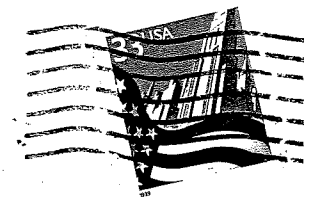

**PERSONAL WATERCRAFT**

**Be a Considerate Neighbor - Use Sound Judgment**

Personal Watercraft noise complaints are one of the most common types of calls received by Water Safety Officials.

The way some people operate their machines cause a great deal of concern among other people on the lake. Some people tend to run their machines for long periods of time in a relatively small area. Having to listen to one or more water scooter buzzing around for a long length of time in front of their property is very disturbing. REMEMBER - personal watercraft must travel at slow, no wake speed (5 mph or less) within 150 feet of non motorized boats, docks, swim rafts, swimmers, any moored or anchored boats AND shore (unless launching or landing skiers). Please be respectful and ride responsibly.

## REGARDING MILFOIL

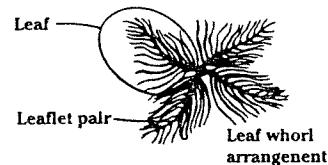
A group of volunteer property owners check Cedar Lake every year. This was done on Saturday, June 19th and the results were negative.

Several of the other lakes in our area have had milfoil problems for some time. It is important that "if" we should get milfoil in our lake, we catch it early. It is a problem and the responsibility of every property owner. A portion of the membership (CLCC) dues are set aside in a separate fund for this problem, should it arise. There is enough money to start correcting a problem, but not necessarily to solve the problem. Join the CLCC (Cedar Lake Property Owners Association)! Become involved! It's important!

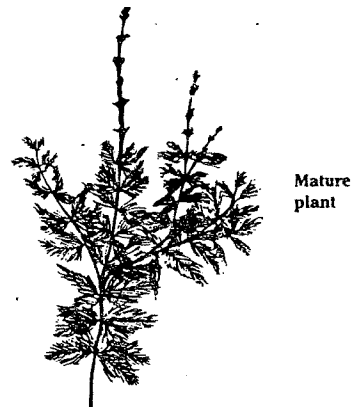
### What Does it look like?

Eurasian water milfoil may be identified by:

- long stems with feather-like leaves attached in whorls of four;
- leaves typically having nine to 21 pairs of leaflets;
- flowers appearing terminally on the stem above the water;
- formation of mats at the surface.

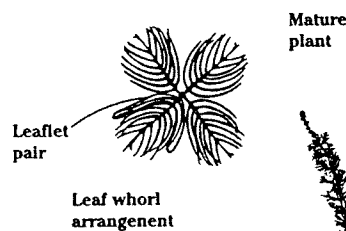


Eurasian water milfoil

### Confusing Look-alikes

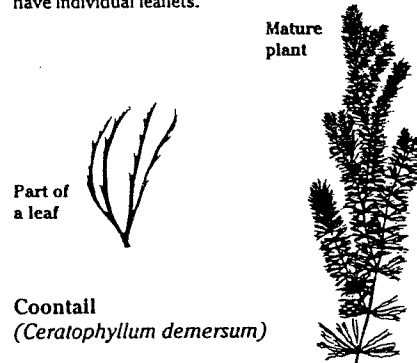
Northern water milfoil (*Myriophyllum exalbescens*) is very similar in appearance, but typically has seven pairs of leaflets and a maximum of 11 pairs.

Coontail (*Ceratophyllum demersum*) is also often mistaken for Eurasian water milfoil, but coontail doesn't have individual leaflets.

Friendship Ventures, which operates Camp Friendship, offers camping, respite, and travel programs year-round.
