# New Watercraft Cleaning Station at CTY Rd 6 Access

# Walleye Stocking



CLCC and the Wright Soil and Water Conservation District (WSWCD) are pleased to announce the addition of a second CD3 (clean, drain, dry, dispose) station on Cedar Lake in Wright County. The new CD3 station—installed on May 25th—can be found at the County Road 6 public access. The first is at Schroeder Park.

A CD3 station is a solar powered, <u>free to use</u>, self-service, watercraft cleaning station. Tools include a wet/dry vacuum, blower system, tethered hand tools, and lights.

The stations are designed to assist boaters in – as well as educate them about the importance of – reducing the spread of aquatic invasive species (AIS).

Clap and cheer! On May 8th, 455 pounds of six to eight inch walleye fingerlings were stocked in Cedar

The stocking was paid for using your generous donations to the CLCC Walleye Visionary Fund.

## Aquatic Invasive Species Updates

Plans are well in place to control aquatic invasive species (AIS) on our lake. Here's the bumper sticker of what is happening this summer:

- Access monitoring is in full swing at Schroeder Park, and the CTY RD 6 landings. CLCC has purchased an extra 1,135 hours of access monitoring to supplement the Wright County Soil and Water standard program.
- Treatment of 4.1 acres of Curly Leaf Pondweed (CLP) on May 17th on the southeast side of the lake.
- Treatment of limited Eurasian Water Milfoil (EWM) is planned for July/August. Last year, we did not have any patches that met treatment criteria. If the water within 150 feet of your property is treated, there is a sign posted on your shoreline. There are very few restrictions should your property be in the treatment area.

**Cedar Lake is infested with zebra mussels.** If your watercraft is "resident" to Cedar (e.g. in the lake all summer) there is a good chance it will have zebra mussels. Given this knowledge, and the time and difficulty for a complete decontamination, **consider not visiting other lakes with your watercraft.** Likewise, docks, lifts, and sea legs are favorite hiding places for zebra mussels, so sell or buy used equipment only if it has over-wintered before moving to a different lake.

#### Good Weed or Bad Weed?

Included with this mailing is a page of common lake vegetation in Cedar. A new addition to the information is buttercup—a good weed. Buttercup is excellent food for wildlife, but it is a floating weed and depending on density, can be unfriendly to recreation.

#### Good Weed



Over 99% of the aquatic vegetation in our lake is a good weed—native vegetation. We have a wonderful assortment in our lake including the highly desired hard-stemmed rushes and lily pads. Some scientists believe a robust native population may reduce invasives. Our di-

verse native vegetation is a sign of a healthy lake with a balanced system to provide food and shelter for wildlife.

#### **Bad Weed**



Curly Leaf Pondweed (CLP) and Eurasian Water Milfoil (EWM)—aquatic invasive species are in our lake. Our aggressive control strategies over the past decade have been successful and we have very small areas of infestation.



The newest bad weed in Minnesota is starry stonewort. The threat is close to Cedar given nearby infestations in Sylvia, Pleasant, and Koronis. <u>Starry</u> <u>stonewort spreads by fragments.</u>

If you wish to reduce some vegetation for recreation at your shoreline, please check the DNR Aquatic Plant regulations. Should you elect to cut or rake the aquatic vegetation, remove and compost the vegetation so it doesn't end up on your neighbor's shoreline.

## Loon Update

The CLCC Fish and Wildlife Committee put up four loon nesting platforms this year. We are delighted to report all four platforms attracted nesting pairs.

As of this writing, the south pair was first with one chick and the sandbar pair had twins! The other two nests have mama or papa

sitting tight.

The chicks do not go back to the nest so they are exposed to the many perils of open water. Also, parents with chicks on their backs will not dive.

Give them plenty of space—at least 200 feet.
