We will again have our Monday, September 14 membership meeting at the Victor Emmanuel outdoor pavilion (311 Hazel St., Reading). The VEII pavilion is very large and has many amenities...concrete floor, large picnic tables, electric, speakers, and permanent restroom facilities nearby. Note: VEII has two pavilions and we will be using the one on the right side of their main building, in the rear.

The VEII catered menu will include: salad, pizza, baked ziti, meatballs, sausage, bread & butter, and unlimited soda fountain which includes cold filtered water. This is a buffet and VEII will serve our members. No alcoholic beverages will be provided, nor allowed. Members are invited to bring desserts and may want to consider bringing store bought prepackaged desserts.

To access the private parking lot for our pavilion, turn right at the front entrance to the main building (Hazel St.) and just beyond the row houses on the left (at Belvedere St.) turn left into the dirt driveway to the back of the row houses where you will access an open gate into the grass parking lot. This parking lot is solely for the pavilion use. Should we have rain (wet grass) you might want to park on the paved lot closest to the UGI facility. Note: If VEII remains closed to "indoor dining" we can park on any of the paved parking lots.

To assist VEII in providing sufficient food, we need to ask all members who plan to attend to provide us with a headcount. **Please email kspeicher@comcast.net or call 610-777-5414 with the number of attendees no later than Wednesday, September 9**. We will have food at 6:00 PM and the meeting at 7:00 PM. Please bring your masks and adhere to the then current social distancing guidelines.


