Pomegranate Cosmopolitan

Ingredients:

2 ounces Vodka, ½ ounce Triple Sec, ½ ounce Lime juice

1 ounce Pomegranate juice In a shaker with ice combine all the ingredients, and shake very well. Pour in a chilled cocktail glass.



Fudgy Brownies

These brownies are a perfect match of a fudgy center and a crackly top! Great for potlucks!

Ingredients:

* 2 sticks unsalted butter *8 oz semisweet chocolate, roughly chopped (use the best brand you can afford) * 4 large eggs at room temperature * ½ teaspoon Kosher salt * 1 cup granulated sugar * 1 cup firmly packed dark brown sugar * 2 teaspoons vanilla extract * 1 cup all-purpose flour

Instructions

Set the rack in the middle of the oven and preheat to 350. Line a 13 x 9 x 2-inch pan with parchment paper (bring parchment up sides of pan so there is a slight overhang) and grease with nonstick cooking spray. **2.** Place the butter in a medium microwave-safe bowl and melt in the microwave until slightly bubbling. Add the chocolate and whisk until the chocolate is completely melted. If the butter isn't melted place mixture in the microwave and heat for about 20 seconds or so, then whisk again. **3.** Whisk the eggs in a large bowl. Add the salt, granulated sugar, brown sugar, and vanilla; whisk until smooth (check for lumps of brown sugar). Add the chocolate mixture and add flour and whisk until the batter is smooth. **4.**Pour the batter into the pan and spread evenly. Bake for about 45 minutes, until the top has formed a shiny crust and the batter is moderately firm. Cool completely in the pan on a rack. **5.** To cut brownies, lift them out of the pan using the parchment overhang and transfer them to a cutting board. Using a sharp knife, trim away the edges and cut the brownies into 24 2-inch squares.
