#### President's Letter

Greetings to the Cedar Lake community! Spring is in full swing on the lake. Ice out was early this year-March 19<sup>th</sup>—and within a matter of hours our loons were back and calling. How did they know the ice would be out so early? Many on the lake have docks and toys in the water already. And since we didn't use the snow mobile suits much last winter, they work great for early spring pontoon rides!

CLCC is energized for our best year ever. We have a strong approach for Aquatic Invasive Species control and plan to stay ahead of the curve. Of course, time will tell as we are just beginning to understand what it will take to control Eurasian Water Milfoil on Cedar. The Water Quality Committee's report on page 6 provides more details.

The next CLCC event is **Earth Wings and Water Nature Expo** on May 19<sup>th</sup> at Camp Courage. The event is open to everyone and is free of charge. The list of speakers is over the top, including Stan Tekiela, well known author, naturalist and wildlife photographer and Darby Nelson, Aquatic Ecologist, professor, and author. New this year is a kid's program--Master Naturalist Lynn Fisher will lead small groups of children through ten learning stations and families can also assemble a bluebird house for a small fee. CLCC members Paul Schutte, Cheryl Wold, Ray Howard, and Mike Hankee have worked very hard to make this event even better than last year. Check out more details on page 2.

I would like to recognize two lake individuals who are in new CLCC leadership positions. Board member Cathy Campbell is our new secretary and Bob Badger is the chair of the Water Quality Committee. Please take a moment to thank these generous folks for stepping up to these important positions.

If you have not paid your 2012 CLCC dues, please take a moment right now to fill out the included form. This year, you will notice a spot to offer your time and talent to CLCC. Is this the year you can answer the call? Also on the 2012 dues form is a voluntary chance to add a bit more to your CLCC dues check. The Board decided to keep dues at \$25/year, \$10 of which will go toward this year's control curly leaf pondweed. Our dues are one of the lowest in the area. CLCC remains in a healthy financial position, thanks to almost 80% of the residents belonging and the Visionary contributions. More information about the Visionary program is available on page 7.

To close, I know there are many who share with me a deep gratitude for the gift of our lake community. As we enter the summer season, please establish a culture in your family to stop the spread of aquatic invasive species. *Always* remove plants, drain water, dispose of bait, rinse and dry your watercraft when transporting. When guests visit with their water craft, help them understand the importance of an inspected, clean launch. Honor our loons from a distance. Marvel at the bull-rushes and lily pads by leaving them undisturbed. Catch and release unless you are certain you will enjoy a tasty fish dinner. Consider that this might be a good year to do some natural lakescaping on your shore line. And above all, have fun and enjoy our treasure.

#### Loons

As you travel around the lake you will see some buoys marked "Loon Nesting Area." Everyone should stay away from this area until the loons have completed their nesting.

Last year the pair near the sand bar chose to use one of our platforms and successfully hatched out their chicks! Thanks to Paul Schutte, Dean Nicholson, and Mike Hankee for placing the platforms and buoys this year.

#### Walleye Stocking

This fall we plan to be doing our additional stocking of walleyes in Cedar Lake. The funding for this comes from raffles and donations at our events and with the Visionary Donations through CLCC. Let's make this even a larger stocking project than we had in the fall of 2010, when over 1900 walleye fingerlings stocked. Any donations are always accepted and are tax deductable.

#### **Operation Of Your Watercraft**

As the boating season begins we urge everyone to be a responsible watercraft user. We encourage everyone to operate your watercraft at no wake speeds in all of the shallow areas on the lake. This courteous and safe speed will help many things such as preventing shoreland erosion, vegetation disturbance (uprooting native species and allowing the non-native species to take over) and destruction of fish habitat. Your cooperation is essential to maintaining a healthy lake.

### **Doing Our Part**

As I look out on Cedar Lake, I feel very blessed to be here on a great lake that provides us with much enjoyment. It's a great fishery lake. with many birds and animals that we take for granted. Much of what we have begins with "Water Quality." Please ask: "What can I do to help improve it?" 

#### Water Quality Committee By Bill Arendt

#### Update on Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS)

A recent survey of CLCC members shows that overwhelming majorities believe controlling AIS and improving lake water quality are 'mission critical" activities for CLCC. This reinforces the Board's involvement in AIS Control and many water quality improvement projects.

Professional Lake Management (PLM) has preliminarily identified 21 acres of Eurasian Water Milfoil (EWM) and 39 acres of Curly Leaf Pondweed (CLP) that should be treated. Cards were sent to 139 property owners seeking their approval to treat the lake by their shorelines. As of March 30, 2012 there are 124 responses. All but 2 approved the treatment plan. We anticipate the CLP will be treated in late April or early May and the EWM treatment will be in late June. At this writing, PLM has completed a Spring 2012 vegetation delineation and has submitted this to the DNR to process with our permit application. See the map below; it can be viewed in more detail on the CLCC website.



Many of you are familiar with our AIS control efforts. In summary, here are a few important points:

- The DNR makes the final determination about the acreage we can treat. We can only treat those areas that the DNR authorizes.
- The CLP treatment is paid for by the CLCC water quality fund (\$1,900) with the balance collected by the Clearwater River Watershed District (CRWD). The chemical used for CLP is endothall.
- The EWM treatment is paid by the CRWD under our new AIS project. This project provides a long term funding strategy which leverages contributions from all lake shore owners. The chemical used for EWM is triclopyr.
- CLCC continues to provide AIS oversight and management on a volunteer basis.

#### **New DNR Regulations For "AIS" Control**

This spring will be the first time that boaters will be impacted by the new DNR Regulations for Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS). These regulations require several steps everyone must take when transporting or launching any watercraft: <a href="CLEAN: All watercraft">CLEAN: All watercraft and trailers must be cleaned of all weeds & mud. Especially be on the alert for zebra mussels, since numerous lakes have already been infected. Rub your hand over trailers, motors, propellers & water intake vents. These are areas that might be hiding AIS species.

\*\*DRAIN: All drain plugs must be pulled (and kept out) and water drained before transporting. On the labourd wake board.

<u>DRAIN:</u> All drain plugs must be pulled (and kept out) and water drained before transporting. On the Inboard wake board boats, be sure to drain all plugs. In addition, live wells, bait buckets and bilge areas must also be drained. The DNR will be utilizing checkpoints throughout the state to enforce these regulations and fines will be given for violations.

<u>DRY:</u> When possible, let your boat dry at least one day when going from lake to lake. Be especially cautious when leaving an infected lake. These lakes have signs at the launching ramps that signify an infected lake.

These rules also apply to docks and lifts that may be transported between lakes. The DNR will have decals available at the Earth Wings and Water Expo to attach to trailers as a reminder of the steps to be followed. #### **Improvements Made To Segner Pond**

Segner Pond is a basin built in 2006 as part of the Clearwater River Watershed Distrit's Cedar Lake improvement project P06-1. It is located between Cedar Lake and Hwy 55. The pond is used to store water from Swartout, Albion and Henshaw lakes for treatment through a limestone filter berm. Phosphorous-laden water passes through the berm, where

phosphorous binds to the limestone and stays in the pond while the water continues to Cedar Lake. The basin also gives suspended sediment time to settle out to the bottom of Segner Pond instead of the bottom of the lake.

Last November, the area south of Segner Pond pond was widened to aid the process of seining carp. Erosian damage from last year's high water was also repaired.



#### **The Survey Says** CLCC Member Survey Results

 Thanks to all those who completed the member survey last month. The results confirm that the lake association is focusing on the right issues. 98% believe controlling Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) and maintaining/improving water quality is mission critical or important.

This chart depicts the percentage of respondents who believe these issues are mission critical or very important.



Here are a few more highlights:

- It appears that the communication efforts are working.
   98% strongly agree or agree that they understand what CLCC is doing to control AIS,
- 76% can identify Eurasian Water Milfoil.
- 98% understand how they are paying to control AIS.
- 94% agree the directory is important.
