



## GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

### APPLICABLE TO ALL EXHIBITORS:

1. All exhibitors agree to accept these regulations and any regulations pertaining to a department when entering. Please call (928) 899-6056 if you have any questions.
2. All exhibits must conform with special regulations of the proper department. Agriculture, Horticulture, and Floriculture must be grown by the exhibitor. Any entry (except livestock) that has been previously shown at the Yavapai Fair shall be disqualified. A "professional" is anyone who sells said item from his home or business and makes 50% or more of his income from said activity. "Junior" or "Youth" is a person 18 years or younger as of the first day of the fair, unless otherwise specified within the department.
3. Online Entry is available at ([www.yavapaifair.com](http://www.yavapaifair.com)), In Addition to Online Entry we can accept Entries at the Fair office from Aug 1<sup>st</sup> – Entry Deadline. (Excluding All Livestock)
4. Every entry shall be entered in the name of the owner and/or the person who created the item and be residents of Yavapai County. You also must have planted and grown in Yavapai County for Floriculture/Horticulture.
5. All judges will be selected by the Fair and the awards of the judges will be accepted by entrants. **JUDGES will make no award where, in their opinion, the exhibit is not worthy, regardless of number of exhibits in the Division or Class.** No exhibitor shall interfere in any way, either by making suggestions or arguing with a judge. In any violation of this rule, the exhibitor will be barred from exhibition and will forfeit premiums and entry fees. In the event of a dispute, the decision of the Fair Committee **of Yavapai County Fair** will be final.
6. All exhibitors will be expected to remove their exhibits or plan for removal with the coordinators of the proper department on Sunday of the Completion of Fair **NOT BEFORE 6:00 P.M AND UP TO 7:00 P.M (Picking Up your Item prior to the Pickup Times**
7. THE FAIR WILL TAKE EVERY PRECAUTION TO GIVE PROPER CARE AND PROTECTION OF EXHIBITS BUT WILL NOT ACCEPT RESPONSIBILITY FOR LOSS OR DAMAGE TO ANY EXHIBIT OR PERSON. Any property left over two (2) days after closing of Fair becomes the property of the Yavapai Fair and may be disposed of.
8. **Premiums will be paid by the Yavapai Fair. Unclaimed monies & Checks not cashed within 90 days of the Date of Check Issued will be forfeited.**
9. Online Entries are allowed 1 FREE Yavapai County Fair pass. The pass is to be used only by the exhibitor. One pass only will be issued regardless of how many entries you have.
10. Open School Exhibits will NOT be given a free pass for students, teachers, or Administrators of the School
11. Judging will be in the Danish style. Which means there may be more than 1 blue, red, white, and honorable mention ribbon per class and division. 5 or more entries in one class can be split to a separate Division upon discretion of the Fair Committee of Yavapai County Fair
12. Check-Out – NO EXHIBIT can be picked up or removed prior to 6:00pm on the Sunday of Fair. There is no EXCEPTION – Removal of an exhibit early can cause for future disqualification.
13. Premium Book updates will be made at the discretion of the board as needed. Changes will be reflected on the website. The website most current changes will supersede any printed copy of the Premium book.

We will furnish containers for all cut flowers and herbs. Cut flowers will be watered by the department and removed when they are unsuited to remain. House plants will be watered (unless labeled). **ALL FLOWER ENTRIES SHOULD HAVE FOLIAGE.**

Use a general entry form. You may enter online or bring the completed form with your entry. All entries will be received on Wednesday, September 4, 2024 from 3pm to 6pm.

Entries will be on display - Neither Coordinator nor the Fair are liable for loss or damage to exhibits left after this time. Any entries left become the property of the Fair and may be discarded.

Judging is closed to the public.

Exhibits must have been grown in Yavapai County by a Yavapai County resident.

Each person may make as many entries as desired, but only one entry in each class.

Each exhibitor will be entitled to ONE fair entry pass regardless of how many entries the person has.

So, all Blue-Ribbon quality will receive a Blue Ribbon, Red Ribbon quality will receive a Red Ribbon, White Ribbon quality will receive a White Ribbon. - \* The coordinator may change the plate or platter and place them inside a display case for presentation.
- Presentation of Entries - All entries must be in a sturdy, closeable container; that Transports the items without harming, squishing, disturbing item(s), or its/ their decoration. You may Bring Items in/on Disposable or Non-Disposable containers. **Please remember to pick up your non-disposable containers after the fair Sunday between 6-7 pm, if they are left behind, they will be disposed of.**
- Extra Small Entries - Minimum of 8 items: example candies, Bite size food
- \*Small Entries - Minimum of 8 items: example 3" cookies, Mini muffins, Fudge
- Medium Entries - Minimum of 6 items: example 4" cookies, Standard Cupcakes/Muffins,
- Large and Extra-Large Entries - Minimum of 1 Item (**plus A sample if you do not want main item to cut**): example: jumbo cookies + 1 small cookie, 2 Jumbo cupcakes, 1 mini cake + 1 sample, 2 Mini Loaves, Standard Loaf, Cake, Pies.

**Canning Entry Rules:**

- Canned good entries: 1/2 Pint - 1/2 Gallon acceptable
- Jars: standard canning jars identified by the manufacturer name on the container.
- Use caps and seals free from rust or scratches ~ preferably new
- Screw rim must be loosened but not removed.
- Seal must be tight and intact when opened for judging.
- Do not use wax.
- Canned goods must be clearly labeled and free from stickiness.
- Labels: placed on each jar, should show date made and name of product. **Do not include the exhibitor's name on labels.** Items not labeled will not be accepted.

If no exhibit is deserving, then there are to be no awards for that class. A minimum of 3 items in each class must be entered into fair for full premiums to be awarded. Classes will be combined if minimum entries are not received.

## Seasonal Pass is Required for All Entries and Must be Present at Ear Tagging and Check-In You must bring a copy to provide to the fair

**Special Accommodations:** Persons with a disability may request reasonable accommodation by contacting the Youth Livestock President. Requests should be made as early as possible to allow time to arrange for the accommodation.

**Exhibitor Dress:** All exhibitors must present themselves in the official dress of the youth livestock organization they enter with. If the organization does not have an official dress, then a collared shirt, pants or skirt, and closed toe shoes. **NOTE: The youth livestock committee may dismiss or restrict an exhibitor from the class or sale for inappropriate attire including, but not limited to, any wording promoting drugs, alcohol, & profanity. Check with your superintendent in advance if you have any questions regarding your attire. EXHIBITOR # ON BACK must be worn during all shows.**

#### Entry Requirements

1. ALL INFORMATION INCLUDING RULES ARE SUBJECT FOR CHANGE AND CLARIFICATION AS DEEMED NECESSARY BY THE YFC BOARD, IN EVENT THE EVENT IS CANCELED ALL ENTRY FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE.
2. **Entries are to be submitted online with Sho Works at [www.yavapaifair.com](http://www.yavapaifair.com) prior to tagging. These** are to be used for each department and/or species in which the exhibitor participates. Go to [www.yavapaifair.com](http://www.yavapaifair.com) for specific information. No entries will be accepted without **Entry Fees and Supporting Paperwork Submitted ENTIRELY online.**
3. **Seasonal Passes / Premise I.D.'s** - All exhibitors are required to be in full compliance with the Arizona Department of Agriculture (AZDA) regulations regarding Seasonal Passes. Seasonal Pass Numbers will be required at time of entry and will be verified prior to check-in. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to follow the rules and regulations of the department of agriculture.

**Seasonal passes are issued by the livestock inspector not the office. The inspector will be at the youth livestock monthly meetings to issue seasonal passes. If you need one, just call the inspection line and request a seasonal pass. If a leader wants to schedule the inspector to come to a youth meeting contact the fair office and we will coordinate for you.**

#### General Rules & Information

1. The Yavapai Fair assumes no responsibility for loss or damage. All animals must be free of infectious diseases and its signs. Show management has the right to ask for any animal showing signs of ill health or behavioral problems to leave the premises.
2. All exhibits not claimed by **7:00pm on Sunday** will be disposed of by the Yavapai County Youth Livestock Committee and Yavapai County Fair.
3. Exhibitors will be responsible for feeding and watering his/her animals, cleaning their stalls, and keeping their portion of the aisles always clean during the fair for the safety of all exhibitors and public.
4. It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to provide additional supplies or fencing to keep the animal in the pen in the event the animal can escape. (Material must be wrapped to protect the pens.)
5. **Animals should be fit, cared, and handled by the exhibitor. ONLY exhibitors entered the Livestock division of the fair can assist another exhibitor. NO parents or leaders will be allowed in the fitting area or behind the show ring, alley ways, or the holding area. If an exhibitor needs assistance the coordinator will need to be contacted. Only leaders and parents with helper bands that have been approved will be allowed in the fitting area or behind the show ring, alley ways, or holding pen. Swine will be the only exception, which will allow parents or exhibitors entered in the livestock division to keep pigs hydrated and cooled in the alleyways and holding pens.**
6. **NO paints will be allowed for any reason in Swine, Goat, & Lamb.**
7. **All species fitting will NOT allow any additional hair, wool, or synthetic substance added to the animal.**
8. **NO Exhibitor can charge for any fitting or assisting at the fair.**
9. **NO STRAW can be used for bedding!**
10. **Only one sheep/goat stand per exhibitor and one cattle blocking chute per exhibitor.**
11. **NO Sides on pop-up covers will be allowed in the fitting areas. The space is limited and to be shared.**
12. **NO animals are allowed to leave the pens at check-out without the proper paperwork.**
13. **No Exhibitor Under the Age of 18 Shall be left at Fair without supervision.**
14. **Awards are not guaranteed in any department from year to year.**
15. **Pens for animals will be assigned and not to be changed without prior consent. Single animal pens are not guaranteed, and animals will be assigned to share as needed for space.**
16. All exhibits are to be owned by the exhibitor or under a lease agreement.
17. Exhibitors must show (EXHIBITOR'S) animals both in conformation and showmanship to be eligible to sell. The showmanship animal may be any animal entered in that species by that exhibitor.

18. Exhibitors must provide their own bedding, as well as feed and water containers.
19. Animals will be placed according to the weight of the official scale.
20. Animals with health concerns will be checked by the official show vet, if there are health concerns it will be addressed by the show vet and can result in disqualification.
21. The USDA Wholesome Meat Act applies to all animals. It is the exhibitor and exhibitors' family responsibility to read and know the USDA Wholesome Meat A
22. Animals do not need to be purebred to enter the Yavapai County Fair.
23. Drenching is allowed for the hydration and nutrition of the animal (No item or device shall be inserted in an animal's mouth more than 2" and no airways are blocked. Nor shall any item at any time be inserted in any other area of the animal). Drenching for medication can only be done with the show veterinarian or Yavapai County Fair Board of Director Member present.
24. ALL Medication can only be given to the animal under the supervision of the fair veterinarian or Yavapai County Fair Board of Director Member.
25. The committee reserves the right to check teeth or any other method to verify the age of an animal entered
26. ANY VIOLATION OF A RULE OR RESPECT OF A DEADLINE OR VOLUNTEER CAN BE GROUNDS FOR DISQUALIFICATION, AWARD REMOVAL, REMOVAL FROM THE SALE, OR OTHER ACTION AS SEEN FIT BY THE Yavapai County Fair Youth Livestock Committee and Yavapai County Fair Board.
27. 3 or more animals in a class will constitute a separate class, if there are less than 3 a separate class will not be formed.
28. Rules can be modified or clarified by the Board of Directors at any time and will be posted on the website. Changes reflected on the website will supersede any printed copy.
29. Exhibitors shall abide by the general rules as well as the specific livestock rules.

### Check-In / Check-Out:

1. All Animals must be free of disease and fungus at time of check-in.
2. All paperwork must be complete and submitted at time of check-in.
3. NO Check Out of ANY ANIMAL or PROJECT will be allowed prior to 6:00pm on Sunday of the Fair.
4. All Animals leaving the fair must be released by the coordinator prior to leaving the premises.
5. ALL TRAILERS must leave the premises prior to 5:00am on Thursday of the Fair.
6. NO TRAILERS will be allowed in the parking on Sunday of the Fair.
7. No guarantee of vehicle or trailer access during check-in.

### Judging:

1. All Conformation judging of animals will be done in the manner of the Danish Award System. The decision is the decision of the judge and all judge's decisions are final. If there is a case of fraud or misrepresentation the award will be removed, and the exhibitor will be disqualified.
2. Showmanship is a judging of the exhibitor's ability to show, fit, and handle the project. Questions can be answered as part of the judging process.
3. No Awards from Year to Year are Guaranteed at any time.

### Auction Rules

1. All ribbon awards blue, red, and white will be sold in the livestock auction.
2. No private treaty sales will be allowed on the fair premises, the fair has a consignment sale process for all exhibitors to sell animals and projects outside the livestock auction.
3. **An exhibitor may sell one large livestock, one small stock and/or one indoor exhibit in the live auction.**
4. The sale order will be Grand Champions, Reserve Champions, Supreme Exhibitor, then all blue, red, white ribbons.
5. No Grand or Reserve Champion animal will be allowed to pull from the auction, All Grand & Reserve Champion Animals are required to sell.
6. Max Payouts: Steers Max Payout 1300 lbs., Lambs Max Payout 150lbs, Goats Max Payout 100lbs, Swine Max Payout 300lbs
7. The Yavapai County Fair, Yavapai Fair Foundation, Inc. does not guarantee the sale of any animal or project. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to promote the auction to prospective buyers.
8. NO costumes or decorations in any way will be allowed in the sale ring.
9. 7% commission will be deducted from the total proceeds, including add-ons, of each item sold in the auction. The auction proceeds are held in a scholarship and sponsorship fund to help grow youth livestock in Yavapai County.
10. The exhibitor that enters the animal must show their own animal in the auction.
11. Auction order will be Indoor followed, Goat, Beef, Pig, catch a Calf, Lamb and will rotate each year.
12. Checks will not be issued prior to the Carcass award night, as well as prior to exhibitor sending a copy of the Thank You card & Addressed envelopes for all donations received from the sell at auction.
13. If a check is wanted to be mailed a self-addressed stamped envelope will need to be turned in at check-in.
14. Checks not sent prior to 180 days from fair that have not met the requirements of gratitude are subject to forfeiture of funds as well as possible further repercussions.
