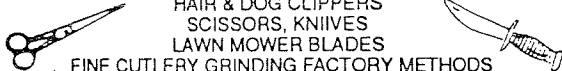

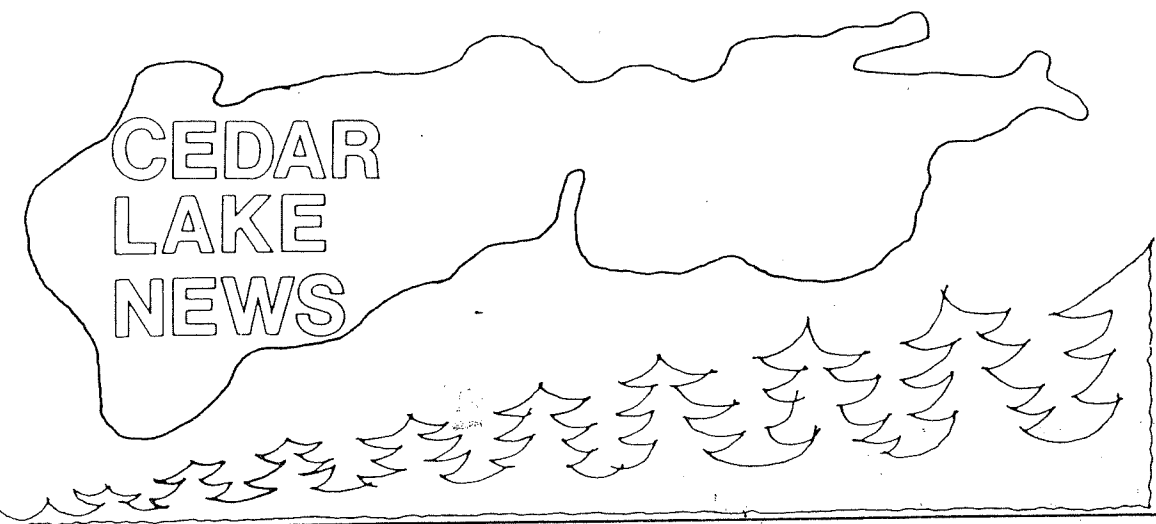

To Everyone on Cedar Lake:

The ice is out, the loons are back and the lake is ready for another summer of activity.

Your Cedar Lake Conservation Club Board of Directors is once again planning the spring get-together and the annual dinner meeting in August, as well as a number of items dedicated to the protection and preservation of Cedar Lake.

Our principal concern is the spread of Eurasian Milfoil. Given our proximity to Clearwater and Sugar Lakes, which have already been infected, the probability of the plant reaching our lake cannot be ignored. Early detection can make the difference between widespread infestation or something we can keep in check. Individually, we should all be watching for it while boating, swimming or fishing.

With this in mind, we are planning an organized search for Eurasian Milfoil (as we did last year) on Sunday, June 6th, between 2:00 and 3:00 p.m. with the participants reporting results when completed. Our Board Members are located in every section of the lakeshore and I have asked each one to be responsible for their nearby area. If you wish to participate in this search, and we can use everyone's help, please contact your nearest Director or call me at 274-5823. The club has hooks for dragging available.

As property owners and users of the lake we all have a vested interest in the quality of the lake. We are sending this letter to ALL property owners on Cedar Lake. If you are not already a member of the Conservation Club, membership is \$15.00 per year with \$7.00 going to the Eurasian Milfoil Fund. I invite all of you to join. 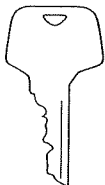

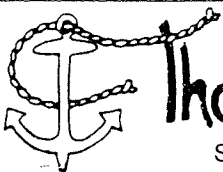

MINNESOTA SONGBIRDS IN DECLINE Part 4 of 8

Tennessee Warbler

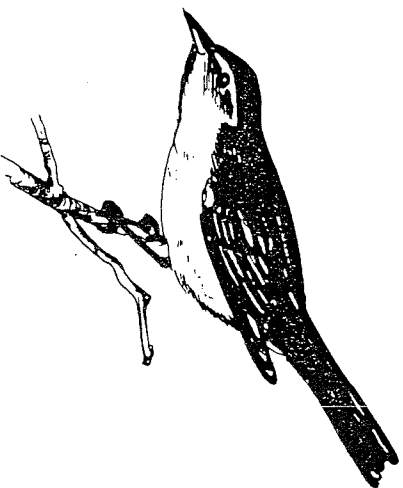
One of Minnesota's northern warblers that is well-known for its loud calls and its abundance during outbreaks of spruce budworms is the Tennessee warbler. This species nests in the northeastern fourth of the state. It is usually found in habitat consisting of cedar and tamarack swamps, young fir stands and edges of swamps. Where habitat is ideal they may nest close to one another - almost like a colony.

The Tennessee warbler is a "tropical migrant." In fall it migrates to wintering areas from southern Mexico to northern Columbia and Venezuela in South America.

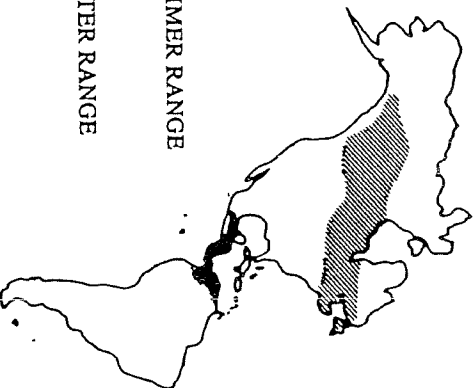
John R. Sauer and Sarah Droegge of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service have reported that Tennessee warbler numbers have declined 11.1 percent per year during the ten-year period from 1978 to 1988.

The reason or reasons for this dramatic decline are not known. There might be survival problems for the birds in their northern woodlands because of habitat loss or cowbird parasitism. There could also be problems with the loss of rainforest wintering habitat in Central America.

Further research will be necessary to determine the reason for the decline of the Tennessee warbler. The Department of Natural Resources' Nongame Wildlife Program needs donations to the Nongame Wildlife Checkoff on your state tax form to help fund projects that will help preserve our northern songbirds.
