


Thank you for all that you do Timothy Stott by Sal Siraguse

This fall, the Christopher Columbus statue was vandalized in Pueblo, Colorado. Video surveillance and great police work identified the individual who caused the damage. As a result, the subject Vincent Martinez Ortega was arrested on the charge of damaging and defacing public property, a felony. On January 9, 2022, in the City and County of Pueblo, Ortega reached a plea agreement which reduced the felony violation to a misdemeanor. As a result of this conviction, the defendant was sentenced to 18 months supervised probation, payment of all court costs, 100 hours of community service, and restitution of \$3,900 to pay the city back for the damage and repair of the statue.

Ironically, Ortega is running for a City Council position in Pueblo. The defendant must also abstain from alcohol and marijuana use during his probation with mandatory weekly testing. If any of these conditions are violated, his probation will be revoked.

Anyone can conduct a "Google" search for Valentine's Day. What is most interesting is the similarities of Valentines in Italy. Historically Valentines was celebrated as a Spring Festival. Italians will celebrate the advent of spring together by spending time outdoors, strolling in parks, sitting under trees or in beautiful gardens, and listening to music or talking.

Florence and Venice are traditionally considered to be two of the most romantic places in Italy but Verona, the city of Romeo and Juliet celebrates Valentine's Day with a four-day celebration of events designated "Verona in Love." In the center of Piazza dei Signori a giant red heart is painted on the street.

Holiday recipes....

Are you looking for something delicious to serve at the holidays or anytime really....check out these recipes.

COORS HAM –Great!

- 1-15 lb. precooked ham with bone
- 1-pound dark brown sugar
- 4 12-oz. cans Coors beer and water

Glaze

1/4 C. honey

1/4 C. Dijon mustard

2 C. packed dark brown sugar

1/2 C. bourbon



Place the ham in deep roasting pan. Firmly pat 1-pound brown sugar on all sides of ham. Pour beer around ham. Cover and bake at 325 degrees for 3 3/4 hours (15 minutes per pound). One hour before end of baking time, pour off all but 3 inches of beer. In small saucepan, combine honey, mustard, 2 cups brown sugar, and bourbon; heat until sugar melts. Baste ham with beer mixture from bottom of pan and then bourbon glaze. Use all bourbon glaze before removing ham from oven. **Do not pour out the sauce!** It's great for reheating ham pieces. Slice thinly and serve with sauce remaining in pan. Serve with cheesy mashed potatoes or gratin dauphinois.

GRATIN DAUPHINOIS GOOD

There is something about the texture of the potatoes surrounded by creamy goodness and topped by golden brown cheese that wows people. The technique of starting the potatoes in a saucepan of half-and-half and ending them in a buttered gratin dish comes from the masterful Jacques Pépin.

- 2 1/2 lbs. boiling potatoes, such as Yukon Gold
- 1 sliced very thin Vidalia onion
- 2- to 3 1/2 cups half-and-half (enough to cover potatoes)
- 2 large garlic cloves, minced
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1/8 teaspoon freshly grated nutmeg
- 3/4 cup coarsely grated Gruyere or ½ cup Cheddar
- Put a rack in middle of oven and preheat oven to 400°F. Generously butter a 9x11 pan or large gratin pan.
- Peel potatoes. Slice with a mandolin crosswise into 1/16-inch-thick slices with slicer and transfer to a 4-quart heavy saucepan. Add half-and-half, garlic, salt, and pepper and bring just to a boil over moderate heat. Meanwhile slice onion if using.
- Pour some potato mixture into buttered dish, distributing potatoes evenly, and then adding the onions, then more potato. Pour in all the cream. Sprinkle nutmeg and cheese evenly over top. Place pan on a cookie sheet. Bake until potatoes are tender, and top is golden brown, 35 to 45 minutes. Let stand for 15 minutes before serving.

COOKS' NOTE: The gratin can be made up to 1 day ahead. Cool completely, then refrigerate, covered. Bring to room temperature before reheating, covered, in a 350°F oven, but not as good as freshly baked. Serves 8
