MEMBER PROFILE, ROD LOOSE

Rod has owned sports and "sporty" cars for fifty years. Starting with a 1965 Dodge Coronet convertible, he also owned a 1969 Camaro, a 1976 Datsun 240Z, a 1983 Nissan 260Z, and a 1988 Nissan 280ZX. He bought his first Corvette, a C7 Grand Sport coupe during 2019.



He grew up in West Lawn, where he attended Wilson High School. Following graduation, he attended Millersville University, where he majored in Secondary Education, Comprehensive Social Sciences, receiving a Bachelor's Degree in Education. Years later he earned a Master's Degree in Criminal Justice Management from West Chester University.

While attending Millersville, he enrolled in the Marine Corps' Platoon Leaders Course, Officer Candidates School at the Marine Corps Base at Quantico, Virginia. Following his graduation from Millersville, he was commissioned a Second Lieutenant. Assigned to the Marine Corps Air Station, Cherry Point, North Carolina, he was designated an Air Strike Control Officer. His three-year tour of active duty culminated in assignment as Officer in Charge of the Direct Air Support Center, attached to the 32nd Marine Amphibious Unit with the US 6th Fleet in the Mediterranean. After his discharge from active duty, he joined the 49th Marine Aircraft Group, Marine Corps Reserve, at the Naval Air Station, Willow Grove, Pennsylvania. He retired with the rank of Major during 1996. (Rod served alongside CWO4 John Barone, who is also a member of the SDCC.)

Following his release from active duty, Rod worked for the Department of Defense for nine years, as an Industrial Security Specialist, Personnel Security Investigator, and Civilian Criminal Investigator for the US Army. During 1984 he was selected for training as a Special Agent with the FBI. Following New Agent Training at the FBI Academy at Quantico, he was assigned to the FBI Field Office in Richmond, Virginia. As a member of the Bank Robbery Squad, Rod was trained and certified as a Hostage Negotiator, Police Instructor, and a member of the SWAT Team.

After three years in Richmond, he was transferred to the New York City Field Office, where he worked Soviet Counterintelligence, Colombian Drugs, Domestic and International Terrorism, and coordinated the Police Training Program. Rod was eventually promoted to Supervisory Special Agent, and transferred to the FBI Academy in Quantico. Assigned to the Investigative Training Unit, he was the Primary New Agent Instructor for Domestic Terrorism, International Terrorism, and Islam & Arabic Culture. He also taught law enforcement officers overseas, in Ghana, Kenya, Hungary, and the Republic of Georgia. During 2004, he attended counterterrorism training in Israel.

Following his retirement, he returned home to Berks County and teaches for Alvernia University as an Adjunct Professor of Criminal Justice. Rod conducts presentations on Domestic Terrorism, Weapons of Mass Destruction, Suicide Bombers, and his experiences as an FBI Agent in New York City on 9/11 to civic groups, historical societies, high school classes, and the Alvernia Seniors College. An Eagle Scout, he chairs Boards of Review for aspiring Eagle Scouts, and volunteers every year at the World War II Weekend at the Reading Airport.

He is the father of Kathryn, a senior at Ringling College of Art & Design, in Sarasota, Florida

He was interviewed by Tom Frank and recorded for the Berks TV show. Gene also loved to build and fly his remote model airplanes in his later years with some of his flying friends.



However, due to the current circumstances, delays in completion of your order may be unavoidable. Rockhound will notify you by email when your order is ready for pick-up, or delivery by mail to your home, depending upon the option you selected.

If you don't see what you're looking for in the SDC store, considering checking out what other styles might be available (in limited sizes / colors) by going to Rockhound's website at rockhoundapparel.squarespace.com. In the upper right corner of the Home page, click on "Price Quote". You will then see Rockhound's vendor websites. Most of the SDC items are from SanMar. Feel free to browse the vendor sites. If you see something you like, jot down the style/model number and contact Katy. She will be able to tell you if it is available in your size and the color you want, as well as give you a price with our logo.

2 ways to get into the online store:

1. Go to Rockhound Apparel's website - rockhoundapparel.squarespace.com
 - Click on "MARKET" at the top of the page
 - Scroll down and click on the SDC logo
2. Go directly to the SDC online store by entering - rockhoundapparel.squarespace.com/skylinedrive

Once you are in the online store, scroll down to select an item that you might like. Most are available in sizes up to 4X for both men and women, and offer 3 different color choices. Each "style" is shown with the traditional logo (revised pagoda design) and a new "modern" logo. Size and color options are shown when you click on the item.

Items with the traditional logo are several dollars more than those with the modern logo due to the embroidery for the traditional being more intricate and taking more time to complete.

Steps to place an order:

1. Click on the item of your choice. You will see a description of that item.
2. Scroll down to select the color from the drop box. (click on icons at the very bottom to see the item in available colors.)
3. Select your size from the drop box.
4. Make sure the "quantity" is correct, then click on "ADD TO CART".
5. When shopping is completed, click on the cart in the upper right corner, then click on "CHECKOUT".
6. Enter your email address, click on "CONTINUE". (you don't have to subscribe to their mailing list)
7. Enter shipping information.
8. Select "Shipping Option" - In-store pickup or Flat-rate shipping (if there is any other option shown, ignore it)
9. Fill in payment information
10. Review and complete Purchase
