GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

APPLICABLE TO ALL EXHIBITORS:

1. All exhibitors agree to accept these regulations and any department-specific regulations when entering. Please call (928) 899-6056 with any questions.
2. All exhibits must comply with the special regulations of the appropriate department. Agriculture, Horticulture, and Floriculture entries must be grown by the exhibitor. **Any entry (excluding livestock) previously shown at the Yavapai Fair will be disqualified.** A "Junior" or "Youth" is defined as a person 18 years or younger as of the first day of the fair, unless otherwise specified within the department.
3. **Entries must have been completed during the Fair Year**
4. Online entry is available at (www.yavapaifair.com). In addition to online entry, entries will be accepted at the Fair office from August 1st until the entry deadline (excluding all livestock).
5. Every entry must be entered in the name of the owner and/or the person who created the item. For Floriculture/Horticulture entries, the exhibitor must also have planted and grown the item in Yavapai County.
6. All judges will be selected by the Fair. The awards given by judges will be accepted by all exhibitors. Judges will not make an award where, in their opinion, the exhibit is not worthy, regardless of the number of entries in a division or class. Exhibitors must not interfere with judges by making suggestions or engaging in arguments. Violations of this rule will result in disqualification and forfeiture of premiums and entry fees. In case of a dispute, the Fair Committee's decision will be final.
7. Exhibitors must remove their exhibits or arrange removal with the coordinators of the appropriate department on the Sunday of fair completion between 6:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. Removing items prior to this time without authorization may result in disqualification from the fair.
8. The Fair will take every precaution to care for and protect exhibits but will not be responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits or persons. Any property left two (2) days after the Fair closes becomes the property of the Yavapai Fair and may be disposed of.
9. Premiums will be paid by the Yavapai Fair. Any unclaimed monies or checks not cashed within 90 days of the date issued will be forfeited.
10. Online entries are entitled to one free Yavapai County Fair pass, which is to be used only by the exhibitor. One pass will be issued per exhibitor, regardless of the number of entries.
11. Open School Exhibits will not receive a free pass for students, teachers, or administrators.
12. Judging will follow the **Danish style**, meaning there may be more than one blue, red, white, or honorable mention ribbon per class and division. Blue, red, and white ribbons represent the quality of the work according to the standards of the class, division, or department.
13. Class winners will be awarded for each class if there are 5 or more entries in the class, and there are 3 or more classes in a division with 5 entries each. Otherwise, only division awards will be given. The combining and forming of classes and the setting of award levels is at the discretion of the Fair Committee of the Yavapai County Fair.
14. Age Divisions:
 - (Child) Child: 4-12 Years of Age
 - (Youth) Youth: 13-18 Years of Age
 - (Youth) Child/Youth: 4-18 Years of Age (Floriculture & Agricultural)
 - (Adult) Adult: 19+ Novice
15. Check-Out: No exhibit can be picked up or removed prior to 6:00 p.m. on the Sunday of the Fair. There are no exceptions. Early removal may result in disqualification from future participation.
16. Premium Book updates will be made at the discretion of the board as needed. Changes will be reflected on the website. The most current website updates will supersede any printed copy of the Premium Book.

We will furnish containers for all cut flowers and herbs. Cut flowers will be watered by the department and removed when they are unsuited to remain. House plants will be watered (unless labeled). **ALL FLOWER ENTRIES SHOULD HAVE FOLIAGE.**

You may enter online. All entries will be received on Tuesday September 8th 12pm - 7pm.

Entries will be on display - Neither Coordinator nor the Fair are liable for loss or damage to exhibits left after this time. Any entries left become the property of the Fair and may be discarded. Judging is closed to the public.

Exhibits must have been grown in Yavapai County by a Yavapai County resident.

Each person may make as many entries as desired, but only one entry in each class.

Each exhibitor will be entitled to ONE fair entry pass regardless of how many entries the person has.

All entries meeting Blue-Ribbon quality will receive a Blue Ribbon, those meeting Red-Ribbon quality will receive a Red Ribbon, and those meeting White-Ribbon quality will receive a White Ribbon. Following this, a Best of Class will be awarded for each class, a Best of Division for division winners, and finally, a Best of Show for common areas.

The coordinator may change the plate or platter and place them inside a display case for presentation.

- Presentation of Entries - All entries must be in a sturdy, closeable container; that Transports the items without harming, squishing, disturbing item(s), or its/ their decoration. You may Bring Items in/on Disposable or Non-Disposable containers. ***Please remember to pick up your nondisposable containers after the fair Sunday between 6-7 pm, if they are left behind, they will be disposed of.***
- Extra Small Entries - Minimum of 8 items: example candies, Bite size food
- *Small Entries - Minimum of 8 items: example 3" cookies, Mini muffins, Fudge
- Medium Entries - Minimum of 6 items: example 4" cookies, Standard Cupcakes/Muffins,
- Large and Extra-Large Entries - Minimum of 1 Item (***plus A sample if you do not want main item to cut***): example: jumbo cookies + 1 small cookie, 2 jumbo cupcakes, 1 mini cake + 1 sample, 2 Mini Loaves, Standard Loaf, Cake, Pies.

Canning Entry Rules:

- Canned good entries: 1/2 Pint - 1/2 Gallon acceptable
- Jars: standard canning jars identified by the manufacturer name on the container. • Use caps and seals free from rust or scratches ~ preferably new
- Screw rim must be loosened but not removed.
- Seal must be tight and intact when opened for judging.
- Do not use wax.
- Canned goods must be clearly labeled and free from stickiness.
- Labels: placed on each jar, should show date made and name of product. ***Do not include the exhibitor's name on labels.*** Items not labeled will not be accepted.

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

Exhibits must have been grown in Yavapai County by a Yavapai County resident.

Each person may make as many entries as desired, but only one entry in each class: for example, as many onions in the Onion division as desired, but only one each in Class 1 Pearl, Class 2 Bermuda, Class 3 Red, etc.

Each exhibitor will be entitled to ONE fair entry pass regardless of how many entries the person has.

There are no entry fees in the Horticulture Department.

All entries must be free of disease and insect injury. Superintendents or the Fair will not be held liable for loss or damage to exhibits left after this time. Any entries left become the property of the Fair and may be discarded.

Exhibits will be displayed on uniformly sized plates furnished by the Fair. All exhibits will be cared for in an efficient manner but in no case will the Yavapai Fair be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.

All classes are judged on market standards of size, uniformity, and presentation. If there are not enough entries in a class to provide adequate competition, closely related classes may be combined at the discretion of the Judge and Superintendents. It is the sole discretion of the Judge whether the exhibits are awarded first, second, or third ribbons. No exhibitors may be present during judging.

QUALIFICATIONS/CATEGORIES

DISPLAY RULES

Each piece of artwork should have a copy of the "School Art / Educational Exhibits

Then on the front each item should have an identification card in any color about the size of a business card should be attached to the front bottom corner of each item. **The card should identify: Name and Grade of Student, their teacher, and School.** It is encouraged for the schools to make their own cards on a computer w/ the name of the school preprinted on the cards, so they are easy to read. Each school is responsible for A BIG SIGN to be posted in their space indicating the name and location of their school.

- Junior: 7-11 (Age by Fair Check In) (Cattle)
- Intermediate: 12-15 (Age by Fair Check In)
- Senior: 16-18 (Seniors who Graduate the May Prior to Fair can return at 19 the fair immediately after they graduate, cannot be over the age of 19) (Age by Fair Check In)

Note: It is the exhibitor's responsibility to know the rules of their respective youth livestock organization.

Entry Fee and Paperwork Requirements:

Market Entry Fee \$25.00

Non-Market Entries \$25.00 Small Stock: Entry Fee \$15.00

Seasonal Pass is Required for All Entries and Must be Present at Ear Tagging and Check-In You must bring a copy to provide to the fair

Special Accommodations: Persons with a disability may request reasonable accommodation by contacting the Youth Livestock President. Requests should be made as early as possible to allow time to arrange for the accommodation.

Exhibitor Dress: All exhibitors must present themselves in the official dress of the youth livestock organization they enter with. If the organization does not have an official dress, then a collared shirt, pants or skirt, and closed toe shoes. (If entered as an FFA student – Official Dress for Shows and Auction, 4-H Clubs should be in 4-H attire, other club entrants should be in the official dress for that club)

NOTE: The youth livestock committee may dismiss or restrict an exhibitor from the class or sale for inappropriate attire including, but not limited to, any wording promoting drugs, alcohol, & profanity. Check with your superintendent in advance if you have any questions regarding your attire. **EXHIBITOR # ON BACK must be worn during all shows.**

Entry Requirements

1. ALL INFORMATION INCLUDING RULES ARE SUBJECT FOR CHANGE AND CLARIFICATION AS DEEMED NECESSARY BY THE YFC BOARD, IN EVENT THE EVENT IS CANCELED ALL ENTRY FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE.
2. **Entries are to be submitted online at www.yavapaifair.com prior to tagging. These** are to be used for each department and/or species in which the exhibitor participates. Go to www.yavapaifair.com for specific information. No entries will be accepted without **Entry Fees and Supporting Paperwork Submitted ENTIRELY online.**
3. **Seasonal Passes / Premise I.D.'s** - All exhibitors are required to be in full compliance with the Arizona Department of Agriculture (AZDA) regulations regarding Seasonal Passes. Seasonal Pass Numbers will be required at time of entry and will be verified prior to check-in. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to follow the rules and regulations of the department of agriculture.

General Rules & Information

1. The Yavapai Fair assumes no responsibility for loss or damage. All animals must be free of infectious diseases and its signs. Show management has the right to ask for any animal showing signs of ill health or behavioral problems to leave the premises.
2. All exhibits not claimed by **7:00pm on Sunday** will be disposed of by the Yavapai County Youth Livestock Committee and Yavapai County Fair.
3. Exhibitors will be responsible for feeding and watering his/her animals, cleaning their stalls, and keeping their portion of the aisles always clean during the fair for the safety of all exhibitors and public.
4. **ALL Animals entered the fair will be available for use for round robin at the Yavapai County Fair.**
5. It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to provide additional supplies or fencing to keep the animal in the pen in the event the animal can escape. (Material must be wrapped to protect the pens.)

6. **Animals should be fit, cared, and handled by the exhibitor. ONLY exhibitors entered the Livestock division of the fair can assist another exhibitor. NO parents or leaders will be allowed in the fitting area or behind the show ring, alley ways, or the holding area. If an exhibitor needs assistance the coordinator will need to be contacted. Only leaders and parents with helper bands that have been approved will be allowed in the fitting area or behind the show ring, alley ways, or holding pen. Swine will be the only exception, which will allow parents or exhibitors entered in the livestock division to keep pigs hydrated and cooled in the alleyways and holding pens.**
7. NO paints will be allowed for any reason in Swine, Goat, & Lamb.
8. All species fitting will NOT allow any additional hair, wool, or synthetic substance added to the animal.
9. NO Exhibitor can charge for any fitting or assisting at the fair.
10. NO STRAW can be used for bedding!
11. Only one sheep/goat stand per exhibitor and one cattle blocking chute per exhibitor.
12. NO Sides on pop-up covers will be allowed in the fitting areas. The space is limited and to be shared.
13. NO animals are allowed to leave the pens at check-out without the proper paperwork.
14. No Exhibitor Under the Age of 18 Shall be left at Fair without supervision.
15. Awards are not guaranteed in any department from year to year.
16. Pens for animals will be assigned and not to be changed without prior consent. Single animal pens are not guaranteed, and animals will be assigned to share as needed for space.
17. All exhibits are to be owned by the exhibitor or under a lease agreement.
18. Exhibitors must show (EXHIBITOR'S) animals both in conformation and showmanship to be eligible to sell. The showmanship animal may be any animal entered in that species by that exhibitor.
19. Exhibitors must provide their own bedding, as well as feed and water containers.
20. Animals will be placed according to the weight of the official scale.
21. Animals with health concerns will be checked by the official show vet, if there are health concerns it will be addressed by the show vet and can result in disqualification.
22. The USDA Wholesome Meat Act applies to all animals. It is the exhibitor and exhibitors' family responsibility to read and know the USDA Wholesome Meat A
23. Animals do not need to be purebred to enter the Yavapai County Fair.
24. Drenching is allowed for the hydration and nutrition of the animal (No item or device shall be inserted in an animal's mouth more than 2" and no airways are blocked. Nor shall any item at any time be inserted in any other area of the animal). Drenching for medication can only be done with the show veterinarian or Yavapai County Fair Board of Director Member present.
25. ALL Medication can only be given to the animal under the supervision of the fair veterinarian or Yavapai County Fair Board of Director Member.
26. The committee reserves the right to check teeth or any other method to verify the age of an animal entered
27. **ANY VIOLATION OF A RULE OR RESPECT OF A DEADLINE OR VOLUNTEER CAN BE GROUNDS FOR DISQUALIFICATION, AWARD REMOVAL, REMOVAL FROM THE SALE, OR OTHER ACTION AS SEEN FIT BY THE Yavapai County Fair Youth Livestock Committee and Yavapai County Fair Board.**
28. A minimum of 3 animals must be entered in a division/class to constitute a separate class and grand champion awards.
29. Exhibitors can enter as many entries as desired. However, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to groom, feed, and fit all entries for the show. Exhibitors can assist others, however showing multiply species and not being able to effectively handle your entries is not acceptable and can cause disqualification if the expectation is not met at the discretion of the Yavapai County Fair.
30. Rules can be modified or clarified by the Board of Directors at any time and will be posted on the website. Changes reflected on the website will supersede any printed copy.
31. Exhibitors shall abide by the general rules as well as the specific livestock rules.

Check-In / Check-Out:

1. Animal Check-In will be scheduled – Swine 7am-8am, Sheep, Goat, Beef 10am-12pm^(noon) (If you have swine and another specie you can come to swine check-in time with both species), Small Stock Check-In – Pick up Packet in Large Livestock Parking then go to Small Stock Barn to check-in Animal
2. All Animals must be free of disease and fungus at time of check-in.
3. All paperwork must be complete and submitted at time of check-in.
4. NO Check Out of ANY ANIMAL or PROJECT will be allowed prior to 6:00pm on Sunday of the Fair.
5. All Animals leaving the fair must be released by the coordinator prior to leaving the premises.
6. ALL TRAILERS must leave the premises prior to 5:00am on Thursday of the Fair.
7. NO TRAILERS will be allowed in the parking on Sunday of the Fair.
8. No guarantee of vehicle or trailer access during check-in.

Judging:

1. All Conformation judging of animals will be done in the manner of the Danish Award System. The decision is the decision of the judge and all judge's decisions are final. If there is a case of fraud or misrepresentation the award will be removed, and the exhibitor will be disqualified.
2. Showmanship is a judging of the exhibitor's ability to show, fit, and handle the project. Questions can be answered as part of the judging process.
3. No Awards from Year to Year are Guaranteed at any time.

Auction Rules

1. **Grand Champion & Reserve Champion Market Animals Large & Small Livestock will all be a terminal sale. (This means they will be processed and not kept for pet or breeding)**
2. **Exhibitors approaching buyers to have animals returned to them or asking buyer to change processor or manner of handling of animal purchase is NOT allowed and can be grounds for disqualification or forfeiting of auction proceeds.**
3. All ribbon awards blue, red, and white will be sold in the livestock auction.
4. No private treaty sales will be allowed on the fair premises, the fair has a consignment sale process for all exhibitors to sell animals and projects outside the livestock auction.
5. **An exhibitor may sell Only One Lot in the Auction (One Large, or One Small, Or One Indoor) The only exception is All Grand and Reserve Large Livestock Must Sell.**
6. **An Exhibitor showing multiple species in Large Livestock can declare at Entry which specie is the auction specie. This specie will sell even if the other specie wins Grand or Reserve.** (i.e.: exhibitor shows beef and sheep, and declares the beef as the auction specie, the exhibitor will sell the beef and only sell the sheep if the sheep wins grand or reserve)
7. **An Exhibitor showing ONLY small stock animals can declare at Entry which animal is the auction specie.** This specie will sell even if the other species entered wins Grand or Reserve.
