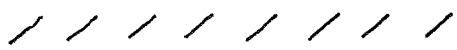
President Thernell called upon our guests to say a few words. They will be around after the meeting.

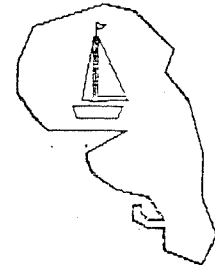

PRIZES WILL BE TWENTY DOLLARS FOR THE LARGEST FISH IN EACH CATEGORY AND FIFTEEN DOLLARS FOR THE SECOND LARGEST FISH IN EACH CATEGORY. THE CATAGORIES ARE WALLEYE, NORTHERN BASS, CRAPPIES, SUNFISH AND BULLHEAD. THE OFFICIAL WEIGH-IN WILL BE AT GEARDINK'S RESORT. AS IN THE PAST, YOUR 1991 MEMBERSHIP DUES TO THE C.L.C.C. MUST BE PAID.

GOOD LUCK TO ALLNO FISH IS TOO SMALL TO ENTER

ZEBRA MUSSELS INVADE LAKE SUPERIOR - THREATEN GAME FISH

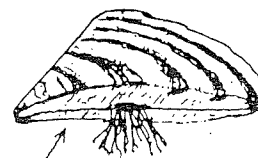
THE ZEBRA MUSSEL, A FRESHWATER SPECIES THAT POTENTIALLY COULD HARM GAME FISH POPULATIONS, HAS INVADED LAKE SUPERIOR. THE MINNESOTA DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES IS ASKING BOATERS TO HELP STOP IT FROM SPREADING FURTHER INTO THE STATE.

AN EXOTIC SPECIES ORIGINALLY FROM EUROPE, THE ZEBRA MUSSEL WAS FIRST DISCOVERED IN LAKE ERIE IN 1987, PROBABLY DEPOSITED THERE FROM A EUROPEAN SHIP'S BALLAST WATER. RECENTLY, THE ZEBRA MUSSEL WAS REPORTED IN THE DULUTH HARBOR OF LAKE SUPERIOR, THE FIRST OCCURRENCE IN MINNESOTA WATERS.

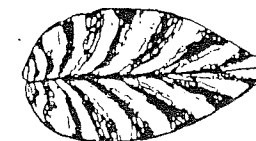
THE SMALL ZEBRA MUSSEL, WHICH MEASURES 1 TO 1 1/2 INCHES ACROSS, DAMAGES FISHERIES TWO WAYS. BY FEEDING ON ALGAE AND ZOOPLANKTON, IT STEALS FOOD FROM BAIT FISH, WHICH IN TURN REDUCES THE NUMBER OF GAME FISH. SOME SHALLOW BAYS IN EASTERN LAKE ERIE HAVE ALREADY BECOME CRYSTAL CLEAR FROM A LACK OF PLANKTON. IN ADDITION, THE MUSSEL LIVES IN DENSE COLONIES OF UP TO 30,000 INDIVIDUALS PER SQUARE METER. IN LAKE ERIE THEY HAVE CLOGGED WATER INTAKE PIPES AND SUNK NAVIGATIONAL BUOYS BY THEIR SHEER WEIGHT AND VOLUME.

THE DNR'S ECOLOGICAL SERVICES SECTION IS ASKING BOATERS TO HELP PREVENT THE ZEBRA MUSSELS FROM SPREADING AND HARMING MINNESOTA'S VALUABLE FISHERIES BY INSPECTING THE BOTTOMS OF THEIR BOATS AND REMOVING ANY CLINGING ZEBRA MUSSELS. ANGLERS SHOULD NOT TRANSPORT FISH LIVE WELL WATER BETWEEN LOCATIONS, SINCE THE LARVAE MAY BE TRANSFERRED IN THE WATER. ANGLERS SHOULD DRAIN THE WELL, LET IT DRY, AND IF POSSIBLE, STERLIZE IT WITH BLEACH. ADULT MUSSELS CAN SURVIVE FOR MORE THAN A WEEK OUT OF WATER, CLINGING TIGHTLY TO ANY SURFACE THEY CAN FIND.

PEOPLE WHO FIND MUSSELS ON THEIR BOATS SHOULD RY THEM OFF AND CALL THE DNR ECOLOGICAL SERVICES SECTION AT (612)297-4888 TO REPORT THE DATE OF SPECIFIC LOCATION WHERE THE MUSSEL WAS FOUND. TO HELP SCIENTISTS DOCUMENT THE SPREAD, PLACE THE MUSSEL IN A JAR OF RUBBING ALCOHOL AND SEND IT TO THE DNR SECTION OF ECOLOGICAL SERVICES, 500 LAFAYETTE ROAD, ST. PAUL, MN 55155-4025.

We Are Survivors!!!

Consider the changes we have witnessed:

We were born before television, before penicillin, before polio shots, frozen foods, Xerox, plastic, contact lenses, Frisbees and the Pill.

We were born before radar, credit cards, split atoms, laser beams and ballpoint pens, before panty-hose, dishwashers, clothes dryers, electric blankets, air conditioners, drip-dry clothes and *before man walked on the moon.*

We got married first and then lived together. *How quaint can you be?*

In our time, closets were for clothes, not for "coming out of." Bunnies were small rabbits and rabbits were not Volkswagens. Designer Jeans were scheming girls named Jean or Jeanne, and having a meaningful relationship meant getting along well with our cousins.

We thought fast food was what you ate during Lent, and Outer Space was the back of the Granada Theatre.

We were born before house-husbands, gay rights, computer dating, dual careers and computer marriages. We were born before day-care centers, group therapy and nursing homes. We never heard of FM radio, tape decks, electric typewriters, artificial hearts, word processors, yogurt, and guys wearing earrings. For us, time-sharing meant togetherness—not computers or condominiums; a "chip" meant a piece of wood; hardware meant hardware, and software wasn't even a word!

In 1940, "made in Japan" meant junk and the term "making out" referred to how you did on your exam. Pizzas, "McDonalds", and instant coffee were unheard of.

We hit the scene when there were 5 cent and 10 cent stores, where you bought things for five and ten cents. Brown's Drug Store sold ice cream cones for a nickel or a dime. For one nickel you could ride a street car (trolley), make a phone call, buy a Pepsi or enough stamps to mail one letter and two postcards. You could buy a new Chevy Coupe for \$500.00, but *who could afford one*; a pity, too, because gas was 11 cents a gallon!

In our day, cigarette smoking was fashionable, *Grass* was mowed, *Coke* was a soft drink, and *Por* was something you cooked in. *Rock Music* was a Grandma's lullaby and *AIDS* were helpers in the Principal's office.

We were certainly not born before the difference between the sexes was discovered, but we were surely born before the sex change; *we made do with what we had*, and we were the last generation that was so dumb as to think you needed a husband to have a baby!

No wonder we are so confused and there is such a generation gap today!

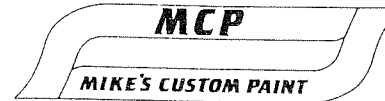

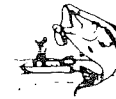

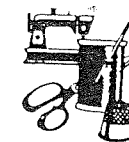
