
# **Prayer for Vocations**

They love and they follow you in poverty on the path of sacrifice. Great is their generosity and their consecrated life is a great gift to your Church.

**Priest:** In the remotest corners of the world, at times in the midst of persecution and at great personal risk, your missionaries preach your Gospel to those who have not heard of you. They endure loneliness, fatigue, and misunderstanding. Yet, they








Vocation Action Network (VAN), formerly Vocation Action Circle, is a network of lay people who actively promote vocations within the Church. To support vocation work, VAN encourages prayer for vocations through "Adoration for Vocations" (AFV), which began in the 1990s as a grass roots effort to pray for all vocations within the Church. AFV encourages prayer to the "Lord of the Harvest," asking for holy vocations in our families, parishes, dioceses and the Universal Church.

Vocation Action Circle, incorporated in 1994 by Legionary of Christ priest, Fr. Anthony Bannon, in response to Pope John Paul II's consistent request for prayer and active promotion of vocations. In 2002, Vocation Action Circle launched vocation.com and held the first vocation.com Coffee House at World Youth Day in Toronto, Canada, the last World Youth Day for Pope John Paul II. The Coffee House helped many young people experience the intimacy of Jesus and embrace their vocation.

In 2004, Fr. Anthony had the great blessing of meeting Pope John Paul II after a world-wide *Adoration for Vocations* campaign had gathered 125,000 hours of *Adoration for Vocations* from 41 countries. The hours of Adoration were a gift for the 25th anniversary of John Paul II's pontificate. In a private audience with the beloved pope, Fr. Anthony presented the gift on what he described as one of the greatest days of his life.
