF THE BLUEBIRDS' DRAMATIC POPULATION RECOVERY IN MN IS DUE TO THE EFFORTS OF THE NONGAME WILDLIFE PROGRAM, WHICH IS FUNDED BY CHECKOFF DONATIONS FROM INDIVIDUAL TAXPAYERS.

THE STATEWIDE EFFORT TO RESTORE THE EASTERN BLUEBIRD BEGAN IN 1982 WITH 150 VOLUNTEERS RAISING 1,490 BLUEBIRDS. THE DNR REPORTED THIS WEEK THAT THE 1989 SUCESS RATE BROKE ALL PREVIOUS RECORDS; 489 VOLUNTEERS RAISED 15,879 BLUEBIRD CHICKS IN NEST BOXES. THE VOLUNTEERS AVERAGED 1.35 CHICKS PER NEST BOX, WHICH IS UP FROM 0.92 RECORDED IN THE FIRST YEAR. IN EIGHT YEARS, A TOTAL OF 67,893 BLUEBIRDS HAVE BEEN SUCCESSFULLY HATCHED.

DNR BOOKLET ABOUT MINNESOTA'S ENDANGERED PLANTS AND ANIMALS NOW AVAILABLE

A new 22-page booklet entitled "The Uncommon Ones: Minnesota's Endangered Plants and Animals" is now available from the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR).

The booklet, edited by Lee A. Pfannmuller and Barbara A. Coffin of the DNR, clarifies the link between habitat destruction and species extinction. It provides a comprehensive overview of the reasons for species endangerment in Minnesota.

"We tried to put a real emphasis on the fact that the primary reason for most species being endangered is loss of habitat," said Pfannmuller, a specialist for the Nongame Wildlife and Natural Heritage programs of the DNR Wildlife Section.

The booklet discusses the factors (mostly human-induced) that threaten the survival of rare species, and shows how three DNR programs are responding to the challenge of conserving these species.

"The primary way to protect species is to protect the habitat," Pfannmuller said.

"The Uncommon Ones: Minnesota's Endangered Plants and Animals" describes the seven major habitat types in Minnesota and the rare species associated with each.

The booklet, which features detailed drawings and full-color photographs of Minnesota habitat and endangered species, is available at DNR regional offices and from the DNR Information Center, 500 Lafayette Road, St. Paul, MN 55155-4040. Minnesota's wildlife, from bald eagles to butterflies, benefit from the generosity of the state's taxpayers each year. With tax preparation season upon us, Minnesotans again have an opportunity to donate to the Nongame Wildlife Program.

The Minnesota income tax form (M-1) and the property tax form (M1-PR) both feature a line that allows taxpayers to donate to the Nongame Wildlife Checkoff.

Minnesotans have historically been strong supporters of the Nongame Wildlife Checkoff, according to Carrol Henderson, Nongame Program supervisor for the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR). Last year more than 8.5 percent of all taxpayers voluntarily donated to the Nongame Wildlife Checkoff, which is twice the national average.

The total dollars contributed by Minnesotans each year has shown steady growth, from \$569,277 donated in 1980 to \$1,063,465 contributed on forms filed last year.

"Minnesota's Nongame Wildlife Program has become one of the best in the nation during the past several years, thanks to the generosity of the state's taxpayers," said Henderson.

"This continued support is necessary to maintain the momentum of this effort to preserve Minnesota's wildlife," Henderson said.

Funds raised support more than 130 wildlife conservation projects to help bald eagles, peregrine falcons, Blanding's turtles, bluebirds, trumpeter swans and many other species.

Checkoff donations are easy to make. Loon symbols on the income tax and property tax forms indicate the line on which donations can be designated for the Nongame Wildlife Program.


