WATKINS INCINERATOR

THE TOWN OF WATKINS, MN, WHICH IS LOCATED WEST OF KIMBAL, MN HAS BEEN THE FOCUS OF A NATIONAL CONTROVERSY. THE QUESTION HAS BEEN WHETHER OR NOT TO ALLOW A TWENTY MILLION DOLLAR INCINERATOR TO BE BUILT TO HANDLE MEDICAL WASTE. MINNESOTA SONGBIRDS IN DECLINE Part 2 of 8

Wood Thrush

One of Minnesota's favorite woodland songbirds, the wood thrush, has undergone a significant decline during the past decade.

A report by John Sauer and Sam Droege of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service observed that national breeding bird survey counts of the wood thrush declined at a rate of 4.0 percent per year from 1978 through 1988.

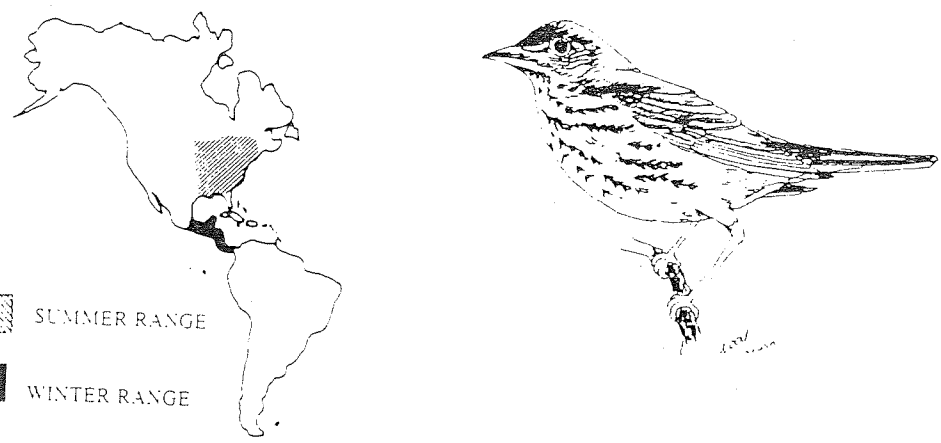
The wood thrush nests throughout Minnesota's hardwood forests and in the northeast part of the state. It is best known for its wonderful flute-like calls in the spring.



Wood thrushes winter from southern Mexico south through Panama.

The reason for the dramatic decline is unclear at this time. There could be problems with loss of forest land, nest parasitism by cowbirds, or loss of wintering habitat in Central American lowland rainforests.

Biologists with the Department of Natural Resource's Nongame Wildlife Program are depending on donations to the Nongame Wildlife Checkoff on state tax forms to help fund the work that will help create a better understanding of the problems faced by the wood thrush and to identify strategies to help manage woodland habitat for their benefit.
