#### **US Department of Defense and our First Responders**

At our general meeting (social evening) November 16, we will be honoring veterans and first responders. Please make the time to come and join us in showing our appreciation to these men and women who have put their lives on the line to protect us.

**Army** – The largest and oldest service in the United States Military, the Army provides the ground forces that protect the United States.

Navy – On, above and below, the Navy is America's forward-deployed force and is a major deterrent to aggression around the world.

Marines – A component of the Department of the Navy, the Marine Corps maintains amphibious and ground units for contingency and combat operations.

**Coast Guard** – The Coast Guard provides law and maintains safety enforcement marine and environmental protection and military naval support. Part of Department of Homeland Security during peacetime and operates under the Navy during time of war.

**Air Force** – The Airforce provides a rapid, flexible and lethal air and space capability that can deliver forces anywhere in the world within hours.

**National Guard** – National Guard comprised of the Army National Guard and Air National Guard is a versatile force, supporting combat missions, domestic emergencies, humanitarian efforts, homeland security operations and more.

A Firefighter - is responsible for using their physical stamina and compassionate nature to combat fires and other hazardous situations while ensuring the safety of others. Their duties include using equipment to extinguish fires, rescuing members of the public from dangerous conditions and providing cleanup services to law enforcement at the scene of a car accident or natural disaster.

A police officer - is a government employee who protects lives and property, enforces law and order in communities and investigates crimes. A police officer issues citations for minor offenses like traffic violations and testifies in court cases. Police officers also provide first aid to road accident or crime victims before paramedics arrive. Police officers have ranks based on their skills and job experience.

**Federal law enforcement** officer - officer, agent, or employee of the United States authorized by law or by a Government agency to engage in or supervise the prevention, detection, investigation, or prosecution of any violation of Federal criminal law.

**EMT/Paramedic** They provide first-line medical or emergency care for sick and injured people at the scene, which may be in the person's home, at an accident site or other places and while they are being transported to the hospital for care. They typically operate in teams with one person serving as an emergency vehicle operator while the other continues to provide life-saving emergency care to the pattern oute to a medical facility



Italian Family Values and Traditions by Eleanor Gacetta
Italian family traditions often change as each generation passes to
their eternal home. This is true with most cultures. Italian family
values are steeped in tradition. Here are some of the most
prevalent traditions to Italians.

#### 1.Family

Family is the most important part of the lives of Italians. Italians are close knit, not just their immediate family but their extended family as well. Hell, friends often become like family. When I was growing up, we were taught to stay close to families and to strive to maintain the larger family network as we grew to be adults. Sharing both joys and sorrows with family members is still a staple of the Italian culture. One of the most notable changes missing in American Italian traditions today is the large Sunday family gatherings. Why? For the past several decades, families have consisted of two wage earners. Children are involved in sports, music, school and other outside weekend activities. With both parents working the weekend is the only time young families can spend together shopping, do household chores, or prepare for the upcoming week. The traditional Sunday family dinners require an entire day to prepare and an afternoon to consume. Today such time commitment is a precious commodity. Today the time families spend together on holidays, or backyard barbecue or birthday party are as special a time to catch up on each other's lives. It is as meaningful as the old Sunday dinner.

#### 2. Music

Opera has always been associated with the Italian tradition. The booming opera voices heard on stage in elaborate costumes drew big crowds back in the day. As the generations evolved so did music and how we enjoy it. Rather than sit and listen to Pavarotti, Italians also loved dancing to folk music like the tarantella. Today traditional opera and folk music have been replaced by Italian and American contemporary music. Young (and older) Italians not only love to listen to the music but love to dance and move. 

#### 3. Art

Italians love art. Visiting Italy means taking in the splendor of ancient art in castles, basilicas, churches, museums, the Coliseum, and Vatican. Vacations to Italy include touring the countryside to enjoy the architecture within large and small cities. Art also includes Italian fashion. Many of the world's renown fashion creators are Italian. Among the most notable are Armani, Gucci, Benetton, Verace and Prada. Priced outside the reach of the average Italian, we still enjoy the creativity and beauty of Italian art.

#### 4. Religion

80% of Italians are Catholic. The church rituals and customs are as traditional today as in ancient Italy. Italians go to church and believe in the power of prayer in their lives. Italian homes proudly display the crucifix and pictures of Jesus and La Madonna. One thing our ancestors taught us was that prayer can move mountains. We continue to endeavor to instill the belief that prayer is important to the younger generations.

#### 5. Holidays and Celebrations

Italians love to celebrate and often don't need a reason. Growing up we gathered to celebrate traditional holidays such as Christmas, Easter, All Saints Day, Fourth of July, Memorial and Labor Days, Thanksgiving and even Halloween! Add to that list weddings, baptisms, and funerals.

But celebrations have changed with the generations and passage of time. The very elaborate Christmas traditions of my childhood have been replaced with newer, more relaxed, traditions as the generations change. Growing up, women would begin buying and preparing for the seven-fishes dinner several days prior to sitting down at the table on Christmas Eve. Today my family enjoys baked shrimp and pasta Milanese, but the meatless-Christmas Eve dinner has been replaced with "American" meats alongside some fish and different pastas. For Easter, we no longer eat traditional goat or lamb – the tradition meat of choice is now prime rib. Growing up we always had several meals in one, never put the turkey and "fixings" on the table without homemade raviolis and pork for Thanksgiving. Pasta is either the star or not on the table for today's holidays. But that doesn't mean we aren't celebrating our heritage.

Take some time before the end of the year to think about how your family traditions have changed as the generations have changed. But never lose sight of the fact that Italians love tradition.

#### **Peppermint Mocha Mudslide**

- 3 ounces Kahlua Peppermint Mocha
- 1 ounce vodka
- 1 Tablespoon chocolate syrup
- 3 ounces heavy cream
- Ice
- Candy canes crushed

#### Instructions:

Crush up a candy cane or peppermint candies into small pieces and spread on a small plate so that it is about ½" deep.

Dip each cocktail glass into the simple syrup so that the rim is fully coated, then dip the rim into the crushed candy cane until it sticks to the glass. Allow to set.

Fill each prepared cocktail glass with ice.

Add all liquid ingredients to a cocktail shaker with ice. Shake vigorously for 5 to 10 seconds.

Strain and pour into your cocktail glasses. Enjoy immediately!

#### Pumpkin Bread from our own Kathy Holt


- 1 ½ cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon ground cloves
- ½ teaspoon baking powder
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 4 large eggs
- 1 cup white sugar
- ¼ cup light brown sugar
- ½ teaspoon vanilla extract
- ¾ cup canned pumpkin (not pie filling)
- ¾ cup vegetable oil
- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Grease an 8 1/2-x4 1/2-inch loaf pan.
- 2. Combine flour, baking soda, nutmeg, cinnamon, cloves, baking powder, and salt in a large bowl; mix well and set aside. (**See note**)
- Beat eggs, white sugar, brown sugar, and vanilla extract in a large bowl with an electric mixer on high speed until combined, about 30 seconds. Beat in pumpkin and oil. Add flour mixture; mix until batter is blended and smooth. Pour batter into the prepared loaf pan.
- 4. Bake in the preheated oven until the top is dark brown and a toothpick inserted into the center of the bread comes out clean, about 70 minutes. (Check at 65 min)
- Let bread cool in the pan for about 30 minutes, then invert onto a wire rack to cool completely. Cut into 1-inch-thick slices.

**Note:** You can also substitute 3 teaspoon pumpkin pie spice instead of individual spices.

This is a recipe based on Starbucks.

This bread freezes perfectly. Seal any leftover slices in a resealable plastic bag or wrap them in plastic and pop them into the freezer. To serve, microwave one frozen slice on high for about 45 seconds, and it will taste like it just came out of the oven!
