## SO, WHAT IS A DUAL CLUTCH TRANSMISSION

The C8 Corvette features a dual clutch transmission (DCT) for the first time. So, what is a DCT?
Dual-Clutch Transmissions are quite interesting and once you learn how they operate, your opinion on whether that clutch pedal is necessary just might change. In short, a DCT is far more than a transmission, in fact it is two transmissions in the same case. The "dual clutch" term comes from the fact that there are two separate transmission gear sets, each with its own clutch pack. Each transmission has an electronically actuated clutch. When you pull the paddle behind the steering wheel, the DCT disengages one clutch and activates the other, allowing shifts to happen within 100 milliseconds, quite literally faster than you can blink. In broader terms, a DCT is an ultra-high performance manual transmission blended with the best parts of an automatic, without the failure-prone components such as the torque converter, drums and clutch bands.

How Does It Work?


You may have images of transmissions trapped together inside a large complicated housing, but it is way more complicated than that. Just like a typical transmission, there is a shaft that connects to the engine via an input shaft. Unlike a traditional manual, the clutch pack is internal to the transmission. Like a motorcycle or auto trans, the clutches are wet, meaning they are designed to be coated with transmission fluid. The main input shaft runs throughout the transmission just like a typical manual, however in a DCT, the input shaft has an inner and outer shaft, each of which has its own clutch. Each clutch pack is made of 6 plates, for a total of 12 clutch plates, one pack for each shaft. This allows the two shafts to spin independently. The gears are split between the two shafts, for instance the TR-9080 has gears $1,3,5$, and 7 on the outer shaft, while the inner shaft has gears $2,4,6$, and 8 . The output shaft ties both transmissions together. All told, there are 2 clutches, 6 shafts, 24 individual gears, 5 synchros, 5 shifting rods, bearings for all, and this is all squeezed together in to the 5-piece case.

Each of the main shaft gears are directly meshed with the corresponding gears on the countershaft. The countershafts each connect to the pinion gear shaft via meshed ring gears on the countershaft. When a gear is selected, the next gear (the one being shifted to) is engaged before the previous gear is released. This is what allows the transmission to shift so fast, the synchronizers engage the selected gear to the shaft, and the two clutches engage and disengage in a seamless manner, you never had a moment where power is not being transferred. Gears on a DCT can't grind, shifts are perfect, every single time.

Monitoring and controlling all of this is a cadre of sensors, 3 electrohydraulic controllers, and a master controller that ensures everything is operating as it was designed. Beyond the mechanical operation, the electronics are mind-blowing as well. Upshifts do not skip gears, it is 1-2-3-4-5-6-7-8, however in some conditions, downshifts can jump gears to the other shaft, you can't go 7-5 as those gears are on the same shaft, instead the transmission will go $7-4,6-3$, etc.

Tremec worked closely with GM engineers to develop these new DCT transmissions to give the manufacturer what they needed for this dynamic ultra-high-performance car. With well over 600 hp available, there was nothing available, these DCTs had to be developed with a blank sheet of paper. The clutch packs, for instance

are a hybrid wet design. Unlike motorcycle clutches with are always wet, the clutches in the Tremec DCTs are only lubricated when they need it. This gives the TCM better control over the thermal load and by only spraying fluid when the clutches need it, there is less drag from fluid like you get in a standard wet clutch transmission.

Operation of the transmission is handled through the transmission control module or TCM. This computer controls every aspect of the transmission, and even learns the driver's behavior, so it adapts to your driving style. The vehicles have selectable driving modes, to better operate under specific conditions, such as normal driving, sport mode, track mode, drag mode, etc. The TR-9080 in the C8 Corvette is also the differential, and can be configured as a mechanical LSD (Limited Slip Differential) or E-LSD controlled by the transmission master controller. The TCM controls wheel slip in the E-LSD configuration, giving the driver even more control over how the car drives in given conditions.

In normal mode, the transmission shifts silky smooth for comfort. Switch to sport mode, and the shifts are faster, 80 milliseconds. In drag mode, the shifts are actually slowed down so that the engine can build maximum torque before the shift so the transmission can put as much power to the wheels as possible. In track mode, the TCM works with the engine to reduce shift torque, allowing you to actually shift in the middle of a corner, rather than having to wait until you are exiting the corner to grab the next gear.

This can shave tenths of second off an individual corner, as you can accelerate sooner with more control and less concern about breaking traction because of the torque bump you would see from a typical transmission shift. C8 Corvettes have 2 user-progammable modes where the driver can adjust the transmission, engine, and suspension parameters for their own preferences.

What Does This Mean For Me?
A DCT transforms a car from 4 relatively independent systems to 1 system working together. The engine, transmission, differentials, and the driver all must be in sync with a clutched manual. One hiccup, whether it is missed shift, poor timing, throttle position, even the suspension all must be understood to get the most out of the car. With a Tremec DCT, the engine and transmission work together, making minute alterations to every system, reading the sensors and driver input directly, so the transitions between gears is perfect, every time. The paddle shifters are directly connected to the TCM, they do not use the CAN-bus system, reducing electrical delays.

For drag racing, there is even a "burn-out" mode, which limits RPM to 3500 for an efficient tire warming session, launch control to eliminate wheel spin off the line, and in the case of the C8 Corvette, puts you on the path to $0-60$ in 2.9 seconds.

These transmissions do require some light maintenance. The fluid is to be changed ever 22,500 miles with a filter change every 7500 miles. The TR-9080 has an 11-liter capacity. Tremec's DCTs are liquid cooled via engine coolant that flows through a heat exchanger mounted outside the transmission.

Tremec's DCT transmissions are not the death of the manual transmission, rather they are the evolution. Unlike an automatic, the DCT gives you control at the smallest level but with the speed and precision of your thoughts. It takes the average person 1 second to make vertical shift (1-2,3-4) and up to 2 seconds to make a horizontal shift (2-3, 45). The Tremec DCT does it in 100 milliseconds, as fast as you can pull the paddle.

Sure, it isn't quite the same as slammin' 4th on the back stretch coming out of a long sweeping left hander, but when you put your foot to the floor and slap that paddle $3 / 4 \mathrm{~s}$ thru the turn and the tires dig in and you hit the straight 5 or 10 miles an hour faster than you could before, that just might matter a little more.
