Stop Aquatic Invasive Species

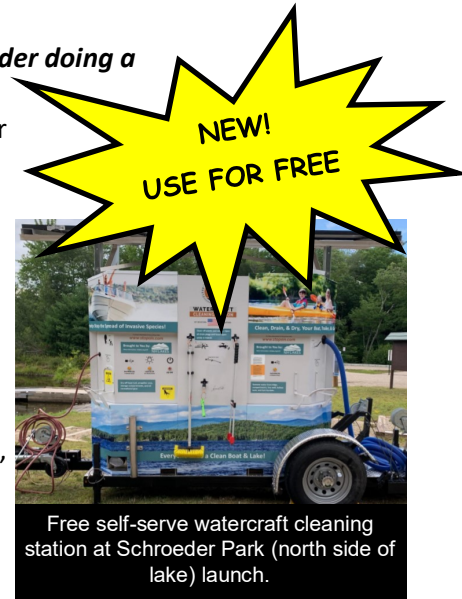
Have you been to a lake in the last 5 days? Please consider doing a free decontamination before launching in Cedar. The decontamination station is just a few miles west of Cedar Lake off of HWY 55.

WHERE: 1300 Business Blvd, Annandale (HWY 55, north on Annandale Blvd—follow road to the end)

WHEN: Fri-Sun 8-6 | Mon-Thu 9-5

HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE?: Smaller boats about 10 minutes, larger vessels 20-30 minutes.

Take advantage of the free self-service watercraft cleaning station at the Schroeder Park launch (north side of lake). You will find a wet-dry vacuum, air blower, weed grabber, and more to remove aquatic invasive vegetation.

Cedar Lake Has Aquatic Invasive Species

Cedar Lake has eurasian water milfoil. It can be spread by water craft propeller cutting. When possible, ski and tube in water deeper than 12 feet to reduce the chance of spreading the invasive eurasian.

Cedar Lake is also infested with zebra mussels. If you launch a watercraft while you are here, please do a free hot water decontamination at the station in Annandale before launching in another lake. See information above regarding the station at 1300 Business Blvd.

Watch Your Wake

To help reduce erosion, and also as a great safety practice, we ask for a **voluntary practice of a “no-wake” when you are close to shore**—at least 150 feet from shore. A “no-wake” for most water crafts is the slowest speed possible to navigate.

Kids Don’t Float—Free Life Jacket Loaner Station

Are you short a life jacket? On the north side of the lake at Schroder Park is a Kids Don’t Float life jacket station. There are jackets of all sizes—including adult—on loan for free. Just use and return! **Don’t take a chance! Be safe and have fun!**

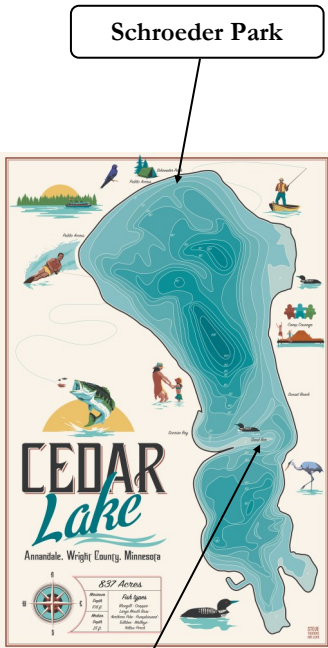


Cedar Feathered Friends

Check out the “T-14” **Purple Martin House** and **Chimney Swift Tower** at the Schroeder Park beach (north side of lake). Both structures are sponsored by the Cedar Lake Conservation Club, with the kind cooperation of Schroeder/Wright County Parks. There is an established colony of Purple Martins; listen for their sweet song and watch their acrobatic flight. Check out the interpretive signs and learn more about both!

We have **several pairs of nesting loons**. Some of the nesting areas are posted with buoys. Marvel and enjoy, but **please stay at least 100 feet away**.
