MEMBER PROFILE JOY and JOE GOLT NEWSLETTER EDITORS FOR 20 YEARS

We joined SDC in 1999. At that time John and Nancy Messersmith were the newsletter editors. In 2000 they announced that they wished to step down. So, we decided to give it a try. The September 2001 issue was our first newsletter. That was twenty years ago!

At that time the newsletter was 100% hard copy. We had to print it and hand carry to Minuteman Printing. Once the printing was finished another couple (Ray and Ann Fisher) collected the newsletter, attached address labels, and then folded and stapled it together. At last, it was taken to the post office. This was cumbersome and expensive. The newsletter budget was close to \$6000.

It was a long process, but we eventually were able to produce the newsletter in PDF format, suitable for emailing. Today we mail to only 21 hard copy hold outs. 210 members get the emailed version. Newsletter budget today is around \$400.



Our history:

I was born and raised on the streets of Baltimore. Joy came from Belair MD. Like most young boys, I idolized my dad. And my Dad was a Chevrolet man to the core. His DNA helix was connected by Chevrolet bow ties. Naturally, I liked the Chevy also. The Corvette was my dream car. In the 50's you only saw a Corvette maybe twice a year. In 1971 I bought my first Corvette, a 1970 Bridgehampton blue Convertible. I met Joy in a night club in 1972. We began dating. It was a 45 minute drive to Belair just pick her up. We were married in 1975 and moved to Reading in 1983 due to my job.

Trip to Washington state, yes we drove our 2001 across the country. West coast trip, when we fedexed the 6 Vettes to Reno and flew there to start the drive. The 2004 Lab of Pa. The C7 reveal in Detroit. Milford proving grouns(not open to the public).The many Corvette Museum sponsored Lap of Kentucky's. Countless shows including Invette-ta-tionals. Many Holiday parties . The list goes on and on.

I guess, as long as we stay healthy we will continue to publish the newsletter as a way to give back to the club for all the wonderful times we had.
