A Message from Sue for CHRISTMAS 2021

Every year my mother, Helen McCahill, wrote a Christmas letter to keep in touch with all her friends and family around the globe. I have copies of many of these letters, starting with 1963 when we moved to a new (over 150-year-old) home in Dover. Early on, the letters gave news of her children, Susan, Wendy and Jay. As we grew, her focus on other people grew. Soon her letters were filled with issues of poverty, homelessness, and injustice.



This year she was having difficulty composing her annual sharing of the joys and challenges of life as a deaconess in the United Methodist Church. This is what she struggled to share: Helen was embarrassed to have fallen victim to two scams. It was solely her dream to build transitional housing for women and their children that made her desperate to raise money. After the scam, she wished to warn others not to purchase gift cards for strangers, even though she herself had no fear of strangers. She was a fearless advocate for homelessness prevention. She had a dream for a better and more compassionate world for everyone.

I want to share the serious implications of diabetes and the importance of taking your medication and seeing your doctor regularly. The notes and cards over the years mentioned Helen's efforts to take good care of herself. She wanted to live to be a hundred but only made it to 87-years-old. To the very end she was helping others – that morning, she was cleaning snow off her car to go help a friend in need. Even after death, she is helping medical students to learn by donating her body. Continuing to learn and teach and grow were vital to her, and she leaves behind many books as evidence.

Mission u (formerly known as The Cooperative School of Christian Mission) was one of the events she attended annually. Her goal was to bring someone new along to experience the joy of learning and the supportive fellowship. She wished others had her compassion for housing for women, children and youth, who are the mission focus of United Methodist Women. Through her travels and contact with people of differing race, income, gender or sexuality, she expanded her concept of mission. In the words of Bishop John Schol, "Helen was a champion for justice."

Redistricting for Greater New Jersey United Methodist Women Approved on January 15, 2022

"The Leadership Team of the Greater New Jersey United Methodist Women (GNJUMW) moves forward in 2022 with the six newly-aligned districts as approved by the Greater New Jersey United Methodist Church Adjourned Session of the Annual Conference on Oct. 14, 2021. The six districts in two regions are Skylands, Meadowlands, Raritan Shore (Metro-Highlands), Central, Delaware Bay and Cape Atlantic (Coastal Plains)."

This resolution, as clarification for our purposes only, was suggested at a GNJUMW redistricting meeting on Saturday, December 11, 2021, drafted by the Standing Rules Committee, and approved at the Leadership Team meeting on January 15, 2022.

Elections in each new district will be held no sooner than 30 days from the January 15, 2022 meeting to allow notification to the local units.

The changes in the GNJUMW Districts will take effect on Monday, February 28, 2022.

All conference leaders were scheduled in breakout rooms to learn and discuss new plans and opportunities for Greater New Jersey. GNJUMW President Susan Zahorbenski served as program facilitator.

GNJUMW Fall Meeting October 16, 2021

The GNJUMW fall meeting was presided by President Sue Zahorbenski via zoom on the topic "Equity in Voting" with three speaker presentations followed by the business meeting.

Speaker Rev. Dr. Liz Theoharis, co-chair with Rev. William J. Barber II of the Poor People's Campaign, shared the work of the Poor People's Campaign and the Kairos Center on democracy and protecting and expanding voting rights.

Speaker Toni Zimmer, Board member of the League of Women Voters of Sussex Highlands (LWVS), presented the role of the League of Women Voters and their work to ensure all voices are heard.

Speaker Joyce Pratt, freelance writer and President of T&J Associates of NJ LLC and the Oneal Group discussed the importance of equitable access to voting in New Jersey and three issues that could affect the ability to vote: School Segregation, Redistricting/Redlining/Gerrymandering, and our dept ceiling.
