President's Letter by Mike Hankee

Hello to all,

The warm weather has finally arrived and the lake activities are in full swing. Did you know that this year's ice out date was May 1, making it the latest ice out date since the CLCC started keeping records in 1955? Wow!

Our Water Quality Committee has been very busy. Once again, the CLCC was awarded Grant Funds to help treat Curly Leaf Pondweed and Eurasian Milfoil this year. Please be careful to stay out of weedy areas on the lake in an effort to not spread the Curly Leaf and Eurasian Milfoil around. These areas are usually in the 0-10 foot deep areas. Think at least 10 ft deep water as a safe area to cruise around the lake. Please check your prop for weeds and make sure you are weed-free if you go through a weedy area.

Also, because of the high water, please consider keeping a 300 foot no wake zone as you travel around the lake and please conduct your jet skiing, water skiing and wake boarding in the deeper parts of the lake. The new PO6 Enhancement project that we have been talking about for the past year is still in the planning stages. For more complete information on our water quality issues see the Water Quality Article on page 6. Thanks again to Orv and Kathy Jonsrud for their hard work.

Please watch out for all the baby loons and their parents on the lake. We had a great year for baby loons. We believe there are four pairs of loons on the lake having a total of five babies. Unfortunately one baby washed up on shore near Leslie Kreutter's home after one of

the late June storms. Thanks to Paul Schutte, Glenn Baird and Dean Nicholson for managing and storing the loon buoys.

I was delighted to see a growing number of people from our lake getting involved with efforts to learn more about establishing native gardens along the shoreline. The April 27th native shoreline and rain garden class was well attended as was the native garden plant sale and tour on June 8th. A big thank you to Cheryl Wold for all her work and planning these events.

<u>Get ready for the Annual CLCC Pic-</u> <u>nic and Band on the Barge!</u> This event will again be held at Camp Courage on August 24th at 12PM followed by a band on a barge playing at the sandbar. Read more about it on page 2.

Native Shoreline Activity on Cedar By Cheryl Wold

It's been a busy season for Cedar Lake residents working on native shoreline projects. The CLCC hosted two successful events to promote

and encourage shoreline restoration. In April, Karen Terry from the University of Minnesota Shoreline Education Program led a workshop helping property owners design shoreline projects for their site. Participants left with a plan in hand and valuable resource materials. We held a native plant sale and a tour of



Cedar Lake homes with native shoreline plantings in June. It was a great opportunity to purchase healthy and inexpensive native plants. The tour gave people the chance to see existing shoreline buffers and what can be done. We saw differences in terrain, site usage, plant selection and planting techniques. Thanks to the Hankee's, Glass's, Wold's and Motzko's for sharing their shoreline experiences. Native



shoreline buffers provide many benefits to our lake. They help filter out pollutants, capture run -off, and can prevent shoreline erosion. The beautiful array of foliage and flowers provide good habitat for birds, butterflies and bees. So if you have a beach, a lawn up to the lakeshore, or other runoff or erosion challenges, please consider adding a native shoreline buffer area to your property!

Als Monitoring at Schroeder Park By Bobby Ebert This year, the CLCC team implemented a new program by partnering with Schroeder Park through the jurisdiction of Marc Mattice, Wright County Parks Administrator. Marc, Bobby Ebert, and others of the CLCC Board hired a young college student, Mark Sandquist, to monitor the boats launching at the Schroeder Park landing; the DNR does not monitor this landing and focuses their attention on the CR6 landing. Mark continues to be present at Schroeder Park's landing primarily on weekends from May 25 until August 18. He has been an asset and our ally; we appreciate his hard work and dedication.

The statistics are interesting. 50 boats were polled on Saturday and Sunday from May 25th-June 23rd. Thus far, the boats are reported in good condition as they enter and leave the lake. The visitors are primarily fishing boats (31), runabouts (12), and pontoons (5) and travel an average of 20 miles to come to the lake; 22 of the 50 boats originated from Wright County. The boat operators have been cooperative, friendly, and conscientious to have their boats and trailers free of weeds. The primary concern is having the plug in the boat or water in live well, which Mark helps them correct before entering our waters.

This is a worthwhile endeavor to further protect our lake. We thank all those involved in making this happen!

Fish and Wildlife Conservation

Our Loons This year we were very fortunate to have three successful nesting pairs of Loons on Cedar Lake. On June 19th the pair on the sand bar hatched out two chicks on one of our loon nesting platforms. Unfortunately a chick was found dead on the south end of the lake after the big storm on June 20^{th.} The second pair nested in the southeast channel of the lake on natural vegetation resulting in one chick. The third pair nested in the Camp Courage Bay on natural vegetation, and hatched out two chicks. There appears to be a fourth couple with no babies that is hanging out in the northeast corner. While you enjoy the lake, we ask you to keep your distance from the parents as they raise their young.

Purple Martins This year Purple Martin Landlords on the lake could see a banner year of young being born from their colonies. It appears that from the reports I have received, we have more units being occupied than ever before! At one of our public locations, Schroeder Park is currently hosting 14 nests with 36 eggs and 40 chicks in the T-14 housing. At our other public T-14 location, Camp Courage and is currently hosting 12 nests with 20 eggs and 25 chicks. This is the first year this location has been occupied!! Surprisingly, we have not lost any birds due to weather so far. This could be our biggest number of fledged birds on our lake!!

These birds have been on a decline for the past 40 years but now appear to be holding at a steady population because of the many people who are committing to be great landlords for Purple Martins! Take a moment to view these beautiful birds by checking the lake tour map out at our web site for colony locations. If you have interest in starting a colony at your location, feel free to contact me.

Pelicans and Cormorants Wondering why you are seeing more Pelicans and Cormorants this year around Cedar Lake? This past winter, Swartout Lake (a shallow lake south of Hwy 55) froze out leaving that lake without food for these birds. Pelicans and Cormorants spend much of their time on some of these shallow lakes in the area feeding on fish and just loafing. Cedar Lake offers only a minimum amount of shallow water for them so it would not be their first choice to spend allot of time here. It should also be noted that there has been an increase in Pelicans and Cormorants throughout the state.

Walleye Stocking The funding for stocking beyond the DNR efforts comes from raffles/donations and with the Visionary Donations through CLCC. Last fall we stocked 5,000 walleye fingerlings!! The DNR will be stocking this fall and we will be planning for stocking in the fall of 2014. Look for our special raffles at our summer picnic on August 24th. Remember, any donations are always accepted

and are tax deductible. Consider a contribution to the Visionary Fund (see p. 7).

Members of CLCC have worked very hard to keep our lake one of the finest in the area, not only for quality fishing, but as the host to many species of birds, animals, reptiles, insects and native plants. We will continue to work closely with the DNR to help make good management decisions for our lake. With everyone practicing good stewardship and working hard to protect our water quality, all of these will be here for us to enjoy in the future.

Fishing Contest You still have plenty of time to register that Lunker! Take that fish over to Dean Nicholson's, at 8979 Iresfeld Ave NW and have it weighed in. (North side of the lake near Schroeder Park) You could be eligible for prizes that will be given out at our Summer Picnic at Camp Courage on August 24th.

The contest will run thru the 19th of August. We encourage kids to enter the contest. Any species of fish is eligible. So grab that fishing pole, go wet a line, and it might just win!

> Identifying AIS By Kathy Jonsrud

We have some new tools and services to identify and control Curly Leaf Pondweed (CLP) and Eurasian Water Milfoil (EWM). **ASK ME!** A new CLCC campaign that not only provides a reminder to always be on the look-out for aquatic invasive species, but identifies a lake neighbor who can help! About 12



members of the Board and Water Quality Committee have offered to "fly the flag" on their watercraft or dock to let you know they can help identify an invasive species. If they are not able to help, they will connect you with someone who can. So watch for the bright green flag and be on the look-out for CLP and EWM!






Water Quality Committee By Kathy Jonsrud

2013 Vegetation Mapping Every three years, we conduct a total vegetation mapping on our lake. This is not only a required activity by the DNR, but an important tool to understand the impact and effectiveness of our AIS treatment. We received three bids for the treatment and the project was awarded to Wenck and Associates at a cost of \$4,000. The vegetation mapping is extensive and precise using GPS technology which is shared with the DNR and our AIS treatment. There are two steps to the mapping project: the first mapping was in late May and the second will be in late July.

DNR Grants Approved Once again, CLCC received DNR grants to help treat Aquatic Invasive Species. This is very good news indeed! The CLCC, through years of networking and leadership, is recognized as an active association with a long history of lake stewardship. The grants, for up to \$3,250 depending on the amount treated, will help toward the expense of controlling curly leaf pondweed (CLP) and Eurasian Water Milfoil (EWM).

Eurasian Water Milfoil (EWM) Treatment Another piece of good news is that we have limited EWM to treat this year. The patch on the north side that has been treated for two


years has really been knocked down. Our permit to treat is for only 1.5 acres this year. Treatment will be completed in July. Last year we treated 22 acres. Everyone must be on the look-out for EWM. I know in our bay we see an occasional plant which is quickly harvested. Correct identification of EWM is critical: the invasive



Eurasian water milfoil typically has 12 to 21 pairs of leaflets. The non-invasive native <u>northern water milfoil</u> is often mistaken for EWM. We have lots of Northern, which has only 5 to 9 pairs of leaflets. Do you think you have EWM? Curly Leaf Pondweed (CLP) The DNR gave CLCC a permit for treating eight acres this year. The cost was \$4,476. Because of the treatment resistance of the CLP on the south side over the past several years, we worked with our vendor and the DNR to try a newer chemical - Clearcast. Unfortunately, the CLP treatment this year was not effective. Though Clearcast was effective on some lakes, our vendor believes Cedar was a bit cooler and the lake was still "rolling" so the chemical did not have a chance to work. Though this is disappointing, in the whole scheme of our long term strategy, this is a minor set-back. Our vendor stands behind our contract and will reimburse for 100% of the 2013 CLP treatment costs. The detailed 2013 vegetation mapping indicates some new areas of CLP that may be candidates for the 2014 treatment. Also, we are evaluating alternate permitting strategies that will allow our vendor for greater flexibility.

DNR Inspections on Cedar and New Laws As serious lake people know, there is not a magic bullet to prevent aquatic invasive species from entering our lake. Education is the key! Once again this year we will have DNR staffing inspections on CTY RD 6. Cedar is scheduled for 54 hours of inspections which started the second week in July. Laws in effect to help fight invasives:

- Boaters will be subject to mandatory roadside check stations for invasive species inspections.
- Fines for those caught violating the invasive species laws range from \$100 to \$500.
- Lifts, docks, swim rafts, etc. that are removed from any water body may not be placed in another water body for at least 21 days, to kill invasive species that might be attached.

Boaters are required by law to:

- CLEAN VISIBLE AQUATIC plants, zebra mussels, and other prohibited species off watercraft, trailers, and equipment before leaving any water access.
- DRAIN WATER FROM the boat's bilge, live well, motor, ballast tanks and portable bait containers before leaving any water access or shoreline property.
- KEEP DRAIN PLUGS out and water draining devices open while transporting watercraft. This includes pontoon plugs that are reasonably accessible.

Help your friends and family who visit Cedar to remember these laws and the importance of a clean launch on our lake!

PO6 Project Enhancements—Legacy Grant for

\$277,900 Awarded In 2012, the CLCC Board of Directors asked the Water Quality Committee to evaluate the effectiveness of the Clearwater River Watershed District (CRWD) PO6 project. This was the project started in 2006 to reduce phosphorus and carp population in Cedar Lake (check out www.crwd.org for more details about PO6). For most of 2012, the Water Quality Committee worked closely with the CRWD staff to gather facts and data about the project's results and anticipated future success. As a result, two additional projects have been recommended to "slow down" the water runoff during heavy rain falls-one on East Swartout and the other on the south side of Cedar. In January of 2013, the CRWD received a \$277,900 grant from the Legacy Funds for these two efforts. The estimated total cost of the projects is \$554,000. Discussions and evaluation of the projects has been active this spring and early summer. Optimal designs for the projects are being evaluated. As of this writing, the project on the east - a V-Notch wier with iron/sand filers -continues to be the best option. For the project south of Cedar, a type of manmade wetland with filters is emerging as the most effective.

With the legacy grant off-set, the estimated cost to a lake shore owner on Cedar would be \$500-\$600, which, if the project is approved, could be paid as a lump sum or over a period of years. If the project moves forward, construction would begin in 2014.

Your CLCC Water Quality Committee and Board of Directors have researched this project thoroughly, asked many questions of CRWD, and attended countless meetings to fully understand the costs and benefits of the proposed enhancements. At the April 2013 Board of Directors meeting, the CLCC voted to support the PO6 project enhancements. Also, to encourage thoughtful use of all the resources available, the Board voted to contribute \$10,000 of the CLCC Water Quality Fund if the projects are ultimately approved.



The Cedar Lake Visionary Fund is a great way to donate to the CLCC. Your contributions will be directed to the fund of your choice. CLCC is a 501-C(3) tax exempt organization, so your donations are tax deductible. For 2012, we had 54 members donate \$7,800. The current funds are: General, Walleye Stocking and Water Quality.
