A Message coming from Our President Sara Joslin

"Celebrating Our Past, Embracing Our Future"

CWU-NJ continues to celebrate its 80th year as a state unit. We are "Telling our Stories" Past and Present. We celebrated our history and the legacy of CWU Presidents "Along the King Highway" including our first President, Mrs. Alfred Robie Driscoll of Haddonfield, Peg Stewart and Dr. Carolyn Hill Jones of Moorestown at our Fall Gathering at my home church, St.Andrew's UMC in Cherry Hill.

We engage together to strengthen our skills, serve others, and build communities. Lilisa J. Williamson led "Servant Leadership" zoom training in September. Gerry Harvey presented an interactive fundraising workshop at the 2023 Fall Gathering in October. The ingathering of donated items was distributed through Little Hands, Little Feet children's clothing ministry, the Cherry Hill Food Pantry, Neighborhood Center of Camden and the Maker's Place diaper depot in Trenton. Our CWU National President Elmira J. Washington visited New Jersey in November where she facilitated New Jersey CWU Financial training at the Cranford Community Center, engaged in a "Meet and Greet" in Plainfield, and attended Sunday worship service at Franklin St-Johns UMC in Newark followed by lunch and conversation among the members.

Our CWU-NJ 2023 Fall Gathering's speaker Jose Sanchez, Director of Immigration, Refugee and Migrant Services for Catholic Charities, Diocese of Camden, explained about the dangers of crossing the 60 mile wide roadless Darlen Gap and shared his experiences in service helping migrants arriving at the Catholic Respite Center in Brownsville Tx. Worship leader Rev. Cricket Denton, Director of Student and Missions at Haddonfield UMC and GNJ Conference Disaster Response Coordinator, challenged us to act to address climate change, seek justice, and eradicate racism in disaster response and recovery from natural disasters. We move forward "Living our Faith" in pursuit of peace, wholeness and justice. We Stand UP and Speak OUT for human rights of all God's children, serve others and pray for the sojourners displaced by war, violence, poverty or climate change "Finding Refuge, New Beginnings." We Advocate for Peace, We Act to Cultivate Love, Hope and Peace for All Creation.

Welcome to the new members and our CWU-NE Regional Coordinator Leslie Grantberry. We celebrate civil rights and climate activists, mentors and peace-builders, advocates and active listeners, engage all hearts and hands to pray, heal, and serve. Leslie was born and raised in Brooklyn, NY, a product of the Public School System 161,
International School 320 and Samuel J. Tilden High School. A proud Blue Devil out of Brooklyn,
NY. Received her BA and Master's degree in Criminal Justice from Monroe College. Leslie is a
member of the CWU-Brooklyn unit where she has served on the Justice Committee.

"Retired as a New York Correctional Officer, after 21 years at the Rikers Island Facility. During that time, I needed an outlet to keep myself grounded and I found it with the Girl Scouts of greater New York. I have ended up being a girl scout leader with great pride for over 25 years. I have watched my daughter, cousins and nieces and now granddaughter morphed from little girls to beautiful women and their dreams and inspirations come true. Some of my former" scouts have become nurses, police aides, and culinary chef. Just recently I helped one former scout acquire a position in the House of Representatives and one received a White House internship. How rewarding this position has been.

I think it is important to expose people, children especially, to things that exist outside of their neighborhoods. These experiences may have a lasting impact on them that could shape their future. It has shown so many positive events in the African American culture where they were made aware of the number of female judges we have in our history.

The same energy that I put into helping my young girls, I also put into working, talking and helping my senior citizens. I am still learning from them. The stories I am told, I can relate. My great-grandmother lived to be estimated 102 years. She was born before their birth certificates were given out. (The federal government did not start issuing birth certificates until 1907). Our family Bible states grandma was here since 1905. She passed at the age of 83.

I am also a Guardian AD Litem for housing court. I've received calls from Kings or Weschester Housing court to assist a person, the majority seniors, who doesn't understand or know anything about the housing court system. I have a soft spot in my heart for people and I try to protect them as much as possible. I put on my armor and prepare for war. No one is going to take advantage of my senior. I go above and beyond to make sure all of their needs are taken care of. I make it very clear even though the court has sent me to assist them, I am here for them. Those smiles and thank you fills my cup. To God be the Glory!!!!! "

2023 is rapidly ending which provides this opportunity for CWU-NJ to reflect on our goals and aspirations in the area of fiscal responsibility and sustainability:

We thank Ernestine Harrield for serving as our CWU-NJ state Treasurer and Evelyn Jacobson for facilitating the Treasurer transition after her many years of faithful service.

Steps have been taken towards fiscal actions at the state and local unit levels:

- (1) transition of the Treasurer role and responsibility at state and local levels.
- (2) Review/update state and local bylaws consistent with CWU National bylaws.
- (3) obtain/provide training & affirm non-profit status for our state and local units.
- (4) fundraising for sustainability of our state/local budget and programs/projects.

CWU- NJ approved a proposal at the June 2023 annual Retreat to hold a major fundraising event that will include participation by the local units and serve as a celebration of our 80th anniversary as a state unit. It was recommended that the event be held in Spring 2024. The "Hats Off to CWU - 80 years of Service" will include a luncheon with Tabletop Competition, recognition of former CWU leaders, highlights of our accomplishments, prizes and entertainment. Further details will be provided from the event committee at the Jan 18 CWU meeting.

CWU-NJ Finance Committee member Gerry Harvey provided a Fundraising 101 training at the CWU-NJ Fall Gathering in Cherry Hill NJ on October 21, 2023. Topics covered included benefits of fundraising, types of fundraising, and steps in executing a successful fundraiser. The workshop was well received and will be held again in the near future.

Another significant accomplishment was providing financial training to unit treasurers and other interested CWU members to clarify financial practices and procedures. Our CWU National President Mira Washington came to NJ for the November 11 & 12th weekend. Mira provided training packets and led a hybrid financial management training event from 10am to 2:30 pm at the Cranford Center in Cranford NJ. Topics which were addressed included financial controls, banking, 501 (c) 3 status, financial reporting, and submission of funds to the CWU National Office. Thank you to Gerry Harvey, Maxine Husbands Brown, Coleen Williams Lewis, Danielle Lewis Thompson (zoom host) and Bertha McPhaul for facilitating this training event & hospitality. Gerry Harvey hosted a dinner reception for Mira Washington. Members of the Newark Unit, as well as Maxine Husbands Brown and Gerry Harvey of the Plainfeld unit, attended worship service at Franklin-St. John UMC together with President Mira Washington who was also the guest of the Newark Unit for "brunch" following church. Mira provided a "thank you" note for the opportunity to train CWU members and for the hospitality she received from New Jersey. She wished us success in our state and unit projects and is available to assist us if needed.
